## By-law

These by-laws may be cited as the Conservancy

By-laws, 1949

2 The occupier of any premises which are provided with a pail latrine and which are benefited by a conservancy service established by the Council shall, if section 174 of the Ordinance does not apply to those premises, pay a conservance fee calculated at the rate of two supees for each night soil pail used in that latime and cleaned by a labourer of the Council.

Provided however that, it a rate imposed under section 173 of the Ordinance is paid in respect of such premises, such occupios shall-

(a) if only one night soil pail is used in such latime and cleaned by such labourer, be exempt from the payment of such conservancy fee, and

(b) if two or more such pails are so used and cleaned, be exempt from the payment of such conservancy fee in respect of only one of those pails

3 Where on any premises there is or are a sump-pit or sump-pits cleaned by a labourer of the Council, the occupier of those premises shall pay a conservancy fee calculated at the rate of two rupees for each such sump-

The fees payable under by-law 2 or by-law 3 shall be paid at the office of the Council before the tenth day of the month immediately following that in respect of

which it is due.

### By-laws

- No person shall slaughter any animal in any slaughter-house unless such animal has been approved as fit for slaughter by the Medical Officer of Health, or any other officer appointed by the Council for the pur pose
- 2 Every person who brings any animal into the premises of any slaughter-house, shall, if the animal is rejected as unfit for slaughter, remove such animal or cause it to be removed from those premises immediately after such rejection
- The Medical Officer of Health, or the officer referred to in by-law 1, may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if after it has been approved under by-law 1, it is found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human consumption
- 4 If the meat or offal of any annual slaughtered in any slaughter-house is, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health or of the officer referred to in by-law 1, diseased or unfit for human consumption, he shall cause the meat or offal to be destroyed immediately or so disposed of as to prevent such meat or offal being exposed for sale or used for human consumption
- 5 The officer in charge of any slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption under by-law 1, or the slaughter of which has been prohibited under by-law 3
- 6 No person shall remove from any slaughter-house, except under the directions of the Medical Officer of Health or the officer referred to m by law 1, any meat or offal which has been declared under by-law 4 to be unfit for human consumption
- In the case of any sheep or goat, a written permit authorising the slaughter of such sheep or goat and signed by the Medical Officer of Health or the officer referred to m by-law 1, shall be produced at the slaughter-house by the person who brings such sheep or goat for slaughter
- 8 No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of any other animal or until the carcase of every animal previously slaughtered in the premises shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned
- 9 A fee at the following rates shall be paid in advance to the Council for the use of the slaughterhouse -

Cents

For cattle For sheep, goats, or pigs 75 per head 25 per head

10 Any person who commits a breach of any one of the foregoing by-laws shall be guilty of an oftence, and shall be hable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty tupees for any one offence, and in the case of a continuing offence, to an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees tor every day during which the offence is committed after conviction or after service of a written notice from the Chairman drawing attention to such contravention

By-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals

The schedule required to be furnished under rule 211 of the rules made by the Executive Committee of Local Administration and published in Gazette No 9,600 of October 4, 1946, shall not be furnished

The annual tax imposed by the Council in respect of vehicles and animals under sections 175 and 176 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the thuty-first day of March in every year at the office of the Council

(1) The Chanman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which the annual tax has been paid, a metal plate with such of the distinguishing letters for vehicles specified in the Schedule hereto as are appropriate to that vehicle and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles

(2) When any plate issued under paragraph (1) becomes indistinct of defaced by use or otherwise, the owner of the plate shall, on returning it to the Chanman and on making a payment of twenty-five cents, be entitled to receive a fresh plate

(3) The Chamman may, on his being satisfied by iffidant or otherwise that any plate issued under paragraph (1) has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner of that plate a fresh plate on the application of that owner and on payment by him of fifty cents

4 (1) The person having possession, custody or control of any vehicle in respect of which a plate has been issued under by-law 3 shall cause that plate to be affixed to a conspicuous part of that vehicle

(2) Every person who contravenes the provisions of paragraph (1) of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees

5 It shall be lawful for the Charman of any person

authorised in wirting by him, to stop any vehicle for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate required by by-law 4 (1) to be affixed thereon, every driver of a vehicle shall, on being requested to do so, stop the vehicle and permit and assist such inspection.

