## GREETING

WHEREAS it appears to me to be necessary to appoint a Commission to inquire into and report on the matters hereinafter mentioned, being matters in respect of which an inquiry will, in my opinion, be in the interests of the public welfare

Now, therefore, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor-General and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon and its Dependencies, reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence, ability and fidelity, do in pursuance of the provisions of section 2 of the Commissions of Inquiry Act, No. 17 of 1948, by these presents appoint you the said Edward Fredrick Noel Gratiaen, K C., to be my Commissioner for the purposes of inquiring into and reporting on the following matters, that is to say—

- (1) The circumstances in which firearms, ammunition and other prohibited articles were found in the cells of certain prisoners in the Welikade Prison on June 15, 1949, and the means by which they were introduced
- (2) The person or persons who were directly or indirectly responsible, whether by any act, omission, neglect of duty or otherwise, for the introduction or for assisting or permitting or in any way facilitating the introduction of the said articles
- (3) The purposes for which the said articles were introduced and for which they were intended to be used.
- (4) The security measures usually adopted in the Prison, the sufficiency or adequacy of such measures and the question whether they were duly taken and maintained at or about June 15, 1949
- (5) The measures and safeguards which should immediately be put into effect in order to prevent a recurrence of similar incidents in the Prison

And I do, further, hereby direct that such part, if any, of the inquiry as you may in your discretion determine shall not be held in public

And I do hereby authorise and empower you, the said Commissioner, to hold all such inquiries and make all such investigations into the aforesaid matters as may appear to you to be necessary, and require you to transmit to me a report thereon under your hand as early as possible

And I do hereby require and direct all public officers and other persons, to whom you may apply for assistance or information for the purpose of your inquiries and investigations, to render all such assistance or furnish all such information as may properly be rendered or furnished in that behalf

POSTS OF ASSISTANT COMMISSIONER, DEPARTMENT OF  
LOCAL GOVERNMENT

APPLICATIONS are invited for five posts of Assistant Commissioner, Department of Local Government. Four posts are permanent and pensionable. One is to be filled in an acting capacity.

2 The candidates selected for appointment to the permanent posts will be appointed on probation for 2 years and will be paid on appointment Rs 3,000 for first year, Rs 3,360 second year and on confirmation Rs 4,800—10 of Rs 360 and 5 of Rs 480—Rs 10,800. Those over 26 years of age at date of appointment will start on Rs 4,440 for first year on probation and then proceed to Rs 4,800. The other post is on the scale Rs 3,000 first year, Rs 3,360 second year, and thereafter Rs 4,800—10 of Rs 360 and 5 of Rs 480—Rs 10,800.

3 The grant of leave and other conditions of service will be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Papers VIII of 1934 and VIII of 1946. Rent and cost of living allowances will be paid according to sanctioned Government rates.

4 Every candidate must fulfil the following conditions—

- (a) He must be a Ceylonese
- (b) He must have attained the age of 22 years and must not have attained the age of 40 years on July 15, 1949. Applications from members of the Local Government Service will be considered irrespective of age up to a maximum of 50 years if they have had a minimum of 10 years service in a local body and have held a responsible position therein.
- (c) He must be a graduate of a recognized University. Applications from members of the Local Government Service will be considered irrespective of educational qualifications if they have had a minimum of 10 years service in a local body and have held a responsible position therein.
- (d) He must possess a good knowledge of Sinhalese or Tamil.

Ex-servicemen of His Majesty's Fighting Forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services (excluding those who had left these services of their own accord) will be allowed to deduct the periods of such service from their ages for eligibility alone, provided they are qualified in all other respects.

A candidate having a professional qualification entitling him to practise his profession will be regarded as eligible. A knowledge of Sinhalese or Tamil and legal experience will be considered as additional qualifications. Preference will be given to those with special knowledge and experience of the work of local authorities or those who possess wide administrative experience.

5 Applications will not be entertained from persons (including probationers) holding permanent or pensionable posts under Government. Applications from other officers holding temporary posts will be considered only if they are forwarded through the Heads of their respective Departments. 6 Selected candidates for permanent appointments, if not already in the Public Service will, before appointment, be required to pass a medical examination by a Government Medical Officer. If the candidate is found to be physically unfit, the provisional appointment will be cancelled.

