THE TOWN COUNCILS ORDINANCE, NO 3 OF 1946

Order under section 30

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 5, 6, and 30 of the Town Councils Ordinance, No 3 of 1946, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Solomon West Ridgeway Dias Bandaranaike, Minister of Health and Local Government, do by this Order—

(1) vary the limits of the Town of Belhatta (as defined in the Proclamation published in *Gazette* No 9,532 of March 22, 1946.)—

(a) by the substitution in the schedule to that Proclamation, under the heading "South" for all the words and figures from "of the lane south of lot 100" to "84E to its western extremity", of the following—

"of the lane south of lot 100, thence by a line drawn south-eastwards through lots 104 and 143 to the north-western corner of lot 140A, thence by a line drawn eastwards along the northern boundaries of lots 140A, 140, 139 and 138, southwards and south-westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said lot 138, eastern boundaries of lots 139, 141 and 140c westwards and northwards along the southern and western boundaries of said lot 140c to the landmark at its north-western corner, thence by a line drawn westwards across lot 104 to the eastern boundary of lot 143, thence by a line drawn southwards and north-westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said lot 143 to the landmark at the south-western corner of the said lot 143 in Final Village Plan 308, thence by a line drawn southwards, north-westwards and south-westwards along the northern boundary of lot 2 in Final Village Plan 299, westwards along the northern boundaries of lots 35B and 35D and north-westwards along the northern boundary of lot 2 to the landmark on the eastern boundary of Dickwella-Walasmulla road, thence by a line drawn south-westwards along the eastern boundary of the said road to a point in line with the southern boundary of lot 44, thence by a line drawn westwards across the said road and along the southern boundary of the said lot 44 to the south-eastern corner of lot 45 in the Final Village Plan 299"; and

(b) by the substitution in that schedule under the heading "West", for all the words and figures from "By a line drawn from the last-mentioned

point northwards" to "in Final Village Plan No 298", of the following:—

"By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the eastern boundaries of lots 45 and 46 in Final Village Plan 299, eastwards along the northern boundary of lot 43 to its eastern extremity, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards through lots 42B, 42A and 42 to the landmark at the south-western corner of lot 38, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards through lot 38 to its north-eastern corner, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards, through lot 39 to the south-western corner of lot 39½, thence by a line drawn northwards along the western boundary of lot 39½ and the eastern boundary of lot 39 in Final Village Plan 299 to the southern boundary of foot path south of lot 217 in Final Village Plan 308, thence by a line drawn westwards along the southern boundary of the said foot-path till it meets the eastern boundary of lot 107 in Final Village Plan 298, thence by a line drawn north-westwards and westwards along the eastern and northern boundaries of the said lot 107 and westwards along the northern boundary of lot 84E to its western extremity, thence by a line drawn northwards along the western boundaries of lots 90D and 90, westwards along";

(2) revoke the Order relating to the number of members of the Belhatta Town Council and the number of and limits of the wards of the town of Belhatta published in *Gazette* No. 9,536 of March 29, 1946;

(3) order that the Belhatta Town Council shall consist of six members, and the town of Belhatta shall be divided into six wards with the limits as defined in the schedule hereto, and

(4) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1), (2) and (3) of this Order shall come into effect on the date immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Belhatta Town Council who are in office at the date hereof.

WARDS OF THE TOWN OF BELHATTA

Ward No 1—Belhatta North

North: By a line drawn from a point on the western boundary of Walasmulla-Dickwella road about 1 chain north of the north-eastern corner of lot 157 in Final Village Plan No. 291 eastwards, south-eastwards and again eastwards along the

- northern limit of the Town Council area to the landmark at the north-eastern corner of lot 4N (Nalagama Road) in Final Village Plan No 308
- East.** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the eastern boundary of lot 4N (Nalagama Road) in F.V.P. No 308 to the landmark at the north-western corner of lot 40 (cemetery) in supplement No 5 to Final Village Plan No. 308, thence by a line drawn westwards across the road to the centre of the said road, thence by a line drawn south-westwards and westwards along the centre of the said road to the centre of the junction with the Vincent Road, thence by a line drawn southwards along the centre of Vincent Road to the northern boundary of the market premises, thence by a line drawn eastwards, north-eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said market premises to the centre of the Tangalla-Hakmana Road.
- South.** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre of the Tangalla-Hakmana Road to the centre of the junction with the road leading to Walasmulla Behatta Junction).
- West:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of the road leading to Walasmulla to a point in line with the northern boundary of the path running through lot 158 in Final Village Plan No. 291, thence by a line drawn westwards across the road to the western boundary of the said road, thence by a line drawn northwards along the western boundary of the said road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No 2—Puwakdandawa.