(1) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive trades

Manufacture of soap

Manufacture of compost or artificial manure

Manufacture of vinegar

Manufacture of cigars

Manufacture of beedies

Keeping of a tannery

Keeping of a toddy collecting station

(2) The tollowing trades shall be deemed to be dangerous trades .-

Manufacture of coconut oil by mills of chekkus

Manufacture of desiccated coconut

Manufacture of aerated water

Manufacture or storing of fibre

Manufacture or storing of matches

Manufacture or storing of fireworks

Any trade in which muchinery driven by oil or other

fuel or steam or electricity is used

Burning or storing of lime Quarrying to cabook, gravel or metal

Storing of cotton-wool

Storing of any oil

Extracting of oil by apparatus

Sawing of wood by the use of water, steam or other mechanical power

Blasting of rock or road metal.

(8) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive and dangerous trades

Dyeing of fibre

Burning of bricks or tiles

2 (1) No person shall carry on any offensive or dangerous trade unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health

(2) Every licence shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued unless it is previously cancelled under by-law 12
(8) No licence shall be transterable
3 No person shall be entitled to a licence

- No person shall be entitled to a heence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade unless
  - (1) the place at which that trade is to be carried on is approved by the Medical Officer of Health,
  - (2) the building or buildings, if any, to be used for the purposes of that trade is in conformity with the following requirements —
    - (a) the building must be in good repair, well ventilated, well lighted and provided with adequate drainage and latrine accominodation.
    - (b) the roof of the building must be made of some permanent material and the floor must be cemented

(c) the eaves of the building must be not less than six feet from the ground,

(d) every room in the building must be provided with windows capable of being opened, and the area of such windows when open must be not less than onefifteenth of the superficial floor space,

(e) the walls of every room in the building must be not less than seven feet in height,

- and must be built of brick, stone or cabook,
- (f) the internal surface of such walls must be plastered with cement to a height of at least four feet from the floor, and the rest of the walls must be limeplastered and limewashed, and

(g) the woodwork of the building must be oilpainted or limewashed

- (1) It at any time during the period for which a licence has been issued in respect of any offensive or daugerous trade any building used for the purposes of that trade ceuses to conform to the provisions of by-law 3, the Charman may, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, cause a notice to be served on the hiensee requiring him to do, before a day specified in the notice, all things necessary to make such building conform to such provisions
- (2) No holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade on whom a notice is served under paragraph (1) shall fail to comply with the requirements of such notice within the time specified therein
- Any notice under by-law 4 shall be deemed to have been served on the holder of a hoence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade if it is affixed to the premises at which he carries on that trade or if it is left with any person employed by him in such premises

6 The holder of a licence to carry on any offensive

or dangerous trade shall cause

(a) the floor of every building used for the purposes of such trade to which his licence relates to be swept and cleaned daily

(b) the walls of every such building to be lime-

washed at least once in every twelve nionths,
(6) all apparatus, implements and vessels used in
such trade to be kept clean, and

- (d) all refuse, sweepings, scrapings and waste and by-products which are not to be subjected to turther trade processes to be removed daily in covered receptacles from the premises in which such trade is carried on
- 7 No holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall pollute or contaminate any well or tank or any river, stream, canal, channel, lake or other inland water
- No holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall carry on such trade in any manner likely to cause a nuisance to, or to be injurious to the health or comfort of, persons in the neighbourhood
- Every holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall cause any offensive vapours or gases which are emitted in the course of carrying on such trade
  - (a) to be discharged into the external air in such a manner and at such a height as to admit of their diffusion without injurious or offensive effect, or
  - (b) to be passed directly through a fire or into a condensing apparatus.
- It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Assistant or any officer of the Committee authorised in writing by the Chairman at all reasonable times to enter upon and inspect any piemises at which any offensive or dangerous trade is being carried on and the licensee or person in charge thereof shall permit the inspection to be made
- The holder of a licence to carry on any offensive 11 or dangerous trade shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the premises in which such trade is carried on, the licence obtained under by-law 2, or where such licence cannot be affixed cause a board to be affixed, with the licence number and the name of the holder of the licence clearly painted, in a conspicuous place on such premises
- 12 It shall be lawful for the Rural Court in addition to any other punishment that it may impose to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of a breach of any of the by-laws relating to offensive or dangerous trades, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.

