The Village Communities Ordinance

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 11 (1) of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Solomon West Ridgeway Dias Bandaranaike, Minister of Health and Local Government, do by this Notification amend, with effect from July 1, 1951, the Notification relating to the village headman's divisions in the Kandy District, published in *Gazette* No. 8,735 of April 8, 1941, by the insertion, in the Schedule thereto under the heading 'The Gandahe North, Village Area in Patha Hewaheta in the Kandy District, of the new item set out in the Schedule hereto, the several particulars contained therein being set out in the appropriate columns in the first-mentioned Schedule.

SCHEDULE

5. Gurudeniya Ward No 10, comprising the villages of Kendawalamaditta, Gurudeniya (part) and Gona-watte, Haragama Estate and Sinna Haragama Estate and bounded as follows:—
- on the east by Haragama Wasama in Gandahe South,
 - on the west by Talatuoya Oya,
 - on the south by Ketawala, Kossinna, and Dulmure Wasama in Gandahe South, and

The Village Communities Ordinance

BY-LAWS under section 49 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), made by the Village Committee of the Yatakalan Pattu village area in the Chilaw District, and approved by the Minister of Health and Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by sub-section (3) of that section as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

BY-LAWS

Bakeries

1. In these by-laws—

- “bakery” means any premises in which bread, biscuit or confectionery is baked for sale as food for human consumption and includes any premises in which such food is prepared or in which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored;
- “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Village Committee;
- “Committee” means the Village Committee of the Yatakalan Pattu village area; and
- “village area” means the Yatakalan Pattu village area.

2 (1) No person shall establish, or carry on the business of, any bakery except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall, unless, it is earlier cancelled under by-law 10, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

3. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 2 unless the premises to be used as a bakery are in conformity with the following requirements:—

- (a) the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;
- (b) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and white washed;
- (c) the floor must be cemented;
- (d) the premises must be provided with sufficient latrine accommodation and sufficient drains;

- (e) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof;
- (f) the premises must not be situated within fifty feet of any cesspit, permanent manure heap, latrine or open sewer;
- (g) the premises must be provided with a separate kneading room having a superficial floor space of not less than twelve feet by ten feet;
- (h) there must be a free external air space, not less than seven feet wide, on at least two of those sides of the kneading room which contain doors or windows;
- (i) the door of the oven must not open directly into the kneading room.
4. The licensee of a bakery shall cause—
- (a) all utensils, furniture and other requisites used in or belonging to the bakery, to be kept clean;
- (b) the tops of the tables in the bakery to be made of well seasoned, closely-fitting planks or of some non-harmful impervious material and the tables to be scraped and cleaned daily;
- (c) the floor of the bakery to be swept at least once in every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings to be placed immediately in an impervious and covered receptacle and removed from the bakery daily;
- (d) the premises of the bakery to be kept clean and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy or cesspit and from any other similar nuisance;
- (e) the floor which is used in the bakery to be kept on a platform raised at least three feet above the ground;
- (f) all refuse from the premises of the bakery to be removed and the drains to be flushed daily;
- (g) at least two spittoons to be kept in some part of the premises other than the kneading room, but so as to be easily accessible to those engaged in the manufacture of bread;
- (h) clean water, clean towels, nail brush and soap to be provided on the premises for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread; and
- (i) a copy in Sinhalese of the by-laws relating to bakeries to be exhibited in a conspicuous part of the bakery.
5. The licensee of a bakery shall not—
- (a) allow the bakery to be used as a place for sleeping or for keeping any animal or any article other than an article necessary for the purposes of the bakery;
- (b) allow any bread, biscuit or confectionery to be exposed for sale or otherwise than in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases;
- (c) allow any person, engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuit or confectionery, to use any flour, water or other materials which are not good and wholesome;
- (d) use or keep in the bakery any furniture or equipment which cannot be moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor; or
- (e) allow any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place on the premises of the bakery.
6. Every person employed in the process of preparing or baking bread, biscuit or confectionery, shall wash his hands before engaging in the process, and shall wear a clean white apron covering the chest, armpits and body, and also a white cap or turban.
7. No person shall spit within the premises of the bakery except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.
8. No person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any contagious, cutaneous or infectious disease or has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any person in charge of a bakery to enter the bakery or to take part in the manufacture or sale of bread, biscuit or confectionery, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.
9. (1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Inspector, or any officer authorized by the Chairman in writing, at all reasonable times and at any time when the process of kneading or baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect the bakery.

(2) The licensee or the person in charge of a bakery shall permit the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Inspector, or any officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, to enter and inspect the bakery, and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.

10. It shall be lawful for the Rural Court, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to bakeries, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.

Eating-houses, restaurants and tea or coffee boutiques

11 (1) No person shall establish, or carry on the business of, any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall, unless it is earlier cancelled under by-law 19, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

12 No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 11 unless the premises to be used as any eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique are in conformity with the following requirements:—

- (a) the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;
- (b) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and white washed;
- (c) the floor must be cemented; and
- (d) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof.

13. The licensee of any eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique shall cause—

- (a) the premises thereof to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition;
- (b) all utensils, furniture or other equipment used in or belonging to the eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique to be kept clean;
- (c) all refuse and dirt in or about the premises of the eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to be swept and removed twice daily;
- (d) all cakes, sweets and other food exposed for sale on such premises to be kept in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases;
- (e) all waste tea, coffee, or milk and all remnants of food to be collected in a fly-proof receptacle with a closely fitting lid or cover, and removed from such premises twice daily;
- (f) all utensils used in the preparation, sale and consumption of food or drink to be washed with soap and water at least once in every twenty-four hours;
- (g) every utensil or receptacle to be washed immediately after it is used by a customer and before it is used by any other customer; and
- (h) a list of the names and addresses of all employees to be kept at all times in the premises so as to be available for inspection.

14. The licensee of any eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique shall not permit—

- (a) any waste tea, coffee or milk or any remnants of food to be thrown on the floor of the licensed premises; or
- (b) any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place on the licensed premises.

15 The licensee of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall cause at least two spittoons to be kept at all times on the licensed premises so as to be readily available to the visitors to the premises, as well as to the employees.

16 No person shall spit within the premises of any eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

17 No person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any contagious, cutaneous or infectious disease or has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall be permitted by any person in charge of any eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee

boutique to enter such place or to take part in the preparation or sale of any food or drink therein until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

18. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Inspector, or any officer authorised by the Chairman in writing at all reasonable times, to enter and inspect the premises of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, and the licensee or the person in charge of those premises shall permit him to enter and inspect those premises, and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.

19. It shall be lawful for the Rural Court, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to eating-houses, restaurants, or tea or coffee boutiques, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.

Municipal Council Proceedings

Minutes of Proceedings of the Monthly General Meeting of the Kandy Municipal Council held at the Town Hall, Kandy, at 9.15 a.m. on February 25, 1950, in pursuance of the notice dated February 20, 1950.

Present E. L. Senanayake, Esq. (Mayor), presiding; A. A. Dharmasena, Esq. (Deputy Mayor), Senator W. A. B. Soysa, Messrs. N. Wimalasena, A. S. Karunaratne, Fred E. de Silva, D. Ramanujam, P. B. A. Weerakoon, A. C. L. Ratwatte, P. L. P. Alwis, H. A. C. Wickremaratne, Hadji M. Usoof Ismail, T. B. Tennakoon, H. B. Udurawana and E. R. Senanayake.

(Mr Fred E. de Silva and Mr E. R. Senanayake attended the meeting when item 7C (2) in the Agenda was being considered.)

1. The minutes of proceedings of the monthly general meeting held on January 28, 1950, and of the adjourned monthly general meeting of the Council held on January 30, 1950, copies whereof had been previously furnished to the members, were taken as read, and it was resolved that these minutes be approved and that they be signed by the Mayor as true records of the proceedings of the Council on these dates.

2. *Announcements by the Mayor.*—The Mayor announced that the reservoir reading for February 25 1950, indicated that the reservoir was 2 ft. 7½ inches below spill level, and that last year at this time the reservoir had been 9 feet below spill level.

The Mayor also drew attention to an article published about three days ago in the Press to the effect that a party of pilgrims had been observed bathing in the lake. He stated that this article was a misstatement of the facts and he had documentary evidence to prove that pilgrims who had alighted from a 'bus were merely drying their clothes at the spot. It was not possible for anyone to bathe in the lake at this spot, and he deplored the publication of such irresponsible statements in the Press.

The Mayor tabled the following statement submitted to him by the Works Engineer in connection with the Peradeniya Pumping Scheme:—

'The desilting of one well has been completed. Although one pump has been erected, according to the present position, about 14 feet of water at the bottom of the well cannot be pumped as the suction pipe ends at a height of approximately 14 feet from the bottom of the well. The delivery pipe has not been connected to the rising main for want of a special casting required for the purpose.'

The Mayor added that unless the casting was obtained it would not be possible to have the water from these wells for public use for at least three months.

