The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947

BY-LAWS for the area comprised within the limits of the Municipal Council of Colombo, made by the Municipal Council of Colombo, under sections 267 and 272 (20) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, and approved by the Minister of Health and Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 268 of the Ordinance (as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947) and confirmed by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

BY-LAWS

1. (1) No person shall use any premises for the storage or manufacture of jaggery for sale except under the authority of a licence issued in that behalf by the Commissioner: Provided, however, that no licence shall be necessary in respect of any premises which is used for the storage or manufacture of jaggery solely for sale by retail.

(2) No person shall be entitled to a licence under paragraph (1) unless—

- (i) the place at which the jaggery is to be stored or manufactured is approved by the Commissioner; and
- (ii) any building which is to be used for the purpose of storing or manufacturing jaggery is in conformity with the following requirements:—
 - (a) the building must be in good repair, well ventilated and well lighted;
 - (b) each of the rooms where the jaggery is to be stored must have a minimum floor area of at least one hundred and twenty square feet and must be provided, for the purposes of ventilation, with doors and windows capable of opening either directly or through an open verandah into an external air space and having an aggregate opening of not less than one-seventh of the superficial floor area of the room; the windows and doors must also be covered with fly-proof wire mesh and each of the doors must be provided with spring hinges;
 - (c) the building must have a kitchen which has a superficial floor area of not less than eighty square feet, an efficient smoke vent and at least one window capable of being opened into an external air space; each such window when opened must have an area of not less than one-fifteenth the area of the floor space; no smoke vent shall be necessary where gas or electricity is used;
 - (d) the kitchen and the store room in the building must have no direct internal communication on the same floor with any part of a dwelling-house;
 - (e) the building must be provided with adequate surface drainage, a sanitary bin and latrine accommodation;
 - (f) the floor of the building must be cemented throughout;
 - (g) the wood-work of the building must be oil-painted;
 - (h) the building must be provided with a pipe-borne water supply from the town mains for the use of the manufactory;
 - (i) the building must be provided with separate rest and meal rooms for the workers;
 - (j) the average height of every room in the building must be not less than ten feet and the height in no place must be less than seven feet and the walls must be built of some permanent material with the inside thereof lime-plastered and lime-washed;
 - (k) there must be no open drains anywhere within the building;
 - (l) the store room in the building must be provided with a ceiling of asbestos or closely fitting planks.

2. (1) No person shall use any premises for the storage or manufacture of sherbet or sweetmeats for sale except under the authority of a licence issued in that behalf by the Commissioner:

Provided, however, that no licence shall be necessary in respect of any premises which is used for the storage or manufacture of sherbet or sweetmeats solely for sale by retail.

(2) No person shall be entitled to a licence under paragraph (1) unless—

- (i) the place at which the sherbet or sweetmeats are to be stored or manufactured is approved by the Commissioner; and
- (ii) any building which is to be used for the purpose of storing or manufacturing sherbet or sweetmeats is in conformity with the following requirements:—
 - (a) the building must be in good repair, well ventilated and well lighted and each of the rooms used for the storage of sherbet or sweetmeats must have a minimum area of at least one hundred and twenty square feet and must be provided for the purposes of ventilation with doors and windows capable of opening either directly or through an open verandah into an external air space and having an aggregate opening of not less than one-seventh of the superficial floor area of the room; each of these rooms must be provided with a ceiling of asbestos or closely fitting planks;
 - (b) the doors and windows of every room in the building used for storing or manufacturing sherbet or sweetmeats must be covered with fly-proof wire mesh and the doors must be provided with spring hinges;
 - (c) the rooms in the building used for storing or manufacturing sherbet or sweetmeats must have no direct internal communication on the same floor with any part of a dwelling-house;
 - (d) the floor of the building must be cemented throughout;
 - (e) the wood-work of the building must be oil-painted;
 - (f) the building must be provided with a pipe-borne water supply from the town mains;
 - (g) the building must be provided with adequate surface drainage, a sanitary dust bin and latrine accommodation;
 - (h) the building must be provided with separate rest rooms and meal rooms for the workers;
 - (i) the average height of every room in the building must be not less than ten feet and the height in no place must be less than seven feet and the walls must be built of some permanent material with the inside thereof lime-plastered and lime-washed;
 - (j) there must be no open drains anywhere within the building;
 - (k) the building must be provided with glass cases to keep the sweetmeats so that such food might not be exposed to flies and dust;

3. (1) No person shall use any premises for the storage or manufacture of papadams for sale except under the authority of a licence issued in that behalf by the Commissioner:

Provided, however, that no licence shall be necessary in respect of any premises which is used for the storage or manufacture of papadams solely for sale by retail.

