The Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939

Order under Section 30

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No 61 of 1939, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,773 of September 24, 1947, I, Solomon West Ridgeway Dias Bandaranaike, Minister of Health and Local Government, do hereby—

- (1) revoke the Order published in *Gazette* No 9,238 of February 18, 1944, in so far as that Order relates to—
 - (a) the limits of the town of Hatton-Dickoya, and
 - (b) the limits of the wards (therein called "electoral divisions") of the town of Hatton-Dickoya,
- (2) order that—
 - (a) the limits of the town of Hatton-Dickoya shall be those defined in the First Schedule hereto, and
 - (b) the limits of the wards of the town of Hatton-Dickoya shall be those defined in the Second Schedule hereto; and
- (3) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) shall—
 - (a) in so far as they relate to any matter connected with the general election of the members due to be held in the year 1950, come into effect on the date hereof; and
 - (b) in so far as they relate to any other matter, come into effect on the day immediately following the date of the expiration of the term of office of the members of the Hatton-Dickoya Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof

FIRST SCHEDULE

Limits of the town of Hatton-Dickoya

North By a line drawn from a point 200 feet west of the centre of the Dimbulla-Hatton road and in line with the northern boundary of the Kuda Oya burial ground (P. P 6,987) south-eastwards

crossing the said road and along the northern boundary of the said burial grounds to the landmark at its north-eastern corner

East By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards along the landmarked eastern boundary of the Kuda Oya burial ground (P. P. 6,987) to a point 200 feet east of the centre of Dimbulla-Hatton road, thence by a line drawn southwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 feet from the centre of the said road to a point 200 feet due east of culvert No 7/6 on the said road, thence by a line drawn eastwards to the north-western corner of the property of K. Naina Mohammodu, thence by a line drawn eastwards along the northern boundary of the said property and crossing Hatton estate road east of the premises occupied by the Secretary of the Hatton Police Court to the eastern boundary of the said Estate road, thence by a line drawn south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said Estate road to the western boundary of the Tunnel Bungalow premises, thence by a line drawn northwards, eastwards and southwards along the western, northern and eastern boundaries of the said premises to the centre of the confluence of Dick-oya and a stream flowing through 'Fernando Town', thence by a line drawn southwards along the centre of Dick-oya to a point 200 feet north of the centre of the bridge on Bathford Valley cart road, thence by a line drawn eastwards, southwards and again eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 feet from the centre of the said cart road and crossing Darrawela Estate road to its eastern boundary north of the junction of Annfield-Bathford cart road, thence by a line drawn southwards along the eastern boundary of the Darrawela Estate road crossing Annfield road to the centre of Darrawela Oya

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of Darrawela Oya to the centre of its confluence with Dick-oya thence by a line drawn southwards and south-westwards along the centre of Dick-oya to the southern edge of the Wanarajah Bridge on the Dickoya-Norwood road, thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the western boundary of the Dickoya-Norwood road, and crossing the Dickoya-Norton Bridge road to a point 200 feet west of the centre of the said Dickoya-Norton Bridge road.

