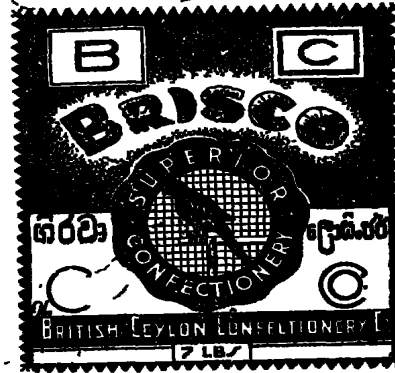

" A new type of steel rim for cart wheels for securely fixing solid rubber tyres "

Abstract.—The inventor describes an iron rim with cover plate welded to it on one side which is shrunk on to the wheel The rubber tyre is vulcanized on to a thin metal band provided with clips to hold the tyre in place The band is slipped on to the iron rim and the cover plate on the outside secured with set screws A series of studs on the inside of the cover plate are provided to prevent rotation of the tyre relative to the rim For additional security the shrunk rim is fixed to the felloes by wood screws
