PRESIDENT TELLS INAUGURAL SESSION OF NINTH PARLIAMENT

PRIORITY FOR NEW CONSTITUTION

19TH AMENDMENT WILL BE RFPFALFD

Removing the 19th Amendment and evolving a new Constitution will be the first priority of the Government as it embarks on the next five years of governance, President Gotabaya Rajapaksa declared yesterday.

Delivering the Government's Policy Statement at the Inaugural Session of the Ninth Parliament, President Rajapaksa said the people had given the Government a resounding mandate for making Constitutional changes that will aid the country's forward march.

"The basis of the success of a democratic state is its Constitu-

tion. Our Constitution, which has been amended 19 times, from its inception in 1978, has many ambiguities and uncertainties, presently resulting in confusion. As the people have given us the mandate we wanted for a Constitutional amendment, our first task will be to remove the 19th

Amendment to the Constitution.
After that, all of us will get together to formulate a new Constitution suitable for the country. In this, the priority will be given to the concept of one country, one law for all the people," the President said.

He also added that while introducing a new Constitution, it is also required to make changes to the existing electoral system. "An unstable Parliament that cannot take firm decisions and succumbs to extremist influences very often is not suitable for a country.

While introducing a new Constitution, it is essential to make changes to the current electoral system. While retaining the salutary aspects of the proportional representation system, these changes will be made to ensure stability of the Parliament and people's direct representation."

The government had also made a promise to the people to eradicate waste and corruption. TO PAGE 02



Central Bank Governor Prof. W.D. Lakshman said yesterday that this will ease financial pressure for those using credit cards. He said that during the lockdown they had also observed an increase in the use

Attorney General's Coordinating Officer Nishara Jayaratne said the Attorney General made this statement after observing CCTV footage of the surrounding areas near the scene of Sampayo's 'purported' arrest.

The Negombo Police HQI said that Sampayo was arrested following intelligence information and the Police Media Spokesperson also made a statement to the media that the arrest was made based on intelligence information. However, CCTV footage and the other investigations revealed that the arrest was not conducted based on such intelligence information and those scenes show that Sampayo was welcomed by the Negombo HQI, Jayaratne

Accordingly, the Attorney General directed the acting Inspector General Police (IGP) to conduct investigations over the statement by Police Media Spokesperson SSP Jaliya Senaratne and the conduct of Negombo HQI on the execution of the warrant against Anurudda Sampayo.

On July 22, The Negombo Magistrate issued an arrest warrant on interdicted Negom-

bo Prison Superintendent Anuruddha Sampayo and three other officials of the Negombo prison over an incident where a cell equipped with luxury items were discovered inside the Negombo prison.

The arrest warrants were obtained by the Criminal Investigations Department, on the directions of the Attorney Gen-

Accordingly, arrest warrants had been issued on interdicted Superintendent of Negombo Prison Anuruddha Sampayo, Chief Jailors Upali Sarath Bandara, Nishantha Senarathne and Jailor Prasad Kalinga Kaluaggala.

On August 2, Interdicted Superintendent of Negombo Prison Anuruddha Sampayo was arrested from the Kurunegala area by the Negombo Police.

On July 25, Negombo Prison Jailor Kalinga Kaluaggala was surrendered to the CID and Chief Jailors Upali Sarath Bandara and Nishantha Senarathna were surrendered to the Negombo Magistrate's Court on July 29. They all are in remand custody after producing them before the Negombo Magistrate's Court.

"I will not hesitate to enforce the law against those who are involved in fraud and corrupt actions, irrespective of the status of any such perpetrators," the President asserted.

"I will review the progress of the achievement of the goals of the Government that are implemented through Ministries and the public sector. If I find any Ministry failing to achieve its set targets, I will not hesitate to effect necessary changes to implement policies of the Government," the President warned.

He said that he had observed that some institutional procedures of those institutions do not add any value to the government or to the public but only

waste the time of the public. "You should identify new methods to provide efficient, speedy and convenient service to the public instead of continuing with prevailing traditional methods. You need to re-engineer the processes for greater productivity and customer satisfaction. We should find new technological solutions in this

regard." The President said that he loves his country and proud of his country. "I have a vision for my country. Our ardent desire is to build a prosperous nation with a productive citizen, contented family and a righteous society. What we have done so far as well as the plans we propose to implement in future will be aimed to achieve this objective," he added.

He noted that the government has commenced a programme to provide employment for 100,000 persons representing the most underprivileged families in the country. "Simultaneously, we have set plans in motion to provide job opportunities to 60,000 graduates and train them to render their services efficiently. When offering government job opportunities, we will accord priority to poorest of the households. Further, we will have to ensure equal distribution of job opportunities for every province.

Every appointee to the gov-

ernment should contribute productively to the country," adding that no unnecessary and arbitrary enrollment will be allowed to any ministry or institution.

President Rajapaksa also noted that his Government's basic aims are to strengthen the local economy and to increase export income.

Currently, he said that the income from tea, coconut and rubber industries is not at a satisfactory level, adding that operations will be launched to develop tea plantations and at the same time, the government will assist the small and medium scale tea estate owners as well. (Also see page 8)

Kegalle District MP Ranjith Siyambalapitiya was appointed Deputy Speaker of the ninth Parliament while Jaffna district MP Angajan Ramanathan was appointed Deputy Chairman of Committees.

Parliament General Secretary Dhammika Dassanayake read out the statement by the President on the summoning of Parliament which was followed by the electing of the Speaker. Thereafter, the elected MPs took their oaths.

The Speaker, Deputy Speaker and the Deputy Chairman of Committees were then appointed.

A brief bio of Speaker Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena.

Born on October 10, 1945 in Makandura, Matara, Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena is a senior politician with more than 30 years of experience. Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena received his primary education from Thelijjavila Central College and Rahula College, Matara.He then obtained his first degree from

the University of Colombo. He has also received specialized training in Management from the Institute of Management, Chandigarh in India.

He won the Hakmana by-election in 1983 and entered Parliament for the first time representing the United National Party. He has been a Member of Parliament for 23 years. Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena, who contested from the Sri Lanka Podu Jana Peramuna for the Matara District in the 2020 General Election, entered Parliament with 80,895 preferential votes.

He was the Chairman of the Southern Provincial Council during 1993/94 period and also served as the Chief Minister of the same Provincial Council from 1994 to 2001. He has also held a number of Ministries such as Health, Cultural Affairs and National Heritage, Irrigation and Rural Development, Industry and Commerce, Parliamentary Affairs and Agricul-

He was also a member of the COPE Committee in 1987. Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena has also attended the Asian Parliament for Peace in Beijing, China in 2002, attended the 50th C.P.A Conference in Dhaka, Bangladesh and the 2005 International Parliamentary Conference in Fiji.

The loss had occurred when leasing out the Modara Fisheries harbour to a private company while he was Fisheries Minister in 2014.

Commission to Investigate Allegations of Bribery or Corruption Director General filed indictments against former Minister Rajitha Senaratne, Ceylon Fisheries Harbour Corporation (CFHC) former Chairman Upali Liyanage and CFHC former Managing Director Neil Ravindra Munasinghe under section 70 of the Bribery Act on five charges.

The Bribery Commission alleged that the former Minister had unlawfully taken a decision to lease out the Modara Fisheries harbour to Sea Gulf UK Private Ltd at a lower price between August 1, 2014 and November 1, 2014, while he was serving as the Fisheries

The Bribery Commission alleged that by knowing this transaction would cause unlawful loss to the government, the former Minister had motivated the members of the CFHC director board to lease out the fisheries harbor to Sea Gulf UK Private Ltd.

The indictments had been filed under five counts under section 70 of the Bribery Act and section 113 and 102 of the Penal Code. The prosecution had named 17 individuals as witnesses. The Bribery Commission further listed 55 documents as production items in

Through a judgement delivered on July 20, 2020 the BTF was ordered to pay compensation to one Roshini Sivagurunathan, the petitioning creditor, together with legal costs out of the assets of the Tamils Forum UK Limited.

Accordingly, the BTF, which has used the UK based All Party Parliamentary Group for Tamils (APPGT) as its mouthpiece while being excessively committed to the propagation of pro-LTTE ideology and fund-raising through its so called 'Secretarial' assistance to the APPGT has now been thrown out by the High Court Judge-

Earlier in December 2019, the Court ordered the Tamils Forum UK Limited to pay damages to Roshini Sivagurunathan after hearing the petition, filed by her. The paragraph 237 of the judgment stated that there is 'manipulation of minutes', 'distorted recording', 'deliberate omissions' and 'unscrupulous conduct' by the BTF in relation to the Roshini Sivagurunathan vs BTF case. The judge also found the BTF to have been involved in direct discrimination, victimization and denial of natural justice against the petitioner and costs and damages in addition to the liability for the already bankrupt BTF which has been ordered to pay £ 70,000.

Controversially, the BTF using the official address of the Tamil Community Association Limited registered under the Industrial Providence Society Act has been enjoying the charitable status and the Tamil Community Association Limited, contrary to its 'regulated and non-political organization status, has facilitated the bankrupt BTF to stage pro-LTTE political meeting in the premises

Reports also claimed that the BTF has throughout prevented all other moderate Tamil organizations having any influence on the APPGT since the founding of the APPGT under the chairmanship of MP Keith Vass MP, the BTF never wanted to incorporate wider Tamil views on the exact ground realities in Sri Lanka.

The BTF, an evolvement of the former LTTE front, British Tamil Association (BTA) and its representation of LTTE flag carrying members in the streets, allowed the BTF to extend its will aggressively without allowing others to have any interactive engagement with the APPGT.

Tipper truck knocks down police officer

Yet another police officer succumbed to critical injuries yesterday while receiving treatment after being knocked down by a tipper truck at the Kongala checkpoint on Matara-Hakmana road on July

The deceased was a 47-year-old sergeant attached to Hakmana Police. He was a resident of Watukolakanda, Kirinda. He was under medical care at the Matara District General Hospital from the date of the accident.

Previously, a Police Constable (36) attached to the Hakmana Police died from an incident. He was a resident of Walasmulla.