Mr. A. S. Karunaratne enquired whether the statement published in the Press to the effect that some excavated earth had been dumped on the pipeline and had caused damage to the pipeline was correct.

The Mayor stated that he would make enquiry into the matter and supply the information required. He also mentioned that Brigadier Hull and Mr. Sanderson proposed to visit Kandy on March 1, to explore the possibility of building a high level storage reservoir at Roseneath in connection with which advice from Brigadier Hull had been asked for, and that Brigadier Hull was not charging the Council any fee for his visit and his advice on the point.

In reply to Mr. Wimalasena, who enquired what progress had been made in connection with the Lewella Pumping Scheme, the Mayor stated that filter beds were being constructed at the reservoir now and that if the pipes were received within the anticipated time, Mr. Sanderson had expressed the opinion that it would be possible to complete the scheme by the end of 1950.

Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte drew attention to the fact that people were bathing in the moat by the Dalada Maligawa and suggested that steps be taken to prevent this, as water from the moat flowed into the lake, and there was danger of pollution of the lake water supply.

3. The following statements and reports were tabled:—

- (1) Statements of receipts and disbursements in respect of the General Revenue Account for December, 1949, and of the Electricity Department Revenue Account for November, 1949.
- (2) Progress Report of the Municipal Electrical Engineer for September, 1949.
- (3) Report of the Medical Officer of Health for the months of December, 1949, and January, 1950.
- (4) Inspectors' Reports on Laundries and Bakeries for the months of December, 1949, and January, 1950.
- (5) Reports on Public Latrines for December, 1949, and January, 1950.
- (6) Reports of the Municipal Free Ayurvedic Dispensaries for the month of January, 1950.
- (7) Works Engineer's report for the month of December, 1949.
- (8) Minutes of the meeting of the Public Assistance Committee held on January 27, 1950.
- (9) Reservoir readings for the week ended February 24, 1950.

4. *Memorials, petitions, complaints and communications addressed to the Council.*

(1) To consider letter addressed to the Mayor by Mr. Fred E. de Silva, M.M.C., asking for leave of the Council to absent himself from meetings of the Council

for seven months from March, 1950, as he proposed to be away from the Island during this period. (Leave can be granted to Mr. de Silva under the provisions of section 13 (2) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947.)

It was resolved that leave of absence be allowed to Mr. de Silva for a period of seven months from March, 1950, accordingly.

(2) Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte drew attention to the inconvenience suffered by the public in the Municipality by the increase of mosquitoes and he suggested that the M. O. H. be asked to take measures to abate the nuisance.

(3) Mr. Hadji M. Usuf Ismail drew attention to the inadequacy of public lighting provided in Colombo Street and he stated that even some of the existing lamps in this street were not being lit at night. There were very few lamps in Colombo Street, while there were as many as 85 public lamps between the United Services Library and the Y. M. C. A. in Victoria Drive.

(4) Senator W. A. B. Soysa complained that traffic was obstructed and endangered in Hospital Road by reason of huge boulders being piled up on one side of this road. He asked that the P. W. D. should be requested to remove these boulders. Senator Soysa also drew attention to the large number of accidents and deaths caused by 'buses being permitted to run at excessive speeds on the roads of the Municipality and he suggested that the Police be asked to carry out an intensive campaign to check excessive speeding.

(5) Mr. Karunaratne pointed out that there was no reason for continuing to supply lake water to residents of the town, with the reservoir 2 ft. and 7 inches below spill level. He thought the practice was to supply lake water only when the reservoir was 12 ft. below spill level.

(6) Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte complained that poor people were being subjected to grave inconvenience by being asked to call at the Municipal Office from day to day in connection with the supply of free school books to their children. He asked that such persons whose cases had been investigated and were eligible to receive school books should be supplied with books on an appointed date instead of their having to call at the office from day to day, and being compelled to waste their time.

(7) Mr. D. Ramanujam stated that in consequence of the motion which he moved at the last meeting requesting that cases in which labourers had been persecuted by the Overseers of the Health Department should be investigated several cases of thuggery by Overseers against persons who were in a position to give evidence had taken place.

The Mayor having stated that he had asked Mr. Ramanujam to furnish him with specific instances in which such persecution had taken place, with a view to enquiry and he had not received such information, Mr. Ramanujam handed a petition to the Mayor addressed to Mr. Ramanujam by H.D. labourer No. 170 Selambaram alleging that he had been threatened with assault by one Dharmay at the instance of Overseer Packeer Ally.

(8) Mr. P. B. A. Weerakoon presented a petition signed by Mr. A. K. Kandiyaya and several other residents of Siyambalagastenne praying that a pipe-borne supply of water be provided for Siyambalagastenne.

(9) Mr. P. L. P. Alwis complained that no repairs were being effected to the Phoenix Tea Gardens for which the Council had provided a vote of Rs. 6,000.

He also stated that no action had yet been taken on the motion which he moved suggesting that public lights be provided for the Gangawata Road.

(10) Mr. A. A. Dharmasena stated that in consequence of a motion which he moved in the Council in the year 1945 the Council had taken over the road passing by Mr. H. L. Ratwatte's house, and as there was some dispute in this connection the Council had also taken steps to acquire the road. He mentioned that a few days ago when the Works Engineer sent some labourers to attend to the road, Mr. Ratwatte had driven them away. He suggested that Mr. Ratwatte be addressed by the Commissioner and asked why he should not be prosecuted for having obstructed the labourers, and that the Works Engineer be instructed to send out labourers again for this work.

The Mayor undertook to look into the several matters referred to in the petitions and complaints

5. *Questions.*—Nil.

6. *Notice of questions.*—Nil

7. *Motions.*—Pursuant to notice, Mr. T. B. Tennakoon was to have moved.—“ This Council resolved that arrangements be made for ensuring that all labourers in employment under the Council who have served for a period exceeding 2 years are provided with work for a minimum of 20 days each month in order to enable them to earn an adequate amount in wages for their maintenance.”

The Mayor made a statement indicating that enquiries made by him showed that all such labourers were now provided with over 20 days' work in the month by all departments, and he suggested that Mr. Tennakoon should withdraw the motion in these circumstances.

Mr. Tennakoon stated that the Building Workers' Union had represented to him that some of its members had not been provided with work for such a minimum number of days in January, and he asked for leave to bring up the motion at the next meeting of the Council after further investigation into the position

The Council accordingly allowed Mr. Tennakoon to bring up the motion at the next meeting.

7A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Fred E. de Silva was to have moved the following motions which stood in his name.—(1) “ That in view of the severe congestion of traffic that prevails in the streets of Kandy today and in view of the fact that the congestion of traffic will daily increase thereby causing a danger to those using the streets of Kandy, that immediate steps be taken in conjunction with the Police to work out a scheme whereby the outstation buses are prevented from entering the limits of the Town by having their halting places on the outskirts of the Town.

(2) “ That the Works Engineer be requested to report on the feasibility and cost involved and the advantage gained by either opening up the existing Halloluwa Tunnel or blasting it open and making a road-way.”

The Mayor mentioned that Mr. Fred E. de Silva, who was not present at this stage, had informed him that he would attend the meeting later and had asked for leave to introduce the motions later in the day.

The Council accordingly agreed to allow the motions to stand over.

7B. (1) Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. Ramanujam moved the following motion which stood in his name:—“ This Council resolves to construct a well and washing tank in Asgiriya for the use of the laundry keepers working there.” Mr. P. B. A. Weerakoon seconded the motion.

It was agreed that the motion be referred to the Works and Finance Committees for consideration and report.

7B. (2) Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. Ramanujam moved the following motion which stood in his name:—“ This Council resolves to extend the same facilities offered to inhabitants of the Municipal model tenements at Deiyannawela to M. C. tenement dwellers at Mahaiyawa for obtaining electricity connection for their tenements.”

Mr. A. A. Dharmasena seconded the motion and suggested that, in cases of this nature, slot-meters should be installed, to permit of the tenants securing the benefit of the lighting under more favourable terms and at cheaper cost than that which they would have to pay if the minimum prescribed charge was levied.

It was agreed that the motion be referred to the Law and Electricity Committee and the Finance Committee for consideration and report.

7B. (3) Pursuant to notice, Mr. D. Ramanujam moved the following motion which stood in his name:—“ This Council resolves to take in hand the widening of Udamadapotha Road immediately ” Mr. N. Wimalasena seconded the motion.

It was agreed that the motion be referred to the Works and Finance Committees for consideration and report.

7C. (1) Pursuant to notice, Mr. N. Wimalasena was to have moved:—“ As the report on Local Government finance submitted to us for consideration lacks a constructive scheme for the satisfactory solution of the

financial relations as between local bodies and the Central Government, and is therefore disappointing and not acceptable, this Council urges the immediate appointment of a commission composed *inter alia* of elected representatives of local bodies to probe into this question exhaustively to formulate a more practicable and equitable scheme.”

