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Notices Calling for Tenders

FOREST DEPARTMENT

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of logs from Crown Forests, as detailed in the Schedule annexed. It should be clearly understood that tenders required are for contracts to supply specified quantities of logs from each area, and not for the exclusive right of exploitation of the area. Tenderers should quote a rate per cubic foot (felling, logging, transporting and delivery) of logs stacked at (1) Wayside Depot and (2) Central Conversion Depot indicated in the Schedule. Where two or more Central Conversion Depots are indicated against an area or areas, separate rates should be quoted for delivery at each depot.

2. Tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Agriculture and Lands, P. O. Box 500, Colombo. A tenderer when applying for tender forms should indicate to the officer issuing tender forms the name and number of area or areas in which he is interested.

3. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Supply of Logs" in the left-hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the Ministry, not later than midday, on Tuesday, April 25, 1950. Each area shown in the annexed Schedule should be tendered for separately. Tender forms will be issued up to 3 p.m. on Friday, April 21, 1950, only.

4. Tenders should either be deposited in the Tender Box in the Ministry, Room No. 352, Third Floor, Galle Face, Secretariat, Colombo, or be sent through the post, preferably under registered cover.

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at any of the Divisional Forest Offices in Colombo, Galle, Trincomalee, Batticaloa, Kurunegala and Nuwara Eliya or the Head Office, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Rates should be quoted both in figures and words. Where the amount given in figures differs from the amount in words or no amount is stated in words, the tender will be rejected.

6. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

7. A deposit of Rs. 50 must be made for every tender form either in the Office of the Conservator of Forests or in a Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. In the case of deposits with the Conservator of Forests they should be paid into No. 1 Account, Conservator of Forests, at the Imperial Bank, Colombo, and the bank receipts produced for the issue of the departmental receipts. If a person to whom a tender form has been issued fails, for no satisfactory reason, to submit his tender within the time fixed in condition 3 above, his tender form deposit of Rs. 50 will be liable to be forfeited at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.

8! A tenderer who has carried out contracts with the Department, but not in the Division or Districts concerned in the notice calling for tenders, should state in which Division or District or Divisions or Districts he has held contracts.

No tender form will be issued to any person or on behalf of any person whose name appears in the list of defaulting contractors. No tender form will be issued to a person on behalf of another as applications for tender forms should be made in person by each tenderer. No tender forms will also be issued to any person who is directly or indirectly having any concern with private timber depots or Central Conversion Depots. If proved to the satisfaction of the Conservator

of Forests after entering into agreement, that such person is having any interest with any of the above depots, action will be taken against him to terminate the Agreement forthwith and matters represented to the Tender Board for necessary action in terms of Conditions 12 below.

9. Tenderers should make their own arrangements for transport and should state in their tenders the number of vehicles they already possess, tonnage and routes licensed for.

10. No tenderer will be awarded more than one area from results of this tender. The selection of such areas will be at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests, whose decision will be final and binding on the successful tenderer.

11. No tender will be considered unless the conditions laid down have been complied with.

The Government reserves to itself the right without question to reject any or all offers and to accept any portion of an offer. No offers will be entertained from persons whose names are on the list of defaulting contractors.

12. The successful tenderer for each area shall within such time, as may be fixed by the Conservator of Forests, of being informed in writing that his tender has been accepted, enter into the necessary contract, supplying at his own cost a stamp of the required value to be affixed to the contract and depositing as security $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the value of the contract. Should he fail to comply with these requirements his tender form deposit may be forfeited to the Crown; he may render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract in future, and to make good any resultant loss. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left, at the address given by the tenderer. All tender form deposits will be returned upon signature of the contracts.

13. The contract shall be entered into by the successful tenderer (hereinafter called the contractor) with the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction the area of operation lies, acting for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

14. The contract may not be assigned or sub-let without the authority of the Tender Board. The Tender Board reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by the Contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contractor's behalf.

15. The contractor shall not employ any person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors. The Divisional Forest Officer may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

16. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for.

The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for, will be made a condition of the contract, and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances the Conservator of Forests may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Treasury. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence will be deemed a breach of contract.

The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include all persons born in Ceylon and no others.

17. Special rules for felling and removal of material which are to be observed by the contractor are more fully outlined in the Special Conditions given below. Nothing in these Special Conditions will exempt the contractor from liability under the Forest Ordinance (Cap. 311), should he be responsible for the commission of a forest offence.

