INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES FOR CADETSHIPS PRIOR TO COMMISSIONING AS SECOND-LIEUTENANTS IN THE CEYLON ARMY

SIX vacancies are now offered for Cadetships prior to Commissioning in the rank of Second-Lieutenant in the Ceylon Army.

2. Applicants for Cadetships will be required to fulfil the conditions set out in paragraph 4 below. A preliminary selection will be made from applications received from those who fulfil these conditions, and a

final selection will be made after interview of these selected candidates by a Selection Board appointed by the Minister of Defence.

3. The following is the procedure which will be adopted and the rules which will apply in respect of those candidates who are selected for the existing vacancies.—

- (a) Candidates will be enlisted as Cadets in the Ceylon Army on a normal regular engagement for a period of five years with the Colours and seven years with the Reserve;
- (b) On enlistment, selected candidates will be required to undergo such training in Ceylon as may be prescribed by the Commander of the Army;
- (c) On successful completion of the training referred to in para. (b) above, Cadets will be sent at Government expense to the United Kingdom where they will undergo a short period of training with the British Army, commencing on July 15, 1950, before being admitted to the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, for a course of training of 18 months, commencing in August, 1950;
- (d) During the period of training at Sandhurst, all tuition and maintenance fees for which will be paid by the Ceylon Government, the status of Cadets will be that of other ranks and they will be subject to Military Law. Their basic rate of pay while under training in the United Kingdom will be that of a One Star soldier of the British Army (i.e., 5s. per diem) on first enlistment and that of a Three Star soldier of the British Army (i.e. 6s. 6d per diem) on completion of 12 months service. No cost of living allowance is payable. All expenses such as pocket money, maintenance during compulsory leave periods between terms at Sandhurst, the cost of civilian clothes which may be worn when off duty, etc., will be the responsibility of the parents or guardian of the individual cadet. Such expenses should be about Rs. 2,000 per annum for the period during which the Cadet is away from Ceylon;
- (e) (i) In the event of a Cadet voluntarily terminating his candidature for a Commission during his course at Sandhurst, the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on account of such Cadet. Such Cadet will also be required to return to Ceylon at his own expense;
- (ii) If at any time during his course, a Cadet is reported on by the authorities at Sandhurst as being unsuitable, for reasons of misconduct, or due to causes within his own control, for the issue of a Commission, his parents or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred on his account by the Ceylon Government;
- (f) Parents or guardians will sign declarations as given in paragraph 10 below in respect of sub-paragraphs (d) and (e) above and forward them together with the application. Parents or guardians of selected candidates will be required to enter into a Bond substantially in this form with the Ceylon Government prior to the appointment of these candidates;
- (g) After successful completion of the period of training at Sandhurst, Cadets will return to Ceylon at Government expense and will thereupon be Commissioned as Second-Lieutenants in an arm of the service of the Ceylon Army according to their aptitude and the needs of the Army at that time. On appointments to commissions Cadets will be discharged from the Regular Army engagement into which they entered as "Other Ranks". Officers will be expected to serve in the Army for a minimum period of 5 years after commissioning. The prospects and conditions of pay and service for officers of the Ceylon Army are as published in the *Government Gazette* and reproduced in the Press.

4 The conditions under which candidates may be accepted for cadetships are as follows:—

- (a) *Nationality*—Candidates must be citizens of Ceylon;
- (b) *Age*—Candidates must not be less than 19 years but not more than 21 years of age on July 1, 1950;
- (c) *Education*—Candidates must have passed the Senior School Certificate Examination (English). Preference in selection will be given to those candidates who have passed such examination with not less than five credits (including English and Elementary Mathematics) and a pass in Sinhalese or Tamil;
- (d) *Status*—A candidate must be unmarried. No Cadet will be permitted to marry while at the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst;
- (e) *Medical Standard*—A candidate must conform to the required medical standard. All candidates selected for interview by the Selection Board will be medically examined under Ceylon Army arrangements at the time of the interview.

5. Applications for commissions will be submitted in writing on a copy of the form given in paragraph 8 below, and will be forwarded to the Ministry of Defence and External Affairs, Colombo, to reach there not later than March 27, 1950. The envelope in which the application is forwarded will be marked "APPLICATION FOR ARMY CADETS".

6. Applications will be accompanied by two certificates of character, one of which shall be originated by a responsible person of mature age who has known the applicant for the past one year in private life, and the other from the Principal of the last school attended.

SCHEDULE II

Candidates for appointment as pupil midwives will be selected on the results of a competitive examination, which will be of the Junior School Certificate Examination standard in English, Sinhalese or Tamil. The examination will be held at the following centres on June 3, 1950:—

Colombo, Galle, Gampaha, Jaffna, Kalutara, Kandy, Negombo, Panadure, Ratnapura, Kurunegala and Veyangoda. If, however, the number of candidates entered for any of these centres is less than 50, such centre or centres will be cancelled and the candidates concerned will be entered for the nearest centre according to the private address stated in the entry form.