(2) No person shall be entitled to a licence under paragraph (1) unless—

- (i) the place at which the papadams are stored or manufactured is approved by the Commissioner; and
- (ii) any building which is used for the purpose of storing or manufacturing papadams is in conformity with the following requirements:—
 - (a) the building must be in good repair, well ventilated and well lighted and each of the rooms where the kneading or storing is done must have a minimum floor area of at least one hundred and twenty square

- feet and must be provided for the purposes of ventilation with doors and windows capable of opening either directly or through an open verandah to an external air space and having an aggregate opening of not less than one-seventh of the superficial floor area of the room;
- (b) the building must be provided with tables of closely fitting planks for the purposes of kneading;
- (c) the kneading and store rooms in the building must have no direct internal communication on the same floor with any part of a dwelling-house;
- (d) the floor of the building must be cemented throughout;
- (e) the wood-work in the building must be oil-painted;
- (f) the building must be provided with a pipe-borne water supply from the town mains;
- (g) the building must be provided with adequate surface drainage, a sanitary dust bin and latrine accommodation;
- (h) the building must be provided with separate rest and meal rooms for the workers;
- (i) the average height of every room in the building must be not less than ten feet and the height in no place must be less than seven feet and the walls must be built of some permanent material with the inside thereof lime-plastered and lime-washed;
- (j) there must be no open drains anywhere within the building;
- (k) the kneading room and store room in the building must be provided with ceilings of asbestos or closely fitting planks;
- (l) platforms which must be not less than three feet from the ground must be provided in the building for placing the flour used for manufacturing papadams; and
- (iii) where drying is necessary, there must be an enclosed place within the premises where the papadams are to be manufactured or stored, with platforms (not less than three feet from the ground) which should be provided with wooden or metal trays for drying the papadams.
4. (1) No person shall use any premises for the storage or manufacture of delicatessen for sale except under the authority of a licence issued in that behalf by the Commissioner:
- Provided, however, that no licence shall be necessary in respect of any premises which is used for the storage or manufacture of delicatessen solely for sale by retail.
- (2) No person shall be entitled to a licence under paragraph (1) unless—
- (i) the place at which the delicatessen is to be stored or manufactured is approved by the Commissioner, and
- (ii) any building which is to be used for the purposes of storing or manufacturing the delicatessen is in conformity with the following requirements:—
- (a) the building must be in good repair, well ventilated and well lighted and each of the rooms in the building where the delicatessen is stored must have a minimum floor area of at least one hundred and twenty square feet and must be provided for the purposes of ventilation with doors and windows capable of opening either directly or through an open verandah into an external air space and having an aggregate opening of not less than one-seventh of the superficial floor area of the room;
- (b) the building must be provided with glass cases to keep the delicatessen so that such food might not be exposed to flies and dust;
- (c) the floor of the building must be cemented throughout;
- (d) the building must be provided with a kitchen which has a superficial floor area of not less than eighty square feet, an efficient smoke vent and at least one window capable of being opened into an external air space; each such window when opened must have an area of not less than one-fifteenth the area of the floor space; no smoke vent shall be necessary where gas or electricity is used;
- (e) the building must be provided with at least two spittoons for the use of the customers;
- (f) the building must be provided with a pipe-borne water supply from the town mains;
- (g) the building must be provided with rooms which have no direct internal communication on the same floor with any part of a dwelling-house;
- (h) the average height of every room in the building must be not less than ten feet and the height in no place must be less than seven feet and the walls must be built of some permanent material with the inside thereof lime-plastered and lime-washed;
- (i) there must be no open drains anywhere within the building.

