Minutes of the Eleventh General Meeting of the Municipal Council, Nuwara Eliya, held on November 7, 1949, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated November 2, 1949

Present.—J. J. Kanagaretnam, Esq. (Mayor) presiding, Messrs. H. R. Hyde, W. P. A. de Silva, R. A. Perera, P. K. A. Vergheese, E. D. Taylor, D. Abraham Singho, the Commissioner and the Accountant.

1. To confirm minutes of the Tenth General Meeting held on October 10, 1949, and of the Special Meeting held on October 27, 1949—

(a) There being no amendments the minutes of the Special Meeting of October 27, 1949, were taken as read and confirmed.

(b) The minutes of the Tenth General Meeting of October 10, 1949, were taken as read and confirmed subject to the following amendments:—

(i) Delete the minutes *re* item 7 (b) referred to in item 12 (a) and substitute therefor—

“Item 7 (b) was adopted subject to the amendment that Overseers, Ratnayake and Majeed, be recommended to the Special Committee on salaries to be placed on a permanent and monthly-paid basis”.

(ii) Delete the minutes *re* items 5 & 6 referred to in item 12 (c) and substitute therefor—

“*Re* items 5 & 6, it was resolved that pending the sanction by the Local Government Service Commission of the payment of the Car Allowances the Cashier and the Revenue Inspector be paid the advances applied for”.

2. To consider letter No. A. 452 of October 12, 1949, from Commissioner of Local Government in reply to Council's request to reduce the area of jurisdiction of the Medical Officer of Health.—Resolved to note and await a further communication.

3. To record the acceptance of the tender of N. Velupillai for Rs. 2,000 for the construction of Retaining Wall, New Labourers' Lines, Hawa Eliya.—Resolved to record that Contractor N. Velupillai was authorized to carry out the work at the Superintendent of Works's estimated cost of Rs. 2,000.

Mr. S. K. Sivalingam, Deputy Mayor, arrived at this stage.

4. To consider Mudaliyar A. C. G. S. Amarasekara's designs for the Mayor's chain and the Council's crest.—It was resolved to point out to Mudaliyar Amarasekera that in the opinion of Council the sun in the crest should be smaller and the lake and the forests should also be depicted. As regards the chain the pattern drawn by Messrs. Punchi Singho Bros. was accepted. It was also resolved that a Sub-Committee consisting of the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor and Mr. P. K. A. Vergheese be authorized to decide on the final form of the crest and chain.

5. The Mayor to move:—“That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider recommendations of the following Standing Committees:—

(a) Works Committee of November 2, 1949.

(b) Law and Sanitation Committee of November 1, 1949.

(c) Finance Committee of November 4, 1949

Mr. S. K. Sivalingam seconded.—Carried

Council in Committee

(a) The recommendations of the Works Committee of November 2, 1949, *re* items 2, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 & 14 were adopted.

Item 1—Resolved to invite the Water Supply Expert to Nuwara Eliya for a discussion on the subject

Item 5—Resolved to accept the recommendation. It was further resolved that plans *re* the Middle Class Housing Scheme be circulated among the Members for their information.

Item 6—Resolved to call for an estimate from the Electrical Engineer for the installation of the lights. It was also resolved to consult the Assistant Superintendent of Police as regards the removal of the 4 triangles at the junction.

Item 12—Resolved to reject the Committee's recommendation and to adopt the old system.

Item 13—Resolved that the suggested improvements be carried out without exceeding the budgetted provision.

(b) The recommendations of the Law and Sanitation Committee of November 1, 1949, *re* items 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9 (a), 9 (b), 9 (c) and 9 (d) were adopted.

Item 2—Resolved to inquire from the Ceylon Turf Club whether the canteen run at the Race Course is a private one meant for the use of its employees only or whether it is a public tea kiosk.

(c) The recommendations of the Finance Committee of November 4, 1949, were adopted.

6. The Mayor moved in Committee:—“That the Council do resume” Mr. S. K. Sivalingam seconded. Carried.

7. The Council resuming the Mayor moved:—“That the resolutions of Council in Committee and the recommendations of the Standing Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee be adopted.” Mr. S. K. Sivalingam seconded.—Carried.

8. The Mayor tabled a statement of Receipts and Disbursements for October, 1949.

Minutes of the Meeting of the Works Committee held on November 2, 1949, at 10 a.m.

Present—D. Abraham Singho Esq. (Chairman), presiding; Messrs. H. R. Hyde, P. K. A. Vergheese, W. P. A. de Silva, R. A. Perera, M. Arokiasamy, the Commissioner, the Accountant and the Superintendent of Works

1. To consider the Water Supply Expert's letter *re* the water supply of this town.—Recommended that a deputation from the Council should interview the Commissioner of Local Government with a view to explaining to him the impracticability of complying with the Water Expert's request.

2. To consider Assistant Town Planner's report about the tenements already constructed in the Slum Clearance Scheme, Hawa Eliya.—Recommended to forward a copy of Assistant Town Planner's report to the Contractor and call for his explanation in the first instance.

3. To consider the Assistant Town Planner's letter *re* the fixing of wooden doors and windows for the Middle Class Housing Scheme, Kelegala.—Recommended to invite Messrs. Critall & Co. to send a representative so that full details *re* steel windows may be obtained.

4. To consider Resident Engineer's letter *re* the renting out of a room in the 3rd set of tenements in the Hawa Eliya Housing Scheme.—Recommended to inquire from the Resident Engineer whether a room in one of Mr. D. L. Senaratne's houses would be suitable for him. It was also recommended to ask the Contractor whether he would put up a shed with corrugated sheets.

5. To consider petition signed by E. M. Charles and 4 others *re* the issue of sand permits.—Recommended to refer the petition to the Assistant Government Agent, with the recommendation that the Council is of opinion that the issue of sand permits should be entrusted to an officer whose office is in this Town

6. To consider Park Superintendent's suggestion *re* the installation of lights at the Scandal Corner Junction.—Recommended to call for an estimate from the Electrical Engineer. It was also recommended to ask

the Public Works Department to remove the 4 triangles at the junction because they form an obstruction to the traffic.

7. To consider what action should be taken *re* the clearing of stream in the park.—Recommended that the subject be discussed with the Secretary of the Fishing Club. It was also resolved to warn Park Overseer, T. K. Amit, for allowing sand to be removed. It was further resolved to suspend Contractor Solomon Fernando from tendering for any of the Council's works and also not allow him permits to remove metal from the Council's quarry for one year as a punishment against his conduct in the matter.

8. To consider letter from the Hony. Secretary, Nuwara Eliya Club, *re* improvements to the Club building.—Recommended to revise the rent of the premises leased to the club to Rs 180 per annum from 1950. It was also recommended that improvements to the extent of Rs. 325 be effected.

9. To approve Commissioner's action in issuing tender forms to M. D. P. Samarasinghe and K. R. de Silva, and to consider their applications for registration as contractors.—Recommended to register them as follows:—

10. To consider S W's report *re* Roman Catholic Cemetery.—Recommended to request the Public Works Department to provide a retaining wall. It was also recommended that in the meantime the Superintendent of Works should prepare an estimate for the construction of a retaining wall.

11. To consider the purchase of Fire Fighting Apparatus.—Recommended to call for quotations for the necessary equipment.

12. To consider the question of revising the present method of calling for tenders.—Recommended that the present system should continue.

13. To consider further improvements, if any, to the park.—Mudaliyar Alex Sylva, who was present on invitation explained the improvements he proposes to carry out.—Recommended that his suggestions be approved and that he be allowed a free hand in the matter.
