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Notices Calling for Tenders

TENDER FOR THE TRANSPORT OF RICE FROM WELIGAMA RAILWAY STATION TO WELIGAMA RICE STORES

TENDERS are hereby invited for the transport of rice, &c., from the Weligama Railway Station to the Weligama Rice Stores.

2. All tenders should be sealed under one cover, and addressed to the Chairman, Local Tender Board, Kachcheri, Matara.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the Kachcheri, Matara, or sent through the post under registered cover.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Weligama Rice Transport" in the left hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the Chairman, Local Tender Board, Kachcheri, Matara, not later than 12 noon on Tuesday, January 24, 1950.

5. Quotations should be made separately in respect of the following—

- (a) rate of transport per ton from the Weligama Railway Station to the Weligama Government Rice Stores;
- (b) rate per ton for loading into lorry or cart at the Railway Station and unloading and stacking at the Rice Stores.

6. Transport should be by lorry or cart and the tenderers should state the number of vehicles available for the purpose. They should be in a position to execute the contract with the transport at their disposal. They should not tender in the expectation that the Commissioner for Motor Transport will allow applications for route licences for new lorries on the ground that they hold a Government contract.

7. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

8. A deposit of rupees ten (Rs 10) will be required to be made at the Matara Kachcheri and a receipt produced for the same duly attached to the tender. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract, and bond, or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

9. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of security required will be rupees two hundred (Rs. 200). All other necessary information can be ascertained upon application at the Matara Kachcheri.

10. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

11. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

12. No contract may be assigned or sub-let without the authority of the Deputy Food Controller, Matara. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of Attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorising him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

13. The Deputy Food Controller, Matara, may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

14. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract should give his full name and permanent address stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests.

15. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Deputy Food Controller acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office, and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.
