The Savings Certificates Ordinance, No. 7 of 1946

WHEREAS a resolution authorising a sum of Rs. 10,000,000 to be borrowed within Ceylon by the issue of savings certificates under the Savings Certificates Ordinance, No. 7 of 1946, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, has been passed by the House of Representatives under section 3 of the Ordinance and has been published in *Gazette* No. 9,938 of January 13, 1949 :

The Notaries Ordinance

REGULATION made by the Minister of Home Affairs and Rural Development under section 8 of the Notaries Ordinance (Chapter 91), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

The First Schedule to the Notaries Ordinance (Chapter 91), is hereby amended by the substitution, for the regulations relating to the "ADMISSION OF ARTICLED CLERKS UNDER SECTION 7", of the following new regulations:—

1. Every person intending to be an articulated clerk with a view to qualifying himself for the office of a notary shall be required to sit for a competitive examination.

2. Every application by a candidate to sit for the examination referred to in regulation 1 shall—

- be sent to the Registrar-General;
- be substantially in the Form set out in the Schedule hereto, which Form shall be in lieu of the Form A set out in the second schedule to the Notaries Ordinance (Chapter 91),
- be accompanied by at least two certificates of character, one of which shall be not more than three months old, and
- be accompanied by the birth certificate of the candidate or such other authentic proof of age as may be acceptable to the Registrar-General.

3. Every application shall be made in the language in which the candidate proposes to practise, and shall be in his own handwriting.

4. No person shall be permitted to sit for the examination, unless he has reached the age of eighteen years on the date of the commencement of the examination.

5. The examination shall be conducted by the Director of Education, who shall send a report to the Registrar-General, setting out the results of the examination in order of merit.

6. (1) On the receipt of the report referred to in regulation 5 from the Director of Education, the Registrar-General shall make inquiries, regarding the character, repute and suitability of such number of the candidates named in the report as he may deem necessary.

(2) The Registrar-General shall, after due consideration of the results of the examination and the information obtained in consequence of the inquiries made under paragraph (1), select the required number of candidates to be articled clerks and grant to each such candidate a licence to become an articled clerk to a proctor of the Supreme Court.

7. Every candidate to whom a licence has been issued shall, within six months of the date of the issue of such licence—

(a) enter into articles of agreement with the proctor named in the licence; and

(b) send a copy of such articles of agreement to the Registrar-General.

8. No person shall be an articled clerk unless he has obtained a licence from the Registrar-General.

9. Every articled clerk shall serve his articles for a term of not less than three years, during which period he shall not follow or be engaged in any other occupation whatsoever save the study of the law and of the business of a notary.

10. If the proctor under whom the articled clerk is serving is not a notary practising in the language in which the clerk proposes to practise, he shall serve for two years as a clerk of such proctor, and for one subsequent year as a clerk in the office of a notary practising in the language in which he intends to practise and shall, in such a case, obtain a fresh licence from the Registrar-General and enter into fresh articles of agreement with the notary named in such licence. A copy of such articles of agreement shall be sent to the Registrar-General.

11. In the event of the proctor to whom any person is articled dying or discontinuing to practise in the district in which he practised when such articles were entered into, or for any other good and sufficient reason, the Registrar-General may permit such articled clerk to transfer his articles to some other proctor, in which case the time during which he shall have served under his original articles shall be reckoned as part of the term of his apprenticeship, notwithstanding such transfer.

12. In proof of service under regulations 9 and 10, the clerk shall, on or before the thirty-first day of March, the thirtieth day of June, the thirtieth day of September, and the thirty-first day of December, in each year, forward to the Registrar-General a certificate in Form B in the second schedule to the Notaries Ordinance (Chapter 91) from the proctor or notary under whom he is serving.

13. Any articled clerk failing to furnish the certificate referred to in regulation 12 shall not be allowed, unless he explains such failure to the satisfaction of the Registrar-General, to count the period during which he shall have so failed as part of the period of his apprenticeship."

REGULATIONS

1. Every application for a permit for carrying out any operations for taking chanks or for taking chanks in any of the areas specified in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall be in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

2. Every application for a permit shall be in duplicate and sent through the post under registered cover or deposited in the tender box of the Ministry of Industries, Industrial Research and Fisheries.

3. Every application for a permit in respect of any chank fishery area shall be accompanied by an application fee of fifty rupees.

4. If an applicant desires permits for carrying out any operations for taking chanks or for taking chanks in more than one fishery area, he shall submit a separate application in respect of every such area.

5. The deposit payable by any person selected by the Director as a person to whom a permit shall be granted in respect of any chank fishery area, shall be the amount specified for that area in column 2 of the First Schedule hereto.

6. The minimum rent payable in respect of any chank fishery area shall be the amount specified for that area in column 3 of the First Schedule hereto.

7. (1) Every permit issued to any person to carry out any operations to take chanks or to take chanks shall be in the form set out in the Third Schedule hereto and subject to the conditions specified therein.

(2) Every permit referred to in paragraph (1) shall be valid for the period specified therein.

8. The Director shall, for the purpose of registration of the vessels used by any permit-holder, keep a book in the form set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.

9. No permit-holder shall take from any chank fishery area a number of chanks exceeding the amount specified for that area in column 4 of the First Schedule hereto; and no permit-holder shall take a number of chanks less than the amount specified for that area in column 5 of that Schedule.

10. If any stock of chanks taken by a permit-holder is found, after a count thereof has been taken, to contain immature chanks in excess of one per centum of the total number of chanks, the permit-holder by or on whose behalf the chanks were taken shall be liable to a penalty calculated at the rate of one hundred rupees for every unit of one per centum of immature chanks in excess of one per centum of the total number of chanks. In the calculation of such penalty, any fraction of a unit, in excess of the last complete unit, shall be counted as one unit.

11. Every permit-holder shall, when he has taken the maximum quantity of chanks which he is authorised to take under the permit issued to him, immediately give notice in writing to the Director that such maximum number of chanks has been taken.

12. No permit-holder shall keep the stocks of chanks taken by him in any place other than his enclosure.

13. No permit-holder shall remove any chanks from his enclosure unless—

(1) the chanks have been inspected by the Director or any officer authorized by him in that behalf;

(2) an application for the removal of the chanks has been made to the Director or any officer authorized by him in the form specified in Part I of the Fifth Schedule hereto; and

(3) the removal of the chanks has been authorised by the Director or such officer by the issue of a licence in the form specified in Part II of the Fifth Schedule hereto.

14. In these regulations, "Director" means the Director of Fisheries
