Parliament to convene from September 8 to 11

Parliament will convene from September 8 to 11, as decided by the Committee on Parliamentary Business, chaired by Speaker Mahinda Yapa Abeywardena, yesterday morning.

The annual report of the Central Bank, the performance report of the Ministry of Finance and the mid-year fiscal report will be taken up for debate as an Adjournment Debate on September 8 as per the proposals made by the Government during the meeting.

Parliament will convene on September 8 from 1.00 to 6.30 pm. Nine regulations under the Excise (Special Provisions Act) and 10 notifications under the Excise Ordinance will be debated on September 9. On September 10, Six notifications under the Ports and Airport Development Levy Act, 03 regulations and 06 resolutions under the Customs Ordinance will be taken up for debate.

Parliament will convene onSeptember 9 from 1.00 pm to 7.30 pm and on September 10 from 10.30 am to 7.30 pm. TO PAGE **06**

20th Amendment proposes **Parliamentary Council**

The draft 20th Amendment to the Constitution has been gazetted by the Justice Ministry. The gazette notice was printed and published yesterday after it had received Cabinet approval, the Government said.

A number of key provisions in the 19th Amendment to the Constitution have been repealed through the proposed new Amendment.

The 20th Amendment to the Constitution has proposed a Parliamentary Council comprising the Prime Minister, Speaker, Leader of the opposition and a nominee from the Speaker and Leader of the opposition, replacing the present Constitutional Council. These nominees should also be sitting MPs. No non-MPs can represent the Parliamentary Council. TO PAGE 06

NAVY, AIR FORCE HELP DISTRESSED CRUDE OIL TANKER

MEPA ON HIGH ALERT OVER **POSSIBLE OIL SPILL**

Twenty two crew members out of 23 on board an ill-fated oil tanker chartered by Indian Oil Corp (IOC) which caught fire 38 nautical miles off the Sangamankanda coast have been rescued.

Navy Spokesman Captain Indika De Silva said one crew member was reported missing. The Indian vessel New Diamond, which is a Very Large Crude Carrier (VLCC), was heading to the port of Paradip in India. It had sailed from Mina-Al-Ahmadi in Kuwait. The fire had erupted in the engine room of the vessel and was raging by last

evening. An injured seaman aboard the crude oil tanker was rescued by the Sri Lanka Navy and brought ashore, said the Navy Spokesman.

The remaining 19 members of the crew have been rescued by a passing merchant vessel and are being accommodated aboard the ship, the Navy said.

The Navy had rescued three of the crew mem bers aboard the ill-fated vessel.

Meanwhile, two Russian war ships which had anchored at the Hambantota Harbour for fuelling also rushed to assist in dousing the fire on board the Indian oil tanker. TO PAGE 06



Daily News: 25 years on the Information Superhighway

Having been forced onetime, under threat of withholding salary increments, to abandon an old, trusty and robust 'Olympia' typewriter for a computer, I still struggle to understand how the editorship of Sri Lanka's first online newspaper was thrust upon me.

Whether due to, 'old school ties' - the then newly appointed benign and soft spoken Chairman Lakshman Jayawardena was an old and senior Thurstanite--(which could be discounted due to my avoidance of anyone wielding power irrespective of whether they used it or not) , or due to the then Production Manager and present General Manager, Abhaya Amaradasa's ability to talk even the hind leg off a horse or due to some unknown force, the challenge of editing the online edition of the Daily News fell upon me, though strictly speaking I was a member of the Sunday Observer staff back then.

It indeed was a great challenge at the time. WWW or the World Wide Web, http (Hypertext Transfer Protocol), html and other new terminology seemed out of this world to me at least. With one week of training before its launch in 1995, my diffidence dissolved under the guidance of technicians such as D.N. Wijesinghe and T.A.L. Ratnayake. They put me through the paces and burnt the midnight oil assisting in the search for a reader friendly format for the new addition to the Lake House flagship. Bleary eyes greet-



ed a new day with the final selection of the format comprising sections for Business, Features, Editorial, Security, Politics, World, Letters, Sports, Archives and Obituaries, which by and large have survived to this day. They with the all important 'In Brief' section would cover the gamut of the newspaper's contents.

Following the launch at the Galle Face Hotel, the Internet Edition of the flagship was steered by a few dedicated journalists and technicians. Operating from a backroom on the top floor of Lake House overlooking the railway lines leading to and from the Fort Railway Station to the island's South, they put their shoulders to the wheel with determination.

Starting in the afternoon, all page proofs of the print edition would be accessed, perused, stories selected, sometimes followed up and updated, edited or re-written to cater to a readership of locals, expatriate Sri Lankans and foreigners. Pramod de Silva and Dinesh Weerawansa, who now happen to be the Editors of the Daily News and the Sunday Observer respectively, were among the first young journalists selected to the team. Riza Rawdin of the Daily News, who is now domiciled overseas, came on board a bit

Technicians Ratnayake, Jagath Dharmaratna, Nalaka de Silva (the only duo who still work for the Internet section from the original team) and Gerald Nadesan strove to ensure that the publication went ahead without glitches. Punctuality in uploading was paramount to prevent competitors accessing any exclusive stories through the online edition. Theirs was the more onerous job.

Much was achieved by the small team in a small room that became known as the 'Internet' and soon the *Sunday Observer* too went online. It was a moment to be proud of. There was positive and negative feedback. Staffers from a diplomatic mission of an East Asian country, being denied direct access to news from their homeland were profuse with their thanks. Appreciative e-mails (itself fairly new at the time) from around the world including from far off Iceland drove the team to perform at peak as did broken links which failed to mirror stories and sometimes the whole edition. A couple of awards also came their way during the first three months.

Negative feedback mainly related to political stories. They were passed with straight faces on to the then editors of the print editions. A couple of unsuccessful individual attempts were made to divert blame as we strove to maintain credibility. Challenges were accepted and surmounted.