- North:** By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of Nalagama and Vincent Roads eastwards and north-eastwards along the eastern limit of Ward No 1 to the landmark at the north-western corner of lot 40 (cemetery) in supplement No 5 to Final Village Plan No 308, thence by a line drawn eastwards along the northern limit of the Town Council area to its eastern extremity
- East:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Town Council area till it meets the centre of the road leading to Tangalla.
- South:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre of the Tangalla-Hakmana Road to the eastern limit of Ward No. 1.
- West:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards, south-westwards and again northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 1; to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 3—Kahatagahawela

- North.** By a line drawn from the centre of Beliatta junction south-eastwards along the southern limits of Nos. 1 and 2 to the eastern limit of the Town Council area.
- East:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards and south-westwards along the eastern and southern limits of the Town Council area to the south-eastern corner of lot 103 in F V P. 308.
- South:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards and south-westwards along the southern limit of the Town Council area to the centre of the lane south of lot No 100 in Final Village Plan No 308, thence by a line drawn westwards along the centre of the said lane to the centre of the Dickwella-Walasmulla road
- West:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the centre of Dickwella-Walasmulla road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 4—Beliatta South.

- North.** By a line drawn from the centre of Geta-manna road on the western limit of the Town

- Council area north-eastwards along the centre of the said road to the centre of the junction with the Dickwella-Walasmulla road
- East** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards and eastwards along the western and southern limits of Ward No 3 to the southern limit of the Town Council area, thence by a line drawn eastwards and south-westwards along the said limit to the eastern corner of lot 35 in F.V.P. 299.
- South** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards, along the southern limit of the Town Council area to its western extremity
- West:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards, westwards and north-westwards along the western limit of the Town Council area, to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward

Ward No. 5—Kambussawela.

- North.** By a line drawn from the point on the Northern boundary of Hakmana-Tangalla Road where the western limit of the Town Council area crosses the said road south-eastwards along the said boundary of the road to the south-western corner of lot 175 in F V P 291, thence by a line drawn southwards across the said road to its centre, thence by a line drawn eastwards along the centre of the said road to a point in line with the southern boundary of lot 174 in F V P. 291
- East.** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the centre of Hakmana-Tangalla Road to the centre of the junction with Dickwella-Walasmulla Road, thence by a line drawn southwards along the centre of the said road to the eastern extremity of the northern limit of Ward No 4
- South:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the northern limit of Ward No 4 to the Western limit of the Town Council area.
- West.** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards, along the western limit of the Town Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No 6—Kahawatta

- North:** By a line drawn from the western extremity of the northern limit of the Town Council area eastwards along the said limit and crossing Walasmulla-Dickwella Road to the centre of the said road
- East:** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the western limit of Ward No 1 to the centre of the Beliatta junction
- South.** By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards and westwards along the eastern and northern limits of Ward No 5 till it meets the western limit of the Town Council area.
- West:** By a line drawn from the last mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Town Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

BY-LAWS made by the Mullaittivu Town Council under sections 166 and 170 of the Town Councils Ordinance, No 3 of 1946, and approved by the Minister of Health and Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 167 of the Ordinance, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947

By-laws*Conservancy Scavenging*

1. In these by-laws—

“ Chairman ” means the Chairman of the Mullaittivu Town Council; and
“ Council ” means the Mullaittivu Town Council.

2 The Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of any premises situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established, require such owner to provide a pail latrine of such size and type and in such a position on the premises as may be approved by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health or an officer authorised by such Medical Officer

3 If the Medical Officer of Health certifies that any cesspit or latrine (not being a pail latrine of the size and type referred to in by-law 2) situated on any premises within the area for which a conservancy service has been established is insanitary and dangerous to health, the Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of such premises, require such owner to close such cesspit or latrine

4 Every owner on whom a notice referred to in by-law 2 or by-law 3 has been served, shall comply with the requirements of such notice within such time, in no case to be less than two months, as may be specified in such notice.

5 Every occupier of premises provided with a pail latrine and situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established, shall maintain such latrine at all times in a sanitary condition and in good repair

6. No person other than a conservancy labourer employed by the Town Council shall remove or otherwise dispose of the night soil from any pail latrine within the area for which a conservancy service has been established

7 For the purpose of inspecting any cesspit or any latrine, whether constructed or in course of construction, on any premises, it shall be lawful to the Medical Officer of Health or an Officer authorised by him, to enter the premises at any time between sunrise and sunset, and the occupier of the premises shall render such officer all such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such inspection

8 Upon the establishment of a scavenging service for the whole or any specified part of the Urban area, the occupier of any premises situated within an area for which such service has been established, shall cause all ashes, sweepings and all other refuse from his premises to be deposited in a bucket or bin with a suitable cover and of such shape and size as may be approved by the Chairman.

