NOTIFICATIONS UNDER "THE PATENTS ORDINANCE, 1906"

✓ A process for the preparation of halogenated rubber in a dispersed state.

Abstract.—The inventors claim the process of producing halogenated rubber dispersion from rubber latex in which the latex is first made strongly acid resistant e.g., by the addition of a cation soap, or of a neutral emulsifying agent, &c., and acid is added to make the solution at least normal and preferably three times normal or higher for strong inorganic and eight times normal for weak acids and thereafter halogen is passed into it. The dispersion may be acidified with an acid having the same halogen as that with which the halogenation takes place. Preferably the halogen is introduced first at a lower temperature and thereafter at a temperature between 70°C and 100°C. Deproteinised rubber may be made the starting medium. When the method of absorption displacement is used for deproteinising a substance can be used having the property of stabilising latex in an acid medium.

Coagulated halogenated rubber can be produced from the above dispersion by precipitation with an organic solvent, with alkaline reacting solutions or the like.

There are 8 examples and 9 claims.