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards, eastwards and north-westwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 feet west of the centre of the Dickoya-Norton Bridge road and crossing Gimigathene road till it meets the common boundary between T. Ps 45,506 and 45,507, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the said boundary to a distance of about 528 feet where it meets the southern boundary of the Dunbar Estate earth drain, thence by a line drawn south-westwards and northwards along the southern boundary of the said drain and crossing the Dunbar Estate path to its western boundary, thence by a line drawn northwards along the western boundary of the said estate path to the centre of the water course, thence by a line drawn southwards along the centre of the said water course and crossing the Dunbar Estate road to its southern boundary, thence by a line drawn south-westwards, northwards and eastwards along the southern and western boundaries of the said Estate road to a point where it meets a line drawn southwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 feet west of the centre of the road which is to the west of the Recreation Ground premises (V. O. T. P. 424,528), thence by a line drawn northwards through Dunbar Estate (T. P. 45,506) parallel to and at a distance of 200 feet west of the centre of the said path to a point immediately west of the junction of the Dunbar Estate road and Recreation Ground road, thence by a line drawn north-westward through Dunbar Estate (T. P. 45,506) to the south-western corner of the property of Arasaratnam, thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the western boundary of the said property and of the property of Vama-devan till it meets a point 200 feet south of the centre of the Dunbar Estate road, thence by a line drawn north-westwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 feet from the centre of the said Estate road to the western boundary of the premises known as "Dumburugiri", thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the western boundary of the said premises till it meets the western edge of the foot-path leading to the said premises, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the western edge of the said footpath to its junction with the bridge path and Dunbar Estate road, thence by a line drawn north-westwards passing west of Dunbar Cottage formerly occupied by Mr Shand to the northern boundary of Hatton Estate bridge path north of the said cottage, thence by a line drawn north-westwards to the source of the stream west of "Bank House", thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the centre of the said stream to the centre of its confluence with Fruit Hill Oya, thence by a line drawn westwards to the western boundary of M. T. Maniccam's property, thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the western and northern boundaries of Kandiah's property to the centre of the stream, thence by a line drawn northwards along the centre of the said stream to the centre of its confluence with Fruit Hill Oya, thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the centre of Fruit Hill Oya to a point 200 feet north-west of the centre of the bridge No 19/16 on the Nawalapitiya-Hatton road, thence by a line drawn eastwards, northwards and again eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 feet north of the centre of the said Nawalapitiya-Hatton road till it meets the drain which runs through culvert No 20/6 on the said road, thence by a line drawn northwards along the western boundary of the said drain to the centre of culvert over Kuda Oya on Nawalapitiya-Hatton railway line at 107 mile, 12 chains, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the centre of Kuda Oya to a point 200 feet west of the centre of Dimbulla-Hatton road, thence by a line drawn north-westwards parallel to and at a distance of 200 feet from the centre of

the said road to the starting point of the northern limit of the area

SECOND SCHEDULE

The limits of the ward of the town of Hatton-Dickoya

Ward No. 1—Fruit Hill

- North* By a line drawn from the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban Council area south-eastwards along the said limit to its eastern extremity
- East* By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards, eastwards and again southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to a point in line with the centre of the Nursing Home road
- South* By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards across the Hatton Estate road south-westwards, northwards and westwards along the centre of the Nursing Home road crossing the Colombo-Nanuoya railway line to the centre of the junction with Dimbulla-Hatton road, thence by a line drawn westwards between Messrs R. S. de Silva's and Sinnatamby's bungalows to the western limit of the Urban Council area at the source of the stream west of Bank House
- West* By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards, eastwards and northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward

Ward No. 2—Residential

- North* By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of the Dimbulla-Hatton road and Nursing Home road eastwards, southwards and north-eastwards along the southern limit of Ward No 1 and south-eastwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to the north-eastern corner of Tunnel Bungalow premises.
- East* By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to the centre of the confluence of Dickoya and the stream flowing through "Fernando Town".
- South* By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards to the centre of the estate path east of Hatton House, thence by a line drawn northwards along the centre of the said estate path to the railway "Up-Home" signal post, thence by a line drawn northwards to the centre of the railway line, thence by a line drawn westwards along the centre of the railway line to a distance of 200 feet, thence by a line drawn southwards to the centre of the terminus of the Circular road, thence south-westwards and north-westwards along the centre of the Circular road to the centre of the junction with Cross Street, thence by a line drawn westwards along the centre of Cross Street to the centre of the junction with Main Street
- West* By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the centre of Main Street and Hatton-Dimbulla road to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward

Ward No. 3—Dunbar

- North* By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Ward No. 1 eastwards along the said limit to the northern extremity of the western limit of Ward No. 2
- East* By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-eastwards along the western limit of Ward No 2 to the centre of the junction of Main Street and Cross Street, thence by a line drawn southwards along the centre of Main Street to the centre of the junction with Fish Stall road, thence by a line drawn southwards along the centre of the Fish Stall road to the centre of the junction with Recreation Ground road.

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of the Recreation Ground road and north-westwards along the centre of the Dunbar Estate road to a point at the bend where the road takes a northerly direction, thence by a line drawn westwards across the said Dunbar Estate road to the western limit of the Urban Council area

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 4—Fernando Town

North By a line drawn from the centre of the junction of the Circular road and the New Street south-eastwards, and north-eastwards along the southern limit of Ward No. 2 to a point north of the "Up Home" signal post.