9. The occupier of any premises referred to in by-law 8 shall—

- (1) daily, between such hours as the Chairman may from time to time notify by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, cause such bucket or bin to be placed by the edge of the road outside such premises, but so as to cause no obstruction to traffic on the road, and
- (2) cause such bucket or bin to be removed within half an hour of the emptying of such bucket or bin by the scavenging labourers of the Town Council

10 No person shall place on any road any bucket or bin referred to in by-law 8 except between such hours as are referred to in by-law 9.

11 The occupier of any premises served by the scavenging service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Town Council on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Town Council a scavenging fee of twenty-five cents.

12 The scavenging fee referred to in by-law 11 shall be paid to the Chairman of the Town Council or to any person duly authorised by him in writing to collect such fee, on or before the tenth day of the month immediately following the month in respect of which such fee is due: Provided that, when the owner or occupier of any premises has given written notice in advance to the Chairman that the premises will not be occupied during the whole of any specified month, and such owner or occupier subsequently satisfies the Chairman that such premises were in fact not occupied during that month, no scavenging fee shall be payable in respect of those premises for that month.

13 The by-laws made by the Sanitary Board of the Mullaittivu District, published in *Gazette* No 7,960 of January 6, 1933, and therein called “ Regulations ”, are hereby amended, in so far as they apply to the town of Mullaittivu, by the rescission of the by-laws set out in “ Chapter XII ”, and by-law 2 in Chapter XIII.

Regulations

1. In these regulations—

" Council " means the Batticaloa Urban Council, and
" Chairman " means the Chairman of the Batticaloa Urban Council.

2. No water shall be drawn from the Batticaloa Waterworks except from the public standpipes or fountains or except from a pipe forming part of a private water service, or otherwise than in the manner set out in these regulations.

3. No person shall take water from a public standpipe in a cart or barrel or in any vessel except a bucket or other similar receptacle carried or capable of being ordinarily carried by hand.

4. No person shall attach any hosepipe, pipe, tube, shoot or other contrivance of any nature whatsoever either temporarily or permanently to any public standpipe.

5. No person shall interfere with the automatic self-closing valve or other automatic appliance attached to or forming part of any public standpipe or do any other act likely to prevent either temporarily or permanently the automatic action of such valve or appliance.

6. No person shall draw water from a public standpipe for any purpose other than a domestic purpose.

7. No person who is suffering from any contagious or infectious disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any such person, shall draw water from any public standpipe.

8. No person shall bathe or wash any part of his body or wash any animal or any vehicle, clothes, utensil or other article whatsoever at or near any reservoir, standpipe, fountain, cistern, pipe or other waterworks forming part of the Batticaloa Waterworks.

By-laws

1. Within the administrative limits of this Council, no person shall affix or cause to be affixed in any place any advertisement capable of being seen from any thoroughfare situated within those limits, unless such place has been approved by the Council by a resolution for the time being in force, as a place suitable for that purpose

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to the affixing or exhibition of any poster, placard, handbill, notice, or advertisement—

- (a) on any place of business for the purposes of that business; or

- (b) on any other premises for the purpose of advertising the fact that such premises or any articles kept or situated on such premises are to let or for sale.

2 Every contravention of by-law 1 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees and in the case of a continuing contravention with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction thereof by a court of competent jurisdiction or after service of a written notice from the Chairman or other authorised officer directing attention to such contravention.

By-laws

Hairdressers' and barbers' shops and saloons

1. (1) No person shall establish, or carry on the business of, a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon, except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Municipal Commissioner

(2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

2 No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 1, unless the building or part of the building to be

used as a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon, and the equipment of the shop or saloon, are in conformity with the following requirements—