Any contractor who personally or through the actions of his agents or workmen becomes responsible for any offence against the provisions of the Forest Ordinance (Cap. 311), or for the contravention of any of the conditions of this contract on more than one occasion during the currency of his contract will be liable to have his name included in the list of persons who are debarred from holding Government contracts.

18. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Cap. 117.)

19. The payment to which the contractor may render himself liable under the contract may be deducted by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned from all moneys then due or that may become due to the contractor under this or any other contract he may hold under Government, and/or from the security deposited by the contractor and hypothecated to the Crown, or be recovered from him by action at law.

20. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting the contractor's employees and of rescinding the contract if the above conditions are not adhered to.

21. In case of any disagreement arising between the parties to the contract except where the right of final decision is reserved to the Conservator of Forests, it shall be referred to the Tender Board whose decision in every such case shall be final and binding on the parties to the contract.

22. The contract shall be current for a period of one year from date it is signed. Extension of time will not be granted under any circumstances.

23. "All temporary lines built for housing shall conform to the schedule of requirements and standards of temporary lines laid down by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services and the contractor shall maintain the lines in a sanitary condition during the period of his contract. He shall carry out all the instructions issued to him by the departmental officers relating to repairs, maintenance, water supply, disposal of refuse, latrine accommodation, &c., of any building erected by him for the accommodation of his staff."

24. No lorry over $1\frac{1}{2}$ tons can be used on a road not specifically included in the P. W. D. road schedule. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim by or in respect of any damage caused to roads by misuse and negligent handling of timber.

25. Contractors using Forest Department roads must leave them at the end of the contract periods in the same condition in which they took them over. As security that they will carry out this condition, a sum of Rs. 300 per mile will have to be deposited with the Conservator of Forests. This security will be released on production of a certificate from the Divisional Forest Officer concerned. Contractors should also abide by the rules and regulations governing the use of lorries on P.W.D., D.R.C., V.C., Irrigation Roads, &c. and for the use of such roads the question of damages payable by the contractors will have to be settled before use of these roads.

26. For any further information, application should be made to the officer issuing tender forms.

Special Conditions

1. The minimum quantity required to be supplied from each area is 3,000 cubic feet of logs of the species and specifications hereinafter stipulated in condition 12.

Incidental to the main supply of logs it may become necessary for the Divisional Forest Officer concerned to obtain supplies of (a) Cleaned Ebony, (b) round wood of hard-wood species suitable for sawing (i.e., branchwood, lop and top over 4 ft. in length and $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. or over in girth, (c) firewood, and (d) poles; and in such an event the contractor will be allowed to deliver such requirements at such rates as may be decided by the Divisional Forest Officer with the prior approval of the Conservator of Forests in each case.

2. Sufficient trees will be made available for felling, conversion and delivery of the specified quantities of logs, &c. from each area. Any quantities of logs delivered by the contractor in excess of the minimum will be accepted and paid for, provided such excess material is up to specifications required.

Prospective tenderers are advised to inspect the area personally and satisfy themselves as to the lie of the area, the quantity the area would yield, &c., as representations made later will not be considered under any circumstances. A sketch of the area will be available for inspection at the respective Divisional Forest Offices.

3. (a) Only trees marked by the Forest Department for felling shall be felled. Control of such fellings and the compartments in which such fellings shall take place will be at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer and he may issue directions from time to time as regards felling.

(b) Climbers on trees to be felled, interfering with other growth, should be cut according to directions of a Forest Officer prior to felling of such trees.

(c) Should the contractor or any of his agents or workmen be responsible for the felling or damaging of any trees not marked for felling, the contractor shall be liable to pay a fine not exceeding double royalty for each tree so felled or damaged. If the contractor persists in such unauthorized fellings and/or does unnecessary damage to regeneration and the forest crop he shall be liable to have his agreement terminated.

4. Lopping of branches and top ends from trees into logs may take place at the site where trees are felled. Logs shall not be removed from the felling site until they are stamped by a Forest Officer with such distinctive hammer marks as are approved for the area.

The removal of material from the forest to the delivery point shall be covered by removal permits or cart-notes issued by the Range Forest Officer in charge of the forest. The contractor shall be responsible for the safety of the material whether at felling site, or in transit or at delivery point, and the contractor shall make good the value of any timber lost or damaged.

5. The contractor shall effect the first delivery not later than one month from the date of his signing the agreement. In the case of delay the Conservator of Forests shall be entitled to recover from the contractor as liquidated damages a sum of Rs. 50 for every month or part of a month of such delay until the first delivery is made. Subsequent deliveries which must be evenly distributed for the remainder of the contract period should be at intervals of not longer duration than one month and in the case of default the Conservator of Forests shall be entitled to recover from the contractor as liquidated damages a sum of Rs. 100 for each month's delay. All fellings must be stopped before two months of expiry date of contract to admit transport of felled material to the delivery point before the date of expiry of the contract.