Hakmana police arrested the tipper truck driver for running over three police officers purposely who were on duty at a roadblock by the tipper truck in July. He is a resident of Lunama,

The police had found the tipper abandoned at a compound of a house in Kattakaduwa, Hunga-

Police said the charges against the suspect include homicide, attempting to homicide, injuring the officers on duty, reckless driving and driv-

ing on the wrong side of the road.
Police Media Spokesman SSP Jaliya Senaratne said two police officers attached to the Kirinda Police Station had stopped the tipper on suspicion. However, the driver of the tipper had not stopped the vehicle and had sped off. The police officers had then notified the police checkpoint in Kongama and they had stopped the tipper.

The police officers subsequently issued the driver a spot fine permit as a temporary licence and warned him against reckless driving and failing to stop.

The tripper truck driver had then proceeded towards Hakmana. He had then turned the vehicle and come towards Matara later and deliberately run over the police officers at the checkpoint.

Abolish 13th, 19th amendments soon'

The top priority of the Government would be to introduce a new Constitution and to abolish the 13th amendment to the Constitution, Pediatrician and Dean of Ruhunu Medical Faculty Professor Wasantha Dewasiri said.

He was addressing a discussion on contemporary political situation of the country and need for a new Constitution. The event was organised by Galle Vidvath Ekmuthuwa, a collective of professionals and academics of Galle. Prof Dewasiri is also the convener of the organisation.

The country needs a stable government. The Constitution has been reformed for 19 times. The 13th and 19th amendments which are very destructive to the nation should be abolished without delay. Although it was very difficult to get a 2/3 majority in Parliament under the voting system. The people has given a clear mandate to the Government for a constructional change at the previous parliamentary election. No community will be let down under a Sinhala- Buddhist system of rule, the Professor said.

"The 13th amendment was introduced and implemented at a time when there was a civil war in the country. However, we could defeat the separatist terrorism. Nevertheless, we did not consider to repeal the 13th amendment, which is highly destructive to the progress of the country. Now the time has come to complete the national task which we failed to accomplish decades before," he said.

He said that the administrative powers of the country should be devolved. "The people should be introduced with a system which allows them to solve their economic, social and administrative issues at village level. For that purpose there is no need of the system of Provincial Councils. So the Provincial Council election should not be held spending colossal amounts of money, he continued," he said.

"We initiated this organisation 10 years before under the guidelines of President Gotabhaya Rajapaksa's "Viyath Maga" organisation. Today we have been able to achieve our objectives. At present, the once fragile national security has been aptly defended as we

"Gotabaya Rajapaksa assured a fully native Constitution which the people of the country overwhelmingly endorsed. Education Sate Minister Wijitha Berugoda said 1,000 new National Schools will be opened countrywide while streamlining the available National Schools. He was addressing a media briefing at his ministry yes-

A new education systems will also be set up, he added. "A huge development in the education sector is achieved by implementing new education systems to

streamline education sector of the country," he said. State Minister Berugoda said that the issues of the education system are identified. After identifying them, step

WORLD MUST RESOLVE TO END TERROR



he victims of terrorism are all over the world. But unfortunately and surprisingly there is no one to stand by their rights. There is a lot of talk about terrorism, war crimes, separate states and so on, but not about the victims of terrorism. Here in Sri Lanka, it was the same during the past five years and before 2005. The previous regime started to talk about the victims of so-called war crimes instead of talking about the real victims. It was very concerned about missing persons, but not about missing heroic soldiers of our armed forces. But Mother Nature always stands by the real victims of all types of terrorism. She makes sure that justice is done for them. She changes relevant things at relevant times to do the justice to those who

The LTTE, once described by the FBI as the most ruthless terror group in the world, especially targeted innocent civilians for its brutal attacks. It hacked to death a large number of civilians belonging to all ethnicities and religions who lived in the North and the East. Those villages were called 'border villages'. The people living in those villages left their homes at night and spent the night in thick jungles and treetops to protect their lives from the LTTE. But some such as the elderly, the sick, the disabled, infants and pregnant women could not do it. The LTTE cadres came at night with sharp weapons and guns and hacked them to

Bhikkus who lived in those border villages did not leave their temples because of the innocent people. They stayed back and faced the brutality of the LTTE while protecting people belonging to all ethnicities and



priceless historical archeological sites which provided concrete proof of real Sri Lankan history. The LTTE tried its best to fabricate a new Sri Lankan history to help their claim for the lands, but the ancient historical archeological sites stood as evidence for the true Sri

A large number of people who lived in the southern parts of the country lost their lives due to suicide bomb attacks and claymore mines. They lost their lives while traveling to offices, schools or while returning home

after work. Some became victims while working in their offices. The best example is the Central Bank bomb blast in 1996. Some victims have already died without being able to live as permanently disabled persons. Some had committed suicide without being able to face life. Parents did not travel together before May 18, 2009, because they wanted to save the life of at least one of them in order to look after the children.

What if you cannot hear anything and cannot see anything hereafter? They heard and saw the world for the last time 15 or 20 years ago and not thereafter. If you become blind or deaf by birth, Nature makes all your other senses very strong, but if you lost what you received by birth, the situation is not that easy. What if someone else needs to help you to use the toilet and take your meals? We feel certain things only when they hit us hard and not when we see it hitting others hard. This is the bitter truth in life. The victims of terrorism experience this bitter truth for the rest of their lives.

The brutal terrorism of the LTTE came to an end on May 18 in 2009 by the efforts of the heroic Armed Forces of Mother Lanka after sacrificing over 26,000 precious young lives. Hundreds of war heroes became permanently disabled. From that day onwards all Sinhalese, Muslims and Tamils enjoy freedom to move anywhere they want at any time of the day and do whatever they want. From that day, they sleep in their homes comfortably and with the assurance of getting up the next morning alive. The people living in the North and the East do not need to pay ransom to anyone from that historic day. The children in the North can play and study without the fear of being abducted to be trained as child soldiers. Sri Lanka is among the handful of countries that has ended terrorism, though global terrorism can hit any country, as Sri Lankans experienced last year.

According to the United Nations (UN), while more countries are affected by terrorism today, the number of victims has largely been concentrated in a small number of member states.

Victims of terrorism continue to struggle to have their voices heard, have their needs supported and their rights upheld. Victims often feel forgotten and neglected once the immediate aftermath of a terrorist attack fades, which can have profound consequences for them. Few members states have the resources or the capacity to fulfill the medium and long-term needs required for victims to fully recover, rehabilitate and integrate back into society. Victims can only recover and cope with their trauma through long-term multidimensional support, including physical, psychological, social and financial, in order to heal and live with dignity.

The UN says the primary responsibility to support victims of terrorism and uphold their rights rests with member states. The United Nations has an important role in supporting member states to implement Pillar I and IV of the UN Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy through standing in solidarity and providing support to victims, capacity building assistance, establishing networks of, and offering support to, civil society organizations, particularly victims of terrorism associations, and encouraging member states to promote, protect and respect the rights of victims. The United Nations has been working to provide resources, mobilize the international community and better address the needs of victims of terrorism.

The General Assembly, in its resolution 72/165 (2017), established August 21 as the International Day of Remembrance of and Tribute to the Victims of Terrorism to honour and support the victims and survivors of terrorism and to promote and protect the full enjoyment of their human rights and fundamental freedoms

Resolution 72/165 builds on existing efforts by the General Assembly, the Commission of Human Rights and the Human Rights Council to promote and protect the rights of victims of terrorism.

By proclaiming an International Day dedicated to victims, the General Assembly reaffirmed that the promotion and the protection of human rights and the rule of law at the national and international levels are essential for preventing and combating terrorism.

The Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy, adopted unanimously in its resolution 60/288, on September 8, 2006, notes that the dehumanization of victims counts among the conditions conducive to the spread of terrorism, and the most effective way to counter-terrorism is through measures that respect human dignity and uphold the rule of

The last three outcome resolutions of the

Global Counter-Terrorism Strategy review (A/RES/66/282, A/RES/68/276 and A/RES/72/284) have all emphasized the important role of victims in countering terrorism and preventing violent extremism as well as recognizing and upholding their human rights.

The sixth review resolution (A/RES/72/284), particularly notes that building resilience of victims and their families, through the provision of proper support and assistance immediately after an attack and in the longer-term is a major step forward in recognizing that victims who are resilient are less vulnerable to the impacts of terrorism and are able to cope, heal and recover more rapidly after an

The draft resolution on the Enhancement of International Cooperation to Assist Victims of Terrorism (A/73/l.88) specifically recognizes the resilience of victims as important for the social cohesion of society and as vital partners to prevent violent extremism conducive to terrorism. 

A welcome change

hat the Yahapalanaya showpiece 19th Amendment to the Constitution was on its way out under the new Government was inevitable given the ambiguities and uncertainties it was replete with that made Governance next to impossible and reduced to a farce as the country was to experience during the four and a half year Yahapalanaya rule.

The Cabinet nod was received at the new Government's maiden Cabinet meeting to repeal the 19th Amendment and replace it with a new 20th Amendment according Cabinet Spokesman, Mass Media Minister Keheliya Rambukwella. Encouragingly though, 19A will not be abolished in toto, with the Government deciding to retain some of its positive features such as the Right to Information (RTI), which will be incorporated in the 20th Amendment.

New Justice Minister President's Counsel Ali Sabry will now be entrusted with the task of drafting the 20th Amendment, which, according to Minister Udaya Gammanpila will be subjected to a close study by a committee of eminent persons prior to its finalization.

It was evident from the very outset that 19A was a hastily put together piece of legislation aimed only at keeping the Rajapaksas out of power. The two term limit for a President, the dual citizenship bar, the age barrier for eligibility, were all done with this goal in mind.

That is not all. 19A also completely emasculated the powers of the President who is directly elected by the people and tied his hands even in the case of vital appointments. That the country's police service is still headed by an Acting IGP with the President unable to make the substantive appointment to fill the vacancy is a clear instance where the President's powers have been emasculated under 19A.