BY-LAWS under section 49 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), made by the Village Committee of the Palie Pattu village area in the Kukul Korale of the Ratnapura District, and approved by the Minister of Health and Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by sub-section (3) of that section, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

BY-LAWS

Roads and Paths

1. (1) No person shall—
- (a) damage, obstruct, encroach upon, or otherwise interfere with the use of, any public road or path; or
- (b) except with the permission of the Committee, divert the line of any public road or path.
- (2) For the purpose of this by-law "public road or path" includes a public road or path which is in the course of construction.
2. (1) It shall be the duty of the proprietors and cultivators of any paddy field through which a public path runs to maintain such path at its customary width.
- (2) No person shall cut or encroach upon any public path running through a paddy field so as to reduce its width to less than its customary width.
3. Where a range of paddy fields through which any public road or path passes is under cultivation, the cultivators of such range shall be entitled, with the previous permission of the Chairman and subject to such terms and conditions as he may impose, to put up a temporary gate across such road or path during the period of cultivation in order to prevent trespass by cattle.
4. (1) Whenever any work of construction or of repair is commenced on any public road or path, the Chairman shall have the power to prohibit the use of such road or

path by the public for such time as may be necessary, after giving at least three days' notice by beat of tom-tom or otherwise.

(2) It shall be lawful for the Committee, by a resolution in that behalf, to restrict or to prohibit the use of any public road or path by any kind or class of heavy vehicular traffic.

(3) Where a restriction or prohibition is imposed under paragraph (2) of this by-law in respect of any public road or path, the Chairman shall cause a notice setting out the restriction or prohibition in English, Sinhalese and Tamil to be displayed conspicuously at the beginning and at the end of such road or path and at its junction with any other road or path.

(4) No person shall fail to conform to the requirements of any notice displayed under paragraph (3) of this by-law.

5 It shall be lawful for any person thereunto authorised in writing by the Chairman—

- (1) to enter between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. with all necessary workmen, vehicles, animals and implements upon any land adjacent to or near any existing or proposed public road or path for the purpose of doing any work connected with such road or path,
- (2) to throw upon any land adjacent to or near any such road or path any earth, rubbish or materials which it may be necessary to remove from the place of any such work;
- (3) to make any temporary road through the ground near any such road or path during the execution of any such work, or
- (4) to enter upon any land for the purpose of constructing, repairing or cleaning such drains, watercourses or culverts as it may be necessary for the preservation, improvement, repair or construction of any public road or path.

Provided that the earth, rubbish or materials referred to in paragraph (2) are removed within a reasonable time, and the temporary road referred to in paragraph (3) shall not run over any ground whereon any building stands, or over any enclosed garden or yard.

6. In these by-laws—

“ Chairman ” means the Chairman of the Committee, and

“ Committee ” means the Village Committee of the Palle Pattu village area in the Kukul Korale of the Ratnapura District.

2. The post carries a salary of Rs. 840 per annum, rising by 16 annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 1,992 per annum, with an efficiency bar before Rs. 1,488 per annum. A rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be paid according to Government regulations. No special temporary allowance is payable.

3. Applicants should be Ceylonese* and be not less than 17 years of age nor more than 25 years of age on May 10, 1950, and should have passed the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination, or equivalent or higher examination. Preference will be given to those who have had experience in accounts.

4. Applications will also be considered from persons holding permanent posts in the service of a Local Authority irrespective of age and academic qualifications, provided they are otherwise qualified for the post. Applications from such candidates should be forwarded through the Mayor or Chairman of the Local Body in which they are serving. In the case of Ceylonese servicemen the period of their mobilized service will be deducted from their ages for purposes of eligibility.

5. The selected candidate will be on one year's probation or trial and will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the regulations made thereunder.

6. The selected candidate will be required to furnish security either in cash or by fidelity guarantee bond through a guarantee association approved by the Commission.

7. Applications in the candidates' own handwriting, stating age, qualifications, date and place of birth of father, and experience, together with copies only of testimonials, should reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, not later than May 10, 1950.

The Committee recommend (1) that a sum not exceeding Rs. 500 be allocated to meet the cost of providing light refreshments to the school children attending the celebrations, (2) that the use of the Council's Radiogram, microphone, lorries, labour and materials in connection with the celebrations be approved.

2. To consider and report on the draft notice inviting applications for the post of Watcher, Cattle-pound and Store, St. Mary's Street, Negombo.