The invaluable assistance rendered by individuals from several departments including the staff of the adjacent Visual Display Terminal (VDT) and Production Department made the venture a success.

They were called upon to and did more than their job. It is a saga that began on a small note, but one that laid the foundation for today's vast operation that encompasses everything from the E-paper to Facebook and Twitter feeds.

I am indeed proud to have been a member of the original team that made it all possible.

Ruwanpura Highway construction expedited

Highways Minister Johnston Fernando yesterday instructed officials of the Highways Ministry and the Road Development Authority to expedite the construction work of the Ruwanpura Highway, which was halted by the previous government.

The Minister was participating in a Progress Review Meeting on the road development projects held with the RDA officials at the Ministry yesterday.

He said that expediting the Ruwanpura Highway construction was vital.

The Minister said that the proposed Ruwanpura Highway will connect with the Southern Highway and the Central Expressway.

The Ruwanpura Highway will stretch over 73 km from the Kahatuduwa Interchange up to Pelmadulla.

The highway from Kahatuduwa to Pelmadulla via Ratnapura (73.9 km) has been divided into three sections. Section 1 runs from Kahatuduwa to Ingiriya (24.3 km), Section 2 from Ingiriya to Ratnapura (21 km), and Section 3 from Ratnapura to Pelmadulla (28.6 km). The project will complete in three years. The first stage will cost Rs.80 billion.

The selection of contractors to construct the first stage was carried out yesterday.

Eighty nine COVID 19 infected detected within 72 hours

Army Commander Lieutenant General Shavendra Silva yesterday warned that within a 72-hour period until last evening, 89 Covid-19 cases had been identified, while all of them are those who had returned to the country from over-

He said that the threat of COVID-19 remained as long as other countries faced the pandemic and expressed disappointment that a majority of people in Sri Lanka had begun to defy the health guide-

He said that 1,197 of the total number of infections were those returning from overseas. Of them, 42 are foreign nationals and 1,155 are Sri Lankans.

The Army Commander noted that since April 30, Sri Lanka has not reported any community infections, commending the efforts taken by the health services and tri-forces personnel for their efforts to prevent the spread of the coronavirus in the country.

He urged the public to adhere to health guidelines and wear face masks and regularly wash hands and maintain social dis-

With schools reopening and students attending classes, he urged the school authorities and teachers to guide the students to follow the health guidelines and to educate the children on the importance of maintaining social distancing and following hygienic practices and the implications of not doing so.

Two suspects nabbed with 4.7 grams of heroin

Two suspects were arrested in Uduwa with 4.750 grams of heroin on Wednesday night by Moragahahena Police on a tip off. A husband and wife were arrested last morning in Pinnaduwa they were while travelling on a motorcycle. According to the Police, the couple had 500.650 grams of heroin hidden inside five coconuts. The 28-years-old man and the 23-year-old woman are residents of Dadella, Galle. Another female suspect in Akmeemana was also arrested after interrogating the couple.

The woman had Rs. 140,000 and a mobile phone. She is an 18-year-old resident of Rajagaha-Uyana, Akmeemana. Detention orders will be obtained by the police for three suspects to carry out further investigation, police said.

Writ petition requesting to arrest Kurunegala mayor fixed for Oct.9

A writ petition filed by former Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP) Parliamentarian Namal Karunaratne seeking an order directing the Police to arrest Kurunegala mayor over the demolition of the King's Court of King Buvanekabahu II was yesterday fixed for October 9 by the Court of Appeal.

It was revealed that the Court of Appeal has already issued an Interim Order staying the operation of arrest warrants issued by Kurunegala Magistrate's Court against the mayor and four others over the incident.

Court of Appeal two-judge-bench comprising Justice (President) A.H.M.D. Nawaz and Justice Sobhitha Rajakaruna directed the petitioner to file an amended petition before September 30.

Filing this petition through counsel Sunil Watagala, the petitioner had named Acting IGP C.D. Wickramaratne, Headquarters Police Station OIC in Kurunegala Kapila Adikari, Director General of Archaeology Prof. Senarath Dissanayake, Kurunegala mayor Thushara Sanjeewa, the Kurunegala Municipal Council and the Attorney General as respondents in the petition.

The petitioner stated that in the middle of Kurunegala, there was an ancient King's Court (Raja Sabhawa) said to have been

built by King Buvanekabahu II, who reigned the Kurunegala Kingdom from 1293-1302.

The petitioner stated that to the best of his knowledge, the premises where the King's Court lies had been leased to a private hotel, and due to public continuous agitation, the Department of Archaeology had identified the King's Court as an ancient monument which needs to be preserved.

The petitioner stated that any monument lying or being found in Sri Lanka which dates or may reasonably be believed to date prior to March 2, 1815 is an ancient monument within the meaning of the Antiquities Ordinance.

He stated that on or about July 14, 2020, the fourth respondent, Kurunegala mayor, has demolished a part of the King's Court, which is an ancient monument and antiquity within the meaning of the Antiquities Ordinance.

The petitioner stated that he had made a written complaint with Headquarters Police Station of Kurunegala that the Kurunegala mayor has committed an offence punishable under the Antiquities Ordinance. He complained that the police have failed to take any meaningful action regarding his

Kandy police arrested six persons for allegedly attempting to abuse schoolchildren in a public lavatory at the Kandy public market.

The suspects were arrested following a complaint made by a group of students from tuition classes in the city.

The students had complained to Kandy SSP Sudath Masinghe that they were abused whenever they went to the toilet.

Following the complaint, a group of police officers in civvies had been sent along with the students to the toilet and the six persons were arrested when the schoolchildren were in danger of sexual abuse, police said.

The suspects had been reprimanded and released as the students were reluctant to take legal action against them, police said.






resident Gotabaya Rajapaksa having assumed duties as the President made a firm pledge to eradicate the drug menace from this country, while the Defence Secretary too vowed to do the same, irrespective of the challenges they may have to face in achieving this goal.