Besides, the so called Independent Commissions that came into being under 19A functioned as a law unto themselves bypassing the President in making appointments. The 19A which did away with the President's powers to dissolve Parliament after one year, placed the Legislature in a position to run rings round the Executive – a clear recipe for instability and chaos as we witnessed in 2018. This way Parliament could hold a new President to ransom negating the mandate received by him or her. Suitable changes therefore are needed that will give the President the option to dissolve Parliament in case of a hostile House after a suitable time frame.

Of course, with the President and Parliament in this instance being from the same party such an eventuality is out of the question. But it would do no harm for the necessary provisions to be made beforehand in case of a future situation.

This is not to suggest that the baby be thrown with the bathwater and Ministers Rambukwella and Gammanpila promised as much speaking in favour of retaining some positive features of 19A. In this respect the segments ensuring the independence of the judiciary ought to left untouched. An independent judiciary is one of the pillars of democratic Governance and public trust in the judiciary should be upheld at all times to ensure justice to all irrespective of their status or position in life. The Government's decision to continue with the RTI is also an indication that President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has nothing to hide and is committed to democratic Governance. The Government should also think of introducing other progressive legislation, now that it has a two thirds majority in Parliament to take the country forward. There is much that needs to be done to develop our education system to meet with modern demands. Many Government politicians, during the Election campaign asked the voters for a two thirds majority to ensure smooth Governance, a streamlined administration and to usher in revolutionary changes to develop the country. Voters have responded to their call. Now it is their turn to deliver.

An encouraging pledge

he pledge made by new Minister of Education Prof. G.L. Peiris to completely eliminate ragging in the universities would be most welcomed not only by parents preparing to send their children for higher education but also by all right thinking people of this country.

Addressing university officials Prof Peiris stressed the importance of zero tolerance of ragging. Many parents dread sending their children to universities due to the horror stories coming out of the campuses. Professor Peiris, perhaps, more than any other would, no doubt, have a clear insight as to the goings-on within the portals of our local universities, being no stranger to university life himself.

Raggers should be punished severely and university authorities should give more powers to the marshals to catch the culprits. Hopefully this time around, with a strong President at the helm, and an individual familiar with the university system as Education Minister we will see an end to this sadistic pastime by mentally disturbed student segments who have turned our universities into torture chambers.

President outlines plans to achieve his vision for the Nation

resident Gotabaya Rajapaksa yesterday stressed his Government's expectation to create a prosperous nation. Only the present generation can realize this hope on behalf of future generations, he said.

Delivering the policy statement of his Government at the inaugural session of the 9th Parliament yesterday, he said, "We have arrived at an important landmark in history. The people have given the current government a massive mandate. We have been given the responsibility to take the country towards prosperity while safeguarding the people and protecting the sovereignty of the country without succumbing to any force. The present generation must fulfill that responsibility for the sake of the future generations".

He called upon all Sri Lankans to join these efforts to fulfill this responsibility that history has bestowed upon us. "This is the Motherland of all of us. Hence, the time has come for all of us to join hands for the sake of the country irrespective of race, religion or party differences. I extend my hand of friendship to everybody to join me to build a prosperous nation as promised to our people."

"I love my country. I am proud of my country. I have a vision for my country. Our ardent desire is to build a prosperous nation with a productive citizen, content family and a righteous society. What we have done so far as well as the plans we propose to implement in future will be aimed at achieving this objective," he said.

Establishing firmly that the prime policy of our Government is national security, we have restructured the security apparatus and intelligence services, eliminating the fears of the people thereby restoring the security of the country, he recalled. "We have recreated an environment where any citizen can live freely without any fear for the safety of themselves and their families. As I have pledged, the launch of the methodical mechanism to protect the people against social evils such as the activities of the underworld and the drug menace that have been a hindrance to the day-to-day lives of the people has also increased the confidence of the public."

Accordingly, a virtuous and a lawabiding society is emerging as we promised, he pointed out.

President Rajapaksa outlined the policies of the government briefly stressing the plans for every important sector including economy, agriculture, industries, education, technology, health and tourism.

The President, emphasizing the importance of education, said that the government expenditure on education for all the students to pursue their future endeavours and to develop their skills is an investment for the future. In achieving our future objectives, special attention needs to be paid to technical education. "We will pay special attention in education reforms in respect of Grade 6 to Grade 13. We will increase the capacity of Universities enabling all students who pass the Advanced Level Examination to pursue university education. Further, we will take measures to improve the Open University network and Distance Learning methods. The curriculum will be revised to ensure that these degree subjects would directly contribute to the growth of the economy".

The top priority of the government is to enhance growth of agriculture sector. A large percentage of citizens of this country, earn their livelihood through self-employment. During the last two months the President visited many areas in the country and listened to the grievances of the people. The request made by the farmers was for adequate water and fertilizer during cultivation seasons. "We should address these issues. Therefore we will implement broad strategies to rehabilitate the tanks and to develop the irrigation system across the country," the President stressed.

Another major social issue faced by the youth is unemployment. Both short term and long-term solutions have been explored to address this issue. The President referred to the programme to provide employment for 100,000 persons who belong to the most underprivileged families in the country. Simultaneously, another programme put in motion to provide job opportunities to 60,000 graduates and arrange training for them to make their services efficient.

When offering job opportunities we will prioritize the households with the lowest per capita income. In this process, we will ensure equal distribution of job opportunities for all the areas, he said. "Every appointee to government jobs should contribute an efficient service to the country. Therefore, no ministry or department is allowed to arbitrarily enroll individuals to their staff."

Another issue highlighted by the people was that they did not possess proper deeds for their lands. "We will provide them legitimate deeds through a swift process. I assure you that without a proper alternative we will not evict people from their ancestral homes or formlands."

or farmlands."

The intrusion of elephants in to villages has become a major issue. A group of experts have already been appointed to come up with a feasible resolution for this issue. The President pointed out that a separate state ministry solely responsible for this issue was established as the Government is well aware that this issue needs a long-term solution.

A substantial number of people across the country suffer from shortage of drinking water. We will take necessary steps to address these humane issues, the President said and added that as a national policy, steps would be taken to provide drinking water to every part of the country.

Parents request schools with adequate facilities for their children to educate in. The insufficiencies of national schools were evident in every area. Most schools do not have adequate facilities. The shortage of teachers, lab access, libraries and sports was frequently mentioned. Although we request students to follow science and technical subjects in order to successfully contribute to the economy, their schools do not even have basic facilities to teach those streams.

The ministries which had been assigned with new duties will prioritize addressing these issues.

Another important issue was that the inadequacy of facilities in the

health sector. Both resources and facilities in rural hospitals are in an unsatisfactory state. There is a considerable shortage of doctors, nurses and other staff members in these hospitals. Patients in some areas have to travel long distances for treatments. "We will eliminate these unfortunate discrepancies when we ensure free healthcare facilities for everyone," the President said and added that both Ayurvedic and indigenous medicinal systems will be preserved and promoted.

"Instead of spending large amounts of foreign exchange to import medicine, we have already commenced operations to manufacture medicines locally. We will also eradicate corruption which occurs in the importation of medicine. This is why we formed a separate state ministry to manufacture, supply and regulate medicine," he said.

President Rajapaksa explained the

reasons for newly-structured State Ministries. He requested all the Ministers and State Ministers to create job opportunities in their respective areas with the assistance of the private sector. Both main ministries and state ministries are expected to work in cooperation with the respective private companies in the industry to generate job opportunities. In addition, we will take necessary steps to promote self-employment and entrepreneurship in each industry as well. Our duty and responsibility is not to distribute job opportunities but to generate them, he said.

"In order to overcome both local and global challenges and revive the economy, we will have to adopt new ways of thinking. Out of the box thinking is required in order to meet the economic challenges. This time, the ministries have been formed with this thought in mind"

The need of a people-centric economy to ensure real economic revival has been identified. When forming ministries, special attention was given in assigning subjects and tasks in order to cover fields such as agriculture, plantations, fisheries, ancestral industries and promotion of self-employment opportunities which are of utmost importance to the people in the country. Our basic aims are to strengthen the local economy and increase export income. Currently the income from tea, coconut and rubber industries is not at a satisfactory level.

"We will develop tea plantations and at the same time, the Government will aid the small and medium scale tea estate owners as well.

Due to the shutting down of tea factories, they have encountered a number of difficulties. We will resume their operations and eliminate existing irregularities simultaneously encouraging the export of high-quality tea," the President said and emphasized, "We will reclaim the global title we held for Ceylon Tea."

The government will encourage planting of new coconut saplings. In order to enact a reasonable price for rubber, local rubber industrialists will be encouraged to utilize local rubber. Plantation of palm oil trees will be stopped completely. "We promote the production of export crops such as pepper and cinnamon. We will provide opportunities to generate substantial foreign exchange by providing a stable price to the farmers through value

addition to agricultural products and exporting them."

President Rajapaksa said that in delegating responsibilities to ministries, special attention was paid to the development of urban and rural infrastructure facilities and to find solutions to the housing problem faced by the people. "We have identified several sectors that can directly contribute to the development of the country and accordingly to appoint State Ministers responsible for these areas and to assign them the relevant subjects and activities."

As human resource development has been identified as a priority, the subject of education was brought under one Ministry and four State Ministers were appointed in charge of different responsibilities. Separate State Ministries for Pre-School, Education Reforms, Skills Development as well as Dhamma School and Bhikku Education have been set up because of their importance.

"We also initiated measures to build a production economy," the President said. "Paddy farmers were given a higher guaranteed price for their products. We took steps to protect local farmers by halting importation of exportable produce for re-export as well as banning importation of crops that could have been grown locally. Farmers were provided with required fertilizer free of charge. People were encouraged to re-cultivate abandoned lands throughout the country. Through all these, we provided a new lease of life to the agricultural sector in this country."

After having elected, the government has provided tax concessions targeting local entrepreneurs. Interest rates were brought down to encourage businesses. Highly competitive imports were restricted in order to protect local entrepreneurs and industrialists.

The basis of the success of a democratic state is its constitution. Our Constitution, which has been amended 19 times, from its inception in 1978, has many ambiguities and uncertainties, presently resulting in confusion, the President pointed out. "As the people have given us the mandate we wanted for a constitutional amendment, our first task will be to remove the 19th Amendment to the Constitution. After that, all of us will get together to formulate a new Constitution suitable for the country. In this, the priority will be given to the concept of one country, one law for all the people."