Colombo) by the appointment of an officer from among storekeepers in the Local Government Service, on the higher scale of salary assigned to the Assistant Storekeeper, Colombo M. C.

The Committee recommend (1) that the vacant post of Storekeeper be filled by the appointment of an officer on the higher scale of salary assigned to the post of Assistant Storekeeper, Colombo M. C., and that it be recommended to the Commission that the candidate to be selected for appointment should furnish the Council with security in the sum of Rs 3,000 in cash, or Rs 6,000 in immovable property situate within the Municipality of Negombo, (2) that Mr. J. M. Perera, Storekeeper, be released from his duties as soon as possible, and that the Cashier be appointed to act for the Storekeeper, in addition to his own duties, on payment of additional remuneration as prescribed by the Financial Rules of Government, temporary clerical assistance being given to the Cashier during the period that he acts for the Storekeeper.

Mr. Dheen proposed and Mr. Francis Fernando seconded that the recommendations be adopted.—Carried.

3A. The Mayor, at this stage, with the permission of the House, tabled letter dated March 7, 1950, from Mr. S. K. Wijeratnam, M.M.C., intimating his inability to be present at the meeting of Council, asking for leave of absence, and requesting that the consideration of Item 4 of the Agenda be deferred.

The Mayor proposed and Dr. Croos da Brera seconded that the leave asked for be granted.—Carried.

4. To consider the recommendations of the Special Committee of the whole Council appointed by resolution No. 15 of January 24, 1950, to look into the matter of extending, re-dividing and increasing the wards of the Negombo M. C. area, dated February 21, 1950 (a copy of which had been furnished to each Councillor)—Tabled.

Resolved that the recommendations be considered when the final report of the Committee is submitted to the Council.

5 To consider the recommendations of the Standing Committee on Finance, dated February 28, 1950 (a copy of which had been furnished to each Councillor).

(1) Dr. Croos da Brera referred to items 2, 20 and 37 where it is recommended that the papers be circulated among the members of the Standing Committee and re-submitted to a meeting of the Committee, and desired to know whether the papers could be circulated among Councillors who are not members of the Committee.

The Mayor said that if the Standing Committee desired such circulation necessary at that stage, it would have recommended accordingly; that the papers could be inspected or perused by any Councillor in the Municipal Office with the permission of the Commissioner; and that, in cases of urgency, he may circulate any matter among all the Councillors and/or place such matter direct before the Council, without reference to a Standing Committee.

(2) With reference to item 5, Mr. Jayamanne requested that a list of officers to whom advances have been made for the purchase of means of transport, with particulars of re-payments, be tabled at the next meeting of the Committee.

(3) Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

(4) *Re* item 36, the Mayor submitted a draft notice calling for applications for the post.—Read.

Resolved (i) that the amount of security prescribed in the notice be reduced to Rs. 500 and that security be also accepted if this sum is furnished in immovable property situate within the limits of the Municipality of Negombo.

(ii) that the Notice be approved after amendment as above.

(iii) that applications when received be dealt with by the Mayor in consultation with the Chairman of the Standing Committees ‘ A ’ and ‘ B ’ and the Commissioner.

6. Pursuant to Notice, the Mayor moved:—(1) "This Council, by virtue of the powers vested in it under section 33 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, do generally delegate to the Deputy Mayor all the powers, duties or functions conferred or imposed upon or vested in it by or under the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, or by any other written law, excepting such powers, duties or functions as may be delegated by the Mayor to the Commissioner, to be exercised or performed, as the case may be, by him, when specially delegated by the Mayor to act for him". Dr. Croos da Brera seconded.—Carried.

(2) "The Central Government be requested to establish and maintain at Negombo a Home for the Aged, as, in the opinion of this Council, there is a need for such a Home in this Town".

Dr. Croos da Brera brought to the notice of the House that he had information that a benevolent gentleman has an intention of donating about ten acres of land in the town for such a purpose, and said that before the motion is considered he wished to have some time to ascertain more particulars regarding this information.

The Mayor, with the permission of the House, agreed to have the motion deferred till the next meeting of the Council.

(3) "This Council do request the Central Government to construct an Infectious Diseases Hospital, on the outskirts of this Town and on a site to be selected by the Government in consultation with this Council, in place of the building which is reported to have been washed away by the sea".