The Defence Secretary's declaration comes on the heels of several other actions by the government to arrest the threat posed by the drug racketeers in the country. Also, it comes on the heels of some apparent aggressive measures taken by the law enforcement authorities against the drug racketeers, drug users and the officials who had been assisting the drug mafia while being paid by the state to uphold the law and prevent such illegal activities.

In the past too, many successive governments had pledged to eradicate the drug menace but failed in their attempts due to members of these governments being involved with these drug rackets.

Hence, these were all temporary proclamations made by state leaders and law enforcement authorities either for political mileage or other personal gains. However, this time several officials who had been tasked to fight this menace – the officials of the Police Narcotics Bureau (PNB) – have been apprehended for the first time for being hand-in-glove with the criminals.

The Army, Navy, Police, STF, Customs and PNB have all been on their toes over the recent past and many drug and underworld racketeers, including some with prominent connections, have been arrested and many successful drug busts have been made as a result of these combined efforts and the will of the government.

While the ground forces are engaged in raids and arresting these racketeers and seizing large stocks of drugs and raiding illicit drug and liquor dens, the Sri Lanka Air Force (SLAF) has also been silently doing their part.

Accordingly, the Sri Lanka Air Force intelligence operatives together with troops from the Sri Lanka Police Special Task Force conducted raids on eight identified cannabis cultivation sites within the Udawalawe Forest Reserve on August 20.

Acting on the directives of the Head of the Presidential Task Force to rid the country of the drug scourge, Major General (Retd) Kamal Gunaratne and under the guidance of theAir Force Commander Air Marshal Sumangala Dias and with the coordination of the STF Commandant Deputy Inspector General of Police Waruna Jayasundara, the raids were carried out on August 20 within the Udawalawe Reserve.

The sites were identified and confirmed by observations made by the Beach King aircraft of the SLAF. Two SLAF helicopters – a Bell 212 and an MI-17 – were utilized to infiltrate the selected sites by air. The Sri Lanka Police STF troops were airlifted and dropped at the locations by these helicopters and these infiltrations were followed by SLAF and STF troop also raiding the locations from the ground as well.

The cannabis plants grown in these sites amounted to approximately 160,000 which were all destroyed during this operation.

Many of these cannabis cultivations are carried out in heavily forested areas making it impossible for ground troops to locate them. These illegal cultivations have thrived as a result. However, with the deployment of the Air Force for surveillance operations by air, many of these cultivations had been spotted and having recorded the coordinates of these locations, the ground troops could easily be directed to these locations to destroy these cultivations. The Sri Lanka Air Force thus has been silently rendering huge support to the ground troops too have been rendering notable support to the Army, police and STF during ground operations.

Apart from locating cannabis cultivations, the Air Force has also been able to identify illegal breweries operating in heavily wooded areas. These operations have been functioning for a long period undetected as they are carried out in thickly forested areas which serve to conceal their operations.

However, with the deployment of Air Force helicopters for surveillance operations, many of these illegal liquor operations have also been identified from the air and measures have been taken to destroy

these operations and arrest those engaged in such illegal activities.

In one such operation, a large-scale illegal liq-

was observed by aerial reconnaissance operations conducted by the SLAF and ground reconnaissance of the SL Police STF SWAT Teams was destroyed on August 28. This illegal operation was located within the Muthurajawela Forest Reserve.

According to the Air Force, the Presidential Task Force to build a Secure Nation, Disciplined, Virtuous and Lawful Society was enacted by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa with the intension of curbing illegal activities such as the distribution of drugs and also large scale production of illegal liquor. With these intentions in mind and the instructions of the Head of the Presidential Task Force Major General (Retd) Kamal Gunaratne, the SLAF together with the SL Police STF SWAT Teams located a large-scale illegal liquor production operation.

Having identified this location and handing over the coordinates of this location to the relevant authorities, the SL Navy Special Boat Squadron Troops and Special Task Force Troops from the Sri Lanka Police launched a raid on the identified location which was within the Muthurajawela Forest Reserve. A Bell 212 Helicopter from the No 7 Squadron was utilized for this special operation to transport and drop the STF troops by air. The SL Navy SBS troops infiltrated the location by boat using the waterways of the forest reserve. The illegal brewery was successfully destroyed as a result of this joint effort.

It is notable to mention the efforts and contribution of the Air Force in the success of this operation as without their aerial surveillance and contribution by air, locating this illegal operation would not have been possible.

Further, with the assistance of the Sri Lanka Air Force intelligence surveillance wing, eight annabis cultivations were identified in the Udawalawe reserve and destroyed. This operation was carried out by the Air Force Special Forces and the STF under the directives of the Defence Secretary and the Air Force Commander.

On the directives of the Air Force Commander, intensified reconnaissance missions are also being carried out at the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL) to monitor illegal drug trafficking operations and illegal migration through sea routes due to the increased COVID-19 pandemic situation in South East Asia. Accordingly, SLAF conducts a considerable number of intensified reconnaissance missions per week which are carried out during the daytime and also at night.

For these missions, the SLAF unitizes aerial platforms such as Y-12, Beach King aircraft from the No 8 Light Transport Squadron and No 3 Maritime Squadron respectively and also Bell 212 Helicopters from the No 7 Helicopter Squadron. In addition to these missions, additional reconnaissance missions are also carried out by the SLAF on requests made by the SL Navy and other stakeholders with respect to the International Maritime Boundary Line (IMBL) of Sri Lanka.

The Air Force not only contributes to eradicating the drug menace from the country, but with the clear intentions of the government to eradicate the use and spread of dangerous drugs in Sri Lanka, the Sri Lanka Air Force rendered valuable assistance in apprehending a suspect together with 50kgs of Kerala cannabis.

The raid was conducted by members of the Police Special Branch at Kilinochchi together with intelligence operatives from the Air Force in early August. The suspect was arrested by the Police Team and taken in to their custody.