## Unwholesome food and drink

' 2 No person shall keep or expose for sale any article of food or drink which is unwholesome or unfit for human consumption.

3 It shall be lawful for the Charman, or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Inspector, or any person authorised by the Chairman in writing, to seize any article of food or drink kept or exposed for sale, it such article appears to be unwholesome or unfit ior human consumption.

4 Where any officer or person, other than the Medical Officer of Health seizes an article of food or drink under by law 3, he shall place a sample of the seized article in a receptacle and shall, after sealing the receptacle in the presence of the person from whose possession such article was seized, produce that sample with the least possible delay before the Medical Officer of Health or any other Government Medical Officer

5 Where an article of food or drink is seized under by-law 3, the person seizing such article shall, upon demand or a sealed sample by the person from whose possession the article was seized, place a sample of the seized article in a receptacle, and shall, after sealing the receptacle in the presence of the person from whose possession the article was seized, give that sample to that person

6 If the Medical Officer of Health who seizes an article of food or drink under by-law 3, or the Medical Officer before whom an article of food or drink is produced under by-law 4, certifies such article to be un-wholesome or unfit for human consumption, the Chairman shall cause such article to be destroyed or to be so disposed of as to prevent its being exposed for sale or used for human consumption. If the Medical Officer certifies that the article of food or drink is wholesome and fit for human consumption such article shall be returned

to its owner.

7 No person shall sell or expose for sale the flesh of any animal that has died of natural causes or of any disease or by drowning or has been killed by a wild beast

or by the bite of a snake or of a rabid dog

### By-laws

## Dairies and the sale of milk

- No person shall expose, offer or deliver for sale, or sell, or hawk within the village area, any milk which has been produced within that area unless he-
  - (a) is the licensee of a dairy of two or more cows;

(b) is a registered supplier of milk, or

- (c) has been registered by the Chairman as a vendor of milk employed by the licensee of a dairy or by a registered supplier of milk
- 2 No person shall keep a darry of two or more cows unless he is the holder of a licence issued by the Chairman.
- B No licence to keep a dairy of two or more cows shall be assued to any person unless the premises in respect of which the hoence is to be assued are in conformity with the following requirements
- (1) Every building or shed on the premises, intended for the accommodation of cattle must—
  - (a) be built of brick, stone, cabook or wood,
  - (b) have its walls and pillars limewashed,
  - (c) have a roof constructed of durable materials;
  - (d) have its floors paved with brick or stone rendered in cement, cement concrete or asphalt,
- (e) have drains for the purpose of conveying urine, washings and waste water into one or more covered receptacles, such drains being paved with brick or stone rendered in cement, cement concrete or asphalt, and
- (f) be proportionate m size to the number of cows to be kept in that dairy, allowing for each cow a floor space of not less than eight feet in length and five feet in width and a minimum air space of four hundred cubic feet.

- (2) The building or shed on the premises, intended for use as a milk room must-
  - (a) be at a distance of not less than twenty-five feet from the cow-shed or other buildings, and not less than one hundred feet from any latrine, cesspit, ashpit, permanent manure heap or open sewer:

(b) have walls not less than seven feet in height, built of stone, brick or cabook and plastered and imewashed on the inside,

(c) have at least two opposite walls abutting on the

open air,

. (d) have its floors comented, and the junction of the floor with the walls sounded off with cement,

(e) have a ceiling which is constructed of grooved and oil-painted boards capable of preventing the ingress of dust,

(f) have the eaves of the roof at least six feet above

the level of the ground,

(g) have at least one window and one door, the area of the window space being not less than one fifteenth of the floor space of the foom, and have each window and door covered with flyproof netting, and one window facing at least

one door, and
(h) be provided with u table covered with marble, slate, zinc or other impermeable substance approved by the Chairman, and with a sanitary dust-bin and a suitable rack for storing clean

bottles.

