MINUTE ON PERMANENT SECRETARIES

HIS Excellency the Governor-General has been pleased to order the publication of the following Minute on Permanent Secretaries.

1 An appointment of a Permanent Secretary to any Ministry shall be made by the Governor-General under section 51 (1) of the Ceylon (Constitution and Independence) Orders in Council, 1946 and 1947. The appointment is personal and the post is pensionable.

2 An appointment of a Permanent Secretary may be made from the Public Service or from outside the Public Service. Appointments will be made primarily on merit and seniority in the Public Service will be a secondary consideration.

3 A Permanent Secretary will discharge all the duties of his office as well as such other duties as may be assigned to him by the Governor-General. Such other duties shall be discharged without payment of additional remuneration.

4 The Governor-General may, without assigning reasons, discontinue the services of any Permanent Secretary who prior to his appointment was not a member of the Public Service.

5. The Governor-General acting under section 51 (4) of the Ceylon (Constitution and Independence) Orders in Council, 1946 and 1947, may, without assigning reasons, transfer a Permanent Secretary, who has been appointed from the Public Service, to any other public office

6. The Governor-General may, at the request of a Permanent Secretary who has been appointed from the Public Service, order his reversion either to the service from which he was appointed or to the office which he held prior to his appointment as Permanent Secretary

7. Upon transfer as in paragraph 5 above or reversion as in paragraph 6 above, a Permanent Secretary will have the same seniority and the same salary, inclusive of increments, as he would have had if he had remained in the service to which he belonged or in the post which he held before his appointment as Permanent Secretary.

8. Where the Governor-General orders the transfer or reversion of a Permanent Secretary (otherwise than at his own request) the Governor-General may allow or refuse his request to be permitted to retire on special terms equivalent to those granted on abolition of office as laid down in the section of the Minutes on Pensions which deals with the pensions of Permanent Secretaries

9. Where in the opinion of a Minister disciplinary action against his Permanent Secretary has become necessary, the Minister will report the case to the Prime Minister who will, if he agrees with the Minister, advise the Governor-General that disciplinary action should be taken. The Governor-General will thereupon remit the papers to the Public Service Commission for such action as they may deem fit.

10. An application by a Permanent Secretary for leave to be spent within the Island and in South India for a period not exceeding 14 days will require the prior approval of his Minister. Where leave is to be spent outside the Island, or within the Island or South India in excess of 14 days, the application, if approved by the Minister, should be forwarded through the Secretary to the Treasury to the Prime Minister for the sanction of the Governor-General.

11 (1) A Permanent Secretary shall, at least six months before he reaches the age of 55, inform his Minister in writing whether or not he desires to retire on reaching the age of 55. The Minister will thereupon make his report through the Minister of Finance to the Prime Minister who will advise the Governor-General whether the officer should be permitted to retire or to remain in the service

11 (2) A Permanent Secretary who is permitted to remain in the service after the age of 55 will forward a written undertaking to the Secretary to the Governor-General that he will give at least 3 months' notice to his Minister before he retires from service or is granted leave preparatory to retirement, whichever is earlier

12. The Pensions, gratuities, &c., of Permanent Secretaries and their dependants are dealt with in new section 25A of the Minutes on Pensions.

13. Permanent Secretaries shall be bound by all Financial and other regulations of Government in so far as such regulations are not inconsistent with the foregoing provisions.

IN the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 9 (1) of the Ceylon (Parliamentary Elections) Order in Council, 1946, His Excellency the Governor-General has appointed Mr. J. H. PROBATIONERS, CEYLON OVERSEAS SERVICE

AN Examination for entry to the Ceylon Overseas Service will be held by the Public Service Commission in August, 1949. The actual dates will be notified later

2. The number of vacancies will be six.

3. Candidates for this examination must be males and must be Ceylonese. For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

(a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration and

(b) A person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration, and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a prima facie entitlement to such citizenship.

4. Candidates must have attained the age of 22 and must not have attained the age of 30 on August 1, 1949.

5. Candidates must have passed an Honours or Pass Degree Examination of the University of London or an Honours or Pass Degree Examination of the University of Ceylon or any other examination which may be deemed to be of at least equal standard

6. Applications will not be entertained from persons holding permanent or pensionable posts (including probationers) under Government

7. The fee for examination will be—

(a) Rs 75 for examination which should be paid to the Examination Fund (No 2) account of the Director of Education in the Bank of Ceylon. The bank receipt should be attached to the application form.

(b) Rs 10.50 for the medical examination. Successful candidates will be notified later of the manner in which this fee is to be paid

8. The posts carry a salary of £400 per annum and selected candidates will be on trial for a period of two years from the date of appointment, after which they will be eligible for substantive appointment in the Overseas Service on the salary scale £450—40—£650 per annum. Candidates who qualify in prescribed Departmental Examinations and are considered otherwise fit, may, however, receive such appointments after six months. The Government reserves to itself the right to terminate the services of any appointee during his period of trial and before he receives an appointment in the grade of Third Secretary, without giving reasons for such termination

9. There will be a liability for service in Ceylon or in any part of the world to which the candidate may be posted, and the other conditions of service will be as provided in the Overseas Service Minute, which is available for reference in the Ministry of Defence and External Affairs. Selected candidates will, before appointment, be required to produce a certificate from a Government Medical Officer as to their fitness to serve overseas

10. Candidates who possess the necessary qualifications and who propose to sit for the examination will on application to the Secretary, Public Service Commission be supplied with copies of the Regulations, Syllabus and Application Forms

11. Application forms must be filled by the candidates in their own handwriting and must reach the office of the Secretary, Public Service Commission, P. O. Box 500, Colombo, on or before June 30, 1949. Applications should be accompanied by three recent testimonials of character. These testimonials will not be returned

12. Candidates will be notified of the dates and place fixed for the viva voce test. The time table of the written part of the examination will be sent to the address given on the form of application.