Amply supporting the efforts of the government in eradicating the drug menace from the country, the Air Force has also taken steps to ensure that the Air Force personnel conform to these standards. Accordingly, the Sri Lanka Air Force also launched a comprehensive awareness programme for all SLAF personnel. With a clear 'zero-tolerance' policy for dangerous drugs within the SLAF, all personnel were made aware of the dangers and consequences.

This special three-day programme was initiated on the instructions of the Air Force Commander Air Marshal Sumangala Dias. The Commander addressed the entire Sri Lanka Air Force via a live stream which was transmitted by the Air Force Headquarters in early August. The Commander stressed on the dangers of using dangerous drugs not only to the SLAF, but also how it would adversely affect our loved ones at home as well.

With the address by the Commander, an islandwide awareness programme was launched covering all service personnel and civilians serving within the entire Sri Lanka Air Force. The three-day programme included special discussions, speeches, informative

dramas, screening of short documentaries and even guest lectures by experts in the field

Indian Prime Minister's Twitter account hacked

Twitter has said that an account for the personal website of Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi has been hacked.

A series of tweets were sent from the account asking followers to donate cryptocurrency to a relief fund.

Twitter said it was aware of the activity and had taken steps to secure the compromised account.

This is the latest highprofile Twitter security breach after similar attacks in July on US presidential hopeful Joe Biden and Tesla founder Elon Musk.

The account, with more than 2.5m followers, is the official Twitter handle for Modi's personal website.

His personal Twitter account, which was unaffected by this incident, has more than 61m followers.

"We are actively investigating the situation. At this time, we are not aware of additional accounts being impacted," a Twitter spokeswoman told the BBC in an emailed statement.

The tweets, which have now been taken down, asked followers to donate cryptocurrency to the PM National

Under the 20th Amendment, the President would be empowered to appoint members of Independent Commissions, Superior Court Judges, Attorney General, Auditor General, Parliamentary Commissioner for Administration (Ombudsman) and Secretary-General of Parliament after seeking observations from the Parliamentary Council.

These appointments were earlier made by the Constitutional Council. Among the Independent Commissions are: Election Commission, Public Service Commission, National Police Commission, Human Rights Commission of Sri Lanka, Commission to Investigate Allegations of Bribery or Corruption, Finance Commission and Delimitation Commission.

According to the 20th Amendment, the President shall, from time to time, in consultation with the Prime Minister, where he considers such consultation are necessary- (a) determine the number of Ministers of the Cabinet of Ministers and the Ministries and the assignment of subjects and functions to such Ministers; and (b) appoint from among the Members of Parliament,

Ministers to be in charge of the Ministries so determined. The draft 20th Amendment also gives the President more powers, strengthens Presidential Immunity and also allows dual citizens to enter Parliament.

Under the 20th Amendment, the minimum age limit for a President has been reduced to 30 from 35, the limit on the number of ministries fixed at 30 has been lifted, the President would be allowed to dissolve Parliament in a year after it first convenes and he or she would also be vested with the power to remove the Prime Minister.

The Sri Lanka Air Force had deployed a Beech King 200 aircraft and Mi-17 helicopter for assistance while the Sri Lanka Navy had deployed three vessels. The Navy said the Panamanian registered tanker was 38 nautical miles off Sangamankanda point and it carried around 270,000 metric tonnes of crude oil at the time of the accident. The tanker was heading to India.

The Navy deployed three vessels to assist the distressed tanker to rescue injured Seamen aboard. The Air Force also dispatched a surveillance aircraft to monitor the vessel and to assess the damage. The Indian Coast Guard said that it diverted 'Shaurya, Sarang, and Samudra Paheredar' ships and Dornier aircraft as immediate fire fighting assistance was sought by the Navy. Two Russian Navy ships also joined the rescue operation.

A Marine Environment Protection Authority (MEPA) spokesman said it was on high alert over the possibility of an oil spill since the fire had happened in the engine room below. The fire had begun around 7.45 am and the cause of the fire was suspected to be an engine fault. The vessel was built in 2000. The warehouse management headed by Anuradhapura Government Agent R.M. Wanninayake allows farmers to store their harvest at the granary and helps them to market their harvest at a higher price in the off-

Wannianayake said that the

district needed three more granaries to assist farmers.

Farmer organizations in Anuradhapura whose lands are irrigated by 13 major tanks, have been urging the Anuradhapura Government Agent the District Agriculture Committee and the Paddy Marketing Board (P.M.B.) to provide public threshing ground facilities to overcome the acute problem of crop drying facilities. It is reported that farmers are unable to sell their paddy harvest to the government through the P.M.B. due to high moisture rate exceeding 14 percent and are compelled to sell their harvest at a low price to unscrupulous paddy dealers owing to scarcity of drying space and the need to pay off their debts.

English language training for teachers



A giant leap, online

xactly 25 years ago this day, the Associated Newspapers of Ceylon Limited, publisher of the Daily News, took a revolutionary step that would have far reaching implications on how news is consumed in this country. The newspaper you are reading now, the Daily News, launched its web edition on this day, becoming the first-ever newspaper published locally and indeed South Asia, to reach this technological milestone. It was launched by a small team of journalists and technicians, including the present editor of this newspaper. The World Wide Web itself was only three-four years old around this time and even newspapers in advanced economies such as the UK had not yet entered the Web. The Sunday Observer, the flagship weekly of ANCL, followed suit over that weekend.

The Daily News, now in its 102nd year, has always been ahead of its time in terms of technology and innovation. It was always a step ahead as far as printing technology was concerned, be it off-set or colour. It was therefore only natural for the Daily News to break free of its physical limitations and embrace the infinite possibilities of cyberspace long before others even thought of taking that course. Back in 1995, it was an instant success as Sri Lankan expats living all over the world flocked to the site to read the latest news from back home. Today, the Daily News and its sister newspaper the Sunday Observer continue to be the trailblazers in e-journalism, with up to date content available free of charge not just on the web (www.dailynews.lk, www.sundayobserver.lk) but also on e-paper (a digital facsimile of the printed newspaper), Apple and Android Smartphone apps, Facebook, Twitter and a variety of other digital platforms. And 25 years later, practically all the vernacular and English publications of ANCL are also available on the web.