Mr. Wimalasena asked for leave to introduce the motion at the next meeting, in view of the fact that the Finance Committee was meeting shortly to consider the report and it would be desirable to await its report in the matter.

Council accordingly allowed leave to Mr. Wimalasena to move the motion at the next meeting

7C. (2) Pursuant to notice Mr. Wimalasena moved.—

(a) “ This Council resolves to allot forthwith building sites in Dangolle on a proportionate basis to those who own land in Getambe in the area rendered unbuildable due to floods.

(b) “ This Council resolves that in such an allotment those land owners in Getambe be compensated to the extent of the difference in value of land in the two places (Getambe and Dangolle). ” Mr. P. B. A. Weerakoon seconded the motion

It was agreed that the motion be referred to the Works and Finance Committees for consideration and report.

7D. (1) Pursuant to notice, Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne was to have moved:—(1) “ As the primary purpose for which the Bogambara grounds were provided has been almost defeated by reason of the fact that the Council has, year in and year out, rented the grounds for the running of carnivals and fairs, this Council resolves that no portion of Bogambara grounds, reserved for sport should be rented to any institution or organization for the conducting of carnivals, fairs, &c., at any time

The Mayor tabled a report from the Works Engineer supporting the proposal made in the motion that the ground intended for use as the playing field for sports should not be let for such purposes.

The Council having expressed itself in favour of a plan being obtained from the Works Engineer showing what area of land would be available for carnivals under the proposal, before the motion was considered, Mr. Wickremaratne agreed to allow the motion to stand over for the next meeting to permit of the Works Engineer furnishing the required plan.

7D. (2) Pursuant to notice Mr. Wickremaratne moved:—(2) “ In view of the fact that the Ampitiya Road leading to Talatuoya has become extremely dangerous for traffic on account of its numerous curves and bends, this Council requests the P. W. D. to straighten out the bends and curves as far as possible specially at the section called Ratu-bokuwa.” Mr. Hadji M. Usoof Ismail seconded the motion.

Mr. Wimalasena in supporting the motion suggested that in forwarding the motion to the P. W. D. for action, attention be drawn to the fact that accidents were attributable to the existence of such bends and curves on other roads in the Municipality as well and that steps be taken to straighten out such bends and curves on all roads within the Municipality.

The motion was put to the house and was carried unanimously.

At this stage, Mr. Fred E. de Silva attended the meeting and he moved the following motion which stood in his name under item 7A (1) in the Agenda:—“ That in view of the severe congestion of traffic that prevails in the streets of Kandy today and in view of the fact that the congestion of traffic will daily increase thereby causing a danger to those using the streets of Kandy, that immediate steps be taken in conjunction with the Police to work out a scheme whereby the outstation buses are prevented from entering the limits of the Town by having their halting places on the outskirts of the Town.” Mr. A. S. Karunaratne seconded the motion and suggested that it be referred to the Special Committee on the municipalization of the Town bus service for consideration.

Mr. A. A. Dharmasena and Mr. N. Wimalasena spoke against the motion.

Mr. Wickremaratne spoke in support of the motion. Mr. de Silva replied.

It was agreed that the motion be referred to the Special Committee on the municipalization of the Town 'bus service for consideration.

Mr Fred E. de Silva moved the following motion which stood in his name under 7A (2) in the Agenda.—“ That the Works Engineer be requested to report on the feasibility and cost involved and the advantage gained by either opening up the existing Halloluwa Tunnel or blasting it open and making a roadway.” Mr. P. B. A. Weerakoon seconded the motion.

Mr. T. B. Tennakoon, in supporting the motion, suggested that the question of having this work done as an Unemployment Relief measure be considered.

It was agreed that the motion be referred to the Works Engineer for report.

With the leave of the Council, the tenders received for the construction of houses, roads, &c., in Groups 'A' and 'B' of the Getambe Re-settlement Scheme which stood in the Agenda under item 9 thereof, were taken up for consideration at this stage.—

9 To consider the tenders received for the construction of houses in Groups 'A' and 'B' of the Getambe Re-settlement Scheme.

In connection with the condition laid down by the Commissioner of Local Government and the Treasury, in giving covering sanction to the manner in which tenders had been called for the construction of the houses, that the successful tenderer be required to employ Ceylonese labour and provision to this effect be included in the contract to be entered into with the successful tenderer, the Finance Committee at its meeting held on February 11, considered the matter and recommended that a condition on these lines be imposed. The Finance Committee also decided to recommend the inclusion of a further condition requiring the contractor to give preference to unskilled labourers who have been retrenched from Unemployment Relief Schemes, in recruiting labour for the work.

The Commissioner of Local Government has by his letter No. CE 107/20A of February 14, 1950, since received suggested that the condition to be incorporated in the agreement with the successful tenderer should be in the following form:—

“ That the successful tenderer is required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be made a condition of the contract and failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances the Commissioner of Local Government may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Treasury. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval and concurrence in writing is forbidden.”
The term “ Ceylonese ” shall mean.—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration;
- (b) A British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon,
- (c) A British subject who is a descent of a person falling within category (b),
- (d) A person certified by the Ministry of Defence and External Affairs as possessing a *prima facie* entitlement

Mr B Wiratunge, Accountant, C. L. G's Department and Mr L de Soysa, Assistant Town Planner, were present at the meeting.

The Mayor tabled the following recommendation made by the Works and Finance Committees at their meeting held earlier at 8.30 a.m., in connexion with the tenders —

“ The Works and Finance Committees recommend that the tenders of Messrs Samuel & Sons, Ltd., for Rs 459,975.00 for construction of roads, buildings, &c., connected with Group 'A' and for Rs. 261,405.00 for construction of roads, buildings, &c., connected with Group 'B' of the Scheme be accepted and the work be entrusted to this firm subject to the firm complying with the condition suggested by the C. L. G. in his letter

No. CE. 107/20A of February 14 regarding the employment of Ceylonese labour and this condition and a further condition requiring the firm to give preference to unskilled labourers retrenched from unemployment relief schemes in the recruitment of unskilled labour for the work being incorporated in the agreement to be entered into with the firm.

It was reported that Mr. Samuel who had been questioned by the Works and Finance Committees as to whether he would agree to these conditions had signified his willingness to accept the contract on these conditions.

It was pointed out by Mr. Soysa that Government had agreed to contribute its share of the cost of the buildings, on the basis of the estimate of Rs. 560,000 furnished earlier representing the full cost to be incurred in the construction of the houses and the accepted tenders would result in an excess of expenditure over the estimate by Rs 86,800. Mr Soysa suggested that the number of houses to be constructed should be reduced by 14 to permit of the cost of construction of the houses being kept within the estimate.

It was resolved (a) —that the full number of houses contemplated in the scheme be constructed (64 in Group 'A' and 34 in Group 'B') and that Government be asked to contribute the balance payable by it towards the Rs. 86,800 involved in the accepted tenders of Messrs. Samuel & Sons, seeing that the scheme was a Resettlement Scheme and the ordinary conditions applicable to grants made towards housing schemes should not apply to it, (b) that the tenders of Messrs. Samuel & Sons be accepted subject to the firm complying with the requirements laid down in the recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees, referred to earlier.

It was suggested, however, that the proviso in the condition be amended to read as follows, since the Works Engineer was responsible for supervision of the work.—

“ Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances the Works Engineer may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labour previously approved by him in writing. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval is prohibited.”

8. Reports of Standing Committees.

Mr. A. C. L. Ratwatte proposed “ that the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council for the purpose of considering the extracts from the minutes of the Standing Committees annexed to the Agenda.” Mr. P. B. A. Weerakoon seconded.—Carried.

COUNCIL IN COMMITTEE

8 Reports of Standing Committees.—The following extract from the minutes of the joint meeting of the Standing Committees on “ Works ” and “ Finance ” held on February 10, 1950, were considered:—

(1) To interview candidates for the post of Officer-in-Charge, Mavilnada and Dangolla Housing Schemes.

Of the 9 candidates called for the interview, the following 7 candidates appeared and were interviewed by the Committees —

Messrs R Senanayake, Albert Aluwihare, D. P. T. Chelvarajah, W. Sinnethamby, N. G. de La Motte, N. G. Samsuddin and F. V. Jennings.

The Works and Finance Committees are of opinion that Mr. Sinnethamby is the best qualified out of the candidates interviewed, and they recommend that he be appointed to the post.

It was resolved that Mr. Sinnethamby be appointed to the post, as recommended by the Works and Finance Committees.

To consider extracts from the minutes of the meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Establishment held on February 11, 1950.—

(2) In connection with his conversion to the new salary scheme, Mr. D. W. Waidyatillake, the Chief Physician of the Katukelle Free Ayurvedic Dispensary, was placed by the Local Government Service Commission on the salary scale laid down in the scheme for unqualified physicians. Mr. Waidyatillake made an appeal to the Commission contending that the qualifications he possessed entitled him to be placed on the scale laid down for qualified physicians. The Local Government Service Commission held that his qualifications are not equivalent to the D.I.M. & S. (Ceylon) and he cannot therefore be placed on the higher salary scale.