An unstable Parliament that cannot take firm decisions and succumbs to extremist influences very often is not suitable for a country. While introducing a new Constitution, it is essential to make changes to the current electoral system, he said and assured that while retaining the salutary aspects of the Proportional Representation system, these changes will be made to ensure stability of Parliament and people's direct representation.

Referring to the unprecedented mandate given by the people, President Rajapaksa said, "It is clear that people enthusiastically supported us in this election due to the trust we have built in them in this manner."

"We will continue to serve the people in a manner that affirms this trust," he promised the people.

he newly elected government has begun its task of charting the course of the nation, with the appointment of Cabinet ministers and State ministers and Parliament being convened for the first time by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa yesterday in a simple but stately ceremony.

The appointment of the cabinet was awaited with great interest, given the pledges made by President Rajapaksa during his election campaign to create a new political culture. The ministerial appointments that have been announced consisted of 26 Cabinet ministers and

Following the appointment of Cabinet ministers and State ministers, other appointments have also been finalised. Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena is the new Speaker while Ranjith Siyambalapitiya will be his deputy. Jaffna District MP Angajan Ramanathan will be the Deputy Chairman of Committees.

Also being announced was the appointment of Media Minister Keheliya Rambukwella as the new Cabinet spokesman. Pivithuru Hela Urumaya leader and Energy Minister Udaya Gammanpila and Plantations Minister Dr. Ramesh Pathirana will also function as Co-Cabinet

The reduction in the number of ministers to 26 has been commended, even by the President's critics. The previous Government had ministers numbering up to 40 when Parliamentarians from both the United National Party (UNP) and the Sri Lanka Freedom Party (SLFP) were sworn in as ministers.

It must be noted that the Government, though it won a sweeping majority at the August 5 election, returned 145 seats- five short of the 150 required for a two-thirds majority in its own right. However, there are five or more MPs from smaller parties which support the Government to make up 150 seats.

There had been speculation that the Government would offer some portfolios to these parties to ensure an iron-clad two-thirds majority. It could have used the Constitutional provision that allows for a 'National Government' by entering into a 'coalition' with even one of these parties, to do so.

That would have allowed the Government to increase the number of ministers significantly, thereby accommodating all parties and factions within the ruling the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP), the SLFP and other smaller political parties that support it. President Rajapaksa has not done that.

Even for a Government that is formed by a single party, the Constitution allows for up to 30 ministers. However, the President has resisted that temptation and appointed only 26 ministers, sending a clear message that, given the majority he enjoys, appeasing political concerns was not among his priorities.

However, there appears to be some underlying political considerations in the allocation of ministries and ministers. What is apparent is that those who have stood by Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa when he was defeated at the 2015 presidential election have been rewarded for their loyalty.

Thus, those who aligned themselves with him, formed the core of the Joint Opposition (JO) and helped in mobilising support for the formation of the SLPP have been given pride of place. Others who allied themselves with former President Sirisena and joined his government have been relegated.


As a party, the SLPP has received the lion's share of portfolios, with 19 of the 26 ministers being from that party. The SLFP received only two portfolios which went to party senior Nimal Siripala de Silva and former United Peoples' Freedom Alliance (UPFA) Gen-

eral Secretary Mahinda Amaraweera. Five leaders of parties allied with the SLPP have received Cabinet portfolios. They are Dinesh Gunewardena, Wimal Weerawansa, Vasudeva Nanayakkara, Douglas Devananda and Udaya Gammanpila. There was no portfolio for Lanka Samasamaja Party (LSSP) leader Tissa Vitarana.

Former President Maithripala Sirisena was the most conspicuous absentee in the Cabinet. There was speculation that he would be given the Mahaweli Ministry or another high-profile portfolio. Sirisena, who was pre-

sent at the swearing-in ceremony for the ministers in Kandy, did not receive a ministry.

This was followed by speculation that the former President would be considered for the position of Speaker. However, that position went to Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena. As it stands, Sirisena will be a backbencher in the Government- unless another high-profile position is being considered for him.

Several senior SLFPers who held important portfolios in the previous Government headed by then President Sirisena have been sidelined. These stalwarts include S.B. Dissanayake, Susil Premajayantha, John Seneviratne, Anura Priyadarshana Yapa and Mahinda Samarasinghe. Among the key portfolios, Prime Minister Mahinda Rajapaksa retains the Finance Ministry. Similarly, Foreign Minister Dinesh Gunewardena and Health Minister Pavithra Wanniarachchi have retained their ministries, SLPP Chairman G.L. Peiris has been appointed as Minister of Education.

The most notable new entrant to the Cabinet is Ali Sabry, PC, who was sworn in as Minister of Justice. Minister Sabry had a high profile during last year's Presidential Election campaign and had been President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's legal counsel in many court cases, in the lead up to the campaign.

In that period, in the immediate aftermath of the 2019 April Easter day terrorist attacks by Muslim extremists, Sabry had been a strong voice in calling on the rest of the Muslim community to eschew terrorism and join in a process of national reconciliation involving all communities.

The Easter attacks have been a subject of much scrutiny. Former President Sirisena ordered an inquiry which was followed by an inquiry conducted by a Parliamentary Select Committee. Now, another Presidential Commission of Inquiry is conducting its own investigations into the incidents.

Against such a backdrop where prosecution of the

terrorists involved is the most likely outcome, appointing a Muslim minister of Justice has been considered controversial by some but President Rajapaksa has indicated that he retains faith in his former legal counsel to do an impartial job.

Minister Sabry who entered Parliament through the National List is also the only professional to be inducted directly in to the Government, evoking memories of how G.L. Peiris and Lakshman Kadirgamar were included in the Cabinet by former President Chandrika Bandaranaike Kumaratunga in 1994.

Peiris was an architect of the truce with the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE). Kadirgamar played a stellar role as Foreign Minister and was instrumental in having the LTTE banned overseas. Arguably, President Rajapaksa expects a similar noteworthy contribution from his Minister of Justice.

Other relative newcomers to the Cabinet are Prasanna Ranatunga and Ramesh Pathirana. Both are heirs to family political ties, being sons of former ministers Reggie Ranatunga and Richard Pathirana respectively. However, both were ministers in the Cabinet appointed prior to dissolving Parliament.

Included in the Cabinet for the first time is a third generation Rajapaksa, Namal Rajapaksa. He was appointed as the Minister of Sports and Youth Affairs. Thus, Namal Rajapaksa and Ramesh Pathirana become the only MPs among their contemporaries to be elevated to Cabinet rank.

It was reported that former Minister of Justice Wijeyadasa Rajapakshe was offered a state minister's position but that he declined the offer. As a result, the reputed lawyer who has switched political allegiances between the SLFP, the UNP and the SLPP lost out on being appointed to any office.

Interestingly, two General Secretaries of the SLFP, Dayasiri Jayasekara and Duminda Dissanayake have been offered state ministerial portfolios for Batik, Handloom Fabrics and Local Apparel Products and Solar, Wind, Grid Power Generation Projects Development respectively.

Three other professionals been rewarded for their contributions in other fields. They are Former Central Bank Governor Ajith Nivard Cabraal, Sarath Weerasekara and Nalaka Godahewa. Godahewa and Weerasekara topped the preference votes in the Gampaha and Colombo districts respectively.

The titles of some state ministers have come in for criticism and led to amusing posts on social media. This is because they are extremely descriptive in nature. For instance, Prasanna Ranaweera has been appointed as State Minister of Cane, Brass, Clay, Furniture and Rural Industry Promotion.

In an apparent response to this criticism President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has said that the creation of these 'unorthodox' state ministries was to pave the way for a people-centric national economy so that they would be its stakeholders. Hence the descriptive nature of the titles of state ministries, he said.

President Rajapaksa made this observation at the first in a series of meetings to review the portfolios and responsibilities of state ministries. The first to be assessed was that of the State Ministry of Batik, Handloom Fabrics and Local Apparel Products where Dayasiri Jayasekara is the State Minister.

There has also been criticism of the appointment of some ministers and state ministers because of their controversial histories, some of them being charged with various offences in the past and others identified with unruly behaviour in Parliament. With the former however, none had been convicted.

Former President Kumaratunga has vented her frustration at the SLFP being sidelined in the appointment of the new Cabinet, being reduced to two Cabinet portfolios. However, it is clear that that loyalty to the SLPP cause has been a key criterion in the allocation of Cabinet responsibilities.

The new Government was voted in with an unprecedented majority. Voters would therefore have high expectations that they would deliver on their promises, especially in these trying times.

The new Cabinet and President Rajapaksa have significant challenges and onerous tasks lying ahead of

he Ninth Parliament that convened yesterday (20) is a unique Parliament for a number of reasons. No one ever thought that any one party would be able to secure a two-thirds' majority at the just concluded General Election 2020 and form a single-party government.

However, the Sri Lanka Podu Jana Peramuna (SLPP) under the leadership of Mahinda Rajapaksa created political history by securing a landslide victory, winning 145 seats, and, together with their allied parties, managing to obtain 151 seats.

In an exclusive interview with the *Daily News*, Constitutional Law expert, President's Counsel Dr. Jayatissa de Costa expressed his views with regard to the country's Constitution, its proposed changes and the legal provisions for amending or opting for a new Constitution altogether.

Following are excerpts of the interview:

What are the unique factors that you see in the Ninth Parliament?

A. This is a unique Parliament in the sense that in the democratic world, this is, I think, the first occasion where a landslide victory took place in a country where the Proportional Representation system (PR) exists.

In the PR system, it is almost impossible for any party to get a two-thirds' majority. But under the leadership of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, the SLPP, under the party leadership of Mahinda Rajapaksa, was able to achieve what was deemed impossible. They obtained nearly two-thirds of the votes, which is 145 seats, and about five to six seats from alliance members, such as Pillayan, EPDP and Athaulah and with these allied parties' seats the government will get around 151 seats which is more than two-thirds.

This is due to a number of factors, the first being President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's victory a few months ago and the other factor which is the manner in which the Government tackled the COVID-19 pandemic in the country and brought it under control.

