### The Fisheries Ordinance

REGULATIONS for the area within the administrative limits of the Ambalangoda Village Committee in the Galle District, made by the Minister of Industries, Industrial Research and Fisheries, under section 26 of the Fisheries Ordinance, No. 24 of 1940, as modified by the Proclamation published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, and approved by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

REGULATIONS

- 250 1. No person shall catch fish in any river, lake or stream by means of a ma-dela, ko-dela, kundaliya, pala-del, koralipas, pal-ran or other similar net or device which destroys fry or the eggs, roe or spawn of any fish.
- 2. No person shall use any baru-del, elana-del or any other type of net in which the mesh is smaller than four inches stretched or two inches measured knot to knot.
- No person shall erect or use any fish kraal or any part of a fish kraal in any river, lake, stream or other public inland water unless he is the holder of a permit issued in that behalf by the Director or any officer authorised by him in writing.

- 4 Every permit issued under regulation 3 shall be in force until the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued and shall be in the form specified in the Schedule hereto.
- A fee of twenty-five rupees shall be charged for each permit issued under regulation 3.
- 6. No person shall erect any fish kraal in any river, lake, stream or other public inland water unless the site for the erection of the kraal has been approved by the Director or any person authorised by him in that behalf.
- 7. No person shall erect any fish kraal within fifty yards from any other kraal.
- No person shall in any river, lake or stream erect any fish kraal which exceeds in length seventy yards or more than half the distance between the two banks, whichever is the lesser.
- No person shall erect any fish kraal in any river, lake or stream unless an open space of at least sixteen weet is provided for the waterway between either bank and the extreme end of such kraal.
- Every permit-holder shall, between sunrise and sunset, light or cause to be lit with lamps-
  - (a) the extreme ends of his kraal; or
  - (b) the extreme ends of each section of his kraal, where the kraal consists of two sections with a waterway between such sections.
- Where a fish kraal is abandoned or a permit for another year is refused or not renewed, the materials pertaining to such kraal shall forthwith be pulled down and removed by the owner of the kraal when requested to do so by the Director or by any person authorised in that behalf by the Director.

- 12. The Director may refuse to issue a permit to use a fish kraal which, in his opinion, obstructs any other kraal or the free use of the waterway or the free passage of water.
- 13. No permit shall be issued to any person whose previous permit has been cancelled by a court of competent jurisdiction.
- 14. The by-laws under the Village Communities Ordinance made by the Ambalangoda Village Committee, published in Gazette No. 8,135 of July 26, 1935, and therein called "Rules", are hereby amended, under the heading "Fishing", by the rescission of by-laws 1 to 8.
- 15. In these regulations, "Director" means the Director of Fisheries.

in him by that section, as modified by the Proclamation published in Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

#### BY-LAWS

Tax on vehicles, and animals

- 1 (1) For the purposes of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Village Communities Ordinance, every person who has possession or custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee
- (2) The schedule shall be filled up and returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt by the persons to whom such schedule is delivered.
- 2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept or used.
- 3. Subject to the provision of section 47 (2) of the Ordinance every person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals are acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.
- 4. Every person who, having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law I or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.
- 5. The annual tax payable under the provisions of section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the office of the Committee on or before the thirty-first day of March of each year:

Provided that in any case where the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2 is furnished to the Chairman after the thirty-first day of March in any year, the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referred to in such schedule or notice shall be payable within one month of the date on which such schedule or notice is so furnished.

6. On payment of the annual tax by any person, the Chairman shall issue to the person in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the Schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Where any such plate, becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate. The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any such plate has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner thereof a fresh plate on the application of such owner and on payment by such owner of 50 cents.

7. The owner or person in charge of every vehicle shall affix the plate referred to in by-law 6 on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which such plate was issued.
