GREETING

WHEREAS it appears to me to be necessary to appoint a Commission to inquire into and report on the matters hereinafter mentioned, being matters in respect of which an inquiry will, in my opinion, be in the interests of the public welfare.

Now, therefore, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon and its Dependencies, reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence, ability and fidelity, do in pursuance of the provisions of section 2 of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, No 17 of 1948, by these presents appoint you the said Mannikku Wadumestri Hendrick de Silva, K C, to be my Commissioner for the following purposes, that is to say—

(1) To inquire into and report on the questions—

(a) whether any Councillor did at any time after December 2, 1943, corruptly solicit or receive or agree to receive, for himself or for another person, any gift, loan, fee, reward or advantage as an inducement to or reward for such Councillor doing or forbearing to do any official act in his capacity as a member of the Council,

(b) whether any Councillor did, at any time after December 2, 1943, corruptly give, promise or offer to any other Councillor, whether for the benefit of such other Councillor or of another person, any gift, loan, fee, reward or advantage as an inducement to or reward for such other Councillor doing or forbearing to do any official act in his capacity as a member of the Council, and

(2) to report, in the event of the inquiry made under the preceding provisions disclosing the existence of bribery and corruption among the members of the Colombo Municipal Council, on the steps that should be taken to prevent or check such bribery and corruption

And I do, further, hereby direct that such part, if any, of the inquiry as you may in your discretion determine shall not be held in public

And I do hereby authorise and empower you, the said Commissioner, to hold all such inquiries and make all such investigations into the aforesaid matters as may appear to you to be necessary, and require you to transmit to me a report thereon under your hand as early as possible

And I do hereby require and direct all public officers and other persons, to whom you may apply for assistance or information for the purpose of your inquiries and investigations, to render all such assistance or furnish all such information as may properly be rendered or furnished in that behalf

In this instrument—

“advantage” includes—

(a) any office or dignity, and any forbearance to demand any money or money's worth or valuable thing, and

(b) any aid, vote, consent or influence, and

(c) any promise or procurement of or agreement or endeavour to procure, or the holding out of any expectation of, any gift, loan, fee, reward or advantage as hereinbefore defined;

“official act”, when used with reference to any member of the Colombo Municipal Council, includes any act which that member was, by or under the provisions of any law for the time being in force relating to that Council, empowered, authorised, entitled or required to do or forbear to do in respect of any matter or transaction whatsoever, actual or proposed (including the election of a Mayor or Deputy Mayor or of any Committee), in which the Council was concerned,

“Councillor”, means any person who at any time after December 2, 1943, was a member of the Colombo Municipal Council, whether or not he is a member of that Council at the date hereof, and

“the Council” means the Colombo Municipal Council

Note on the Precedence Table

(1) The Commander-in-Chief, East Indies Station, if of the rank of Rear Admiral or higher will, when in Ceylon, be assigned courtesy precedence next after the group of Foreign Ministers, Envoys Extraordinary and Charges d' Affaires.

(2) Religious and Ecclesiastical Dignitaries will be assigned courtesy precedence at the Governor-General's discretion according to seniority of their office

(3) Commanding Officers stationed in Ceylon of United Kingdom Naval, Army and Air Forces will be assigned courtesy precedence at the Governor-General's discretion according to seniority of their office

(4) The Mayor of Colombo, when present at functions within the Municipality of Colombo, will be assigned courtesy precedence next after the Puisne Judges

(5) The Vice-Chancellor of the University of Ceylon will be assigned courtesy precedence next after the Secretary to the Treasury

(6) Sir Richard Aluwihare, C B E , C C S , while holding the post of Chief Commissioner of Police will be assigned personal precedence in the group of officials at point 17 in the Table.

1 These regulations may be cited as the Pilgrimages (Vattappalai Kannaikai Amman Temple) Regulations, 1949.

2 These regulations shall apply to pilgrimages to be made to the place specified in the Schedule hereto

3 In these regulations—

‘ Assistant Government Agent ’ means the Assistant Government Agent of the Vavuniya District and ‘ camp area ’ means the area specified in the Schedule hereto.

4 No person shall camp in any part of the camp area which has been set apart for any other purpose by the Assistant Government Agent by a notice exhibited on the spot

5 No person shall ease himself within the camp area except at a place provided for the purpose

6 No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area, except in a place or receptacle provided for the purpose

7. (a) No person shall keep any cattle for any purpose whatsoever in, or in the vicinity of, the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed as the droppings occur from the camp area to the nearest place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep the place occupied by the cattle in a clean and sanitary condition

8 No person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall enter the camp area, and no person shall bring any person suffering from any such disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person to enter the camp area.

9 In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which, or the manner in which, the pilgrims shall depart

10 Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or to any person authorised by such Medical Officer

11 When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use such tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is so set apart

12 No person shall bathe within the camp area except at a place specially provided for that purpose by the Assistant Government Agent

13 The Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or any person authorised by such Medical Officer may, if he thinks it necessary, chlorinate any well within the camp area

14 No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water factory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala, or expose for sale any eatables within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Assistant Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge on the recommendation of the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or any person authorised by such Medical Officer

15 (1) No person in the camp area shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or by any person authorised by such Medical Officer

(2) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or any person authorised by such Medical Officer to seize and destroy any such food condemned as unwholesome under the provisions of paragraph (1).

16 Every person who exposes any food or drink for sale within the camp area shall—

(1) keep such food or drink, and all materials used for the preparation thereof in glass cases or other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer in charge of the camp area or any persons authorised by such Medical Officer, or wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth so as to protect such food or drink from contamination by flies or dust, and

(2) Keep his premises, furniture and equipment used for the purpose of his trade in a clean and sanitary condition

17. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street or for any other purpose

18. No person shall sell or expose for sale any commodity of any description at any place within the camp area other than a place approved for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent

19. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area or within a distance of one mile from the boundaries of such area

20 No person shall slaughter any animals within the camp area

1 In these regulations —
“camp area” means the area specified in the Schedule hereto, and
“Assistant Government Agent” means the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse, or any rubbish, within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent.

5 (1) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(2) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle galá or at a place approved in that behalf by the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by the cattle.

6 All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being—

- (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or
- (b) kept in closed glass cases, or
- (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer, in charge of the camp area.

7 No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease, shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8 In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9 Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious disease or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical Officer or the Sanitary Officer, in charge of the camp area.

10 When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house, or any boutique where prepared food is exposed for sale, or any galá, within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct a booth, or

extend any building within the camp area, so as to encroach on the main road or other streets of the camp area.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14 No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area except in the place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

15 The Assistant Government Agent may at his discretion order that all vehicles or any class of vehicles shall proceed in one direction only on any road leading to the Marawila Roman Catholic Cemetery from Marawila or Horagolla.

Rule

The Rules for Passenger and Goods Train Traffic and Rates and Classification of Goods, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No 7,514 of February 26, 1926, as amended from time to time, are hereby further amended with effect from June 1, 1949, under the heading "Passengers", by the substitution, for rule 17, of the following new rule.—

"17 Fares—(a) The fares for the conveyance of passengers shall be at the following rates—

	First Class Cents per mile	Second Class Cents per mile	Third Class Cents per mile
On the line Rambukkana to Badulla	16	10	4
On all other lines	11	7	3

(b) In calculating the fare for a journey between any two stations, any fractional part of 5 cents which is less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ cents shall not be reckoned, and every fractional part of 5 cents which is not less than $2\frac{1}{2}$ cents shall be reckoned as 5 cents. Provided, however, that where the distance between any two stations is not more than two miles, every fractional part of 10 cents shall be reckoned as 10 cents "
