

An improved method and machine for making clay

Abstract:-The machine consists of three parts, the geared winch, the main body of the machine and the cutting table. The clay after seasoning for a few days is fed into the hopper and passed through a series of mixing chambers fitted with specially designed blades by means of a screw conveyor. In the process it gets thoroughly puddled and mixed. The mixed clay is forced through a conical chamber where it is compressed to form a proper stiff textured mass. The clay is pushed out of the conical chamber and passes through a specially designed oil lubricated mouth piece from which it issues as an endless clay ribbon with a very thin coating of oil. The clay ribbon has the standard section of the brick. It is oiled on the underside with an extra thick coating of oil thereby enabling it to slide easily over the adjoining zinc table. Two horizontal grooves are formed on each side of the ribbon by four staybrite steel fingers attached to the table. The ribbon is cut into bricks by a thin vertical wire attached to a frame fitted to a horizontal bar with handles. The bricks may be sun dried and used as such or burnt for greater strength, if required.

"Automatically self closing water tap."

Abstract:—The invention relates to a simple form of the type of taps for controlling the issue of water and like fluids, commonly known as "Push" taps. In this invention the numerous parts commonly embodied in such taps like springs, washers, &c., are largely eliminated.

The body of the tap is tubular and the forward end is closed except for a central opening or channel of circular cross section in which the valve stem slides. The outlet spout is integral with the body and opens into the water chamber of the body of the tap. The button or knob is permanently fixed to the valve stem which is of circular section and slides freely in the channel. The stem extends through the water chamber and ends in the valve for which a seating is provided in the tap body. When the button or knob is pressed inwards and retained in that position, the valve will be moved away from its seat thus allowing water to flow. When the pressure on the knob is released the pressure of the fluid in the supply pipe will push it back on to its seat thus stopping the flow.