Further petition received from Mr. Waidyatillake asking that the Council recommend to the Commission the reviewer of this decision is submitted. (Cir. 887 B and C.)

The Health Committee does not think that there are sufficient grounds for asking the Commission to review its decision in this case, but it is open for Mr. Waidyatillake to acquire the prescribed qualifications and secure the benefit of the scale laid down by the Commission for "qualified" physicians.

Mr. D. W. S. Waidyatilleke appeared before the Finance Committee with all his certificates and was heard by the Committee. It transpired that Mr. Waidyatilleke had been registered as an Ayurvedic practitioner in 1937, and that he had been appointed as Chief Physician of the Katukelle Ayurvedic Dispensary in 1944.

The Finance Committee having carefully perused the certificates, is of opinion that his paper qualifications and his experience of 25 years as a practising Ayurvedic Physician entitle him to be treated as if he has passed the D.I.M. & S. Examination. The Committee also observes that Mr. Waidyatilleke comes from a well known family of *Vedaralas*. In these circumstances, the Committee recommends that the Local Government Service Commission be requested to place Mr. Waidyatilleke on the salary scale laid down by the Commission for "qualified" physicians.

It was resolved that action be taken in terms of the Finance Committee's recommendation.

(3) To consider application from Mr. B. E. L. Rodrigo, the Pharmacist, for an allowance in consideration of his having carried out the services connected with the Maternity and Child Welfare Clinics since Dr. Hall, the Acting Medical Officer, Maternity and Child Welfare, vacated the office on February 1, 1948.

Please see Commissioner's memo of June 29, 1949.

The Health and Finance Committees did not recommend the application in view of the fact that they were of opinion that no additional duty could have devolved on Mr. Rodrigo in the absence of a Medical Officer of Maternity and Child Welfare, and it was not competent for Mr. Rodrigo to carry out any of the duties performed by a Medical Officer.

This recommendation was before the Municipal Council at its meeting held on July 30, 1949, and has been referred back to the Finance Committee for further consideration and report.

The Medical Officer of Health was questioned by the Finance Committee and it transpired that although Mr. Rodrigo had been performing additional duties such as the compilation of statistics relating to the maternity and child welfare service, which were outside those pertaining to his office as a Pharmacist, such work had not entailed his having to work outside his normal office hours.

The Finance Committee cannot in these circumstances support his application for an additional allowance for the period, and it is of opinion that in future no extra payment be made to officers for any additional work done by them within their normal office hours.

It was resolved that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted.

(4) To consider memo from Mr. C. E. W. Jayasuriya, stenographer, M. C., Kandy, pointing out that stenographers who do *verbatim* reporting work in the Colombo Municipal Council have had their designation changed to "Reporter" and asking that as he is doing similar work in the Kandy Municipal Council that the designation of his post be changed to Reporter. (Cir. 950 C.)

The Finance Committee does not recommend the change of designation of the post.

It was resolved that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted.

(5) To table representations made to the Mayor by a deputation from the Bahirawakande Gramasamwardhana Samithiya which met him on September 30, in regard to amenities needed for the Bahirawakande area, with the observations of the M. O. H., Works Engineer and Municipal Electrical Engineer thereon. (Cir. 813 B, D and C.)

The Works Committee recommends that a reply be sent to the Samithiya, in terms of the reports of the M. O. H., M. E. E. and Works Engineer.

The Finance Committee recommends that action be taken in terms of the Works Committee's recommendation.

Consideration of this item was deferred for the next meeting at the request of Senator W. A. B. Soysa, who wished to see the papers.

(6) To obtain sanction for the lease to Mr's. J. E. de Silva of the road reservation, facing premises Nos. 21/1, 21/2, and 21/3, Bahirawakande, 3 perches in extent at an annual rental of Re. 1. (Cir. 20 A and C.)

It was also observed that the lease involved an encroachment of 5.94 square feet on M. C. land by the building constructed by her on the premises.

The Law and Electricity Committee recommends that the lease of both encroachments at annual rentals of Re. 1 and Re. 1.50 respectively to her be sanctioned.

The Finance Committee recommends that the recommendation of the Law and Electricity Committee be adopted.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(7) To consider suggestion made by the A. S. P., C. P., in his letter No. MB 3169/49 of January 4, 1949, that the use of loud-speakers at the Phoenix Tea Gardens be prohibited in connection with the letting of the building for public meetings and social functions, with reference to a complaint made by the Managing Director of the Queen's Hotel that the nuisance caused by the use of loud-speakers in the vicinity of the Hotel is seriously affecting their business and might result in their having to close the Hotel. (Cir. 18 A and C.)

The Law and Electricity Committee recommends that the use of loud-speakers at the Phoenix Tea Gardens be prohibited.

Whilst on the subject of the Phoenix Tea Gardens, the Committee is of opinion that the building standing on the premises is an eye-sore and detracts from the beauty of the Esplanade. It recommends that no expenditure be incurred out of the Rs. 6,000 voted in the budget for effecting repairs to the building, pending a decision by the Council as to whether the building should be demolished or not.

The Finance Committee is of opinion that a total prohibition of the use of loud-speakers at the Phoenix Tea Gardens is not desirable, and it recommends that permission be allowed for the use of loud-speakers here between the hours of 3 p.m. and 6 p.m. only, in connection with bookings of the Tea Gardens by the public.

As regards the suggestion made by the Works Committee that the building be demolished, the Finance Committee wishes the question to be put up for consideration by it and the Works Committee, in due course.

It was resolved that the recommendation of the Finance Committee be adopted.

(8) To consider letter No. B. A. 753 of August 15, 1949, from the Commissioner of Local Government inviting suggestions from the Council in connection with proposals being considered by the Ministry of Home Affairs for the amendment of the Explosives Ordinance (Cap. 140) to include provision for—

- (a) revocation of any licence to manufacture explosives and of any licence issued to establish a factory for the manufacture of explosives;
- (b) the annual renewal of licences to establish a factory for the manufacture of explosives;
- (c) the delegation of the Minister's powers to grant licences to establish factories for the manufacture of explosives.

The Accountant points out that at present the Council issues licences only for the manufacture of fireworks which has been declared a dangerous trade, and he suggests that as the Galle M. C. is issuing licences for the storage and sale of explosives, the Council might consider the question of levying a licence fee for the storage and sale of explosives. (Cir. 33 A and C.)

The Law and Electricity Committee recommends that the Council approve of the amendment of the ordinance on the suggested lines, and that meanwhile an annual licence fee of Rs. 10 be levied for the storage and sale of explosives.

The Finance Committee recommends that the recommendation of the Law and Electricity Committee be adopted.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(9) With reference to M. C. Resolution No. 8 (66) of June 25, 1949, whereby the Mayor was authorized to appoint a suitable candidate for the vacant post of

fireman, Kandy M. C., Fire Brigade, in consultation with the Municipal Commissioner, to consider joint report made by the Mayor and Commissioner, dated January 12, 1950, recommending the appointment of Mr. A. A. Mohamed Farouk to this post (Cir. 23 A and C.)

The Law and Electricity Committee recommends that Mr. Mohamed Farouk be appointed to the post of fireman.

The Finance Committee noted that Mr. Farouk did not possess the educational qualification prescribed in the notice by which applications were called for this post, but the Committee recommends that Mr. Farouk be appointed as the Council by its resolution No. 8 (36) of October 29, 1949, has lowered the educational qualification to a pass in the 6th standard in English, or Sinhalese or Tamil and Mr. Farouk possesses this qualification.

It was resolved that papers be referred back to the Finance Committee for re-consideration and further report, Mr. T. B. Tennekoon having pointed out that it would be irregular to appoint this candidate as he did not possess the qualifications prescribed in the advertisement.

(10) With reference to M. C. Resolution No. 8 (2) of October 29, 1949, whereby the Council authorized the Mayor and the Municipal Commissioner to make an appointment after going into the merits of the several candidates for the post of Peon, M. C. Free Library, to consider joint report made by the Mayor and the Municipal Commissioner regarding the merits of 3 of the five candidates interviewed by them. (Cir. 24 C.)

In view of the fact that Mr. E. H. G. Fernando possesses outstanding educational qualifications, although he is over the prescribed age, the Law and Electricity Committee recommends that he be appointed to the post of library peon. (The late Mayor, Senator W. A. B. Soysa, who was present, concurs in this view.)

It transpired that Mr. Fernando was 34 years of age and the age limit prescribed for the post was 30 years.

In these circumstances the Finance Committee recommends that Mr. Somaweera, one of the selected candidates possessing all the prescribed qualifications for the post, be appointed thereto. (Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne dissented from this recommendation.)

The recommendations of the Law and Finance Committees were put to the vote at the request of Mr. H. A. C. Wickremaratne.