East By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the southern limit of Ward No. 2 to the eastern limit of the Urban Council area, thence by a line drawn southwards along the said limit to the centre of the confluence of Dick-oya and Dunbar stream.

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of the Dunbar stream to the centre of the bridge on the Hatton-Dickoya road.

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards, along the centre of the Hatton-Dickoya road to the centre of the junction with the New Street, thence by a line drawn northwards along the centre of the New Street to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward

Ward No. 5—Bazaar

North By a line drawn from the western extremity of the southern limit of Ward No. 3 eastwards and northwards along the southern and eastern limits of the said ward to the centre of the junction of Main Street and Cross Street, thence by a line drawn eastwards along the centre of Cross Street to the centre of the junction with New Street.

East By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the western limit of Ward No. 4 to its southern extremity

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards along the centre of Dunbar stream to the western limit of the Urban Council area, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards, north-westwards and south-westwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to a point on the bend of Dunbar Estate road where it takes a northerly direction.

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards and north-westwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward

Ward No. 6—Dickoya

North By a line drawn from the centre of Dunbar stream on the western limit of the Urban Council area eastwards along the southern limits of Wards Nos. 5 and 4 to the eastern limit of the Urban Council area

East By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the centre of Dick-oya to a point in line with the northern boundary of lot F761 in P. P. 4,312

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards, along the southern limit of the Urban Council area to its western extremity.

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-eastwards, eastwards, and north-westwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward.

Ward No. 7—Darrawella

North By a line drawn from a point on the eastern limit of the Urban Council area 200 feet north of the centre of the bridge on Bathford Valley road eastwards along the said limit to the eastern boundary of Darawella Estate road.

East By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to its southern extremity.

South By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point westwards, along the southern limit of the Urban Council area to the centre of the confluence of Darrawella-oya and Dick-oya

West By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Ward No. 6 to the starting point of the northern limit of the ward

The Rabies Ordinance

REGULATION under section 9 of the Rabies Ordinance (Chapter 333) as amended by the Rabies Amendment Ordinance, No. 13 of 1941, made by the Mayor of the Municipal Council, Colombo, and approved by the Minister of Home Affairs and Rural Development by virtue of the powers vested in him by that section, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

REGULATION

The regulations made by the Chairman, Municipal Council, Colombo, under section 9 of the Rabies Ordinance (Chapter 333) and published in *Gazette* No. 7,703 of April 5, 1929, are hereby amended, by the addition, immediately after regulation 4, of the following new regulations:—

- 5 The Commissioner or any officer authorised by him in that behalf, may declare any place or premises to be an inoculation station for the purpose of inoculating dogs against rabies.
- 6 Every owner or person in charge of a dog shall produce such dog at an inoculation station, for inoculation against rabies, at such time and date as may be fixed for the purpose by the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon by notice published in one or more newspapers
- 7 Where a dog produced for inoculation at any inoculation station is, in the opinion of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon or any other officer authorised by him to inoculate dogs, not in a fit condition to be so inoculated, the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon or such other officer may require the owner or person in charge of the dog to produce that dog for inoculation on such subsequent date as may be appointed by him, and it shall be the duty of such owner or person to comply with such requirement

APPLICATIONS are invited by the Local Government Service Commission for the above posts.

2 The posts carry a salary of Rs. 2,400 per annum, rising by 10 annual increments of Rs. 120 and 8 of Rs. 180 to Rs. 5,040 per annum, with efficiency bars before Rs. 3,600 and Rs. 4,500. A rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance at Government rates will be paid. No special temporary allowance is payable. A travelling allowance will be fixed by the Commission. Free uniforms will be provided by the Council.

3. Applications will be received from qualified Sanitary Inspectors and Sanitary Sub-Inspectors in the

Local Government Service. They should possess a good record of service and have a thorough knowledge and experience relating to Municipal By-laws dealing with Sanitation and Health.