Even though political opponents tried to criticize the government about the statistics on the recoveries, it is a fact that Sri Lanka has only recorded 11 deaths due to the Coronavirus in comparison to the thousands of deaths reported in other countries. That is a feat that could only be achieved by a developed country where the health system is advanced and modern.

But with limited resources, under the leadership of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, and the able assistance of the Health services and the Armed Forces, the

government was able to fully bring the situation under control.

These two are the major factors that contributed to the SLPP's resounding victory, but the overall factor is that the country has accepted President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's manifesto.

Another striking factor in this election is that the UNP, which is one of the oldest political parties and until this recent election, considered the single biggest party, was reduced to a very pathetic performance. This is also the first occasion where not a single member from the UNP was present in a new Parliament.

There are varying views expressed with regard to the President holding a ministerial portfolio. In your view, can the President hold a Cabinet portfolio?

A. The President, according to Article 42(3) of the Constitution, is the leader presiding over the Cabinet. In the same Article, it states that he is a member of the Cabinet. If you are a member of a body and you are the head of that body, why can't you function as a member of that body?

According to the other school of thought on Article 43(2), it says the subjects are assigned to ministries and ministers will have to be chosen from among the Parliament members. On the one hand, after the 19th Amendment, Article 43(2) says that he or she has to be a Member of Parliament, but at the same time, Article 42(3) says the person who is presiding over the Cabinet is the President and he is a member of the Cabinet also. So, this would become academic if they amend the 19th Amendment in such a fashion that they can get over this ambiguity. However, one can argue that being the one that presides over the Cabinet and being a member of that Cabinet, the President can hold a ministerial portfolio.

This is not the first instance in the Constitution after the 19th Amendment where there are ambiguities. For instance, with regard to the dissolution of Parliament (which the Supreme Court has now resolved), where it states that only after four-and-a-half years can the President dissolve Parliament, but after the 19th Amendment, in another section it also says that with the additional powers given to the President, the power to dissolve is also given to the President. There were many arguments that were raised, but the Supreme Court decided and that is now history.

This situation with regard to the President's power to hold certain ministerial portfolios however, is also a result of careless drafting and conflicting meanings due to the flaws in the 19th Amendment. However, one of the main promises made by the government is to do away with the

perpetuate the regime of ruling party at that time, the UNP. That is why without a mandate they introduced the Proportional Representation (PR) system in this country. Of course, Jayewardene got a mandate to introduce the Executive Presidency and he did pass an Amendment to the then republican Constitution and later, the 1978 Constitution came into being. But he never obtained a mandate from the voters for it and it was not included in the UNP manifesto for the 1977 General Election that once they win they would introduce the PR system.

Apart from that, they had stated that the electoral system we are accustomed to would be carried forward. The 1977 UNP manifesto makes it very clear that the First-Past-the-Post system (in Sinhala, 'apata huru purudu mathiwarana krama-ya') will exist. But they did just the opposite.

DESTINED TO MAKE HISTORY

In Sri Lanka, making amendments to the Constitution is a major issue and many call for a fresh Constitution, whereas in neighbouring India, over 100 amendments have been made to their Constitution. So what is the issue for Sri Lanka to introduce amendments without opting for a fresh Constitution?

A. A mere amendment to the Constitution won't affect the basic structure of the Constitution. To meet with various situations you need to introduce amendments to the basic law of the land which is the Constitution. As you pointed out, in India, for the last 75 years or so they have amended their Constitution more than 100 times. But the basic features of the Constitution remain the same.

A case in point was the case of *Kesavananda Bharati vs State of Kerala* which had been heard for 68 days with the argu-

ments commencing on October 31, 1972, and ending on March 23, 1973. The hard work and scholarship that had gone into the preparation of this case was breathtaking. Literally hundreds of cases had been cited and the then Attorney-General had made a comparative chart analysing the provisions of the Constitutions of 71 different countries.

All this effort was to answer just one main question: Was the power of Parliament to amend the Constitution unlimited? The judgement held that Parliament could amend any part of the Constitution so long as it did not alter or amend "the basic structure or essential features of the Indian Constitution" even with a100 percent majority.

Likewise, in Sri Lanka too, the basic features of the Constitution are here to stay. For instance, this is a unitary country and cannot be converted into a federal state. Likewise, the foremost position given to Buddhism cannot be changed and it has come to be a salient feature of the Constitution.

Like these two features, there are others such as respect for fundamental rights and universal franchise which are strong features of the Constitution that cannot be changed. So there is no harm in amending the Constitution as long as it is done properly. Moreover, even if we introduce a new Constitution at some point, we may have to amend it to meet with the situations that may arise. There is no 100 percent foolproof Constitution.

For instance, the US Constitution which is over 100 years old still remains except for a few amendments. In Sri Lanka, since independence in 1948, we have seen three Constitutions being brought in of which the first was the Soulbury Constitution, which was a product of the British Parliament, the second is the Republican Constitution, and the third, the current Constitution.

In the case of the first Republican Constitution, we did not change it according to the then existing Constitution (the Soulbury Constitution). The elected MPs sat as a separate Constituent Assembly and then for the first time, an Autochthones Constitution (legally speaking, 'home grown' or 'rooted in native soil') was formed by the people of Sri Lanka for Sri Lanka

19th Amendment. Hence, it is a matter of time and we will have to wait and see when the Government will take steps to remove these conflicting areas or whether they would promulgate a new Constitution altogether, which they could do as they have a two-thirds' majority.

In your view, do you think it is advisable to amend the 19th Amendment or opt for a fresh Constitution?

A. Well, that is a good question because this Constitution was formulated to perpetuate J.R. Jayewardene's personal rule on the one hand, and on the other hand,

"In the PR system, it is almost impossible for any party to get a two-thirds' majority. But under the leadership of President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, the SLPP, under the party leadership of Mahinda Rajapaksa, was able to achieve what was deemed impossible."



California faces multiple crises



Fires sparked by lightning and a blistering heat wave raged across California, stretching resources and sending people out of their homes in the middle of the night.

Besides having the most coronavirus cases nation-wide, California faced multiple crises this week – a lightning blitz, a record heat wave, wildfires and power outages. Firefighting crews worked long hours to save communities in the path of the blazes and requested 375 fire engines from out of state to assist in the effort.

This week alone, nearly 11,000 lightning bolts hit the state within 72 hours, igniting hundreds of fires, CalFire spokesman Jeremy Rahn said in a news conference. Statewide, there are a total of 367 fires – 26 of them considered major blazes, officials said.

Two giant cluster of blazes – the LNU Lightning Complex and the SCU Lightning Complex fires – are burning in 10 counties.

"This is an incredibly

emotional and stressful time for many of us who have endured many fires and natural disasters over the last couple of years," Sonoma County Sheriff Mark Essick said.

On Wednesday, Gus Valerian woke up to desperate pounding on the door of his Vacaville home in Solano County, about 50 miles northeast of San Francisco. It was about 2 a.m. and a fire department official had come to warn them of the roaring blaze near his family's 16-acre property. Valerian rounded up his wife, Kersti, and their 3-year-old twins, Lincoln and Emmy, and bolted.

The fires in the state have burned more than 320,000 acres and come during a historic and brutal multiday heat wave. About 30 million people across the West are under an excessive heat warning or heat advisory Thursday, CNN meteorologist Michael Guy said.

In Vacaville, one of the hardest-hit cities, inmates at a state prison are getting N95 masks to help with air quality.

The LNU Lightning Complex Fire affecting the city stretches over five counties – Napa, Sonoma, Lake, Yolo, Solano – and has scorched more than 124,000 acres. It's 0% contained and authorities are evacuating some areas.

Outside Vacaville, Thuy Ngo watched Wednesday as flames consumed the barn on his 30-acre farm property. "We didn't think the fire would come down here this fast," he told CNN. "It's just heartwrenching. ... It's just gone."

The second biggest fire in the state – the SCU Lightning Complex Fire – has burned 102,000 acres. By early Thursday, it was 5% contained and had affected Santa Clara, Alameda, Contra Costa, San Joaquin and Stanislaus counties.

A third fire, dubbed the CZU August Lightning Complex, has grown to 25,000 acres in Santa Cruz and San Mateo counties. It was 0% contained by early Thursday.

With the heat wave adding to the fires' ferocity and speed, evacuations are underway throughout the region, but officials don't have a clear number on how many people have been told to leave their homes. The priorities remain the safety of firefighters and the public, evacuation planning and structure and infrastructure protection, said Cal Fire Operations Chief Chris Waters.

Temperatures have hovered above 100 degrees in some parts this week. On Thursday, they are expected to be in the upper 80s

into low 90s.

"The low humidity levels and gusty winds are allowing the fire to spread rapidly," CNN meteorologist Derek Van Dam said.

Power outages are also an issue as the California power grid struggles to keep up with demand.

The rolling blackouts were implemented over the weekend when an intense heat wave causes record temperatures across the state, including a high of 130 degrees in Death Valley on Sunday.

Gov. Gavin Newsom declared a statewide emergency this week to deploy resources to combat fires burning across the state exacerbated by the heat wave and high winds. He also demanded an investigation into the power out-

"These blackouts, which occurred without warning

or enough time for preparation, are unacceptable and unbefitting of the nation's largest and most innovative state," Newsom wrote in a letter to the California Public Utilities Commission and the California Energy Commission.

Experts have warned that wildfires fueled by the climate crisis will be the new normal in California. Warm-season days in the state have increased by 2.5 degrees since the early 1970s, according to a study published last year in the journal Earth's Future. "The clearest link between California wildfire and anthropogenic climate change thus far has been via warming-driven increases in atmospheric aridity, which works to dry fuels and promote summer forest fire," the report said. (CNN)

COVID-19: Airplanes may be safer than we think

Sitting squeezed between a number of strangers on board an aircraft might feel like a risky position during these uncertain times.

But according to some experts who point to the very few documented cases of in-flight transmission, the chances of catching Covid-19 while on board a flight are actually relatively slim.