5 voted for the recommendation of the Law Committee and 7 voted for the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

The Mayor declared the recommendation of the Finance Committee carried.

(11) To consider quotations received for the supply of 500 yards L.T. 2-Core .0225 armoured cable and 500 yards of L.T. 4-Core .0225 armoured cable.

The Municipal Electrical Engineer recommends the acceptance of the quotations of Messrs. The British Insulated Callendar's Cables Ltd., to supply the 2-Core Cable at Rs. 5.25 per yard immediately from stocks and the 4-Core cable at an approximate cost of Rs. 6 i.o.r. Colombo from an expected shipment.

As the two Core cable is required urgently the M. E. E. has been authorized to place an order for 500 yards with this firm, pending M. C. sanction. (Cir. 43 A and C.)

It was mentioned, in regard to the 4-Core Cable quoted for, that the firm was now in a position to offer it at the definite price of Rs. 7.32 per yard, having since received stocks and priced the cable.

The Law and Electricity Committee recommends that the requirements be purchased at Rs. 5.25 per yard in the case of 2-Core Cable and at Rs. 7.32 per yard in the case of the 4-Core Cable, from this firm.

The Finance Committee recommends that the recommendation of the Law and Electricity Committee be adopted.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted. (12) To approve of the draft of the bond prepared by the Council's lawyer in connection with the security to be furnished by Mr. V. K. Fernando, the successful tenderer for the right to collect rents from the traders in the Old Coconut Fair Area during 1950, by the hypothecation of landed property. (Cir. 62 A.)

The Law and Electricity Committee recommends that the draft bond be approved.

The Finance Committee recommends that the recommendation of the Law and Electricity Committee be adopted.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(13) To consider application from Mr. K. M. Koin Bandara of 47, Dodanwela, for a certificate of competency to practise as an electrical contractor within the K. M. C., electricity supply area.

The Law and Electricity Committee had recommended that the Municipal Electrical Engineer be authorized to issue a provisional certificate to him for a period of 5 months, and that the matter be considered further after the Municipal Electrical Engineer makes a full report on the Works carried out by Mr. Bandara.

The Finance Committee deferred consideration of the matter with a view to a further report being obtained from the M. E. E.

The M. E. E. suggests that in future all applicants for certificates of competency be granted provisional certificates for six months, and if their work is found satisfactory within this period, that full certificates of competency be issued to them.

The Law and Electricity Committee recommends that a provisional certificate be issued to Mr. Koin Bandara for six months, and that the procedure suggested by the Municipal Electrical Engineer be followed in connection with the granting of certificates of competency to future applicants.

The Finance Committee recommends that the recommendation of the Law and Electricity Committee be adopted.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(14) With reference to M. C. Resolution No. 8 (42) of October 29, 1949, quotations were called from manufacturing firms in England, as directed, with a view to ascertain if the remaining 4,000 yards of .0025—2-Core Cable, 2,000 yards of .0025—4-Core Cable and 4,000 yards of .06—4-Core Cable could be imported from them direct at cheaper cost.

According to the lowest quotation received (quotation of Messrs. Liverpool Cables, Ltd.) it would appear that if the cable was imported direct the difference in the prices would be in the case of the 4,000 yards of 2-Core Cable Rs. 864.35, in the case of the 2,000 yards of .0025—4-Core Cable Rs. 890 and in the case of 4,000 yards .06—4-Core Cable Rs. 4,056.35, compared with the revised prices quoted by Messrs. Walker & Greig. No provision has been made for rent, harbour dues and other incidental expenses involved in importing the materials direct.

Walker & Greig's revised quotation is based on the lead necessary for the cable being available at £105 per ton, while Messrs. Liverpool Cables, Ltd., have based their quotation on lead being available at £97 per ton.

The Law and Electricity Committee is of opinion that an appreciable saving can be effected by purchasing the requirements direct from Messrs. The Liverpool Cables, Ltd., and it recommends that the tender made by this firm be accepted and that the order be placed with this firm.

The Finance Committee recommends that the recommendation of the Law and Electricity Committee be adopted.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(15) To consider letter dated February 1, 1950, from Mr. S. R. de Silva, Municipal Electrical Engineer, stating that he has been selected for the post of Electrical Engineer, Gal-Oya Development Board, on the salary scale Rs. 13,200—400—Rs. 15,000 per annum, but that he will be willing to continue in the service of the Council if the Council would be good enough to consider the question of placing him on a higher point in his present salary scale.

The Law and Electricity Committee gave careful consideration to the matter and heard Mr. S. R. de Silva, the Municipal Electrical Engineer, who is prepared to continue in the service of the Council if he is placed on the salary of Rs. 11,280 per annum (the next step in his present scale of salary after the efficiency bar). In view of the fact that Mr. de Silva has done good work and there is a dearth of engineers at present and the Council had experienced difficulty in filling the post, before Mr. de Silva was appointed thereto, the Law and Electricity Committee is of opinion that it would be to the advantage of the Council to retain Mr. de Silva's services. It must

however be borne in mind that any concession granted to him would not preclude him from making an application for a transfer elsewhere. In order to obviate this possibility and the resulting inconvenience, the Committee is of opinion that in the event of Mr de Silva's services being retained, he should be required to enter into an agreement to remain in the service of the Council for at least ten years.

In this connection it has been brought to the notice of the Committee that Mr de Silva's application had been forwarded direct to the Gal Oya Development Board. This procedure appears to be irregular as the normal practice should be to forward applications through the Local Government Service Commission, who is now the employer. The Committee wishes both the Mayor and Municipal Commissioner to note this fact in the disposal of future applications from members of the L. G. S. C., for employment outside the service.

The Finance Committee having given careful consideration to the opinion expressed by the Law and Electricity Committee, agrees with its view that it will be to the advantage of the Council to retain the services of this officer. The Finance Committee is, however, not in a position to support the terms he suggests, but it recommends that as some inducement is indicated, the Council offer Mr de Silva subject to L. G. S. C.'s approval, the salary of Rs 9,840 per annum on his present scale with effect from March 1, and his next increment on the date on which it normally falls due. If Mr de Silva is agreeable to these terms he should also be required to enter into an agreement to remain in the Council's service for 5 years from March 1, 1950.

The Finance Committee is also in agreement with the Law and Electricity Committee's view that in future when members of the Local Government Service employed in the Kandy M. C., apply for posts outside the service, their applications should be sent to the Department concerned through the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission.

The Mayor informed the House, in reply to an enquiry, that he had not conveyed the Finance Committee's recommendation to Mr. S. R. de Silva.

It was resolved that the Mayor be authorized to consult Mr. S. R. de Silva and to report to the Council by circular if Mr. de Silva was prepared to accept the terms suggested by the Finance Committee, with a view to further action being taken on this recommendation if Mr. de Silva was agreeable to the suggested terms.

(16) To consider application dated January 13, 1950, from the Education Officer, Central Province, for the free use of Bogambara Grounds and the Ratwatte Pavilion on March 23, 24 and 25 in connection with the Provincial Physical Training Competition 1950.

The Finance Committee recommends that the use of the Ratwatte Pavilion and the Bogambara Grounds, free of charge, for this purpose be allowed, and the Commissioner be authorized to dispose of all such requests in future without reference to the Council.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted (17) To consider application from Peon A. G. Francis for a loan for the purchase of a bicycle.

The Accountant recommends that a loan of Rs. 172.50 be allowed, repayable in 17 monthly instalments of Rs 9.50 each and one of Rs. 11 with interest at 1½ per cent per annum.

The Finance Committee recommends that a loan of Rs 172.50 be granted to peon Francis on the terms suggested by the Accountant.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(18) To consider application from Mr L. P. Uduwela, Revenue Inspector, for a loan of Rs 1,350 to enable him to purchase a motor cycle or a light car for use in connection with his travelling.

The Accountant recommends that the loan be allowed on the usual conditions re-payable in 36 monthly instalments of Rs 37/50 with interest at 1½ per cent. (Cir 50 C.)

The Finance Committee recommends that a loan of Rs 1,350 be granted to Mr Uduwela on the terms suggested by the Accountant.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(19) To obtain sanction for accepting the tender made by Mr A. M. P. Charles Silva to purchase tea seeds of Roseneath Estate at Rs. 205 per maund. (Cir. 60 C.)

The Finance Committee recommends that sanction be allowed accordingly.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(20) To obtain covering sanction for the purchases of Asphalt, Socofix and Colas made by the Works Department and to authorize payments due to the supplying firms in this connection which are shown below —

The Finance Committee recommends that sanction be allowed accordingly.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(21) In connection with the application made by Mr Liyanage, Distraining Inspector, for the higher travelling allowance of Rs 30 paid to Distraining Inspectors who do rate collection work, on the ground that he is doing rate collection work from October 20, the Finance Committee had earlier recommended that the Council inform him that it was not possible to pay him the enhanced allowance in view of the scheme adopted by the Council for the payment of travelling allowances, but that he would be eligible to receive the allowance of Rs. 30 if he used and maintained a motor cycle for his travelling.

