#### The Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939

BY-LAW made by the Matara Urban Council under sections 166 and 170 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, and approved by the Minister of Health and Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 167 of the Ordinance, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

#### BY-LAW

The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 7,387 of April 11, 1924, as amended by by-law published in *Gazette* No. 9,237 of February 11, 1944, are hereby further amended, in by-law 27, under the heading "Rules for members speaking", by the substitution, for rule (1) therein, of the following new rule:—

"(1) The business may be conducted in English, Sinhalese or Tamil."

3. Applicants should be Ceylonese\* and not less than 25 years nor more than 40 years of age on May 1, 1950. They should have passed the 1st year course in Building Construction or the 1st year course in Municipal Engineering conducted by the Ceylon Technical College. Applications will also be received from those who have passed the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination and have had 5 years' training as an overseer under a recognized engineering firm or builders.

In the case of probationary overseers and those performing the work of overseers in the Colombo Municipal Council, their applications will be considered irrespective of age and above qualifications.

Candidates must be able to speak Sinhalese and Tamil and be able to read one of the vernacular languages.

4. Applications from those in a local body or in a Government department should be forwarded through the Mayor or Chairman of the local authority or the Head of the Department in which they are serving.

5. The selected candidates will be on one year's probation or trial and will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and the regulations made thereunder.

6. Applications in the candidate's own handwriting, stating age, qualifications and full particulars of experience, and the date and place of birth of the father, together with copies only of certificates and testimonials should reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, P. O. Box 530, Colombo, on or before June 14, 1950.

7. Applications should be addressed to the Chairman and not personally to the undersigned.

They must be able to typewrite at a speed of 30 words per minute. Preference will be given to those having a knowledge of Shorthand.

4. Assistant Clerks in the Local Government Service, who have been confirmed in their appointments will be eligible to apply irrespective of age, and educational qualifications.

Temporary Clerks in the service of a Local Authority, with not less than 2 years' satisfactory service will be allowed to apply irrespective of age, provided they possess the educational qualifications prescribed in paragraph 3.

In the case of Ceylonese ex-Servicemen, the period of their mobilized service will be deducted from their ages for purposes of eligibility.

5. The selected candidates will have to sit for a typewriting test.

##### Examination for Electrical Foremen, Grade II

###### *Date of Examination—*

A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter Grade II of the Local Government Electrical Foremen's Service will be held in Colombo on July 15, 1950. The examination will be conducted by the Local Government Service Commission

2. (i) *Salary.*—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts in Grade II of the Local Government Electrical Foreman's Service to serve Local Authorities (other than Village Committees) on the salary scale of Rs. 744 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 42 to Rs. 1,416 per annum, with an Efficiency Bar before Rs. 1,080 per annum. Rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be payable in accordance with Government rates and conditions.

###### (ii) *Condition of Service.*—

(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the Local Authority subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on one year's probation, and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in a Local Authority drawing a salary higher than the initial salary assigned to the post of Foremen, Grade II, may be placed on a suitable step on this salary scale.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

###### 4. *Eligibility.*—

(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese\*.

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least—

(a) the 7th standard in English or higher examination.

(b) either should have had at least five years of practical experience in an Electrical Engineering Firm or under a Chartered Electrical Engineer or under Government or local Supply Authority, or should possess technical qualifications of the Ceylon Technical College or its equivalent.

and (c) should have a knowledge of the operation and maintenance of High Tension and Low Tension Distribution System, Transformers Diesel Engine Plant and Switchgear, Testing of Consumers installations, and House Service Meters. Should also possess a working knowledge of the Safety Rules and I.E.E. Regulations for Electrical Equipment and Buildings.

*Noté.*—Applications from persons holding permanent posts in a Town Lighting Scheme of a local authority having the necessary technical knowledge and experience will be considered irrespective of general educational qualification, if forwarded through the Chairman of the Local Authority.

(iv) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph 5 (iv) except that, if necessary

(a) Service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilized service in the last war from their age.

## 5 Applications.—

(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Colombo, up to June 24, 1950, and forwarded by registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than June 30, 1950. Any application received after that date will be rejected.

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or under Local Authorities, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments or the Chairman of Local Authorities in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 3.

(iv) The following documents must be attached to the form of application—

- (a) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than July 15, 1910, and not later than July 15, 1933.