7 Successful candidates will be required to serve in any part of the Island.

8 Anyone who desires to recommend an applicant should do so by giving him a testimonial. Any form of canvassing or attempt to influence the selection of a candidate will disqualify such candidate.

9 Should an interview be deemed necessary in the case of any applicant, he will be required to present

himself for an interview in Colombo, at an appointed time and place which will be communicated to him. No travelling or other expenses will be paid.

10. Candidates who possess the necessary qualifications will, on application to the Secretary, Public Service Commission, be supplied with application forms

11. Applications for the posts should reach the Secretary, Public Service Commission, P. O. Box No. 500, Colombo 1, not later than 12 noon on July 15, 1949, and should state whether they should be considered for both posts—permanent and temporary—or one of them only

2 (i) Successful candidates will be appointed to the Typists Service on the salary scale of Rs 840 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs 72 to Rs 2,424 per annum. In this scale efficiency bars operate before Rs 1,488 and Rs 2,064

(ii) The posts are pensionable for male candidates. Female candidates will be appointed on a Provident Fund Basis

#### 3 Conditions of Service —

- (i) The grant of leave and other conditions of service will, in the case of a new entrant to the Public Service, be governed by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1934, as modified by the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII of 1946. Rent allowance will be payable

6 Full-time members of a Unit of the Armed Forces, who joined such units before August 15, 1945, and who were honourably discharged, and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, and Air Raid Precautions Services who joined such services before August 15, 1945 (excluding those who had left those services of their own accord), will be allowed to deduct the period of their service since September 3, 1939, from their ages in computing the age for the purpose of the age limit. Applications must be sent by registered post only to reach the Director of Education, Examinations Branch, Boathouse, Colombo, on or before August 1, 1949. Any applications received after that date will be rejected

(ii) (a) Candidates who are in Government Service must forward their applications through the Head of the Department in which they are serving.

(b) Candidates who claim eligibility as ex-servicemen must forward their applications through the Head of the Unit in which they have served.

\* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration, and  
(b) A person who has applied for citizenship of Ceylon by registration and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a prima facie entitlement to such citizenship.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 10.

(iv) A certificate of birth and a certificate of character (see paragraphs 5 (i) and 5 (iv) ) must be attached to the form of application.

*Note* —(a) Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(b) Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates

(c) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of birth, under section 18 (i) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, application should be made to the Registrar-General's or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office in the District in which the birth took place, under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, for the amendment of the entry in case 2 of the birth registration entry, and in other cases applications should be made to the District Court under section 29 for rectification of the entry in case 2.

(d) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Director of Education must be attached to the form of application. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or an Assisted School the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended, otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor or Notary, or generally speaking some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

(v) The Director of Education will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate entering himself at an examination hall other than one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time table and the rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervising Examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of examination he should communicate without delay with the Director of Education, Examinations Branch, Boathouse, Colombo, informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following information —

In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing or mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

Touch typewriting in *English* will be regarded as essential. Neatness, accuracy and speed will be taken into account.

Candidates must bring their own typewriters, if possible, otherwise they will be expected to type on the machine provided irrespective of make or model.

13. ## Revision of Registers of Electors

Colombo North, Colombo Central, Colombo South and Wellawatta-Galkissa Electoral Districts

THE Registers of Electors of the Colombo North, Colombo Central, Colombo South and Wellawatta-Galkissa Electoral Districts are now being revised in accordance with sections 16 to 18 of the Ceylon (Parliamentary Elections) Order in Council, 1946.

2 Under section 4 of the Order in Council, no person is qualified to have his name in any register of electors unless he satisfies, *inter alia* the following conditions —

- (a) is a British subject ;
- (b) was not less than 21 years of age on June 1, 1949.
- (c) has for a continuous period of six months between December 1, 1947, and June 1, 1949, resided in the electoral district to which the register relates.

3. Any person who is not disqualified under section 4 is qualified to have his name entered in the register of electors if he has—

- (a) a domicile of origin in Ceylon (section 5) ; or
- (b) a domicile of choice in Ceylon (section 5) , or
- (c) the special literacy and income or property qualification (section 6) , or
- (d) a certificate of permanent settlement (section 7).