The recommendation has been referred back to the Finance Committee for reconsideration in view of the fact that Mr. Liyanage is now drawing Rs. 20 and a ruling is required on the point whether he can be paid Rs 30 as his present allowance is inferior to the allowance of Rs. 30 drawn by other Distraining Inspectors (Cir 68 C.)

The Finance Committee recommends that Mr Liyanage be paid the increased allowance of Rs 30 if he uses and maintains a motor cycle for his work.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(22) To consider letter No RC. 134 of November 15, 1949, from the Director of Public Works stating that owing to the traffic density during peak hours on Peradeniya Bridge the provision of side walks on this bridge has become a need of the utmost urgency and that the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Transport and Works had instructed him to pursue the matter with the Kandy Municipal Council regarding the apportionment of the estimated cost of Rs 73,700 for this work between Government and the Council (Cir 27 C and D.)

The earlier recommendation made by the Committee was reconsidered. The Works Committee recommends that the Director of Public Works be informed that the Council much regrets that as the present unsatisfactory position of the Council's finances obliges it to exercise the utmost economy even in its routine expenditure it is not possible for the Council to make any contribution towards the cost of this work.

The Finance Committee recommends that the Director of Public Works be addressed in terms of the Works Committee's recommendation.

It was resolved that action be taken in terms of the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

(23) With reference to M. C. Resolution No 8 (37) of July 30, 1949, to consider whether this decision should be reconsidered in view of the representations made by the Ward Member stating that there is public objection to the removal of the two bus halting places in question from the Katugastota Bazaar area and of the withdrawal by the Trustee of the Madawala Road Mosque of the earlier representations he made asking that the two halting places be removed.

The resolution to remove the two halting places was passed by the Council in consequence of the representations made by the Police that there was no other method of solving the traffic congestion in the Katugastota Bazaar area (Cir 44 D.)

The Works Committee recommends that as the removal of the two halting places is the only possible method of solving traffic congestion in the bazaar area, action be taken to implement the earlier resolution of the Council and to remove the two halting places.

The Finance Committee recommends that the halting places be removed, as recommended by the Works Committee.

It was resolved that action be taken in terms of the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

(24) To obtain sanction for the purchase of the following materials from Messrs. The India Hume Pipe Co. Ltd., Colombo, which are required by the Works Department for urgent repairs to be carried out to barrel drains:—

The Finance Committee recommends that sanction be allowed accordingly.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(25) To consider letter from Mr. D. M. A. Wijesooriya dated January 21, 1950, the owner of premises 241/5, Katugastota Road, at which the M. C. Free Ayurvedic Dispensary is housed, stating that he has an offer of Rs. 13,500 for the premises and that the intending purchaser wants vacant possession thereof in two months. In these circumstances, he suggests that the Council purchase the premises at Rs. 13,500 or vacate the premises in order to enable him to sell the premises. (Cir. 52 B and C.)

The Health Committee recommends that Mr. Wijesooriya be informed that the building will be vacated as soon as suitable accommodation is found elsewhere for housing the dispensary.

The Finance Committee recommends that the recommendation of the Health Committee be adopted.

It was resolved that action be taken in terms of the recommendation.

(26) K. R. Jinadasa completed his probationary period in the post of Scavenging Kangany on January 11, 1950, and his confirmation is now due.

The M. O. H. recommends that Jinadasa be confirmed. (Cir. 55 B and C.)

The Health Committee recommends that Jinadasa be confirmed in his post.

The Finance Committee recommends that the recommendation of the Health Committee be adopted.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(27) To obtain sanction for the payment of a sum of Rs. 168 88 to the Government Agent, C. P., representing bill of costs in D. C., Kandy, case No. XI,038 in connection with the acquisition of land required for the Car Park at Mahaiyawa.

The Finance Committee recommends that sanction be allowed accordingly.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(28) To consider memorandum dated February 6, 1950, from the Municipal Commissioner, with reference to an enquiry made by the Commissioner of Labour by his letter No. EC 39 of January 13, 1950, what contribution the Council is prepared to make towards the cost of unemployment relief schemes undertaken in 1950, pointing out that the Council has provided Rs. 15,000 in its Budget for construction of culverts, drains, &c., at relief schemes and suggesting that the Commissioner of Labour be apprised of this fact and asked to exempt the Council from any further contributions. (Cir. 80 C)

The Finance Committee recommends that a communication be addressed to the Commissioner of Labour in terms of the Municipal Commissioner's suggestion.

It was resolved that action be taken in terms of the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

(29) To obtain sanction for the payment of a sum of Rs. 1,521.47 made to Messrs W. & T Avery Ltd, Colombo, in connection with the standard yard measure supplied by them to the Council.

The Finance Committee recommends that sanction be allowed accordingly.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(30) To obtain sanction for leasing to Mrs. P. W. de Soysa the encroachment of the road reservation of Lady Manning's Drive, 6 perches in extent, made by her at an annual rental of Re. 1.

The Finance Committee recommends that the encroachment be leased to Mrs Soysa at an annual rental of Re. 1.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(31) To obtain sanction for the payment of a commuted pension of Rs. 5,800 and a reduced annual pension of Rs. 1,740 in terms of pension rules 2 and 2 (A) (1), to Mr. S. F. Williams, who has retired from service.

The Finance Committee recommends that the payment of a commuted pension of Rs. 5,800 and a reduced annual pension of Rs. 1,740 to Mr. Williams be sanctioned.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

3A. With the leave of the Council, in Committee, the Mayor placed the following extracts from the minutes of a joint meeting of the Works and Finance Committees and of a meeting of the Finance Committee held prior to the general meeting of the Council. —

(32) To consider memo. dated January 17 from the Works Engineer pointing out that with the installation of the 'mono' pump at Katugastota it is unnecessary to have a staff of three men and a watcher and suggesting the retrenchment of one man immediately. The Works Engineer also reports that when the other Godiva pump is replaced by an electric pump, one man and a watcher would be sufficient for the station. (Cir. 51 C and D.)

The Works Committee at its meeting held on February 2, 1950, recommended that the Works Engineer be authorized to discontinue one out of the three men who has put in the least number of years' service for the present, and to consider the question of his re-employment for other work, if and when a suitable vacancy occurs.

Papers are re-submitted for consideration in view of the need, in the interests of economy, to make an early decision on the matter.

The Works and Finance Committees recommend that the Works Engineer be authorized to discontinue the most junior out of the men, in terms of the recommendation made by the Works Committee at its earlier meeting of February 2, 1950. The Works Engineer to be also authorized to look into possibility of one of the most junior out of the six men registered for casual employment as drivers being replaced by the man to be retrenched from the Katugastota Pumping Station staff.

It was resolved that the recommendation of the Works and Finance Committees be adopted.

(33) To consider applications received for the post of Artificer, Works Department.

The Works and Finance Committees recommend that Mr. W. H. Lewis Hanry be appointed to the post.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(34) To obtain a vote of Rs. 250 for the purpose of enabling the Works Engineer to employ a private draughtsman to take quantities and prepare plans of the three types of houses which the special committee on housing schemes requires in connection with the formulation of housing schemes for the middle and working classes, arising from item 8 of the minutes of the meeting of this Committee held on February 13, 1950. (Cir. 110 C and D.)

The Works and Finance Committees recommend that a vote of Rs. 250 be allowed for the purpose.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

(35) To consider application, made by the Public Assistance Committee for a supplementary vote of Rs. 2,500 towards the cost of supply of school books to children.

The Finance Committee recommends that a supplementary vote of Rs. 2,500 be allowed.

It was resolved that the recommendation be adopted. Mr. N. Wimalasena moved that the Council do resume and that it adopt the decisions made by it in Committee in regard to the several recommendations of the Standing Committees. Mr. P. B. A. Weerakoon seconded.—Carried.

10. The Mayor deplored the untimely death of Mr D. J. A. Abeyasinghe, retired Chief Revenue Inspector, who had served the Council loyally and efficiently for 34 years and he moved that a vote of appreciation of the

services rendered by this officer to the Council be placed on record, and that an expression of the Council's sincere sympathy with the widow and other members of the family, in their bereavement, be conveyed to them.

The vote was passed in the usual manner, all members standing.

The Minutes of Proceedings of the General Monthly Meeting of the Jaffna Municipal Council held at the Office of the Council on Friday, March 10, 1950 at 5 p.m.

Present.—C. Ponnambalam, Esq. (Mayor); S. R. Thalayasingham, Esq., (Deputy Mayor) Messrs R. B. Nalliah, P. M. John, D. James, J. Sebastianpillai, P. Casipillai, A. M. Brodie, S. Visuvalingam, S. S. Navaratnam, T. S. Durairajah, Kathi S. M. Aboobucker, Messrs S. A. Sabapathy and E. T. Hitchcock.