Fear of flying during the pandemic has drastically reduced global air traffic, which hasalso been restricted due to border closures. If new scientific claims are borne out, the perceived heightened risk of boarding an airplane could be unfounded.

In one case, about 328 passengers and crew members were tested for coronavirus after it was learned thata March 31 flight from the US to Taiwan had been carrying 12 passengers who were symptomatic at the time. However, all the other passengers tested negative, as did the

crew members.

And while there have certainly been cases of infected passengers passing the virus on to an



airplane'screw or fellow travelers in recent months, the transmission rates are low.

A study recently published in medical journal JAMA Network Open found evidence of the possible spread of coronavirus during a fourhour flight from Tel Aviv to Frankfurt in March.

Two passengers developed infections after flying with a group of tourists who had come into contact with an infected hotel manager and also became infected, according to researchers from the Institute for Medical Virology at Goethe University in Frankfurt.

The two who may have been infected were seated at the back of the aircraft, directly across the aisle from seven passengers who had unknowingly picked up the virus.

An earlier flight from the UK to Vietnam on March 2, in which one passenger seemingly spread the virus to around 14 other passengers,



as well as a crew member, is so far believed to be the only known onboard transmission to multiple peo-

One explanation for the apparently low risk level is that the air in modern aircraft cabins is replaced with new fresh air every two to three minutes, andmost planes are fitted with air filters designed to trap 99.99% of particles.

Meanwhile, various new protocols have been implemented, such as face-coverings for both passengers and crew, which is mandatory on most airlines, temperature screenings, as well as more intensive cabin cleaning and limited movement in the cabin during flight.

Arnold Barnett, a professor of statistics at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's Sloan School of Management, tried to quantify the odds of becoming infected with the virus while on board a short flight in a recent study that looked at the benefits of the empty middle seat policy.

Universe: Begun with bang, ending with a whimper

the movement of galaxies and other celestial bodies, the universe is everexpanding. That's fine for now, but eventually, the universe will reach a point where things are so spread out and distant from one another that interactions that generate heat and light will simply no longer be possible, It's called heat death, and it's how many believe the universe will die. One scientist decided to crunch the numbers and theorize when that might happen, with the "death" of the universe being marked by the very last supernova. The theoretical "black dwarf supernova," will be nothing like the massive explosions of stars observed today, but will be more of a fizzle. The research was conducted by Dr. Matt Caplan and was published in Monthly Notices of the Royal Astronomical Society. The "black dwarf" stars won't shine brightly or produce a lot of heat, but fusion will still be occurring deep inside of them, eventually leading to a boiling point and a supernova unlike any that scientists

mass of the sun do not have the gravity or density to produce iron in their cores the way massive stars do, so they can't explode in a supernova right now,"

From what scientists can tell about the movement of galaxies and other elestial bodies, the universe is evertanding. That's fine for now, but the universe will reach a bint where things are so spread out Caplan said in a statement. "As white dwarfs cool down over the next few trillion years, they'll grow dimmer, eventually freeze solid, and become 'black dwarf' stars that no longer shine."

But not all black dwarfs will have

what it takes to blow their top, so to speak. "Only the most massive black dwarfs, about 1.2 to 1.4 times the mass of the sun, will blow," Caplan says. The rest, or about 99% of stars, will remain black dwarfs indefinitely and never reach the point of a supernova.

By that point in time, nobody will be

By that point or a supernova.

By that point in time, nobody will be around to see it, Caplan says. "Galaxies will have dispersed, black holes will have evaporated, and the expansion of the universe will have pulled all remaining objects so far apart that none will ever see any of the others explode. It won't even be physically possible for light to travel that far."

So, when is it going to happen? That's the good news, actually, because the "death" of the universe isn't expected for a very, very long time. The first such black dwarf supernova will happen in 10 to the 1100th years. "In years, it's like saying the word 'trillion' almost a hundred times," Caplan said. "If you wrote it out, it would take up most of a page. It's mind bogglingly far in the future." (BGR)

Sweden records highest ever death tally

Sweden recorded its highest death tally in 150 years for the first half of 2020, according to the country's official statistics office. Between January and June this year, 51,405 deaths were registered more than 6,500 fatalities (or 15%) over the same period in 2019. This is the highest number of deaths in Sweden during the first half of the year since 1869, when the country was struck by famine and 55,431 people died.

The country also experienced the lowest population increase since 2005, with a surplus figure of 6,860 in 2020 that was less than half that of the previous year.

Immigration figures saw a reduction of 34.7% from the same period in 2019, with the figures primarily dropping in the second quarter between April and June.

Unlike most countries, Sweden did not go into a lockdown when the



pandemic spread across Europe in early spring. Instead, there was an emphasis on personal responsibility, with most bars, schools, restaurants and salons remaining open.

Despite the more relaxed approach, only 7.3% of people in Stockholm had developed the antibodies needed to fight the disease by late April – well below the 70-90% needed for herd immunity.

By early June, the country's coro-

navirus death toll was at more than 4,500. According to Johns Hopkins University, it now stands at 5,802.

Much of the criticism around Sweden's response has focused on the high death rates in care homes. Sweden's chief epidemiologist Anders Tegnell admitted in June that the country's Public Health Agency "didn't know that there would be such a big potential for the disease to spread in elderly care homes, with so many deaths."But he told Swedish newspaper Dagens Nyheter: "There are things that we could have done better but in general I think that Sweden has chosen the right way."

In an interview with CNN's Christiane Amanpour in July, Tegnell again defended the country's approach. "I think that we still believe the strategy has served us very well in many different aspects," he said. (CNN/MSN)

'Vaccine should first go to health workers'

Frontline healthcare workers, emergency services personnel and the most vulnerable to the virus should be the first to get any eventual coronavirus vaccine, experts recommend in a new report released Wednesday.

People working to make and distribute the vaccine should also be first in line to get one, the team at the Johns Hopkins Center for Health Security recommends.

"The primary reason for including these candidate groups within Tier 1 is that their prioritization would likely avert the greatest overall harm," the Center's report reads.

According to the World Health Organization, 29 vaccines are in human trials around the world; four of them in the US. Federal government health

officials say they expect to know whether one or more of them works safely by the end of the year and hope to start distribution sometime at the

beginning of next year.

But while companies are already ramping up production in case a vaccine does work, there will not be enough to vaccinate everyone right

"It may take many months before most US residents have access to vaccination; bottle-necks at various stages of the vaccine manufacturing process (eg, supply of vials or syringes, fill and finish process) could cause further delays in vaccine availability," the report reads.

The US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Prac-

tices and the National Academy of Medicine are studying the issue of who should get one first.

The Johns Hopkins team, which included health security experts, vaccine researchers, bioethicists and specialists in patient safety and vaccine access, wanted to inform the discussion. "It is important to emphasize that we are not providing a set of definitive recommendations about who should be prioritized for vaccination," they cautioned. But they said their candidate groups should be given serious consideration.

Even within priority groups, there will have to be rankings. "There will likely not be enough vaccine supply for all members of Tier 1 candidate groups to be offered vaccines concurrently," the report reads.

First in line: "Those most essential in sustaining the ongoing COVID-19 response," they suggested. After that would come those most essential to maintaining "core societal functions," such as

teachers, public transportation workers and food

Also at the front: people most at risk of severe illness or death and their caregivers. It might be more important to vaccinate caregivers, they said, because some at-risk people might not be able to safely get a vaccine, or might not develop a robust immune response.

In the second tier should come health workers not directly involved in the coronavirus response; pharmacy staff; people living far away from health care; electricity, sanitation and other key workers; delivery staff; deployed military; and police.

"Vaccination will not eradicate SARS-CoV-2 from the planet, and COVID-19 is likely to become an endemic disease, even after widespread vaccination, due to the occurrence of sporadic cases and occasional outbreaks," the report cautions.

Joe Biden wins Democratic Presidential ticket

When former Vice President Joseph Biden Jr. became the Democratic Party's official nominee for president on Thursday, he completed two historic and improbable comebacks.

Earlier this year, Biden rose from roadkill status in early February voting to effectively claim the nomination by the end of March.

But 2020 was far from the first time Biden bid for the White House. His nomination realizes the dream of a recurrent campaign first launched more than three decades ago — in another political era, in another century. No other major party nominee has reached this plateau so many years after their first formal candidacy.

Most Åmericans know Biden as the No. 2 who served eight years under Barack Obama. They may know that Biden previously had been a high-profile, six-term senator from Delaware, chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee and then the Foreign Relations Committee.

Fewer may recall that Biden was also a candidate for president in 2008, dropping out after finishing fifth in the Iowa caucuses. Fewer yet remember Biden's brilliant flame-out in 1987, when he was among the early favorites for the 1988 nomination. And few ever knew that Biden flirted with a campaign as far back as 1984 (when he actually received one delegate's vote at the national convention).

Biden was also mentioned as a potential candidate in more recent cycles, notably 2016. As Obama's vice president, Biden might well have been competitive with Hillary Clinton, the eventual nominee. He publicly considered a run in 2015, but stepped back after his son Beau died of cancer in May. He made his announcement in October, but several months later said he regretted not running "every day."

What people do remember is that Biden began the current presidential cycle as the Democrats' putative front-runner, that he stumbled along the way and nearly washed out early. The Real Clear Politics average of polls showed him leading — but not dominating — the field throughout 2019. In a field that at one point teemed with

When former Vice President Joseph Biden more than 20 other hopefuls, Biden's polling became the Democratic Party's official rarely surpassed 30%.

He struggled at times in the debates, caught in the crossfire from rivals — including the one who is now his running mate, Sen. Kamala Harris of California. In the very first debate last year, her jab at Biden's stand on school busing in the 1970s ("That little girl was me") gave her fledgling campaign a bump. It also left a bitter taste with some of Biden's closest advisers that would hinder, but not prevent, her joining the ticket.

As the debates ground on and impeachment proceedings in Washington diverted media attention, Biden struggled to break away from the field. When his main challenger, Sen. Bernie Sanders of Vermont, had a heart attack in October, some Sanders backers gravitated to Sen. Elizabeth Warren of Massachusetts and other candidates, not Biden.

