The fee for a permit issued in respect of a hiring car shall be Rs. 10.00 per annum.

The regulations relating to public stands published in *Gazette* No. 8,427 of January 20, 1939, are hereby amended in the first schedule hereto, in so far as they relate to the area within the administrative limits of the Akuressa Village Committee, by the substitution, for items (a) and (b) of that Schedule, of the following new items—

“(a) For each omnibus or lorry plying from Akuressa, Rs. 2.50 a month.

(b) For each omnibus or lorry not referred to in paragraph (a) 30 cents for any period exceeding fifteen minutes but not exceeding six hours, and thereafter 10 cents for each additional period not exceeding one hour, or a commuted fee of Rs 2.50 a month, at the option of the owner of the omnibus or lorry "

Regulations

1 On any highway within the administrative limits of the Municipal Council of Kandy—

- (a) no motor car shall be driven at a greater speed than twenty miles per hour and
(b) no lorry or omnibus shall be driven at a greater speed than fifteen miles per hour

2 In these regulations, "motor car" does not include a lorry or an omnibus

3 The regulations relating to speed limits published in *Gazette* No 8,833 of December 19, 1941, are hereby rescinded.

Regulations

1 The driver of an omnibus shall not park the omnibus on any highway except in a public stand.

2 The driver of a motor cab shall not stand for hire on a highway unless the motor cab is halted at a public stand

3 No omnibus or motor cab shall enter or be parked in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman

4. (1) A fee of Rs 2 per mensem, shall be charged for a permit issued under regulation 3.

(2) Every permit issued under regulation 3 shall contain the number of the omnibus or motor cab in respect of which it is issued and shall be valid for a period of one calendar month from the date of issue

5. The driver of every omnibus or motor cab parked in a public stand shall, whenever required to do so by a police officer in uniform or by a person duly authorised in writing by the Chairman, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of such omnibus or motor cab under regulation 3.

6. In these regulations—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Kattankudy Town Council

"Public stand" means a place set apart by the Kattankudy Town Council as a place at which omnibuses or motor cabs may be halted or may stand for hire.

THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1938

REGULATIONS for the area comprised within the administrative limits of the Kayts Town Council, made by the Minister of Transport and Works under sections 125 and 174 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938,

Regulations

1. No vehicle other than a hiring car shall enter or be parked in any public stand.

2 No hiring car shall be parked in any public place other than a public stand

3 No hiring car shall enter or be parked in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

4. (a) A fee in accordance with the scale specified in the Schedule hereto shall be charged for each permit issued under regulation 3.

(b) Every permit issued under regulation 3 shall contain the number of the hiring car in respect of which it is issued and shall be valid for the period stated therein

5. The driver of every hiring car parked in a public stand shall, whenever required to do so by a police officer in uniform, or a person authorised for the purpose by the Chairman, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of such hiring car under regulation 3.

6 No hiring car shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any other hiring car entering or leaving that stand.

7. The driver of every hiring car or a person capable of driving it shall remain in charge of such hiring car during the period it is parked in a public stand.

8 The driver or other person in charge of every hiring car parked in a public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner

9. It shall not be lawful for any omnibus to be halted on any highway within the administrative limits of the Council except at a stopping place provided for the purpose.

10. In these regulations—

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council

"Council" means the Kayts Town Council,

"public stand" means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot, and "stopping place" means a place, which is by a notice exhibited at the spot, set apart as a place at which omnibuses may be halted for the purpose of taking up or setting down passengers.