It was this affinity for digital platforms that saw the Daily News and the Sunday Observer adapt very rapidly to the lockdown conditions imposed as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic. With a strict curfew shutting down the printing presses and transport links, it was no longer possible to produce physical editions of the newspapers. The ANCL shifted virtually overnight to an all-e-paper model, that saw editors, reporters, photographers and the technical staff all working from home virtually 24/7 to produce digital versions of the newspapers. Granted, there were some hiccups at the beginning, but these were quickly addressed out and the ANCL newspapers became the number one source of news and views for Sri Lankans here and abroad. These e-papers continue to thrive in the age of the New Normal, with even many traditional print advertisers too scrambling to get on board the e-editions.

The pandemic period gave us a tantalizing, yet somewhat ominous, glimpse of a world without the physically printed word. There is a raging debate on this issue. One cannot gloss over the fact that the print newspaper is at the receiving end of new developments in the world of media. With everyone having a smartphone or two, there is constant access to the latest newsfeeds from around the world as well from your friends and relatives. It is no secret that many people now depend on Facebook and other social media to get their news fix. All media are now converging on the smartphone and tablet, at the expense of traditional mainstream media including newspapers. Worldwide, many newspapers and magazines have had to downsize or even cease publication altogether as readers and advertisers move over to new media. In fact, the printed newspaper has been the hardest hit by this trend, as advertisers spend more dollars on the web and to some extent on the electronic media.

Herein lies the challenge for traditional media including the newspaper. Social/new media and the electronic media offer only a fleeting glimpse of developing events. And because anyone can post virtually anything to social media, they are replete with fake news, alternative facts, post-truths and even deepfake videos where people apparently say things which they have never even said. In this age of misinformation, conspiracy theories and outright lies (as seen from the social media posts on the pandemic itself), the printed newspaper and their Web versions have a major role to play to separate the fact from fiction, the truth from lies.

Thus people still look to the printed newspapers to analyse local and global issues in-depth. Moreover, in this age of depressing news flashes, readers also look to good news and lifestyle news that can lift their spirits. Indeed, there is ample room and scope for high quality reportage and journalism regardless of whether a newspaper is print or digital. A newspaper that gets this formula right can thrive on the Web and on the presses. As we look ahead to the next 25 years in print and online, the Daily News will pledge to stay true to the fundamental tenets of good journalism in a rapidly changing media landscape.

A Giant Leap in Poverty Alleviation

This week's commencement of the most significant social development programme in the country failed to attract its deserving media attention because the main focus shifted to the proposed 20th Amendment to the Constitution.

A member each from 100,000 poorest families in the country commenced their training programme this week to fortify their skills to join the public sector. This is the most significant step taken to uplift the poorest of the poor families in the country. Under this scheme the unemployed youths without any skills were handpicked from 100,000 poor families in the most underdeveloped regions in the country. This employment scheme was gazetted within two months of assuming office by the President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and the selection of youths was completed in the first quarter of this year. However the granting of appointments were delayed due to the restrictions imposed by the Commissioner of Elections and the process was resumed after the completion of general elections on August 5, 2020.

The newly recruited persons will e assigned to public sector offices to fill the existing vacancies of unskilled workers after completion of the training period. Thus 100,000 poorest of the poor families will be assured of a monthly income henceforth, uplifting them to a higher step on the social ladder. At the same time, the unskilled youths will be given an opportunity to learn skills so they would be equipped with capabilities for upward mobility.

Simultaneously, under the graduate employment scheme under which 50,000 unemployed graduates were selected earlier were given employment this week. When the applications were called from unemployed graduates, more than 50,000 applications were received as many graduates who were working in the private sector and those who were in the category of under-employment have also opted to join the public sector. Initially, only those who were unemployed for a period of one year were given appointments. They commenced their training period this week at different public sector offices, schools and other institutions.

Last month, those graduates who failed to get public sector employment because they were underemployed or had worked on temporary jobs and contributed to ETF and Provident Fund, appealed that their applications should be reconsidered. Acceding to the request, another cabinet paper was approved to grant employment to another 10,000 graduates, taking the total to 60,000.

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa

urged the graduates newly recruited to the pubic sector to do their utmost for the country's development to create a culture of 'Rata Wenuwen Weda' (Work for the country) as envisaged in the policy statement, "Vistas of Prosperity and Splendour." The President stated this after handing over letters of appointment to a selected group of graduates symbolizing the recruitment of 60,000 graduates to the Public Service. A simple ceremony in this connection was held at the Presidential Secretariat

The President emphasized that newly appointed employees should do justice to the salaries they earn and avoid being a burden to those who are engaged in agriculture and fisheries sectors who earn money to pay salaries of the public sector.

The President highlighted that the responsibility lies with the newly recruited to enhance their knowledge in the selected field and to pursue post-graduate studies and computer training for the furtherance of their careers. The number of graduates joining the public service yesterday was 50,177. Out of this, 38,760 are women. The number of employed art graduates is 31,172. According to the graduate classification, 29,156 internal graduates and 20,322 external graduates have been recruited. Appointments were also given to 1000 monks.

The selection of 100,000 from the Samurdhi beneficiary families were done though Multi-Purpose Development Task Force established by President Rajapaksa immediately after assuming office. The objective of the Task Force was to empower the poorest families. The Task Force decided to restrict the employment scheme to those families.

Unskilled individuals without any formal education or of lower level of education were selected under the programme. During the first phase, 100,000 jobs were provided, covering the entire island. "Between 300 to 350 persons from each Divisional Secretariat were recruited. They will be seconded to fill the vacancies which do not require any specific educational qualifications existing at schools, hospitals, and other State institutions. Measures will be taken to absorb the candidates to sectors such as masonry, carpentry, agriculture, fisheries, forest conservation, following provision of training according to the needs of the

area," the Task Force stated. The selection was done though the Grama Niladharis to identify the poorest of the families of which none of the members had regular employment. The military and police intelligence was used to double check the financial status of those families.