4. Applications should be forwarded through the Mayor or Chairman of the Local Authority in which they are serving.

5. The selected candidates will be on one year's probation or trial and will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 48 of 1945 and the regulations made thereunder.

6. The selected candidates may be required to reside within the City of Colombo.

7. Applications in the candidates own handwriting, stating age, qualifications and full particulars of experience, together with copies only of certificates and testimonials should reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on or before May 19, 1950.

8. Applications should be addressed to the Chairman and not personally to the undersigned.

9. Canvassing either directly or indirectly will be a disqualification.

Municipal Council Proceedings

Minutes of the Third General Meeting of the Municipal Council, Nuwara Eliya, held on March 13, 1950, at 9.30 a.m. pursuant to notice dated March 6, 1950

Present S. K. Sivalingam, Esq., (Deputy Mayor), presiding; Messrs D. Abraham Singho, M. G. Arokiasamy, H. R. Hyde, R. A. Perera, P. K. A. Vergeheese, W. P. A. de Silva, V. A. Vijayarathnasingham, the Commissioner and the Accountant

Before the proceedings began the Deputy Mayor mentioned the unavoidable absence of the Mayor due to indisposition and requested that his absence be excused

Mr. E. D. Taylor's letter regretting his inability to be present at the meeting was also read.

1. To confirm the minutes of the Second General Meeting held on February 18, 1950.—There being no amendments the minutes were taken as read and confirmed.

2. To confirm the minutes of the Special Meeting held on February 18, 1950. There being no amendments the minutes were taken as read and confirmed.

3 Pursuant to notice Mr. R. A. Perera moved.—“This Council resolves that Sangapulle son of Sitharan who has served this Council for a period of 25 years be paid a substantial gratuity for the services rendered by him to this Council, as he is now 65 years of age and unable to do any hard work in the future”.

This was seconded by Mr. D. Abraham Singho and referred to the Law and Sanitation Committee

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. Abraham Singho moved:—“That Council resolves that the Bus Stand Shed, the Shed at the General Cemetery, the Spout at Kalukelle and the Pan-depot at Kalukelle and the two latrines, be taken in hand immediately and that tenders be called for the said works before the end of next month, as money has already been budgetted for these works by the Council.”

This was seconded by Mr. R. A. Perera and it was resolved to call for tenders for the items for which there is provision in the Budget.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. Abraham Singho moved:—“As this Council has attended to all necessary works in connection with roads, &c, this Council resolves that the tender for the supply of gravel, metal, &c. be stayed this year.”

This was seconded by Mr. R. A. Perera and it was resolved to have the Contractor selected and purchase the Council's requirements after the Works Committee has approved the monthly report of the Works to be executed.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. Abraham Singho moved:—“This Council resolves that all tenants of the Council who have been in occupation of houses belonging to the Council and who are in receipt of an income of less than Rs 75 per month, be brought under the tenant-ownership scheme and that the present rate of tax levied by the Council be charged from them and that such persons who come under the above scheme, be requested to attend to the necessary repairs of the respective tenements at their own cost”.

This was seconded by Mr. R. A. Perera and referred to the Law and Sanitation Committee to consider the subject in all aspects and make a full report of all the implications involved.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. D. Abraham Singho moved:—“This Council resolves that in engaging temporary daily-paid workmen for the Council at least 50 per cent of such labourers be selected out of the Sinhalese unemployed of this town” and with the permission of the House substituted the word “Ceylonese” for “Sinhalese” appearing in the motion. This was seconded by Mr. R. A. Perera and carried.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. V. A. Vijayarathnasingham moved:—“Due to the lack of adequately got up playing fields to cater to the growing needs of both adult and school-going population of the district, this Council is of opinion that the existing playing field at Hawa Eliya be repaired and modernized to serve the needs of the locality”.

This was seconded by Mr. M. G. Arokiasamy and referred to the Works Committee.

9 Pursuant to notice Mr. V. A. Vijayarathnasingham moved:—"In view of so many residents, chiefly from the Districts of Hawa Eliya, Borlanda, Mahagostota and the town area having no bathing facilities, resort to the Water Spout at Hawa Eliya, this Council resolves that two covered bath-rooms be constructed for males and females on the said spot and that shower baths be fixed to control and conserve the flow of water from this natural source".