By the end of the Iowa caucuses on Feb. 3, Biden found himself an also-ran, just as in 2008. It was upstart candidate Pete Buttigieg, the former mayor of South Bend, Ind., who shared the winner's circle with Sanders. Biden finished fourth

Sanders and Buttigieg again virtually tied in New Hampshire's primary on Feb. 11. Biden came in fifth, the choice of only one out of every 12 voters.

As Sanders and Buttigieg dueled for delegates, it was Sanders who got the biggest boost in the polls. His rise coincided with his big win in the Feb. 22 Nevada caucuses, where the avowed democratic socialist showed strong appeal among Hispanic voters and got nearly half the votes overall. Media reports were routinely referring to him as the front-runner.

But Biden stayed alive in Nevada, finishing second with 20%. It was enough to carry him to South Carolina and redemption.

How did Biden come back over time to bestride the party with such stature at this moment? Has Biden changed or have the Democrats changed, or is this a different country today?

In varying degrees, all three have changed.

Often seen as garrulous and talkative in his Senate years, Biden has been more subdued in public during the current cycle. He has also seemed sobered by the pandemic and by the portents he sees in the governing mode of President Trump. That matured persona has played well in the current climate, at least among Democrats, large majorities of whom view the COVID-19 crisis as a major concern and share a sense of anxiety and dread about Trump.

The Democratic Party today is younger and less Caucasian than it was when Biden first contemplated a run for president. Biden will be the oldest nominee either party has ever had, and would be the oldest occupant of the White House ever on the day he took the oath. But the younger voters who preferred Sanders did not turn out in significant numbers during the primaries, a fact Sanders himself acknowledged.

And while Biden would seem miscast as the champion of people of color, he wound up bene-

fiting most from their votes, which never coalesced around Harris, or Sen. Cory Booker of New Jersey or Julian Castro of Texas — all of whom dropped out before Iowa.

This is also a more progressive Democratic Party, as shown by the success of Sanders' two campaigns and the popularity of Warren's stands in 2020. Ideologically, Biden has been generally moderate to center-left, and while he has moved toward Sanders and Warren on health care and other issues since becoming the presumptive nominee, big differences remain

In the end, Biden had just enough connection, whether through his often-mentioned association with Obama or his ties to office-holders and other party influencers, to overcome his deficits.

And as the nation's oldest political party gathers in virtual space for its 2020 convention, it is less a celebration of Biden, or Biden-Harris, than it is a concentration of opposition to the incumbent president. If the Obama-Biden ticket saw itself as groundbreaking, the Biden-Harris campaign will cast itself more as a rescue mission. (NPR)

World condemns Mali coup



A colonel in Mali's army says he's now in charge of the West African country, declaring himself chairman of the junta that forced the democratically elected but unpopular president to resign.

Col. Assimi Goita, one of the five mutinous military officers who announced this week's coup on the state broadcaster ORTM, declared himself chairman of the junta now in power.

"By making this intervention, we have put Mali first," Goita said in a broadcast that showed him meeting with the top officials of government ministries and urging them to resume work Thursday.

"Mali is in a sociopolitical and security crisis," he said. "There is no more room for mistakes."

The day before, African and Western leaders had condemned the junta that forced Mali's president from power, warning the coup was a deep setback for the West African nation that could threaten the battle against Islamic extremism.

Soldiers calling themselves the National Committee for the Salvation of the People promised that they would ultimately hand power to a transitional civilian government but gave no timeline. Junta members urged Malians to return to business as usual. Condemnation of the coup was strong and swift from many quarters, reflecting international concern about instability in Mali and West Africa more broadly amid increasing attacks by Islamic extremists and the ensuing economic fallout, which has been among the drivers of illegal migration to Europe.

The African Union suspended Mali from the bloc, and the West African bloc ECOWAS said it would stop all economic, trade and financial flows and transactions between memberstates and Mali.

Former colonizer France, which has worked to stabilise the country since leading a 2013 military operation to oust extremists from power in

the north, called for an immediate return to civilian rule.

Paris, which has more than 5,000 troops stationed across the Sahel region including in Mali, also joined the condemnation with Foreign Minister Jean-Yves Le Drian saying in a statement that France "strongly reaffirms its full attachment to Malian sovereignty and democracy."

The United States urged dialogue. "The US opposes all unconstitutional changes of government whether in the streets or by security forces," tweeted J. Peter Pham, the State Department's special envoy for the Sahel region.

"The priority is to not lose the fight against terrorism," said a French official who spoke on condition of anonymity because he was not authorized to be publicly named according to official policy.

U.N. Secretary-General Antonio Guterres and the Security Council called for the immediate release of Keita, the prime minister and others.

The U.N. is spending \$1.2 billion a year on a more than 15,000-strong peacekeeping mission in the country, and the body's peacekeeping chief Jean Pierre Lacroix told a closed Security Council meeting Wednesday that the force "remains committed to playing its mandated role ... but the country must swiftly regain a measure of institutional stability and

Constitutional order."

Tuesday's developments "represent an enormous setback" after seven years of investment by international partners to address Mali's insecurity and political challenges, said Judd Deverment, the director of the Africa Program at the Center for Strategic and International Studies.

The country "is going to be paralyzed by the political jockeying over the future, and our ability to work with the government and security services is going to be undercut and restrained," he said. "This intermediary period is really dangerous for the region's security."

A day earlier, armed soldiers fired into the air outside President Ibrahim Boubacar Keita's home and took him into their custody. A distressed Keita announced his resignation on television.

Speaking on national broadcaster ORTM just before midnight, a distressed Keita, wearing a mask amid the COVID-19 pandemic, said his resignation — three years before his final term was due to end — was effective immediately. A banner across the bottom of the television screen referred to him as the "outgoing president."

"I wish no blood to be shed to keep me in power," Keita said. "I have decided to step down from office."

He also announced that his government and the National Assembly would be dissolved, certain to further the country's turmoil amid an eight-year Islamic insurgency and the growing coronavirus pandemic.

The soldiers said on Wednesday that "social and political tension has undermined the proper functioning of the country for quite a while".

of the country for quite a while".

In a statement carried overnight on state broadcaster ORTM, the mutinous soldiers identified themselves as the National Committee for the Salvation of the People led by Colonal Major James Word

Colonel-Major Ismael Wagué.
Wagué added: "Real democracy doesn't go with complacency, nor weakness of the state authority which must guarantee freedom and security of the people." The news of Keita's departure was met with jubilation by anti-government demonstrators.

"All the Malian people are tired
— we have had enough," one demonstrator said.

The detention was a dramatic change of fortune for Keita, who seven years earlier emerged from a field of more than two dozen candidates to win Mali's first democratic post-coup election in a landslide with more than 77% of the vote.

Controversy over Australian PM's vaccine comments

With one comment, Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison managed to turn a positive coronavirus story into a public relations disaster, and highlighted the potential next nightmare of the pandemic: a fight over vaccines.

Speaking about a plan to provide free coronavirus immunization to all Australians as soon as that is possible, Morrison said Wednesday that he would "expect it to be as mandatory as you could possibly make it," with some exemptions on medical grounds.

His health minister, Karen Andrews, reiterated that line later, saying the government was "looking at it being a mandatory vaccine." But by Wednesday evening, Morrison was already backtracking, telling radio station 2GB that "it is not going to be compulsory to have the vaccine ... there are no compulsory vaccines in Australia."

"No one is going to force anybody to do anything as a compulsory measure, but we certainly will encourage people to take this up," Morrison said. "Everybody needs to understand what we are trying to achieve here."

Morrison's reversal came after his original comments had been seized on by anti-vaccination groups in Australia and around the world, many of which have long been warning of supposed plans to force a coronavirus jab on people

force a coronavirus jab on people.
On Instagram, Larry Cook, a leading US anti-vaxx campaigner and founder of Stop Mandatory Vaccines, wrote that "Australia is pushing hard for mandatory

Covid vaccination."

"Is anyone surprised? I sure hope not.
This is, after all, a PLAN-Demic," he added, referencing a widely discredited video that went viral on Facebook and other platforms, which included erroneous claims about vaccines.

Ben Garrison, a popular right-wing cartoonist who was invited to the White House by US President Donald Trump, only to be disinvited due to his work's alleged anti-semitism, wrote on Twitter that Morrison's comments should make Americans "beware" the "coming threat of Covid-19 vaccine tyranny."

This is despite assurances earlier this week from the US' top infectious diseases

expert, Dr. Anthony Fauci, that a compulsory coronavirus vaccine remains highly unlikely. "If someone refuses the vaccine in the general public, then there's nothing you can do about that. You cannot force someone to take a vaccine," said Fauci on Tuesday.

While Australian Prime Minister Morrison's comments created something of an open goal for anti-vax campaigners, the scandal does point to the wider issue of "vaccine hesitancy," which the World Health Organization identified last year (before the coronavirus pandemic hit) as one of the top 10 threats to public health around the globe.

"Vaccination is one of the most costeffective ways of avoiding disease – it
currently prevents 2-3 million deaths a
year, and a further 1.5 million could be
avoided if global coverage of vaccinations improved," the WHO states, and
yet vaccine avoidance is on the uptick,
leading to a resurgence of otherwise preventable diseases like measles.

According to the Lancet, anti-vaxx sentiment has been recorded in 90% of countries, and while some anti-vaxers have changed their minds as a result of the coronavirus pandemic, for others, it has only hardened their stance. Many

groups have been campaigning against a potential Covid jab for months, even as scientists warn it is still potentially a year away.

"Covid has been a growth opportunity for anti-vaxxers," the Center for Countering Digital Hate (CCDH), an NGO which works to counter misinformation online, warned in a July report. "The scale and growth of the anti-vaxx movement revealed by our research is particularly concerning given that scientists estimate that 82% of the population would need to become immune to Covid, either through getting the disease or through a vaccine, in order to safely manage outbreaks."

Polling carried out by British market research company YouGov on behalf of the CCDH found that 44% of Americans and 37% of Brits would consider not getting a coronavirus vaccine even if it was available, a similar result to that recorded in a CNN poll in May.

Last week, Michael Caputo, an assistant secretary for the US Department of Health and Human Services, said that "we see more vaccine hesitancy with the Covid vaccine than with other vaccines. We know that. This concerns us, of course."