*Note.*—(1) Affidavits will not ordinarily be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(2) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth, under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94) will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living applications should be made to the Registrar-General's or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office in the district in which the birth took place, under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, for the amendment of the entry in case 2 of the birth registration entry, and in other cases application should be made to the District Court under section 20 for rectification of the entry in case 2.

- (b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or school-master by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor or Notary or generally speaking some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

- (c) The original certificates of or regarding candidate's educational qualifications.

*N.B.*—Applications will be rejected in the absence of one or more of these documents.

(v) The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time table and the rules for the guidance of candidates for the examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervising Examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination he should communicate without delay with the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following particulars—

- (1) Name of examination,
- (2) Full name,
- (3) Full postal address.

6 Should any of the particulars furnished by the candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will, if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalised.

*Withdrawal and refunds—*

7. In no circumstances will a refund of the value of stamps be made.

*Leave to officers to attend examination.—*

8. Heads of Departments and Chairman of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant to officers of their Departments and of Local Bodies whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.

10. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the viva voce. The number to be called at the viva voce examination will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. The viva voce examination will be held in Colombo.

1. The minutes of proceedings of the General Meeting of the Municipal Council held on April 21, 1950, copies of which were previously circulated to all members were taken as read and confirmed subject to the following alterations:—

- (a) To delete the words "Mr. E. T. Hitchcock" before the words "seconded and spoke" and to substitute in its place the words "Mr. P. M. John" in the second paragraph of item No. 5; and
- (b) To delete the words "Mr. E. T. Hitchcock" before the words "seconded the motion" and to substitute in its place the words "Mr. S. S. Navaratnam" in the third paragraph of item No. 38.

2. (i) Mr. E. T. Hitchcock presented a letter (dated May 9, 1950) from Mr. E. E. Ponnuthurai regarding filling of an old well.

(ii) Mr. D. James presented the following petitions:—

- (a) Petition dated May 10, 1950, from the residents of Ward No. 3 regarding improvement to David Road.
- (b) Petition dated May 8, 1950, from the residents of Cathedral East Road, Bankshall Street, Pachchuvai Road and Moolai Road regarding improvements to roads.
- (c) Petition dated May 7, 1950, from the residents of Old Store Road regarding renaming of Old Store Road as Mathews Road.
- (d) Letter dated May 10, 1950, from the representative of North Ceylon Labour Federation regarding resolutions passed by the Union on April 28, 1950.

The Mayor said that he would look into all the petitions and do the needful.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. E. T. Hitchcock asked the following questions which were answered by the Mayor:—

- (i) (a) "When was the last statement of receipts and disbursements on account of the Municipal Fund and minutes of proceedings of the meetings of the Council last published in the *Government Gazette* as required by Section 190 of Ordinance No. 29 of 1947, and in respect of which months or period?"

Reply: "Statement of receipts and disbursements on account of Municipal Fund have been published in the *Gazette* to end of September, 1949, and the statements for the period October to December, 1949, are being typed to be sent for publication."

"Minutes of proceedings of the meetings of the Council have been published in the *Gazette* up to date."

- (b) "If not published as required by law why haven't these been published and who is or are responsible for this delay?"

Reply: "The Accountant and Acting Commissioner They should have brought to my notice. It is dereliction of duty on their part."

- (c) "Will the Mayor kindly direct that the requirements in the section referred to is adhered to promptly in future and take disciplinary action against the officer responsible for delays in future?"

Reply: "I shall do so. I have taken full charge of administration and I shall see that this is done in future."

- (ii) (a) "May I know the position at present as regards the supply of electric current to this town from the Kankasanturai Cement Factory Power Station?"

Reply: "Contract documents between the Department of Industries and the Council for the supply and purchase of bulk supply from the Kankasanturai Cement Factory Power Station have been signed."

- (b) "What is the earliest possible date when current could be expected from Kankasanturai?"

Reply: "No definite date has been notified but in all probability the supply would be available by the end of this year."

- (iii) "How many consumers of electricity are now being supplied current monthly from our Power Station?"

Reply: "1769 consumers."

- (iv) "At the present rate of incoming applications for house service connections how many more could be taken on without in any way impairing the efficiency of the new engine?"

Reply: "About 400 new service connections."