This was seconded by Mr. R. A. Perera and referred to the Works Committee.

10. Pursuant to notice Mr. V. A. Vijayarathnasingham moved:—"This Council resolves that (a) Four more street lights be installed along Uda Pussellawa Road between the Moon Plains Road Junction and the junction that leads to the Pedro Bungalow, Factory Road and Sewage Farm, (b) Three street lights be installed on the roads leading to the P. W. D. labourers' Lines and Overseers' Quarters".

This was seconded by Mr. D. Abraham Singho and referred to the Works Committee.

11. Pursuant to notice Mr. V. A. Vijayarathnasingham moved:—"This Council is of opinion that a fully qualified Surgeon is very necessary for the Nuwara Eliya Government Hospital and resolves to request the D. M. and S. S. to appoint one without delay".

This was seconded by Mr. R. A. Perera and carried.

12. To consider letter of January 26, 1950, from Mr. T. S. Durairajah, M.M.C., Jaffna, re the formation of an Association of all Municipal Councils of the Island: Mr. M. G. Arokiasamy expressed the opinion that this letter should have come through the Jaffna Municipal Council. The Council resolved to extend its full co-operation to this move.

13. To consider letter of February 27, 1950, from the Education Officer, C.P., requesting the Council to nominate 2 members of the Council to serve in the Nuwara Eliya (Municipal) Education Local Advisory Committee:—It was resolved to nominate Messrs. S. K. Sivalingam and V. A. Vijayarathnasingham.

14. To consider the report of the Board of Survey for 1949:—Resolved to adopt the report. It was also resolved that Mr. W. P. A. de Silva and Mr. N. A. E. Joseph be appointed to form the Board of Survey for the year 1950.

15. To consider tenders for Middle Class Housing Scheme, Maintenance of Councils' Buildings and the Supply of Gravel, Metal, &c., for 1950:—The House went into Committee and considered the following tenders received:—

1. To consider the latest reports received from the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services regarding Nuwara Eliya water supply:—Recommended to await the observations from the Divisional Forest Officer and the Superintendent of Works on the earlier reports.

2. To consider the letter No. B. A. 697 of March 1, 1950, from the Commissioner of Local Government regarding the appointment of Food Inspectors under Food and Drugs Act No. 25 of 1949:—Recommended that Food Inspectors be not appointed immediately, but ask the Commissioner of Local Government to request the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services to give the necessary training to the Sanitary Inspectors sent by him.

3. To consider Messrs. K. Abram Saibo's letter of March 17, 1950, regarding the mutton stall in reply to the Council's resolution of February 18, 1950, *viz.*: "Mr. R. A. Perera then pointed out that K. S. Ibrahim Saibo was carrying on the sale of poultry in the stall allotted to him for the sale of mutton. The minutes of the proceedings of the Council meeting held on March 10, 1950, copies of which were previously circulated to members were taken as read and confirmed.

(ii) Mr. P. M. John submitted a petition dated April 17, 1950, from the residents of his ward re "Boundary walls, alterations and Extensions in the slum area".

The Mayor said he would look into both the petitions. The Mayor replied the following questions given notice of by Mr. S. A. Sabapathy.

3. (i) Is one B. Solomon employed as an overseer or Supervisor of Works in the Works Department of the Council.

Answer.—Yes.

(ii) If he is, then from when.

Answer.—From March 1, 1950.

(iii) What are his qualifications to the post.

Answer.—He has experience which warrants his appointment. I was and I am satisfied that he is well qualified for the post. He is performing his duties satisfactorily.

(iv) Is this Solomon a son of Mr. C. T. Solomon, the Jaffna Correspondent of the Virakesari.

Answer.—A am not aware.

(v) Why did not the Mayor obtain the sanction of the Council for this appointment.

Answer.—Appointment of the overseer was recommended by the Works Committee by resolution No. 3 (iii) of February 1, 1950, and the same was approved by the Council by resolution No. 23 of February 10, 1950, and the appointment was made accordingly.

(v) Was financial provision made either in the Budget or subsequently for this appointment.
