"Improvements in machines for hoeing and like ground cultivating operations"

*Abstract.*—The invention relates to machines used for hoeing and ground cultivating operations. A power-driven ground cultivating machine in which the cultivating implements can be made to move backwards, forwards and up and down and in which width adjusting means are provided for varying the width of the ground strip acted on by the implements as the machine advances. The machine is adapted for rapid cultivation of row crops by an operator who walks behind the machine normally in that adjacent gap which has not been worked.

"Improvement to tea driers"

*Abstract.*—The inventor describes and claims a tea drier in which the hot air passes over the blank trays of the two bottom rows and through the perforations of the upper rows. Scrapers are also fitted to the bottom rows of trays at intervals to sweep the small particles which are deposited on the floor of the machine.

The inventor states that the provision of blank trays minimizes the fall of dust to the bottom and prevents "greying". The moisture abstracted from the leaf is small on the bottom run and is effected by temperature and not so much by the quantity of air circulating. The scrapers fit round the trays and drop a second after the tray drops.

"Combined Respreaders and Air Seals for Tea Driers"

*Abstract*—Rotary air seals are used in tea drying machines to minimize the escape of air at the feed hoppers, end. Rotary spreaders are used to spread the leaf evenly at this end. In this invention the spreader and seal are combined in one unit. The spreader moves in a semi-circular cowl which forms a seal. Provision is made for adjusting the spreader and cowl together.

In the internal spreaders similarly a semi-circular cowl co-operating with a baffle and surrounding the spreader makes an air seal. Spreader and cowl are raised and lowered together for adjustment.