- (v) "If the biggest of the old engines in service which, I understand, is being overhauled at present, how many more consumers could be taken on, taking into consideration additional street lights that are being under contemplation?"

Reply: "No further additional load could be connected as it is the highest load the present engines at the Power House are capable of carrying making allowance for the necessary standby both by day and night."

- (vi) (a) "Has the caterpillar engine set at the Power Station been since sold and if so at what price?"

Reply: "No."

- (b) "If not sold please let me know at what stage the matter stands at present? Were tenders called for and were any offers received? If so what is the highest offer received?"

Reply: "Tenders were called for but there were no offers."

- (vii) "Reference Item No. 26 of April 21, 1950, and No. 22 of the Minutes of the Finance Committee meeting held on April 20, 1950—What I wanted was that the matter be made the subject of correspondence with the Jaffna Magistrate and the Local Government Commissioner with a view to effect a saving, as early as possible, of the expenditure at present incurred by the Council. Will the Mayor please move in the matter accordingly and find out whether we could substitute our own men and if so from when?"

Reply: "I shall move in the matter."

- (viii) "Has any action been taken to apply for a loan from the Central Government to meet the expenditure on the maintenance of and improvement to roads, as suggested by the Commissioner of Local Government, and if so the amount applied for and when the loan could be expected?"

Reply: "I applied for a loan of Rs. 187,000 on March 18, 1950. On receipt of my application the Commissioner of Local Government wrote to me on March 23, 1950, for particulars. Acting Commissioner forwarded the letter to Accountant for furnishing particulars but he failed to do so. I was not aware of it and I invited attention of the Commissioner of Local Government to my application and in reply to my letter inviting attention, the Commissioner of Local Government sent a copy of his letter dated March 23, 1950. Thereupon I pressed the Accountant and particulars have now been forwarded."

- (ix) "May I please know at what stage the matter of shifting the Infectious Diseases Hospital to the proposed Navatkuli site stands at present?"

Reply: "At a Conference held on March 4, 1950, between the Hon. the Minister for Health and

Local Government and the members of this Council it was agreed that the Council should bear the cost of acquisition of the land at Navatkuli and the erection of the Hospital and maintenance thereafter would be a matter for the Central Government. I have addressed the Government accordingly and I am pressing that necessary financial provision be made in the Budget for 1950-51 for the erection of the new Infectious Diseases Hospital at Navatkuli."

4. (i) Pursuant to notice Mr E. T. Hitchcock moved:—"As the Local Government Service Commission has not yet framed a scheme of salaries for officers employed under Municipalities and have not graded the different officers in the employ of Municipalities, I move that the Local Government Service Commission be requested to grade at least four more posts in our Council in Grade I of the Service, namely.—

- (a) Storekeeper.
- (b) Licence Clerk
- (c) Assessment Clerk
- (d) Accounts Clerk."

and speaking in support of the motion said that he is not pressing (a), (b), (c) and (d) above but urged that the Mayor should go into the matter and recommend to the Local Government Service Commission that any two of the existing clerks be raised to the status of Grade I in addition to the two clerks who recently passed examination for promotion to Grade I.—Mr. A. M. Brodie seconded.

Put to the vote and carried 4 voting for and none against.

(ii) Pursuant to notice Mr. E. T. Hitchcock moved:—"As the establishment and maintenance of a Fire Brigade for the protection of life and property from fire of the residents of the Town is the concern of the Municipal Council, I move that this Council make a move in the matter with the assistance of the Police to establish a Fire Brigade even on a small scale and with that end in view direct the Commissioner to obtain the necessary information and particulars as regards the initial cost of equipment, staff, &c, and recurrent and other maintenance charges from other Municipalities in the Island which have already established and are maintaining such Brigades and to place such information and particulars before this Council for its consideration and necessary action"

and speaking in support of the motion moved that the same be referred to the Finance Committee

It was decided to refer the above motion to the Finance Committee.

(iii) Pursuant to notice Mr. E. T. Hitchcock moved:—"As the deep drain along Colombutturai Road in front of Mr C. T. Solomon's residence is dangerous to the users of the road, I move that the Public Works Department, under whose charge the road is at present, be requested to continue the building of the retaining wall to the balance length to meet the culvert in front of St. Anne's Church."

On the request of the mover it was decided to refer this motion to the Finance Committee.