President Rajapaksa, while pointing out that this initiative is an idea that emerged during the presidential election campaign, highlighted the importance of implementing the program efficiently and effectively. The President said this project will be instrumental in liberating families from poverty, and empowering them economi-

The newly recruited unskilled workers will also make their contribution to various activities, such as assisting the government officials to maintain State properties and other civil activities, prevention of diseases including COVID19, dengue, natural disasters, uplifting rural infrastructure facilities, and coast conservation.

The recruits, while employing as unskilled workers, will also get opportunities to train for various selected skills enabling them upward movement in employment. Under another phase, it is also expected to provide foreign employment opportunities based on their capabilities and skills. It has been planned to link them to a pension scheme upon completion of 10 years of service.

Adviser to the President Lalith Weeratunga pointed out that this will pave the way to rectify the long-term political error of recruiting educated people for jobs that do not require a qualification. Another advantage to the new recruits is that they will be given employment opportunities within proximity of their residence.

During the training period they will be paid 22,500 rupees as a training allowance. Based upon available job opportunities in proximity to the applicant's residence and his choice of field for training, his/her vocational program was decided.

The training program will be conducted at the Training Centers in the same area of the applicant's residence or at the nearby Training Centers. Following successful completion of the training program trainees will have the opportunity to be appointed to an accepted permanent government position in his own residence area with a non-primary skilled salary of Rs. 35,000 and allowances. After a satisfactory and uninterrupted career record of 10 years he/she will be eligible for pension.

President Rajapaksa said the program will be helpful those poorest of the Samurdhi beneficiary families who now get only a monthly dole of Rs 3,500 to raise their income Rs. 35,000 plus other allowances entitle by new public sector employees. This is the most remarkable programme ever launched to achieve the vision of poverty eradication.

The selection was done though the Grama Niladharis to identify the poorest of the families of which none of the members had regular employment. The military and police intelligence was used to double check the financial status of those families. President Rajapaksa, while pointing out that this initiative is an idea that emerged during the presidential election campaign, highlighted the importance of implementing the program efficiently and effectively. he COVID-19 pandemic has in the past six months turned our world upside down. Beyond the virus itself, the response has had a disproportionate and devastating social and economic impact on women and girls.

COVID-19 is deepening existing inequalities, including gender inequality. Already we are seeing a reversal in decades of limited and fragile progress on gender equality and women's rights. And without a concerned response, we risk losing a generation or more of gains.

Since the start, women have been on the frontlines of the response, as healthcare workers, teachers, essential staff and as carers in their families and communities.

Between 70 and 90 per cent of healthcare workers are women, but their salaries and conditions often fail to reflect the lifesaving roles they occupy. Personal Protective Equipment is often made to fit a standard man, which means women care workers may be at greater risk of infection, and fewer than 30 percent of decision-making roles in the health sector are occupied by women. 70 to 90 percent of healthcare workers doing the work, with only 30 percent in decision-making roles.

In the broader economy, the majority of women around the world are employed informally. Many have been thrown into financial insecurity by the pandemic, without regular income and lacking any social safety

The pandemic has exposed the crisis in unpaid care work, which has increased exponentially as a result of school closures and the needs of older people and falls disproportionately on women. Before the start of the pandemic it was clear that care work – unpaid in the home and underpaid in the formal economy has long been a contributing factor to gender inequality.

Now, the pandemic has exposed the extent of its impact on physical and mental health, education and labour force participation.

There are also disturbing reports from around the world of skyrocketing levels of gender-based violence, as many women are effectively confined with their abusers, while resources and support services are

In short, the pandemic is exposing and exacerbating the considerable hurdles women face in achieving their rights and fulfilling their poten-

Progress lost may take years, even generations, to recover. We know from the Ebola outbreak in West Africa that when teenage girls leave school, they may never return.

Today, millions of teenage girls around the world are out of school, and there are alarming reports of an increase in teenage pregnancies in some countries. Each of these issues is a crisis within a crisis.

Protecting the rights of women and girls during this time is a top priority for the United Nations. We issued a policy brief in early April, calling on governments to take concrete action to put women and girls their inclusion, representation, rights, social and economic outcomes and protection – at the centre of all

While statistics indicate that women and girls are at lower risk from the COVID-19 virus itself, they are suffering because of the redirection of health funding and services. It is simply counter-productive, for example, to deprioritize maternal and reproductive health services. Governments must take a holistic view of the health impact of this pandemic. All women have a right to quality, affordable sexual and reproductive health services. Governments and other funds to get their econohave a responsibility to make sure women and girls can access these services, even during a crisis.

In the longer term, we need health systems that meet the needs and realities of all, including women and girls. This means prioritizing and

funding primary health care and Universal Health Coverage.

We are also urging governments to prioritize protecting women from gender-based violence in their national COVID-19 plans. At the start of the pandemic, after my call for a global ceasefire, I issued an appeal for an end to all violence everywhere from war zones to people's homes so that we can face this pandemic together, in solidarity.