13. The examination will include the following subjects which should be taken by all candidates. Each subject will carry the number of marks shown against it.—

Essay	.. 100 marks	General Knowledge	150 marks
Précis	.. 50 "	Intelligence Test	.. —
English	100 "	World Affairs	.. 100 marks
	Viva Voce		.. 250 marks

14. The syllabus is as follows—

(1) *Essay*—An essay to be written in English on one of several specified subjects. The essay will be judged not only according to language, style and arrangement but

also according to the degree of thoughtfulness and originality in its treatment of the subject (The paper will be of two hours' duration)

(2) *Précis*—A paper of one hour's duration requiring the candidate to express in his own words, but more succinctly, the substance of one or more passages of prose

(3) *English*.—A paper of one and half hour's duration designed to test the candidate's knowledge and command of written and spoken English

(4) *General Knowledge*—A paper designed to test the candidate's general knowledge. No special syllabus is prescribed but the paper will include optional questions on scientific subjects (The paper will be of three hours' duration).

(5) *Intelligence Test*—A paper of one hour's duration designed to place the candidates in order of merit from the point of view of general ability. No marks will be assigned, but the result of the test will be used in assigning marks for the viva voce examination

(6) *World Affairs*—A paper of three hours' duration designed to test the candidate's knowledge of world affairs in relation to current problems. No special syllabus is prescribed

(7) *Viva Voce*—The candidate will be interviewed by a Board who will have before them a record of his career. He will be asked questions on matters of general interest. The object of the interview is to assess his suitability for the Service for which he is entered, and in framing their assessment the Board will attach particular importance to his intelligence and alertness and his strength of character. Marks will also be given for any experience in public or commercial affairs which a candidate may have obtained as well as for knowledge of any foreign languages

- (iii) Where the Governor-General orders the transfer of a Permanent Secretary (except at his own request) and the Governor-General allows the request by such Permanent Secretary for retirement on special terms, he shall be granted an award in accordance with section 7 of these Minutes, but his salary as Permanent Secretary shall be ignored and he shall be deemed to have continuously held during the period of his service as Permanent Secretary the post or office, or as the case may be, to have continuously been during that period a member of the service from which he was appointed as Permanent Secretary and to have earned increments in the normal manner
- (iv) The proviso regarding liability to be recalled to the Public Service for re-employment referred to in section 7 (2) of these Minutes shall not apply to a Permanent Secretary who has not been appointed from the Public Service

Preliminary Report on the Vital Statistics of Ceylon, 1948

THE Vital Statistics for Ceylon for the year 1948 present the following salient features —

- (a) The marriage rate (General and Kandyan) of the non-Muslim population, 12.2 per thousand, is higher than the corresponding rate for 1947 but lower than the rates for 1942 to 1946.

(b) The birth rate, 40.6 per thousand of the population, is higher than the corresponding rates for 1944 to 1947, and is the same as that for 1943 which was the highest since 1928.

(c) All the death rates (general 13.2 per thousand of the population, infant 92 per thousand live births, and maternal 8.2 per thousand live births) are lower than the corresponding rates for 1947 when the rates for that year were the lowest ever recorded

Population

The estimated population of the Island on December 31, 1948, (excluding the military and shipping populations) was 7,193,000 as against an estimated population of 6,979,000 on December 31, 1947. The births registered during the year exceeded the deaths by 193,984, and the number of immigrants exceeded the number of emigrants by 20,185.

Marriages

The number of marriages registered under the (General) Marriage Registration Ordinance, and the Kandyan Marriage Ordinance, during 1948 was 40,364 (General, 32,413, Kandyan, 7,951), giving the above-mentioned marriage rate for the non-Muslim population of 12.2 per thousand, as against a corresponding marriage rate of 11.8 per thousand for 1947. There were 4,354 Muslim marriages, and the resulting marriage rate is 13.7 per thousand of the Muslim population, as against a marriage rate of 19.4 per thousand for 1947.

Births

287,697 births—146,323 male and 141,374 female—were registered in the Island during the year. The birth rate was 40.6 per thousand of the total population, as against a birth rate of 39.4 per thousand of the total population in 1947. The sex-ratio of the births was 1,035 male to 1,000 females. In the city of Colombo the birth rate was 54.6 per thousand as against 49.2 per thousand in 1947. There were 41,877 births on estates, as against 36,923 in 1947.

Deaths

The number of deaths registered during the year was 93,713—47,850 deaths of males and 45,863 deaths of females—and the resulting death rate is 13.2 per thousand of the population, as against 14.3 per thousand in 1947. In the city of Colombo the death rate was 23.1 per thousand, as against 22.9 per thousand in 1947. 12,794 deaths were registered on estates in 1948, as against 11,400 in 1947.

Infant Mortality

The number of infant deaths registered during the year was 26,507, and the resulting infant mortality rate is 92 per thousand live births, as against an infant mortality rate of 101 per thousand live births in 1947. The city of Colombo had an infant mortality rate of 120 per thousand live births, as against an infant mortality rate of 122 per thousand live births in 1947. The infant mortality rate for estates is 107 per thousand live births, which is the same as the rate for the previous year.

Maternal Mortality

The number of maternal deaths (deaths connected with pregnancy and childbirth) registered during the year was 2,345, and the resulting maternal mortality rate is 8.2 per thousand live births, as against a maternal mortality rate of 10.6 per thousand live births in 1947. In the city of Colombo the maternal mortality rate was 11.9 per thousand live births, as against 17.2 per thousand live births in 1947. The maternal mortality rate on estates is 6.6 per thousand live births, as against a maternal mortality rate of 6.4 per thousand live births on estates in 1947.