5 Pursuant to notice Mr. D. James moved:—"In view of the satisfactory work done for the last ten years and more by M. Kandiah, an employee of the Council in the Electricity Department, I move that he be confirmed in his appointment as assistant linesman on a scale of salary attached to the post, to fill the vacant post created by the promotion of R. Ratnathurai as Grade I linesman."—Mr. E. T. Hitchcock seconded and spoke in support of the motion.

It was decided that Messrs. M. Kandiah and T. Muthuvalue be allowed to continue to act as assistant linesmen.

6 Pursuant to notice Mr. S. S. Navaratnam moved:—"This Council resolves that the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services be requested to make immediate arrangements for the supply to ayurvedic physicians within the Jaffna Municipal Council limits their full quota of opium as these practitioners complain that their practice has been seriously affected by the failure of the Director to supply them with their normal quota of this drug."—Mr. S. R. Thalayasingham seconded.

Passed unanimously.

7. Considered Kathi S. M. Aboobucker's letter of April 20, 1950, regarding the construction of a latrine at Katkulam and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to construct a four-seater latrine adjoining the latrine at Katkulam and to sanction Rs 1,650 under Head 17 (b).

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

8 Considered papers regarding the erection of seven sheds for the use of vegetable and fruit sellers in the Grand Bazaar and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to construct two sheds (one 70 feet in length and the other of 50 feet) on the northern side of the Hospital Road where the vegetable vendors are at present and another of 35 feet in length for plantain vendors (on the open space on the east of the western building) and to sanction Rs. 6,700 under Head 17 (e).

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

9. Considered papers regarding metalling and tarring Navanturai 1st Cross Road from the unmetalled portion up to the cemetery gate and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to execute the work and to sanction Rs 750 under Head 17 (a).

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee

10 Considered papers regarding the conversion of the wooden bridge on 1st Cross Road, Navanturai, into a cement concrete bridge and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to execute the work and to sanction Rs 670 under Head 17 (a).

Decided to cause the work to be done now and to sanction Rs 900 under Head 17 (a) and to replace this amount later when the loan for road maintenance is received.

15. Considered papers regarding the construction of a masonry edge from Eachchamodda Road by the side of Maravakulam Tank and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to defer consideration of same.

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

18. Considered papers regarding the construction of a retaining wall to the balance portion of Taffs Road



and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to defer consideration till next year (1951)

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee

19 Considered Works Committee's resolution No. 14 of May 3, 1950, regarding the motion brought forward by Mr. S. S. Navaratnam, M.M.C., about widening and improving the Clock Tower Lane with a view to its conversion into a road at a later stage and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to execute the work and to sanction Rs. 3,000 under Head 17 (a).

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

20. Considered Council's resolution No 38 of April 21, 1950, regarding the retention of the services of the Secretary and the Accountant and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to sanction the following amounts for payment to the Secretary till end of August, 1950.—

Rs. 2,273.33 under head 1 (a);  
Rs. 227 33 under Head 1 (b); and  
Rs. 425.50 under Head 1 (d).

Mr. T. S. Durairajah moved that financial provision be made for payment till end of December, 1950. Mr. E. T. Hitchcock seconded. Messrs. R R Nalliah and A. M. Brodie opposed Mr. Durairajah's motion and said that the decision of the Finance Committee should be accepted.

Votes were taken—8 voted in favour of the decision of the Finance Committee and 5 against. Mr. T. S. Durairajah's motion was declared lost.

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

21. Considered Mr. G. Berchman's (Messenger) application dated April 27, 1950, for an increase of salary and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to place him on the scale of salary—Rs. 40—Re. 1—Rs. 60 from the date of his appointment (on April 1, 1949) and to pay him now (without payment of arrears) the salary he will be entitled to draw with the annual increment of Re. 1 and to sanction the necessary funds for payment to him.

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee and to place Mr. G. Berchman on his new scale of salary with effect from May 1, 1950, and to sanction the following supplementary votes for payment to him:—

Rs. 120 under Head 4 (a),  
Rs. 56 under Head 4 (d).

22. Considered papers regarding the purchase of four flood lights for the Jaffna Clock Tower and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to sanction Rs 620 as cost of flood lights and Rs. 80 for paying rail freight and other incidental charges. Both amounts totalling Rs. 700 to go under Head 15 (a).