- (1) The building, or the part of the building, to be used as the shop or saloon—
 - (a) must be of permanent materials, and must have a floor space of not less than 120 square feet,
 - (b) must have its walls lime-plastered and lime-washed, its roof provided with a wooden or other similar ceiling painted white, its floor cemented and the junction of the floor with the walls rounded off with cement,
 - (c) must be well lighted and well ventilated, and
 - (d) must be provided with satisfactory drains, and with satisfactory latrine accommodation.
- (2) The shop or saloon must be provided with—
 - (a) a good supply of water,
 - (b) means for securing a supply of boiling water adequate for the purpose of washing or sterilizing the instruments or appliances in daily use,
 - (c) a sufficient number of spittoons kept in such manner as to be readily available to customers and employees,
 - (d) facilities for the hairdressers or barbers to wash their hands during the course of their work,
 - (e) a sufficient supply of towels and overalls for the use of the customers,
 - (f) a movable sanitary bin made of galvanized iron or other equally suitable and impervious material, covered with a close-fitting lid, for the reception of hair-clippings and sweepings;
 - (g) receptacles, at the rate of one for each wash-stand, containing disinfectant for sterilizing razors, scissors, clippers, and other instruments;
 - (h) a tray with disinfectant for keeping the instruments and combs after use, and
 - (i) a sufficient number of tables of impervious material capable of being readily cleansed
3. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall—
 - (1) keep affixed, in a conspicuous position outside the shop or saloon, a board bearing the words "Licensed Hairdressing Saloon" or "Licensed Barber's Shop"; and
 - (2) keep affixed, in a conspicuous position within the shop or saloon, a framed copy of these by-laws in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil.
4. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall—
 - (1) cause the walls of the shop or saloon to be lime-washed and the ceiling to be painted twice a year, in the months of June and December, and
 - (2) cause the floor, walls, ceiling, fixtures, furniture, and equipment of the shop or saloon to be kept clean at all times.
5. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall not use, or permit any other person to use, the shop or saloon as a place for sleeping or eating during the day or night
6. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall not—
 - (1) knowingly permit any person who is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease of any kind, or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from any such disease, to enter the shop or saloon for any purpose;
 - (2) employ any person referred to in paragraph (1) in any capacity in the shop or saloon;
 - (3) knowingly permit any hairdresser or barber employed by him to attend in the shop or saloon on any person referred to in paragraph (1),
 - (4) permit any such hairdresser or barber who has attended on any person referred to in paragraph

(1) to attend on any other customer unless that hairdresser or barber washes and cleans his hands before attending on that other customer; or

- (5) permit any instrument that has been used on any person referred to in paragraph (1) to be used on any other person until it is sterilized

7. (1) The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall not permit any person—

- (a) to commence employment in the shop or saloon; or
- (b) to continue to be employed in the shop or saloon after the thirty-first day of March of any year, or
- (c) to resume work in the shop or saloon after he has suffered from, or been in attendance on any other person suffering from, any infectious or contagious disease,

until the Medical Officer of Health has examined such person and certified that such person is free from any infectious or contagious disease and, in the circumstances set out in paragraph (c), that the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

(2) It shall be the duty of the Medical Officer of Health to examine any person for the purposes of paragraph (1) of this by-law and to give him a certificate free of charge

(3) In this by-law "Medical Officer of Health" means any Medical Officer of Health of the Municipal Council of Kandy and includes the Medical Officer, Maternity and Child Welfare of the Municipal Council of Kandy

8. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall take steps to ensure that every hairdresser or barber employed by him in the shop or saloon—

- (1) observes the utmost cleanliness in his work,
- (2) keeps his person and his wearing apparel clean and in a sanitary condition,
- (3) keeps his finger-nails short and free from dirt; and
- (4) washes his hands with soap and water immediately before attending to each customer

9. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall—

- (1) cause the razors, scissors, and other instruments used in the shop or saloon to be disinfected, immediately before and after each occasion on which they are used, by dipping them in boiling water or in any other satisfactory manner;
- (2) cause all hair brushes and combs used in the shop or saloon to be thoroughly washed, cleaned, and sterilized every day before use, and kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times;
- (3) cause all shaving mugs, cups, and shaving brushes used in the shop or saloon to be thoroughly rinsed in hot water after each occasion on which they are used, and
- (4) cause all hair clippings and other refuse to be gathered after each customer has been attended to and to be deposited in the sanitary bin provided.

10. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall cause all spittoons in the shop or saloon to be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. He shall cause each spittoon to be emptied and cleaned once daily, or more frequently if necessary, and a small quantity of disinfectant left in the spittoon

11. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall not use, or permit any hairdresser or barber employed by him in the shop or saloon to use, on any customer—

- (1) any styptic pencil, powder puff, or sponge, or
- (2) any alum or other material for the purpose of stopping any bleeding, unless such alum or other material is in powder or liquid form

12. The licensee of a hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon shall not supply, for the use of any customer, any towel which is not fresh from the wash or any overall which is not clean.

13. No person shall expectorate within any hairdresser's or barber's shop or saloon except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.