It should concern everyone. Without an effective coronavirus vaccine, there currently appears to be no other viable way to return to pre-pandemic normality.

There are numerous strong arguments in favor of mandatory vaccination, but tackling coronavirus doesn't necessarily require such a move. In the twentieth century, polio was brought under control thanks to a widespread understanding of the horrors of that disease, not because people had to be forced to take a shot.

But by using the threat or even vague suggestion of a mandate to campaign against a potential coronavirus vaccine, anti-vaxxers are actually making such an order more likely. If vaccine uptake is too low to generate herd immunity, governments may have no choice but to compel vaccination, either by preventing children from attending public schools if they are not immunized, or eventually even by mandating everyone receive the vaccine. (CNN)

Steve Bannon arrested over Wall fundraiser

Former White House chief strategist Steve Bannon was arrested on Thursday after being charged with defrauding hundreds of thousands of donors through his "We Build the Wall" fundraising campaign.

Bannon and three of his associates were indicted by investigators for the Southern District of New York. Prosecutors allege that the group of conservatives defrauded donors, by

raising "more than \$25 million to build a wall along the southern border of the United States," but some of that money was used for personal gain, according to the press release.

The United States Postal Inspection Service assisted in the investigation.

The others mentioned in the indictment are Timothy Shea, a 49-year-old from Colorado, Brian Kolfage, an Iraq war veteran, and Andrew Badolato.

The campaign was intended to raise money to help President Donald Trump fulfill a campaign promise of building a wall along the southern border of the United States. Instead, prosecutors allege, that Bannon and his team profited off of the arrangement.

Prosecutors allege that the defendants "collectively received hundreds of thousands of dollars in donor funds from 'We Build the Wall,' which they

each used in a manner inconsistent with the organization's public representations," according to the indictment.

"The defendants defrauded hundreds of thousands of donors, capitalizing on their interest in funding a border wall to raise millions of dollars, under the false pretense that all of that money would be spent on construction," Acting U.S. Attorney Audrey Strauss said in a statement. (CNBC)

North Korean leader hands over more power to sister

North Korean leader Kim Jong-un has delegated more responsibilities to his aides, including his sister Kim Yo-jong, South Korea's spy agency claims.

Mr. Kim still maintains "absolute authority", but handed various policy areas to others to reduce his stress levels, the spy agency reportedly said.

Ms Kim is now "steering overall state affairs", the National Intelligence Service

However, Seoul's spy agency has been wrong about North Korea in the past.

The claims were reportedly made during a closed-door briefing on Thursday to South Korea's National Assembly.

Lawmakers then discussed the assessment with journalists.

"Kim Jong-un is still maintaining his absolute authority, but some of it has been handed over little by little," the agency was quoted as saying.

Ms Kim now has responsibility for Pyongyang's policy towards the US and South Korea, among other policy issues, and is "the de-facto number two leader," it added, although it stressed that Mr Kim had "not selected a successor."

Mr Kim's decision to delegate was in part to "relieve stress from his reign and avert culpability in the event of policy failure," it said.

However, some analysts have been sceptical of the intelligence, with website NKNews noting that she appeared to have missed two important meetings this month, leading to speculation from some observers that she may have been demot-

She is the younger sister of Kim Jongun and the only one of his siblings considered a close and powerful ally.

Born in 1987, she is four years younger than Mr. Kim. The two of them lived and

studied in Bern, Switzerland, at the same time. Ms Kim first gained international attention in 2018, when she was the first member of the Kim dynasty to visit South Korea. She was part of the delegation to the Winter Olympics, where North and South competed as a joint team.

She also worked alongside her brother at international summits, including his meetings with South Korean President Moon Jae-in, China's Xi Jinping and US President Donald Trump.

There's no doubt Kim Yo-jong is on the rise. Some analysts believe the crisis earlier this year between North and South Korea which saw the inter-Korean liaison office blown to bits was manufactured just to give her a major platform.

She issued her first public statement in March. It was a scathing verbal attack condemning the South. She later noted that she had been given "power author-

ised by the Supreme Leader, our Party and the state".

She also wrote about the potential for a summit between Kim Jong-un and President Trump later this year, insisting that North Korea did not have the "slightest

intention to pose a threat to the US". All of which suggests she may have been given responsibility to influence policies toward the United States and South Korea.

Let's caveat this a little. This does not mean she will succeed her brother as leader of North Korea. She is also not the only one to have been given extra responsibilities. Other aides have been handed some power too.

It is also worth noting that the intelligence briefing specifically states that Kim Jong Un remains in overall control - he is merely delegating. He will still have the final say. (BBC)



School cricket to resume on a new format

The Sri Lanka Schools Cricket Association (SLSCA) is to introduce a new limited overs cricket tournament which is to begin from November this year instead of the regular two day fixtures, to make up for their inability to conclude the under-19 school season due to the outbreak of the Covid-19 pan-

After a written confirmation by the Ministry of Education(MOE) to resume all school's sports activities from November 16, to be conducted only on weekends (Saturday and Sundays), the SLSCA tournament committee after a meeting, opted to draw up a new format to run a limited overs tournament involving only the under-19 age category, instead of the regular two-day format.

They are hoping to start the tournament from mid-November with the participation of over 200 schools island wide. mat to replace the old format. They are scheduled to submit this proposal to the Ministry authorities for their perusal and for the final approval by the end of this month. Earlier SLSCA decided to cancel all cricketing events involving all age groups for this year, including this year's knock out tournament which was halted during the quarter final stage due to the pandemic. The introduction of the new format will involve three divisions 1, 2 and 3 respectively. The division 1 and 2 will consist of 36 schools where each group will

2. The tier 1 and 2 will be further divided into two groups as 1-A, 1-B and 2-A, 2-B respectively, consisting of 16 teams in a group. Each team in this group will play eight matches during the group stage before the top two teams in these groups will play in the semifinals followed by the final as the respective winners will be adjudged champions.

Meanwhile the division 3 will consist of two levels one and two. The Level 1 will accommodate 64 teams slated in eight groups. The top two teams end of the league stage, depending on the outcome

of the points table will qualify for the quarter final stage, which will be followed by the semi-finals and the finals. The winner will be adjudged Champions. The format for the level two in this division is yet to be finalized which according to the SLSCA officials is likely to be a similar format like the other

National Sports Council to play a key role in taking Lankan sports to next level

Former Sri Lankan cricketer Mahela Jayawardena has been appointed as the Chairman of the National Sports Council by Sports Minister, Namal Rajapaksa at a ceremony held at his ministry office yesterday.

Mahela along with 13 others including former sportsmen, women and prominent business leaders are appointed to this committee, which according to him, is pretty confident that they can raise the standard of the sports in Sri Lanka. They will serve for a period of three years from immediate effect.

After the discussion with the President and Prime Minister, the Sports Minister using his powers has appointed this council headed by Mahela Jayawardena. After an invitation extended to them by the Sports

Minister, they gave their willingness to serve in this council for the love of the sports, with a vision of restructuring the sports in the country, while raising them to compete in the international standards. "I intend to build the structure through this council. Unlike the past this council will be a unique one, which will be actively involved to build professional sportsmen. As an initiative, I suggested them that appointment of National selectors should be recommended to them, by their respective bodies, after which I will place my signature to approve it. I will also make sure that in future all teams and squads representing all sports

bodies should be sent to this council unlike in the past. Moreover, I will place my signature on their recommendation only." Said Sports Minister.

He further emphasized that the existing sports law which was established in 1973 has to be amended to develop the sports in this country. Considering all these facts he decided to appoint this council to raise the standard of Sports.

Mahela speaking to the media said that he was happy to be appointed to this council, which was the vision of the minister to raise the standard of the sports in this country. From the grass route level to National level.

Pakistan's 10-year run under threat in final Test

until the closing stages, was followed by a draw in a second Test at Southampton where neither side had a chance of victory in a match blighted by bad weather.

There had been concerns that, as happened to the West Indies' fast bowlers during their 2-1 defeat by England in a preceding behind closed door series that marked international cricket's return from lockdown, Pakistan's quicks would be worn out by three back-toback Tests.

But the lack of action in the second match -- Pakistan had bowled just 43.1 overs in England's first innings when a draw was agreed -should mean a first-choice pace attack of Shaheen Afridi, Mohammad Abbas and Naseem Shah are all fit and firing for Friday's finale at the Ageas Bowl.

Pakistan coach Misbah-ul-Haq was confident fatigue would not have been an issue in any event, with the former captain, in a blog for the Pakistan Cricket Board's website, writing that "fitness has been an important part of

our strategy as a team" since he took charge in September.

Despite little play in the second Test, Misbah was heartened by the determination of Mohammad Rizwan, who top-scored with 72, the resilience of Pakistan's top-order in "testing conditions" and the fact an attack featuring leg-spinner Yasir Shah took four wickets.

Before Irfan came on the scene the tallest fast bowler was JOE GARNER of the



sing public restrooms is always a cause for anxiety - you never know what condition you'll find it in until it's too late. Unless you are in Tokyo that is.

As party of the Japan city's Toilet Project, Pritzker Prize-winning architect Shigeru Ban designed two public toilets that allow the potential user to see through walls and into the state of things inside.

The cubicles in public parks are designed using cheerful colours such as blue and green. They are also completely transparent. Before you scoff at the facilities however, there's something you need to know. Once the bathroom is occupied, the cabin turns opaque – this is not a toilet for a voyeur, simply an innovation to aid the unsusecting.

The loos, constructed in Yoyogi Fukamachi Mini Park and the Haru-no-Ogawa Community Park, have glass-tinted rooms that allow a quick assessment of the facilities and whether they are in use and whatever the intention – hold each user to account, for any littering can immediately spotted by people outside.

There are two things we worry about when entering a public restroom, especially those located at a park," Ban says on the project's website.

The first is cleanliness, and the second is whether anyone is inside," the architect

The custom tyres are made from a mould of each water safety message. The mould creates a rubber tyre sleeve that is wrapped around the Ford Ranger tyre tread and fixed into place permanently.