6. The contractor shall at his own cost and charges furnish labour, transport, implements, tools and any material whatsoever required for carrying on the work under the contract. He shall also supply labour, tools, &c., for enumerating trees, demarcating boundaries and for any other work connected with the contract deemed necessary by the Divisional Forest Officer.

7. If at any time during the progress of the said work the Divisional Forest Officer shall consider any part or parts of the said work to have been carelessly or imperfectly executed or if any unnecessary damage shall be caused to the forest by the contractor or by any of his servants or workmen, then and in every such case the contractor shall cause all the works which shall be so carelessly or imperfectly executed to be executed properly at his own cost, and shall pay to the Divisional Forest Officer such sum as the Divisional Forest Officer shall assess in respect of the damage caused to the forest. In the event of the contractor neglecting for seven days after notice in writing given to him by the Divisional Forest Officer to execute properly at his own cost the work carelessly or imperfectly done by him, it shall be lawful for the Divisional Forest Officer to do and perform the same in the stead of the contractor, but at the contractor's cost and risk, and to deduct and repay himself the full amount of such cost of moneys which otherwise would be payable by him to the contractor. Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent the contractor or any of his servants or workmen from being criminally prosecuted for any offence against the Forest Ordinance, the Ceylon Penal Code, or the law applicable to the case.

8. If the contractor shall fail to make fair and reasonable progress towards completing the work within the time hereinbefore specified, it shall be lawful for the Divisional Forest Officer (if it shall appear to him expedient to do so), to take the work into his own hands, after giving one week's notice in writing to the contractor that the said work will be completed by the Divisional Forest Officer, and thereupon to employ sufficient workmen, overseers and materials to furnish and complete the same; and the contractor shall be liable to pay and make good such sum or sums of money, if any, as may be spent by the Divisional Forest Officer in the completion as aforesaid of the said work over and above what may have been payable to the contractor or if he had completed the work within the time specified.

9. The contractor shall not in any manner do, cause, or procure to be done any act, matter, or thing whatsoever to delay or impede the completion of the said work by the Divisional Forest Officer under preceding condition (7), or to obstruct the person or persons so employed by the Divisional Forest Officer or to prevent them from using the plant, implement, tools, wire-shoots, and other materials which shall have been or shall be provided for the execution of the said work; and shall not in any way molest or cause to be molested the Divisional Forest Officer or any person or persons employed by him.

10. The contractor or his agents, whose names shall be given to the Divisional Forest Officer and the Range Forest Officer in charge of the work, in writing at the commencement of work under the contract, and who shall hold a written authority from the contractor, shall at all times, and without fail, be at the working centres to supervise and control workmen and to take orders from inspecting Forest Officers. Should this condition not be complied with, the inspecting officers shall have the power to eject such workmen.

Further the Divisional Forest Officer shall have the power to reject without question any of the contractor's agents or employees. The contractor will be at liberty to change his agents provided the changes are duly communicated to the Divisional Forest Officer and the Range Forest Officer in writing and provided that each new agent holds a written authority from the contractor to act on his behalf.

11. The contractors shall before commencement of work in areas advertised, should first complete remaining work in adjacent areas worked previously.

12. Damages not exceeding Rs. 100 for any breach of the conditions or for any delinquencies on the part of the contractor in carrying out this contract may be recovered from the contractor with the approval of the Conservator of Forests whose decision shall be final.

13. Logs shall be converted from Satin, Palu, Milla, Ranai, Hulanhik, Halmilla, Mi, Kumbuk, Suriyamara, Dawu and also from such other species as may be acceptable from time to time as required by the Divisional Forest Officer. The absolute minimum dimensions of the logs should be 3 feet mid-girth under bark and 9 feet in length. It should be noted that these are only minimum dimensions and that all logs should be as long as possible and of as large girths as available. All logs of sleeper species which are suitable for conversion of sleepers shall be cross cut into sleeper lengths before removal to Central Conversion Depot is permitted.

All Satin logs should be trimmed and barked. Logs of Satin should be carefully barked as soon as they are felled. Logs of other species should be carefully barked up to width of 8 in. at the centre. Logs should be straight and sound and should be free from knots and all forms of decay and other defects. Logs that do not conform to the above specifications will be rejected.

14. Payment will be made only on accepted quantity and measurements. No payments will be made for rejections which will be disposed by public auction from time to time.