It was decided to purchase 4 flood lights for the Jaffna Clock Tower and sanctioned Rs. 800 under Head 15 (a).

23. Considered application dated May 3, 1950, from Mr. A. Manuelpillai (office labourer) for an increase of salary and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to place him on the salary scale of Rs. 40—Re. 1—Rs 60 per mensem and to place him now at Rs. 600 per annum.

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee and to place Mr. Manuelpillai on his new scale of salary with effect from May 1, 1950, and to sanction the following supplementary votes for payment to him:—

Rs. 104 under Head 2 (a),  
Rs. 56 under Head 2 (e)

24. Considered letter dated March 31, 1950, from certain members of the Council regarding 5 per cent. levy from the Jaffna Resthouse keeper on catering charges and the recommendation of the Finance Committee not to recover the levy of 5 per cent. from the said Resthouse keeper as from January 1, 1950

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee. All voted for except Mr S. A Sabapathy who voted against and Mr T S. Durairajah who refrained from voting.

25. Considered the application of the storekeeper for further assistance and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to transfer Mr. Vallavan from the Power House to the stores and also to transfer Mr. Sinnathamby from the stores to the Power House.

Deferred for consideration at a later meeting.

26 Considered papers regarding supplementary votes for payment of holiday railway warrants to the minor employees of the Council and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to sanction the following amounts:—

Rs 2,500 under Head 1 (m),  
Rs. 500 under Head 2 (d),  
Rs. 800 under Head 4 (g),  
Rs. 600 under Head 12 (b)(iii), and  
Rs. 1,000 under Head 4 (h).

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee

27. Considered papers regarding the purchase of dog-carts for the use of the dog-seizers and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to sanction Rs. 1,000 under Head 15 (c) for the purchase of two dog-carts and to call for quotations

Decided to accept the recommendation of the Finance Committee

28 Considered papers regarding the appointment of a temporary clerk to the Accounts Branch of the Council and the recommendation of the Finance Committee to appoint a temporary clerk till end of July, 1950, and to sanction the following amounts for payment to him.—

Salary Rs 180 under Head 1 (a), and

Mr. S. R. Thalasingham seconded.—Carried unanimously.

33. Considered Government Agent's letter No. LA. 616 of February 2, 1950, regarding new Bus Stand,



Jaffna, and the recommendation of the Works Committee which read as follows:—

Considered Government Agent's letter No. LA. 616 of February 2, 1950, regarding New Bus Stand, Jaffna

The Chairman brought to the notice of the Committee that the entire grounds called "The Esplanade" was originally vested in the Jaffna Local Board along with other Crown lands in 1907 when the Local Board came into existence and these lands were automatically vested in the Jaffna Urban Council as the successor to the Local Board.

He further said that during his time as Secretary, of the Jaffna Urban Council, the then Government Agent, N.P., Jaffna, Mr J. D. Brown, requested the Council, for certain administrative reasons, to re-vest the esplanade on the Crown on the distinct understanding that it will be again vested in the Council with the exception of the grounds about the Jaffna Fort and which would also be re-vested in the Council after contemplated action was over and on the condition that whatever revenue the Council derived or accrued to it from these grounds previously will be recovered in the first instance by Government and then given over to the Council. This arrangement was actually carried out as could be found on reference to the relevant files in the office

The Chairman further observed that the Archaeological Commissioner whom the Government Agent consulted in the matter of the re-vestment of the grounds referred to was silent on that point but stated that he was unable to agree with the proposal to shift the Motor Bus Stand to the site suggested without assigning any reasons therefor.

The Commissioner could not have any say in the matter of re-vesting the land which did belong to the Council by vesting order of 1907 and that he had no status to interfere with the Council's decision to shift the Bus Stand which is entirely a matter left to the Council.

The Committee after some deliberation recommended that the Council do direct its Commissioner to interview the Government Agent and explain the position as regards the vesting of the land in question, in terms of the Chairman's statement above and ask him to put the whole case as explained, before the Archaeological Commissioner and obtain his reasons for being unable to agree to the shifting of the Bus Stand to the site proposed.

Decided that the Mayor should correspond further into the matter and bring up for consideration at a later meeting

34 Considered Commissioner of Local Government's letter No. B. 761 of April 11, 1950, and connected papers regarding "Regulations relating to Rabies". Deferred for consideration at the next meeting.