7. (i) Pursuant to Notice, Mr. J. F. Guneratne moved (under by-law No 9 (e) of the by-laws relating to procedure at meetings):—

(4) "The electricity service be extended to cover the whole of St Anthony's Road". Mr. Gilbert Fernando seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the matter be submitted to the Finance Committee.

9. Pursuant to Notice, Mr. T. David Mendis moved:—

(1) "The culvert at the western end of the Temple Road in close proximity to Mr. Goonewardene's estate is subject to floods during the rainy season owing to the rapid flow of water on either side of the road, with the result that the public of the area experience great difficulty in crossing the culvert as the entire area gets flooded; hence action be taken by this Council to put up a new culvert bigger than the present one for the convenience of the public". The Deputy Mayor seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the papers be referred to a joint meeting of the Finance and Works Committees.

(2) "The Katuapitiya Road from the Kurusagahamulla Junction up to the bridge should be metalled and tarred for the convenience of the public". Mr. John Silva seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the papers be referred to a joint meeting of the Finance and Works Committees.

10. Pursuant to notice, Dr. V. Croos da Brera moved.—(1) (a) (i) "In the opinion of this Council, urgent extensions, structural alterations and improvements to the New and Old Resthouses at Negombo are necessary in order that these institutions might be so equipped as to be in a position to cater to the ever-increasing number of tourists and other visitors who patronise them.

(ii) Inasmuch as the New and Old Resthouses and the premises belonging to them are the property of the Crown—the control only being vested in this Council—this Council do request the Central Government to take immediate steps to secure the services of the Government Town Planner or any other competent Architect to advise the Government, after consultation with this Council, on a scheme of extensions, structural alterations and improvements.

(iii) The Central Government, after this Council has approved of the scheme of extensions, structural alterations and improvements, do take early steps to implement the scheme.

(iv) A Special Committee of this Council be appointed to prepare, in detail, a scheme for extensions, structural alterations and improvements to the New and Old Resthouses to enable such scheme to be referred to the Government Town Planner or other Architect who may be appointed by the Government to look into the Council's report". Mr. Jayamanne seconded.—Carried.

(b) Resolved that a Special Committee consisting of the following Councillors be appointed for the purpose indicated in resolution No. (1) (a) (iv) above, viz., the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor, Mr. Jayamanne, Mr. Wijeratnam, and Dr. Croos da Brera.

(2) (a) This Council is of opinion that the rule compelling civil and teacher pensioners personally to draw their pensions at the Kachcheries though incapacitated owing to chronic paralysis and other serious ailments, should be rescinded, as it entails great inconvenience, hardship and unnecessary expense.

(b) Copies of this resolution be forwarded to the authorities concerned". Mr. Gilbert Fernando seconded.—Carried.

11. Pursuant to Notice, Mr. E. John Silva moved:—

(1) "The Central Government be requested to open a sub-Post Office at a central spot at Kurana, Negombo, to serve the needs of the residents of this fast developing area". Mr. Guneratne seconded.—Carried.

(2) "This Council do take early action (a) to remove the Trenching Ground at Kurana to the outskirts of this Town, (b) to provide Model Houses for the working classes on the Council's land, Blake Estate, which is presently used for the burial of night soil, meeting the expenditure thereon from a Government grant and loan". The Deputy Mayor seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the papers be referred to the Finance Committee.

(3) "In view of the inconvenience caused to non-Catholic residents of the Kurana area, who are obliged to travel a distance of nearly 4 miles to bury or cremate their dead at the General Cemetery, Negombo, this Council do open a General Cemetery at a central spot in Kurana to serve the non-Catholic residents of the area, in particular". Mr. David Mendis seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the papers be referred to the Finance Committee.

12. Pursuant to notice, Mr. K. S. E. A. Gilbert

Fernando moved.—(1) "In view of the insanitary conditions now prevailing, on account of the absence of a public latrine, in the canal area towards the Southern end of Munnakkare, immediate steps be taken to construct a latrine, provision for which has been made in the 1950 budget under a token vote". Mr. John Silva seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that the papers be referred to the Finance Committee.

(2) "As the Munnakkare bridge is nearing completion, the Central Government be requested to expedite the

work of the contemplated bridge connecting Mankuliya and Pitipana". Mr. David Mendis seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the M. P. for Negombo, with a request that he should contact the Hon. the Minister of Transport and Works in this connection.