1. (a) The Minutes of proceedings of the General Meeting held on February 10, 1950, copies of which were previously circulated to all members were taken as read and confirmed subject to the alteration.—

To delete in item 21 the words:

“It was decided to accept Messrs. R. Chelliah & Co.'s quotation of Rs. 5.85 per gallon R. P. M. DELO 40 Caltex f.o.r., Jaffna” and to substitute “It was decided to defer the motion.”

(b) The Minutes of proceedings of the Special Meeting held on March 4, 1950, copies of which were previously circulated to all members were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Mr. S. Visuvalingam, M. M. C., presented a petition from the dhobies who wash in the pond called “Selianakulam” and the residents in that locality about the surface pollution of the area round about the pond.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. E. T. Hitchcock asked: (a) (i) “How many applications for Electricity Supply Service connections were pending at the beginning of the current year and how many of these have since been attended to?”

Reply: “The total number of applications pending at the beginning of the current year was 506. Number since attended to—50.”

(ii) “Out of the pending applications how many are for reconnection of already existing rentals?”

Reply: “All applications for new service”

(iii) “Will not applications for re-connection be given priority over new applications?”

Reply: "Applications for re-connections are given priority over new applications."

(iv) "Is there any resolution by this Council that applications for re-connection should also await attention according to the chronological order in which such applications were made?"

Reply: "No."

(v) "If so will the Mayor kindly furnish to the Council a list of all such applications with his recommendation to enable the Council to approve an order of priority?"

Reply: "Does not arise."

(vi) "At the rate service connections are being given at present, how long will it yet take to complete the outstanding list?"

Reply: "Within five months."

(b) (i) "Is there any possibility of the extension of the present electric mains along sections of important roads that are now without lights but with a large number of prospective consumers of electricity?—Vide item No. 5 of July 8, 1949?"

Reply: "I have taken steps for obtaining loan to meet the cost of extension. If the Council will authorize expenditure on advance account pending receipt of loan, extensions can be started within a month."

(ii) "Are there any difficulties in taking up the extensions, and if so, what are they?"

Reply: "Difficulties are that funds are not available and that delay might be involved in obtaining loan."

(iii) "In order to advise and help the Electricity Department in these matters, will the Mayor kindly recommend to the Council the appointment of a separate Standing Committee for the purpose or the assignment of such duties to the Works Committee to be re-named *Works and Electricity Committee*."

Reply: "In my opinion no such Committee is required. But the Works Committee might be re-named as suggested and be empowered to deal with questions affecting Electricity Department as well."

(c) (i) "What is the highest load the present engines at the Power House are capable of carrying making allowance for the necessary stand-by both by day and by night?"

Reply: "500 K. W."

(ii) "According to the highest load available to what extent house service connections and street lighting could be undertaken until the proposed Kankesanturai Power Station supply would be made available to this town?"

Reply: "Another 125 K. W. load can be connected up, viz., 275 service connections for lighting and fans only and 75 additional street lamps of 60 watts each"

(d) (i) "Reference my motion deferred until such time as legal opinion was sought and obtained on the matter vide item No. 5 of March 12, 1949, *re Revision of Assessment*, may I know whether any considered legal opinion has since been obtained on the matter, and if not at what stage the matter stands at present?"

Reply: "Advocate Mr. S. Soorasangan's opinion was obtained."

(ii) "Were my observations on the opinion expressed by Advocate Mr. S. Soorasangan on the matter circulated for the information of the members of this Council? If not, will the Mayor be pleased to circulate the file of papers now?"

Reply: "It is reported that the observations were not received."

(iii) "What is the delay in settling this very important matter? Is there any difficulty?"

Reply: "This question was settled in 1940. There is no difficulty whatever."

(iv) "May I know what the Mayor proposes to do in the matter and whether any action contemplated by him will be taken without any further delay?"

Reply: "I am acting according to law"

(e) "As the provision made in the draft budget for 1950, under Head 12, item (b) (v) was reduced by Rs 2,460 by the Finance Committee, will the Mayor kindly let the members know if the reduction affects the allowance made for the supply of Malted milk, coffee and sugar to the mothers admitted to the Council's Maternity Homes during their post-partum period. If

so, will the Mayor kindly see that the provision for the supply be not interfered with and retrenchment be effected on other items?"

Reply: "In the draft budget under Head 12, item (v) the sum of Rs 7,000 asked for under Child Welfare Work was reduced to Rs 5,000. The provision of amenities and medical comforts to expectant mothers admitted to maternity homes will not be affected by this reduction in the amount provided. Action is being taken to provide medical comforts to maternity homes."

(f) "What action, if any, has been taken in connection with my motions brought forward at the meeting of the Council held on August 12, 1949—Item Nos 9 (i) & (ii) *re Sales Tax and Pawn Brokers' licence fees*. It will be remembered that the Commissioner of Local Government on his last visit to Jaffna recommended at the conference he had with the members of the Council the imposition of a Sales Tax to augment the income of the Council?"

Reply: "Resolution No 9 (i) of August 12, 1949, was forwarded to the C. L. G. who replied that the matter was discussed by the Committee on Local Government Finance and that the Committee's report is being submitted to the Minister. A further report is awaited."

"Resolution No. 9 (ii) of August 12, 1949, was forwarded to the Minister for Health and Local Government for necessary action."

(g) "Reference item No. 21 of September 9, 1949, *re name boards for roads*—How many name boards have since been made and planted? If no action has been taken yet, what is the delay and who is responsible for the delay please? Will the Mayor kindly direct that this work be taken up without any further delay?"

Reply: "An estimate was submitted by the Assistant Superintendent of Works on July 28, 1949, for Rs. 4,325 and as there was no provision and also funds not available last year the work was not taken up. I am including this in the loan for maintenance of roads"

(h) "Reference my motion brought forward at the meeting of the Council held on October 14, 1949, *re Municipal Printing Press*—Has the Finance Committee considered the matter and if so what is the Committee's recommendation? If no action has yet been taken will the Mayor kindly move in the matter?"

Reply: "Inquiries from various Firms revealed that the establishment of a printing press is a very expensive item and in view of the depleted financial position of the Council the matter was left in abeyance. I shall be glad to move in the matter"

(i) "Will the Mayor please let the members know the result of the correspondence that was carried on with the Public Works Department regarding drains and drainage within the Municipal area—vide reply to my question—item No. 3 (ii) of September 9, 1949, and motion—item No 6 (vi) of May 13, 1949?"

Reply: "Public Works Department has sent the necessary plans but no estimate was prepared by them as the work has to be taken up by the Public Works Department. We are calling for the estimates from the Public Works Department to apply for a grant."

(j) "Reference my motion brought forward at the meeting of the Council held on October 14, 1949—Item No. 6—Has any report been made by the Mayor for consideration by this Council. If not, will the Mayor kindly give this matter his early attention and make a report to the Council?"

Reply: "My predecessor recorded the history of every officer concerned and no action appears to have been taken after that."

(k) (i) "Is the Mayor aware or has it ever been brought to his notice that certain sections of streets within the Municipality are obstructed by the residents along such sections using them as more or less permanent stables for horses and garages for motor cars, carriages, carts, &c.?"

Reply: "I shall make inquiries and find out whether there are such obstructions."

(k) (ii) "Will the Mayor kindly direct that in all such cases action may be taken against the offenders in terms of the provision in section 84 of Ordinance No. 29 of 1947?"

Reply: "If there are obstructions suitable action will be taken."

(l) (i). "Reference my motion brought forward at the meeting held on October 14, 1949—item No. 17—was any cart for scavenging employed after October, 1949, and if so, for how many days and at what cost please?"

(ii) "As the scavenging and removal of rubbish in the lanes in the eastern part of the town has even now not improved, will the Mayor kindly employ at least one cart to do this work along the lanes in the area referred to on the authority granted to him at the meeting referred to?"

Reply: (i) & (ii) No carts were employed for scavenging after October, 1949. The temporary suspension of work, due to break-down of the lorry, was resumed and the necessity for employing carts did not arise. At present, provision is made for the scavenging and removal of refuse in this area twice a week, by lorry. Provision has also been made in the Budget for this year for engaging carts and if and when there is a break-down in the lorry service. This will be availed of when the necessity arises.

(m) "As there appears to be several cases of unauthorized sales within the Municipal area of bread and aerated waters manufactured or prepared and dairy produce obtained from outside the area with resultant loss to those engaged in those trades within the area having obtained licences in respect of their trades, will the Mayor kindly direct that steps be taken to prevent such sales except with the written permission of the Mayor?"

Reply: This is desirable but enforcement of such requirement will be difficult. Further it would require all such articles made or manufactured in the town labelled as such with identification marks. This matter requires further inquiries before suitable recommendations can be made.

(n) (i) "Reference my motion brought forward at the meeting on October 14, 1949—item No. 40—As no provision has been made in the 1950 Budget for the grant of even temporary relief to the dhobies using the built ponds at Rakka Road, will the Mayor kindly look into the matter and take the necessary steps to give to these poor dhobies some assistance to carry on their work without any handicap or inconvenience owing to the flooding of the ponds and the land adjoining?"