15. Firewood : (vide Special I (b) where firewood may be required supplies should be as per following conditions :—

- (a) Only trees which are not of accepted timber species should be felled for firewood but trees which emit a milky exudation such as Picus species, Kaduru, Lunumidella, Rukkattana, Kapu, Kottan, Erabadu, Dadap, Etdemata, Kekuna, Amba, Gedumba, Walkaduru, Imbul, Del, and Pulun shall not be felled for conversion of firewood ;
- (b) Firewood shall be cut and split into billets 3 ft. in length and not less than 2 in. or more than 9 in. diameter. Firewood shall be stacked leaving sufficient space between the stacks for inspecting officers to walk round each stack. Stacks should be either 3 ft., 4½ ft. or 6 ft. in height ;
- (c) The contractor will be liable to pay a sum of Rs. 25 as liquidated damages to the Conservator of Forests should a check stack in re-stacking show a decrease of over 10 per cent.

16. All notices to be served on the contractor shall be deemed to have been served if given to him or his agent personally or left at the address given in the tender.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE LIONEL WENDT MEMORIAL FUND FOR THE YEAR ENDED SEPTEMBER 30, 1949

Meetings:—Five meetings were held during the year.

Incorporation:—On July 7, 1949, the Fund was incorporated by the Minister of Justice under section 114 of the Trust Ordinance as a Charitable Trust. The Order of Incorporation was published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* of the 15th of that month. Literature setting out the Order of Incorporation, the objects of the Fund, the regulations governing the Trustees in administering the Fund and the application for incorporation have been printed and copies can be obtained from the Secretary on application.

Publication of Photographs by Lionel Wendt:—In March, 1949, the Trustees entered into an agreement with Messrs. Lincoln Prager (Publishers), Ltd., of London, relating to the publication in book form of certain of the photographs taken by Lionel Wendt. Messrs. Lincoln Prager (Publishers), Ltd., have agreed to publish 3,000 copies of the book of photographs for distribution throughout the world. The cost of publication is £3,150 and the publishing firm will bear 50 per cent. of this cost. The Trustees have agreed to purchase from Lincoln Prager (Publishers), Ltd., 1,500 copies of the book at a cost of £1,575 with sole selling rights for Ceylon, India and Pakistan. Mr. Harold Pieris has agreed to purchase these 1,500 copies from the Trustees at cost. The Trustees later agreed to Messrs. Lincoln Prager (Publishers), Ltd., publishing a further 2,000 copies of the first edition and in respect thereof will receive from that firm a royalty of 10 per cent. on each copy sold. Further editions of the book in terms of the agreement will be on account of Messrs. Lincoln Prager (Publishers), Ltd., who will pay to the Trustees 10 per cent. in respect of the second edition and $\frac{7}{8}$ per cent. in respect of further editions of the nett selling price of each copy sold.

It is expected that the book will be available in March, 1950. Lincoln Prager describes the photographs as being "unique" and states that experts in London are very appreciative.

Memorial Building:—In compliance with the views of contributors to the Fund the Trustees have decided to erect the theatre section of the Memorial Building consisting of the stage, auditorium, orchestral pit, dressing rooms and corridor, men and women's lavatories, drainage and water service, and have entrusted the work to Mr. K. Milan Perera, builder and contractor, under the supervision of Messrs. Billimoria & de Silva, Pieris & Panditaratne, Architects. The contractors' estimate for this work, which has been accepted, is Rs. 122,828 28. It is expected that the work on the theatre section will shortly be started and the Trustees have appealed to Government for State assistance to enable them to undertake the construction of the remainder of the Memorial Building. On September 28, 1949, Mr. Harold Pieris gifted to the Fund the property, and premises, 18, Guildford Crescent, the residence of Lionel Wendt on which the memorial building will be erected. This building houses Lionel Wendt's personal collection of paintings, photographs and books and has been regularly used for concerts and exhibitions. This gift was accepted by the Trustees on November 4, 1949.

Accounts:—The Accounts of the Trust for the year under review have been audited by Messrs. Satchinanda, Schokman & de Silva and the Income and Expenditure Account and the Balance Sheet as at September 30, 1949, are attached. The balance at

credit is Rs. 153,945.35. Receipts during the year amounted to Rs. 5,137.79 of which Rs. 2,774.99 represents interest from investments; Rs. 1,295.70 contributions to the fund and the balance income from 18, Guildford Crescent. Expenditure for the year. it will be observed, amounted to Rs. 3,819.78 which makes net receipts over expenditure Rs. 1,318.01.