I was heartened by the response; more than 140 governments committed to taking action to designate women's shelters as essential, and to continue and expand online services. The United Nations stands ready to support these efforts around the world. The second phase of the response is mitigating the social and economic impact of the crisis. That starts with putting money into the hands of women who work in both the formal and informal economies. Cash transfers, credits and loans should be targeted at women, to mitigate the immediate impact of job osses and increased caring responsi-

As governments inject stimulus mies back to work, they must expand social safety nets and recognize the value of invisible and unpaid care work. This will address the vulnerabilities women experience, ensure women's central role in economic life and in the long term, contribute to

sustainable development and more inclusive and resilient economies. The third phase of the response is

building a better future. The pandemic is only demonstrating what we all know: that millennia of patriarchy have resulted in a maledominated world with a male-dominated culture which damages every-

one - women, men, girls and boys. It is clear that we cannot go back to the failed policies that have resulted in the fragility we see around us in healthcare systems, in social protection, in access to justice. This is the time to rebuild more equal, inclusive, and resilient societies. Our

roadmap is the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

The pandemic has shown us who is doing the work that really matters: nurses, teachers, care workers. As we recover, we need to remember this. It is time to end the inequities of unpaid care work and create new eco-

nomic models that work for everyone. Benefits like health insurance, paid sick leave, paid child and family care and paid parental leave are not luxuries; they are vital to the functioning of our societies. Extending those inevitably has a gender dimension, because so much of the work women do is underpaid and undervalued.



We must also emerge from this crisis with women's equal leadership and representation.

The past months have seen a growing recognition in the media and through academic research highlighting what we have known anecdotally for years: that women leaders are extremely effective. Women Heads of State, Ministers of Health, health workers and community leaders are winning widespread recognition for their empathy, compassion, communication and evidence-based decisionmaking.

Their actions are showing the value of inclusivity. It stands to reason: doubling the resources, capacity and expertise we put into decisionmaking benefits everyone.

And yet less than eight percent of Heads of State, less than 25 percent of Parliamentarians, and less than 30 percent of decision-makers on health care are women. Bias and discrimination are harming us all. And again, this is essentially a question of power. I am proud that we achieved gender parity at the beginning of 2020 with 90 women and 90 men as full-time senior leaders, two years ahead of the target date I had set. We have a roadmap in place for gender parity at all levels of the United Nations in the coming years, and I will push hard for its implementation.

Organizations and companies that include equal numbers of women at all levels are more effective, efficient and resilient to sudden shocks.

This is also why I have made temporary special measures a signature issue of my Call to Action on Human Rights. Unless we use quotas and temporary special measures to remove the biases and obstacles to women's equal participation, women will never realize their full rights, and societies will never reap the benefits of equality and inclusion.

This year is an important one for gender equality, marking the 25th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration, the 20th anniversary of Security Council Resolution 1325 on Women, Peace and Security, and the first year of the Decade of Action on the Sustainable Development Goals.

We remain determined to advance women's priorities and to ensure their equal rights and participation in the peace and security agenda, on climate change, on building inclusive economies, and on reducing and eliminating the digital divide so that women have an equal role in designing the technologies of the future.

I want to reassure women everywhere, that the United Nations stands with you and is working for you every day, around the world. As we mark our 75th anniversary, we need your voices and engagement more than ever.

The United Nations is changing, and we count on you to be part of that change. At a time of growing nationalism and populism, the forces ranged against global solidarity can seem overwhelming. But if we are to meet today's global challenges, from the climate crisis to growing inequality and the digital divide, we must join together, rejecting sexist and ageist stereotypes that prevent women – and men – from realizing our full humanity.

ome speeches have afterlives. They live, nourish and inspire people long after the speech-writer or speech-maker is gone. They are found in books with titles such as 'The Greatest Speeches Ever Made.' Typically such collections feature people who are already well known. The speeches of the unknown don't even make it to the footnotes. Much like the stories of insult and humiliation suffered by people at the wrong end of skewed systems.

And that's why a couple of speeches made by two 17 year olds are that much more pre-

Here's the backstory in brief. People all over the USA took to the streets protesting racism and police brutality following the murder of George Floyd on May 25, 2020. Three months later they are still protesting, demanding sys-

Among the protestors in Philadelphia were some students attending Lower Merion High School. They were out there in the streets with banners and placards. They screamed their slogans. They were tear gassed. They didn't let up. They went out, day after day. At one point they decided that protest is a

necessary 'first step' and as such must be followed by on-the-ground efforts to change. They didn't wait for parents, school, city, state or Washington DC. So they organized a march ('Public School Solidarity') from Cynwyd Station Park to Tustin Playground. This was what it was about: 'Lower Merion students stand with fellow students at Overbrook High School to address racial injustice in public school funding.'

The why of it was explained beautifully by 17 year old Kisara Freeman: 'You can't own a cause from your armchair. You have to get out into the streets and become just another person adding your strength to fight. You have to get comfortable with being uncomfortable.'

Kids from Lower Merion make it to the Ivy League universities. Those in Overbrook rarely do. 'How did we become so wildly talented?' Kisara asked and answered her own ques-

You have to get comfortable with being uncomfortable



'We have round-the-lock access to school counselors, college counselors, mental health specialists, psychologists and social workers, and when the SAT gets canceled because of COVID, we hold our own. Lower Merion High School has clean air and ventilation, Overbrook High School has 62 reports of asbestos. Lower Merion offers electives ranging from ceramics all the way to oceanography, Overbrook offers 5 electives. We pride ourselves on our high athletic achievements. But it's easy to excel with our 4 fields, two basketball courts, an olympic size swimming pool and a regulation track. How can Overbrook even begin to compete?

'Our accomplishments which measure us as being "better than" others can only be proved

if they are earned on a level playing field. And the field is tilted entirely in our favor.

Today we students at Lower Merion demand that our parents, teachers, and administrators, PRACTICE the equality that they preach in our homes and in our classrooms.'

She got what others don't get or are uncomfortable about getting.

'Don't ignore the work and daily activism and courage of the youth in this country then tell us that the only thing that will change anything is the vote. We've technically had the vote for 55 YEARS and voted many different people into office but George Floyd, Breonna Taylor, Trayvon Martin, Eric Garner, John Crawford, John Africa, Michael Brown, Dante Parker, Tanisha Anderson and thousands of others are still dead. Their lives did not matter, because we did not do the work to dismantle a system that insists that black lives do not matter. A system that teaches us in a hundred different ways how very little black lives

Her friend and fellow protestor, Caitlin 'Catie' McGinty, was as eloquent and demonstrated exemplary understanding of 'systems.'