(ii) "In this connection may I know whether the report of the Medical Officer of Health and the Assistant Superintendent of Works have been obtained and whether any action has been taken in the matter of the erection of washing places throughout the town—vide item No 13 (b) of April 8, 1949?"

Reply: (i) & (ii) This matter has been the subject of a joint report by my predecessor and the A. S. W., undated but submitted about the middle of May, 1949. The connected papers are with the A. S. W., presumably for further action.

3. (o) "Will the Mayor please let the members know whether a market-keeper was appointed during last year as authorized at the meeting of the Council held on December 17, 1949—Item No. 10. If an appointment was made, will the Mayor kindly report whether the watcher's work has been satisfactory during the short period he was working and whether in his opinion the continuance of the post is necessary?"

Reply: The appointment was made on December 22, 1949. The watcher's work has been satisfactory. The continuance of this post may be considered after another period of 6 months.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. E. T. Hitchcock moved: (i) "In order to combat the nuisance caused by the inconsiderable use of the wireless, loud-speakers, gramophones, and so on, I move that the following by-laws be adopted by this Council and brought into effect as early as possible—

No person shall—

(a) in any street or public place or in connection with any shop, business premises, or other place which adjoins any street or public place and to which the public are admitted; or

(b) upon any other premises

by operating or causing or suffering to be operated any wireless, loud-speaker, gramophone, amplifier, or similar instrument, make or cause or suffer to be made any noise which shall be loud and so continuous or repeated so as to cause a nuisance to occupants or inmates of any premises in the neighbourhood;

Provided that no proceedings shall be taken against any person for any offence against this by-law in respect of premises referred to in paragraph (b) thereof, unless the nuisance be continued after the expiration of a fortnight from the date of the service on such person of a notice alleging a nuisance, signed by not less than three householders residing within the hearing of the instrument aforesaid.

Any person offending against any of the foregoing by-laws shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding rupees fifty and to a fine not exceeding rupees twenty-five for every day during which the offence is continued after such conviction—Mr. A. M. Broodie seconded. 7 Voted for—None against—Carried

(ii) "I move that for the purpose of preparing a set of up-to-date by-laws, revising and consolidating the existing by-laws made by the previous Local Authorities of which the Municipal Council is the successor and for suggesting the provision of further by-laws which are found necessary in terms of the Municipal Council Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, the Legal Draftsman's Department, which has undertaken similar work for the Colombo Municipal Council be approached and the stipulated fee for the work determined to enable the Council to proceed with the work as in the absence of an up-to-date, amended and new set of by-laws, the members of the Council's Staff will be handicapped in entering prosecutions and establishing charges against contravention of the Council's by-laws." Mr. A. M. Broodie seconded and spoke in support of the motion. 6 Voted for—None against.—Carried

(iu) "I move that those street lights that were dismantled owing to the Black-out Regulations during the emergency period in World War II be re-fixed according to a priority list to be approved by the Mayor." Mr. A. M. Broodie seconded—pro forma. 8 Voted for—None against.—Carried

(iv) "As my motion brought forward at the meeting held on May 13, 1949—item No. 6 (vi) (a) re contribution of half share of the estimated cost of the side drain along the Old Park Road to the Public Works Department, which was agreed to by the Council, was turned down by the Finance Committee without assigning any reason therefore, vide reply to my question—item No. 3 (ii) of September 9, 1949—I move that this Council as the final authority in the matter, resolves to contribute the half-share of the estimated cost and in the first instance to advance the amount required to be settled after the work is completed and that the P. W. D. be written to accordingly and requested to take up the work." Mr. Sam A. Sabapathy seconded—pro forma—7 Voted for. None against.—Carried

5 (a) Pursuant to notice Mr. J. Sebastiampillai moved (i) "That this Council request the Government to open a Veterinary Hospital at Jaffna." Mr. T. S. Durairajah seconded Mr. E. T. Hitchcock with the permission of the Mayor suggested the following amendment:—

"That this Council request the Government to open a Veterinary Hospital at Jaffna on a land that would be given free by the Council."

The mover and seconder agreed. 8 Voted for. None against.—Carried

(ii) "That this Council request the Honourable the Minister for Industries, Industrial Research and Fisheries and Member for Jaffna to be good enough to have an Auction Sale Room, for the sale of fish, constructed at the Passaiyoor Beach." Mr. E. T. Hitchcock seconded—7 Voted for—None against.—Carried.

(iii) "That this Council request the Honourable the Minister for Transport and Works to order the erection of a retention wall along the beach within the Passaiyoor Fishery Harbour." Mr. D. James seconded. 5 Voted for—None against.—Carried.

(b) Pursuant to notice Mr A. M. Broodie moved. "This Council resolves to declare the area round the Jaffna Civil Hospital a "Silent Zone" and request the authorities to pass the necessary legislation for this purpose". Mr S. B. Thalayasingham seconded. 7 Voted for—None against.—Carried.

6. Mr. Sam A. Sabapathy pointed out that it was incorrect to bring forward supplementary votes without first preparing a "supplementary Budget" and thereafter publishing same in the *Government Gazette*.

The Mayor ruled that the consideration of item 6 in respect of supplementary votes was in order.

Mr A. M. Broodie proposed and Mr. J. Sebastiampillai seconded that the recommendations of the Finance Committee in respect of the following items be accepted 7 Voted in favour None against.—Carried

(a) Improving the lane leading southward from Ghemmani Road connecting Ananthanvadaly Road—and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to execute the work and to sanction Rs 3,200

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee and to sanction a supplementary vote of Rs 3,200 under Head 17 (a)

(b) Construction of a retaining wall with masonry edges to St. Patrick's Road and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to execute the work and to sanction Rs. 2,000.

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee and to sanction a supplementary vote of Rs. 2,000 under Head 17 (a).

(c) Improvements to Vannankulam Lane by metalling and tarring and the decision of the Finance Committee not to recommend the execution of the work

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee and to sanction a supplementary vote of Rs. 1,450 under head 17 (a).

16. Considered letter dated March 2, 1950, from Mr. A. 19. Considered application dated March 3, 1950, from the Correspondence Clerk and Stenographer, regarding a monthly overtime allowance for attending the meetings and meeting papers after the usual office hours and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to refer same to the Council together with the report of the Accountant.

Decided to pay overtime according to Government Financial Regulations to the Correspondence Clerk, the Stenographer and any other minor employee of the Council who attend to all meetings, connected matters and other works of the Council after office hours, and to sanction a supplementary vote of Rs. 750 under head 1 (a) to pay overtime from January 1, 1950.

The Council unanimously decided to contest the action if and when the damage is claimed in a competent Court of Law.

Messrs. T. S. Durairajah, A. M. Brodie and S. A. Sabapathy participated in the discussion and suggested the increase of the rent.

Unanimously decided to allow the renewal of the lease for the next three years and to increase the rent to Rs. 100 per mensem.

28. Considered application of March 6, 1950, from Mr. A. Thanotherampillai (of the Store Department of this Council) to make him a permanent employee of the Council.

Decided to refer the matter to the Finance Committee.

29. Considered estimates and connected papers regarding the:—

Sebastampillai moved:—"This Council is of opinion that the present Acting Commissioner is discharging his duties satisfactorily at present and requests the Local Government Service Commission to postpone the making of permanent appointment till July, 1950, when the Commission can review the suitability of the present Acting Commissioner for being made permanent". Mr. S. R. Thalaysingham seconded. 11 voted for Mr. R. R. Nalliah voted against—Carried.

32. Considered letter from Mr. S. Handy-Perumbanayagan, asking for permission to put up free of rent one Advertisement Board (in connection with the Kokkuvil Hindu College Carnival) at the Grand Bazaar Market.

Mr. A. M. Brodie proposed and Mr. E. T. Hitchcock seconded that permission be granted to put up free of rent one Advertisement Board at the Grand Bazaar Market.—Carried unanimously.

33. Considered papers relating to raising loan for improving all roads as suggested by the Commissioner of Local Government at the Special Meeting of the Council on February 28, 1950.

Unanimously decided to recommend the application for a loan of Rs. 187,000 for improvements to all roads.

34. The following resolutions adopted by the Sanitation Committee were tabled for the information of the members of the Council —

- (i) "This Committee notes with regret that in spite of the letter from the Chairman of the Sanitation Committee dated January 30, 1950, no action has been taken regarding cesspool near the Hospital Junction".
- (ii) "This Committee recommends that Sanitary Inspectors in charge of various wards to go round more frequently and report on the complaints received from the residents regarding sanitary matters in general and conservancy complaints in particular".
- (iii) "This Committee requests the Medical Officer of Health to report on the measures that should be taken to prevent 'Surface Pollution' of public places in the town in general".
- (iv) "This Committee recommends a widespread campaign to be launched for inoculation against typhoid and tuberculosis".