(3) "In view of the unemployment relief work now carried on at Munnakkare coming to an end by April, 1950, due to lack of funds, the Central Government be requested to provide sufficient funds to continue the scheme, with a view to reclaiming low-lying Crown land and thereby providing employment to the unemployed". The Deputy Mayor seconded.—Carried.

Resolved that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the M. P. for Negombo, with a request that he should contact the Hon. the Minister of Labour and Social Services in this connection.

(4) "The Members of the permanent establishment of this Council who have already applied for electricity supply to the houses in which they live be given priority". The Deputy Mayor seconded.

On the suggestion of Mr. Dheen, resolved that the applications of Council's employees on the permanent establishment which are already in the priority list, be given priority immediately after the applicants in the list who have already made deposits on account of service connection fees.

13. To consider letter dated February 21, 1950, from the Hon. Secretary, Negombo Muslim League, forwarded by Dr. V. Croos da Brera, Member for Ward No. 2 *re* protection of 15 houses at Kamachchode which are exposed to damage from sea erosion during the monsoon months of May and June.

The Mayor read letter dated March 6, 1950, received from Mr. H. de Z. Siriwardene, M.P., and said that he inspected the area with Dr. Croos da Brera, and the Executive Engineer, P.W.D., Negombo, who, he said, was of the view that immediate action should be taken in the matter.

Mr. Gilbert Fernando seconded.—Carried.

14. To consider letter dated March 1, 1950, from the Manager, Dreamlands Carnival, requesting permission to run a carnival and amusements at the Negombo Esplanade or at the Playground at Vistarini Avenue for a period of two weeks from March 11, 1950.

Resolved that permission be granted to use the playground at Vistarini Avenue for the purpose of running the carnival, on payment of a ground rent of Rs. 50 per diem for a period commencing on March 18 or earlier and ending on April 1, on making a deposit of such sum as may be fixed by the Mayor as security against damage to the grounds—the prescribed performance licence fees and the entertainment taxes being payable by the management, and also the gate admission fees being fixed at not less than 25 cents per ticket.

15. Dr. Croos da Brera proposed and Mr. David Mendis seconded that Messrs. Francis Fernando, Gilbert Fernando and Jayamanne be appointed for the purpose.—Carried.

19. To appoint Mr. W. P. Mendis, Clerk-Stenographer, to be in addition to his other duties, Clerk of Meetings, with effect from January 1, 1950

Resolved that the matter be submitted to the Finance Committee.

20. To consider the question of inviting a suitable person to declare open the first section of the Munnakkare Housing Scheme, comprising of 20 houses, which will be completed by the end of March, 1950.

Resolved that the Hon. Mr. S. W. R. D. Bandaranaike, Minister of Health and Local Government, be invited for the purpose

21. To consider letter No. D. B. 153 of February 24, 1950, from the C. L. G. *re* certification as to correctness of the true account of all the moneys received and paid by virtue of Ordinance No. 61 of 1939, during the year ended on December 31, 1949, and statement of the assets and liabilities existing at the said date.

Resolved that the Municipal Commissioner be appointed to certify to the correctness of the accounts.

22. To consider letter No. D. 132 of February 27, 1950, from the C. L. G. *re* publication of minutes of proceedings of meetings and statement of accounts of M. Cs. tabled.

The Committee recommend that the consideration of the application be deferred.

12. To consider and report on application dated December 3, 1949, from W. P. Nanda, Labourer, Works Department, for an advance of Rs 250 to purchase a bicycle.

The Committee recommend that the consideration of the application be deferred.

13. To consider and report on application dated January 9, 1950, from the office peons requesting that they may be permitted to purchase cloth and to have the three coats allowed to them annually tailored, by tailors of their choice—the cost being met by the Council

The Committee recommend that the application be not granted and that the coats be continued to be supplied as in the past.

14. To consider and report on application dated January 13, 1950, for a re-vote of the unexpended balance of the vote of Rs. 500 provided in 1949, under estimate A.2 (h) cost of vehicle, boat and assessment plates, for meeting payments for fixing assessment plates.

The Committee recommend that the re-vote be approved.

