The rules made under the Public Performances Ordinance (Chapter 134) and published in *Gazette* No. 7,004 of April 4, 1919, as amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 9,108 of April 9, 1943, are hereby further amended, in so far as they relate to the area within the administrative limits of the Haputale Urban Council, by the substitution, for rule A. 3 thereof, of the following new rule—

"A 3 (1) An applicant for a licence for the use of any building or erection for public performances to which persons are admitted for payment shall, before such licence is issued to him, pay to the local authority a fee calculated at the following rates.—
