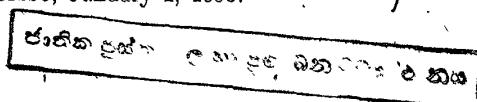

## TENDER FOR THE PRIVILEGE OF RUNNING A GENERAL STORE, &c., IN MANDAPAM CAMP

TENDERS are hereby invited for the privilege of running—

- (1) A general store selling among other things, grocery, oilman stores, shop sundries, piece goods, vegetables, mutton, meat, fish, butter, milk, fowls, eggs, firewood.
- (2) A tailoring establishment.
- (3) A goldsmith shop, and
- (4) A canteen.

exclusively for the camp residents for a period of one, two or three years from February 1, 1950, subject to the following conditions:—

1. The successful tenderer will be allowed to occupy the camp boutiques, rat proof rice store, slaughter house and fish stall on payment of a rental of 6 per cent. of the capital cost of the building per annum.
2. The successful tenderer will be allowed the use of electricity for which he has to pay at the rate of 50 cents per unit. A meter will be fixed for which a rental of rupee one per mensem is payable.
3. The successful tenderer should charge reasonable prices and rates not exceeding 10 per cent. over and above the rates and prices then prevailing in Ramnad markets.
4. The successful tenderer will be allowed the use of fresh water supply in camp for which he will have to pay at the rate of Rupee one per 1,000 gallons. A rental of Rs. 2 per meter per quarter will have to be paid in addition.
5. The successful tenderer should bring inside the camp for sale only those articles which are approved by the Superintendent.
6. The successful tenderer should have a good stock of all articles he is privileged to sell in camp at all times for the convenient purchase by the camp residents.
7. The successful tenderer should supply any article required by the Superintendent, Mandapam Camp, for the camp residents.
8. The appointment of an agent or servants to assist the successful tenderer shall be subject to the approval of the Superintendent and such agent or servants shall continue service in the camp only during the pleasure of the Superintendent, who reserves to himself the right to order one or all of them out of the camp.
9. The successful tenderer and his employees should abide by the camp rules and regulations in force.
  - (i) Each tender should state clearly the amount of privilege fees he is willing to pay to the Ceylon Government monthly.
  - (ii) A deposit of Rs. 50 will be required to be made either at the Treasury or Kachcheri or at the Quarantine Office, Colombo, in case of tenderers in Ceylon and at the

office of the Superintendent, Mandapam Camp, in case of tenderer from South India and the yellow receipt attached to the tender submitted. Any tender without a receipt for Rs. 50 will be rejected.

(iv) Should the successful tenderer decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond or fail to furnish approved security within fifteen days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. #### Posts of Assistant Sanitary Engineers

APPLICATIONS are invited for two permanent and one temporary post of Assistant Sanitary Engineer in the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services. Applications, which should be on a special form obtainable from this office, should reach me on or before the following dates:—

2. Salary, allowance and conditions of service:  
(i) The salary scale attached to the posts at present is as follows:—

Rs. 4,800—360—Rs. 7,680; Rs. 8,040—360 and 480—  
Rs. 10,800 per annum.

(ii) Candidates possessing the full A.M.I.C.E. qualification will be considered for appointment on the following salary scale:—Rs. 4,800—360—Rs. 7,680; 8,040—360 and 480—Rs. 12,720 per annum.

Candidates who have passed Sections 'A' and 'B' of the A.M.I.C.E. Examination or possess exempting qualifications therefrom will be designated Junior Assistant Sanitary Engineers and placed on the following salary scale until they obtain the full A.M.I.C.E. qualification:—Rs. 3,000—360—Rs. 4,080.

(iii) Rent allowance and temporary cost of living allowance are payable according to Government Regulations.

(iv) The appointments will be subject to the Public Service Commission Rules, the Financial Regulations, the Administrative Regulations, Departmental Orders and any other orders and regulations which may be issued from time to time by the Government.

#### 3. Terms of Engagement:

(i) *Permanent Posts.*—Two posts are permanent and pensionable. Appointment to these posts will in the first instance be on probation for a period of two years. The selected candidates will be required to contribute

4 per cent. of their salaries to the Widows' and Orphans' Pension Fund. They may be discontinued at any time during the period of probation, if they are considered by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services to be unsuitable for further employment.

(ii) *Temporary Post.*—The third post is temporary and non-pensionable. Appointment to this post will be terminable at one month's notice on either side. The selected candidate will be required to contribute 5 per cent. of his salary to the Public Service Provident Fund and will be eligible to contribute, at his option, a further 5 per cent. The Government contribution, in either case, will be equal to  $7\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. of the salary paid in to his credit at the close of each financial year.

(iii) The selected candidates will be required to take up duties at short notice, and will be liable to serve in any part of the Island.

4. *Qualifications required:* Every applicant must furnish satisfactory proof that he—

- (a) is a citizen of Ceylon as prescribed in the Ceylon Citizenship Act, No. 18 of 1948;
- (b) is not less than 24 years and not more than 35 years of age on February 3, 1950;
- (c) is of excellent moral character and physically sound;
- (d) is an Associate Member of the Institute of Civil Engineers, or has passed sections 'A' and 'B' of the A M I C E Examination.

5. (i) Officers in the Sanitary Engineers Division of the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services, who are qualified under paragraph 4 above, may apply, provided they obtain the permission of the Heads of their Departments to do so. Applications from other persons (including probationers) holding permanent and pensionable posts in the Public Service will *not* be entertained.

(ii) Applications forwarded through Heads of Departments and received in this office after the prescribed date will not be entertained, *unless* the applications were received by the Head of Department before the prescribed date and the Head of Department concerned recommends acceptance, adducing valid reasons for the delay.