4. For the purpose of this year's revision, enumerators will be calling on residents within the City of Colombo and the Urban Council Town of Dehiwala-Mt Lavinia from and after June 22, 1949, and distributing forms in which information relating to possible electors is required to be given under section 16 (3). The Registering Officer will be grateful for the co-operation of the public in this connexion, and he particularly requests that all information asked for be readily and accurately furnished. If no enumerator calls at any qualified person's residence before July 22, 1949, he is advised to communicate with this office immediately.

5 In the case of residents outside the Urban areas referred to but living within the Electoral Districts of Colombo North and Wellawatta-Galkissa, qualified persons are advised to get in touch with the headmen of their villages and give any information that may be required.

6 In the case of persons who seek to have their names entered in the register of electors by reason of the qualifications referred to at (c) and (d) of paragraph 3 above, they should make independent application to reach me on or before July 15, 1949, on prescribed forms obtainable from this office.

#### Scholarships in Forestry

THE question of awarding three scholarships tenable for a period of 2 or 3 years from October 1, 1949, at an University in the United Kingdom is under consideration. Applications, in the form prescribed below, will be received up to 4.30 p.m. on July 15, 1949, by the undersigned from those willing to be considered.

2. The course of study is designed for the training of selected persons for Staff Grade posts of the Forest Department.

3. A scholar will be entitled to the following:—

- (a) A free sea passage to the United Kingdom and back to Ceylon.

- (c) A scholarship allowance in accordance with any one of the following scales which is appropriate to his case —

#### In the United Kingdom

- 1 15 shillings per night away from headquarters up to a maximum of 2 weeks and thereafter 10 shillings per night for a further 2 weeks for stay at one temporary centre.
- 2 7 shillings 6 pence per diem for absence of not less than 8 consecutive hours and not involving a night

#### On the Continent

- 15 shillings per night up to a maximum of 2 weeks;
- 10 shillings per night for a further 2 weeks, and 5 shillings thereafter without limit for stay at one temporary centre

NOTE.—The above rates are intended to cover all out of pocket expenses including fares portorage, &c., but excluding train fares

- 3 3rd class rail fares in the United Kingdom and 2nd class rail fares on the Continent

4 Candidates to be eligible for these scholarships must—

- (c) possess a Natural Science or Engineering degree of a University in the United Kingdom or the University of Ceylon, preferably an Honours degree in Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Physics or Engineering;

NOTE.—Applications will also be accepted from candidates otherwise eligible who have sat or are sitting for the degree examination in either of the subjects mentioned, viz: Natural Science or Engineering of any of the Universities mentioned. Candidates whose applications are accepted in these circumstances will not be summoned for interview referred to in clause 8 below unless they have been successful at the degree examination, intimation of which should be made to the undersigned as soon as such is known.

- (d) must be of good moral character, certified by two persons of acknowledged social or official positions;

6 On the successful completion of the scholarships, it is the intention to offer scholars appointments to the Junior Assistant Conservator of Forests Grade of the Forest Department, Ceylon, for which the present salary scale is Rs. 4,800 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 360 to Rs. 7,680 per annum. If their service is satisfactory they will be allowed to proceed to the grade of Assistant Conservator of Forests for which the present salary scale is Rs. 8,040 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 480 to Rs. 12,720 per annum. They will also be paid such allowance (e.g., rent, travelling, &c) as are in force for officers in these grades. They will be subject to all regulations relating to officers of their status.

6. Each successful tenderer shall, immediately on being declared the purchaser of the rent, sign the Rent Sale Conditions and pay to the Government Agent as security deposit a sum equivalent to two months' rent payable for the privilege.

**Order**

Whereas the Cabinet has, during the last session of Parliament, approved of the introduction into the House of Representatives of a resolution whereby, if such resolution

be carried, an export duty shall be imposed on the article exempt from duty which is specified in column I of the Schedule hereto:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Revenue Protection Ordinance (Chapter 191), read with the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Junius Richard Jayawardene, Minister of Finance, do hereby order the Principal Collector of Customs from midnight of 24th/25th June, 1949, to demand and to levy, on the article specified in column I of the Schedule hereto, an export duty at the rate set out in column II of that Schedule.
