##### NOTIFICATION

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 5A of the Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations [which, in accordance with the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946, has effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act, 1945, of the Imperial Parliament], I, Herbert Ernest Tennekoon, Controller of Imports, do hereby cancel Open General Licence No. 1 dated January 30, 1942, and published at page 9 of the Supplement to *Gazette* No. 8,855 of that date (as amended by any subsequent Notification).

#### The Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations

##### OPEN GENERAL LICENCE NO. 2

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 5A of the Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations [which, in accordance with the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946, has effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act, 1945, of the Imperial Parliament], I, Herbert Ernest Tennekoon, Controller of Imports, do hereby authorise, until further notice, the importation into Ceylon by any person of such goods of any class or description specified in the Schedule hereto as have been grown, produced or manufactured in any territory except the following :—

United States of America, and any territory under the sovereignty of the United States of America, Philippine Islands, Bolivia, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Venezuela, Japan, Canada, Newfoundland, Switzerland and Liechtenstein, Belgium, Luxembourg, the Belgian Congo and the Mandated Territory of Ruanda Urundi, Argentina, Paraguay, Portugal and the Portuguese colonies, excluding Portuguese India, and Trizone of Germany

The above Open General Licence is issued subject to the condition that nothing shall affect or prejudice, or be deemed or construed to affect or prejudice, the provisions or requirements of any other written law applicable to any goods to which such Open General Licence refers at the time of the importation of any such goods into Ceylon.

**The Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations****OPEN GENERAL LICENCE No. 3**

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 5A of the Defence (Control of Imports) Regulations [which, in accordance with the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946, has effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act, 1945, of the Imperial Parliament], I, Herbert Ernest Tennekoon, Controller of Imports, do hereby authorize, until further notice, the importation into Ceylon by any person of such goods of any class or description specified in the Schedule hereto as have been grown, produced or manufactured in any territory except the following:—

India, United States of America, and any territory under the sovereignty of the United States of America, Philippine Islands, Bolivia, Colombia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Salvador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Venezuela, Japan, Canada, Newfoundland, Switzerland, and Liechtenstein, Belgium, Luxembourg, the Belgian Congo and the Mandated territory of Ruanda Urundi, Argentina, Paraguay, Portugal and the Portuguese colonies, excluding Portuguese India, and Trizone of Germany.

The above Open General Licence is issued subject to the condition that nothing shall affect or prejudice, or be deemed or construed to affect or prejudice the provisions or requirements of any other written law applicable to any goods to which such Open General Licence refers at the time of the importation of any such goods into Ceylon.

**The Public Officers (Security) Ordinance**

RULE made by the Secretary to the Treasury by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 12 of the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance (Chapter 251) as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

The rules made under the Public Officers (Security) Ordinance and published in *Gazette* No. 8,620 of June 7, 1940, are hereby amended with effect from May 1, 1950, as follows:—

- (1) by the insertion, immediately after rule 1, of the following new rule:—

“ 1A. Every officer specified in rule 4, who had executed a security bond on his appointment at any time prior to May 1, 1950, shall, in case the maximum security required from such officer if he were appointed on or after May 1, 1950, exceeds the amount of the bond executed by him at the time of his appointment, execute an additional security bond substantially in such one of the forms A or B, set out in the Schedule hereto as may be appropriate to the case for an amount equal to the difference between the amount secured by the bond executed by him at the time of his appointment and the maximum security required from such officer if he were appointed on or after May 1, 1950.”; and

- (2) by the substitution, for rule 4, of the following new rule:—

“ 4. Every officer shall deposit moneys or make periodical payments by way of security according to such of the following paragraphs as is applicable to his case:—

- (1) Every Telecommunication Inspector and every Night Telephonist shall after appointment pay Rs. 6 per mensem where the annual salary does not exceed Rs. 1,000 or Rs. 7.50 per mensem where the annual salary exceeds Rs. 1,000, until a maximum of Rs. 1,000 is paid.
- (2) Every Postmaster and Signaller shall after appointment pay Rs. 7.50 per mensem where the annual salary does not exceed Rs. 1,000 or Rs. 10 per mensem where the annual salary exceeds Rs. 1,000, until a maximum of Rs. 2,000 is paid.