The licensee shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board on which the phrase 'Licensed Dairy' and its Sinhalese the phrase

equivalent are clearly painted
5 The licensee shall keep m the dairy, so as to be available for inspection at any time, a list of the names and addresses of all persons to whom he supplies milk

- The heensee shall take all necessary steps to ensure that-
  - (a) the walls of every room forming part of the dairy are limewashed and the woodwork is washed with hot water and soap at least twice a year in the months of June and December, and at such other times as may be ordered by the Chairman in writing,
    (b) the floor and the top of the milk room table are

washed at least once every day,

(c) every part of the dairy, its surroundings and drains are kept clean and in good lepair,
(d) all dung, refuse, urine and washings are removed from the dairy at least once a day and disposed of at a suitable distance from the dairy in such manner as to cause no nuisance,

(s) all cattle food, other than grass or straw, is stored

in suitable rat-proof receptacles, and

- (f) all utensils, furniture and other requisites used in or belonging to the daily are kept clean
- 7. The licensee shall not cause or permit—

(a) any milk to be poured into any vessel which is not

thoroughly cleaned,

(b) milk to be stored m any vessel other than a vessel made of glass, porcelain, glazed eathernware or enamelled or galvanized iron, (c) any vessel used for the storage of milk to be kept

in any place other than the milk room,

(d) milk for the purpose of sale to be drawn from any cow unless immediately before the time of milking, the udder and teats of the cow are thoroughly cleaned and wiped with a clean damp cloth, and unless the hands of the person

milking are also thoroughly washed and cleaned
(6) milk intended for sale to be kept in any place other than the milk room, and

- (f) any animal or bird to enter or remain in the milk room for any purpose whatsoever
- The licensee shall provide for the purpose of the dairy only water obtained from a source approved by the Chairman.

(1) The licensee of a dany shall not allow any milk vessel, butter vessel, churn, separator or other article used in the dairy to be used for any purpose other than the purposes of the dairy, and shall cause each such vessel, churn, separator or other article to be washed after each occasion on which it is used, first with cold water, then with boiling water and soda and finally with water which has been boiled and cooled

(2) the licensee shall cause the brushes used in cleaning vessels and other dany requisites to be boiled for

ten minutes each tune after use

10 The licensee shall cause every vessel in the dairy containing milk to be adequately protected with a clean cover or lid, and shall take all precautions to prevent the milk from being contaminated during transit

The licensee shall not use the milk room or permit it to be used for any purpose other than that of

storing and preparing milk

No person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any intectious, contagious or cutaneous disease. or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by the licensee or any person in charge of the dury or milk room to enter the daily or milk room or to take part in the preparation, sale or transport of milk, until the

periods of infection and incubation have elapsed

13 The licensee shall give immediate notice to the Chanman of any case or suspected case of infectious, contagious or outaneous disease which may occur among

the persons employed in the dairy.

The liceusee shall not sell, or cause or permit to be sold the milk of any cow suffering from tuberculosis, actue mastitis, foot-and-mouth disease, anthrax or actinomycosis of the udder, or add such milk or cause or permit it to be added to any milk which is mtended for sale for human consumption

15 The hoensee shall not sell or supply to any person milk obtained from any cow other than a cow kept in the

licensed dairy

(1) No person shall keep a darry of one cow un-16 less he has been registered by the Chairman as a supplier of milk

(2) Registration under this by-law shall be free 17 The Chairman may refuse to register any person as a supplier of milk, if a Medical Officer authorised in writing by the Charman, after inspection of the dairy which that person intends to keep, recommends that that person should not be so registered

18 Every registered supplier of milk shall take all such measures and precautions as may be necessary to

(b) any milk adulterated with water or any other foreign substance or liquid, or

(1) any milk contained in bottles of which the mouths are not adequately covered with impermeable material

Provided that milk to which tea coffee or cocoa has been added for consumption on the premises of any tea or coffee boutique or eating-house shall not be deemed to be adulterated for the purpose of this by-law

25 (1) The Chairman or any officer authorised in writing by the Chairman, may at any time demand and take a sample of milk for analysis, on payment of the value thereof, from the licensee of any daily, or from any registered supplier of milk, registered purveyor of milk, or registered vendor of milk

(2) No licensee of a daily, registered supplier of milk, registered purveyor of milk, or registered vendor of milk shall refuse to comply with a demand lawfully made under paragraph (1) of this by-law 26. The licensee shall cause his licence, and a copy of these by-laws in Sinhalese, to be framed and hung in a conspicuous position in the dairy.
