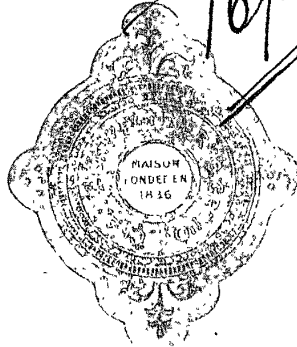

Notifications under "The Patents Ordinance, 1906"

THE following specifications have been accepted:—

No. 3,633 of May 3, 1949 (Date applied for under section 46 of the Ordinance, August 23, 1944.)

Leroy Lincoln Salfisberg.

"Improvements in hydraulic machines for sealing together or crimping layers of material".

Abstract:—A machine is described wherein as great or greater pressure than that supplied by an electric motor can be applied to the jaws wholly manually and with no more effort on the part of the operator than is required to operate the machine. This is achieved by the use of a hydraulic mechanism. The high pressure and the time of its application may be varied in accordance with the requirements. The possibility of injury to the operator's fingers is reduced to a minimum.

The United States Rubber Company.

"Rubber and carbon black mixes directly from natural rubber latex".

Abstract:—The invention relates to a method for the production of natural rubber-carbon black mixes direct from natural rubber latex. It is proposed to overcome the various disadvantages in the usual methods employed for such purposes and described in the specification by the mixing of finely divided carbon black with formaldehyde preserved natural rubber latex. A readily filterable slurry of particles of a rubber-carbon black mixture is formed which can be filtered and dried. Powdered channel black or furnace black may be added in the dry form to the formaldehyde preserved latex without the necessity for the addition of a wetting or dispersing agent. It is preferred to remove the non-rubber ingredients before the addition of the carbon black.

There are 7 examples and 5 claims.