15. To consider and report on application dated December 5, 1949, made on behalf of W. Dona Agnesia for exemption from the payment of rates on premises No. 224, Sea Street, on the ground of poverty, and report of the Revenue Inspector thereon.

The Committee recommend that the sum of Rs. 8.32 due as arrears of rates up to and including the 4th quarter 1949, be waived on the ground of poverty.

16. To consider and report on application dated January 13, 1950, from Inesia Fernando for exemption from the payment of rates on premises No. 21/3, Canal Road, on the ground of poverty, and report of the Revenue Inspector thereon.

The Committee recommend that the sum of Rs. 16.04 due as arrears of rates up to and including the 4th quarter 1949, be waived on the ground of poverty.

17. To consider and report on application dated October 24, 1949, from Dona Vincent Philip for exemption from the payment of rates on premises No. 229, Colombo Road, on the ground of poverty, and report of the Revenue Inspector thereon.

The Committee recommend that the application be not granted.

18. To consider and report on application dated October 18, 1949, from Mrs. C. R. M. Fernando for waiving of rates on premises No. 228, 229 and 230, Chilaw Road, for 2nd, 3rd and 4th quarters of 1947, as the said premises had been demolished in the beginning of 1947.

The Committee recommend that the sum of Rs. 2.70 due as arrears of rates be waived as it is inconsiderable.

The Committee recommend that the papers be referred to Messrs. Wijeratnam and Dheen for their observations.

24. To consider and report on papers *re* regulations relating to hiring car stands, &c.

The Committee recommend that the papers be referred to Messrs. Wijeratnam and Dheen for their observations.

25. To consider and report on building application of Mr. L. J. Shelton Fernando for erection of a building at No. 35, Sea Street (B. A. No. 158/1950), and connected papers.

The Committee recommend (1) that the application be allowed provided—(a) that the applicant enters into an agreement undertaking to demolish that portion of his building falling within 10 feet of the western boundary and adjoining the Council's office premises, without having the right to demand any compensation therefor, on two months' notice being given of the Council's intention to erect a building, lay a road or carry out any other constructional work on the Council's land, and (b) that the applicant and his successors in title agree to the Council allowing the owner of the premises on the northern boundary to build on his premises at a future date leaving 7½ feet from that boundary; (2) that the draft deed of agreement be approved subject to such alterations that the Mayor may deem necessary to authorise.

26. To recommend that a supplementary vote of Rs. 675 be passed under the Head of Estimates E. Sub-head (2) Item (b) Carts, bulls and lorries, to meet the cost of repairing the two lorries used on scavenging and conservancy works.

The Committee recommend that the papers be re-submitted to it after a reply to the letter addressed by the Mayor to Mr. H. de Z. Siriwardene, M.P., on the subject, is received.

31. To consider and report on letter No. R.W.22A of November 1, 1949, from the D.P.W. intimating that it is proposed to construct the side drains, Negombo-Veyangoda Road, in four stages—the estimates for the entire work amounting to Rs. 30,590 and of which the contribution payable by the Council being Rs. 17,590, and requesting the remittance of a sum of Rs. 4,397.50 being ¼ the Council's contribution, which is the amount required in respect of the 1st year of construction, so that steps may be taken to sanction the estimate and put the work in hand, and report of the Acting Superintendent of Works thereon.

The Committee recommend that the papers be referred to the Standing Committee 'B'—Works, for consideration.

32. To consider and report on letter No. E/849 of February 16, 1950, from the Chief Valuer, inquiring whether the Council is agreeable to the payment of a fee calculated at ½ per cent. of the total value plus travelling expenses (with a minimum of Rs. 20 plus travelling expenses) to enable him to take necessary steps to value the land required for acquisition for removal of blind corners at the junctions of Sea Street with 1st and 2nd Cross Streets, and report of the Acting Superintendent of Works thereon.

The Committee recommend that the Council do agree to the payment of the Chief Valuer's fee.

39. To consider and report on application dated January 16, 1950, submitted by Mrs. N. Gooneyardene, Public Health Nurse, for an enhanced uniform allowance as allowed to her last year.

The Committee recommend that the application be allowed, and that a sum of Rs. 150 be assigned in respect of the current year for the purchase of uniforms, shoes and stockings.
