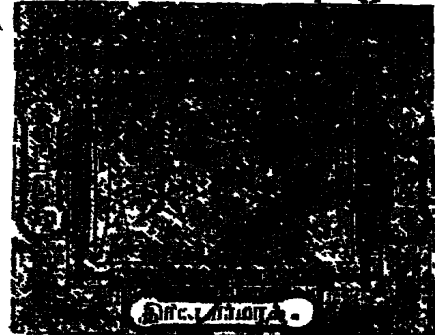

"Improvements relating to bags for medical and hygienic purposes"

Abstract — The inventor describes a bag which can be used either as a ice-bag, hot-water bottle, or an enema. The bag has two orifices, the longer one for ice-filling being on the flat side of the bag, and the smaller, for hot-water filling being on one end. The plug for the smaller end can be substituted by an enema nozzle or tube. An indicating device comprising a branch pipe from the enema nozzle can be provided to show the amount of liquid in the bag.

"Improvements in and relating to the manufacture of tea"

Abstract — The inventor describes a method in which the picked leaf is frozen, and is then subsequently tumbled about in air until it has thawed. After this treatment some portions the cell sap and water is removed from the leaf by centrifuging or pressing so as to render

the leaf sufficiently dry for the process of rolling. The normal process of rolling, sifting, fermenting and firing has been followed. The cell sap may, if desired, be sprayed on to the treated leaf before the firing process.

Improvements in and relating to the treatment of latex

Abstract—It is well known that the protein present in the latex occurs partly in the serum and partly absorbed in the rubber particles. The part in the serum is separated easily but the other part cannot be separated by centrifuging or creaming operations. According to the present invention, the principle of absorption displacement i.e. exchange of absorption is used for reducing the absorbed protein. The process comprises diluting the latex, adding to the diluted latex a capillary active substance which is more strongly absorbed by the rubber particles than the protein, allowing the mixture to stand for some hours and then separating the latex from the serum by creaming or centrifuging. The capillary active substance may be a soap or a sulphonated compound. The foreign substances present in the rubber obtained from the preceding process e.g. the fatty acids are removed by extracting the rubber in the form of wet sheets with liquids in which the substances are soluble, e.g. 0.5 per cent aqueous ammonium solution.

A process for the preparation of rubber hydrochloride dispersions

Abstract—The inventors state that the process of obtaining rubber hydrochloride in solid form by subjecting thin crepe sheets to the action of HCL is known. Another method is by passing HCL into rubber solutions which is costly. The present invention relates to the production of rubber hydrochloride in the dispersed state by passing HCL or equivalent into latex which has been pretreated so as to be stable in the greater part of the PH range, vulcanisation if desired, can be effected in the usual manner. One method of pretreatment is the addition of a cation soap to fresh latex or to old latex after removing the protein decomposition products. Alternatively, a non-ionogenic emulsifying substance may be added to latex. If latex preserved with ammonia is used the ammonia must be removed by passing methyl alcohol into it or by adding formaldehyde.

Solid rubber may be obtained from the dispersion by evaporation, precipitation, flocculation, sedimentation or the like.