- (3) Every Local Postmaster shall deposit Rs. 1,500 in cash before admission for training, and shall after appointment pay Rs. 7·50 per mensem, where the annual salary does not exceed Rs. 1,000 or Rs. 10 per mensem where the annual salary exceeds Rs. 1,000, until a maximum of Rs. 2,000 (including the deposit) is paid.
- (4) Every Local Assistant shall deposit Rs. 500 in cash before admission for training and a further sum of Rs. 500 in cash before appointment, and shall thereafter pay Rs. 7·50 per mensem where the annual salary does not exceed Rs. 1,000 or Rs. 10 per mensem where the annual salary exceeds Rs. 1,000, until a maximum of Rs. 2,000 (including the Rs. 1,000 deposited before appointment) is paid.
- (5) (a) Every Sub-Postmaster, Grade A, shall on appointment deposit in cash a sum of Rs. 1,500 and shall thereafter pay Rs. 12·50 per mensem until a maximum of Rs. 3,000 (including the deposit) is paid  
 (b) Every Sub-Postmaster, Grade B, shall on appointment deposit in cash a sum of Rs. 1,000, and shall thereafter pay Rs. 10 per mensem until a maximum of Rs. 2,000 (including the deposit) is paid.  
 (c) Every Sub-Postmaster, Grade C, shall on appointment deposit in cash a sum of Rs. 500.
- (6) Every Overseer, Daily-paid overseer, and every Skilled Workman shall after appointment pay according to the following scale, until the maximum indicated is contributed :—

- (7) (a) Every Junior Inspector of Uniform Staff, Sorter, Mail Guard and Postman shall deposit Rs. 10 in cash on appointment, and shall thereafter pay Rs. 5 per mensem until a maximum of Rs. 1,000 (including the deposit) is paid.  
 (b) Every Junior Inspector of Telegraph Messengers shall deposit Rs. 10 in cash on appointment, and shall thereafter pay Rs. 3 per mensem until a maximum of Rs. 300 (including the deposit) is paid.  
 (c) Every peon (except Head Office Peons) shall deposit Rs. 10 in cash on appointment, and shall thereafter pay Rs. 4 per mensem until a maximum of Rs. 750 (including the deposit) is paid.  
 (d) Every Mail Porter and Runner shall deposit Rs. 10 in cash on appointment, and shall thereafter pay Rs. 3 per mensem until a maximum of Rs. 500 (including the deposit) is paid.  
 (e) Every Cycle Overseer, Tamil Transliterator, Arachchi and Cycle Cleaner shall deposit Rs. 10 in cash on appointment, and thereafter pay Re. 1 per mensem until a maximum of Rs. 200 (including the deposit) is paid.
- (8) Every Lineman shall on appointment pay Re. 1 per mensem until a maximum of Rs. 50 is paid.
- (9) Every Counter Clerk shall deposit Rs. 500 in cash before appointment, and shall thereafter pay Rs. 6 per mensem where the annual salary does not exceed Rs. 1,000 per annum, and Rs. 7·50 per mensem where the annual salary exceeds Rs. 1,000 per annum, until a maximum of Rs. 2,000 (including the deposit) is paid.

Provided, however, that the Postmaster-General or any officer authorised by him may, on the appointment of an officer, or in any case where an officer appointed before May 1, 1950, furnishes an additional security bond, accept in cash the whole or any part of the maximum security or the additional security, as the case may be, required from such officer, and if part of the security is so accepted, may require the officer to pay the remainder of the maximum or the additional security required from him by such monthly contributions as the Postmaster-General or the officer authorised by him may think fit."
