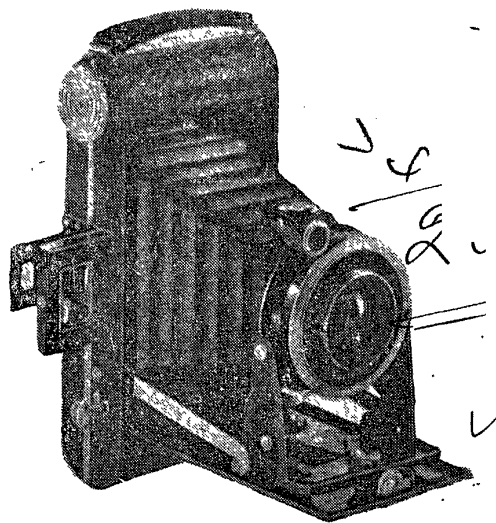

No. 3,638 of May 25, 1949 (Date applied for under Section 46 of the Ordinance; July 22, 1942)

The General Tire & Rubber Company

"Machine for forming fabric bands for Pneumatic Tyres".

Abstract—The invention relates to an apparatus for forming fabric bands that are adapted to form the inner plies of pneumatic cord tyres. A machine for building base bands for use in making pneumatic tyre casings which machine is comprised of a band measuring and building drum of smaller diameter than the smallest base band to be made thereon, driving means for the drum, means in advance of the drum for supporting and

guiding a strip of fabric to the drum and a pressure applying roller mounted for movement into and out of engagement with the drum

There are 12 claims and 5 sheets of drawings.

"Improvements in or relating to a method of applying a rendering of plaster-like material to structures".

Abstract:—A method of applying a rendering of plaster-like material with or without sand to the surfaces of structures which comprises adding the solid ingredient or ingredients of a plaster-mix to a preformed foam produced by the aeration of water containing a stable frothing agent and intimately mixing said solid ingredient or ingredients with said foam to produce a substantially uniform dispersion which is thereafter discharged under pressure through a spray gun or like spraying device, is described. The proportion of frothing agent to the water is approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ to 2 ounces per pint. The preferred frothing agents are the sodium salts of sulphated long chain aliphatic alcohols such as sulphated lauryl or cetyl alcohols.

"A method of manufacturing brown sole crepe out of smoked sheets or smoked rubber laces".

Abstract.—Ordinary smoked rubber sheets or smoked rubber laces are rolled wet through a fluted rubber mill five to six times. They are then rolled wet through a smooth rubber mill twice or thrice or oftener according to the thickness required. The thin laces as obtained are hung out to dry. The dried laces are placed one on top of another up to the required thickness and rolled together in a laminating mill. The novelty claimed is in the raw material to be used, viz., smoked rubber sheets or smoked rubber laces instead of the usual rubber coagulum.

There is one claim.