Every level of our country, beginning with our educational system, is built to profit off and exploit us, particularly historically marginalized people. The SAT [Scholastic Aptitude Test] is the most significant and perfect example because it is the capstone achievement of a deeply racist system that all of us have permitted to stand. Today marks the beginning of a long overdue commitment to no longer support this.'

And so she stated that the protest was actually the launch of a nationwide petition to abolish the SAT from every school 'not because you want to be "progressive" not because you want to make "allowances for COVID issues and test cancellations," but because it is shameful to normalize standardized tests before we've normalized standard education to all students.'

And they were out there for reasons they've obviously put a lot of thought into:

'WE are here today because we recognize that a select type of student is offered more from the get go. WE are here because we are committed to no longer blaming the student for their shortcomings. WE are here because we refuse to participate in a system that favors us and neglects our friends across the street. WE are here because for too long we knowingly and unknowingly reinforced a socio-political system that divides urban and suburban schools. WE are here today because we are committing ourselves to putting an end to this once and for all.' She spoke for all who were there, those peo-

ple who had decided to be comfortable with discomfort, who realized that tokenism is a cop-out and that a sign, an instagram post, a like, a share, a tattoo etc., means nothing if they do not see what's happening on the uncomfortable side of the street. And for those who were uncomfortable about being, well, uncomfortable.

Catie had a clear message to parents, teachers and administrators: 'stand with us or move out of the way because this is just the begin-

These young people are on the move. Agitation has tempered them. Steeled them. Made them so much tender and for this reason alone so much more formidable than they were and others are.

The speeches are all recorded. The media, as Kisara's older sister Hasadri observed in a sharp critique of a particular report, will either not get it or will twist it.

Some words are lost in translation. Some are made to be lost in translation. Some will light fires, move the immovable, squeeze out water from pebbles. When that happens it will not matter what the word was or who spoke

I listened to a recording of Kisara's speech. I read the transcript of Catie's speech. The world got just a little bit safer, I feel.



rotecting the environment and preserving it for the next generation is what Udaya Gunaratna and his partners do. Gunaratna, together with partners Shehan Corea and Priyadharshika Corea, Managing Director and Director of The Eco Biz Packaging, has been developing a sustainable packaging product that's environment friendly and cost-effective

Speaking to the *Daily News*, Gunaratna who was mulling over the idea for almost two years, said he had decided to implement the innovation during the Covid-19 lockdown. "I had researched this for almost two years and decided it's about time to let it out to the world. I called it 'sustainable packing'," he said.

Running through the packaging products made out of partly recycled paper, Gunaratna together with his team has spent days not only on packaging for food, vegetables and fruits, but also for other goods like ceramic plates, glassware and other breakable items.

"The current packaging of lots of these items causes harm to the environment. The chemicals that are used to make polythene are harmful and after one use, polythene is discarded. Sustainable packaging doesn't have all these negative attributes. It is made out of recycled paper and can be reused again. Besides, the packing perfectly fits whatever it is used for. I am a lover of the environment, and now more than ever I feel the environment needs a lot of attention," Gunaratna explained.

It was not easy for Gunaratna, as many were dismayed by the idea at initial stages, and he had to find partners to support the venture financially on a long-term basis. That's when he met Shehan and Priyadharshika Corea, the duo behind Eco Biz Packaging, who already had a packaging company that provides packaging for leading brands. The *Daily News* posed the following questions to Gunaratna:

What does biodegradable sustainable packing do?

One, it's environmentally-friendly. I invented this keeping in mind the environment. Two, it absorbs the moisture but takes to any shape or size of the fruit or vegetable, holding it without letting it slip. It was only last week that the product had obtained the patent rights for the design, which is stretchable and biodegradable.

What are the benefits?

This saves trees, water and electricity. The packaging is not made out of 100 percent virgin paper, and cannot be found in Sri Lanka as I have innovated it. I have received more 6,000 orders from various fruit and vegetable suppliers. I am happy that in a small way, the change is happening and as time goes on, it will catch on.

Any other related benefits for the economy?

This project can provide job opportunities to many, as a lot of companies locally and abroad are moving out of plastic, rigifoam and polythene. Those at home and retired persons can do this on a part-time basis, as the demand will increase in the coming days.

Gunaratna had joined the business sector at a young age, after engaging in various fields. "I am an inventor and I want this product to reach recognition, and I seek assistance from the public and the government to market the product locally and globally."

We are hoping to get recycled paper from a local mill in Valaichchenai, rather than importing it. This will create opportunities for the locals. This biodegradable mesh cover can be a benefit in many ways to the export and import sectors."

Five-year Action Plan on National Child Protection Policy on the cards

The National Child Protection Authority (NCPA) in a response to a Daily News lead story on August 19 titled "NCPA failed to resolve 53% of child abuse cases" said the news item has been based on the special audit report on the National Child Protection Authority.

NCPA Chairman Professor Muditha Vidanapathirana said the Authority under his command has taken tremendous measures to rectify drawbacks during the short stint of nine months since assuming duties.

Professor Vidanapathirana said he and his deputy assumed duties on January 1, 2020 and a massive amount of work has been conducted to regularize the services rendered by the NCPA.

Special attention was paid to rectify the drawbacks that occurred during the past nine years up to September 30, 2019, a period before the appointment of the new management," he

The NCPA Chairman said that the Cabinet of Ministers on October 20, 2019 has approved the National Policy on Child Protection and a fiveyear action plan from 2020 to 2025 is being prepared based on this national policy.

The full statement: Based on the right to reply and equal rights to publish, the Board of Directors of the National Child Protection Authority (NCPA) decided to send a reply for the statements in the above article. This news item was based on the special audit report on the National Child Protection Authority (NCPA) from January 1, 2011 to September 30, 2019.

The newly appointed Chairperson and the Deputy Chairperson assumed duties on January 1, 2020. During the past seven months, a massive amount of work has been conducted to regularize the services carried out by the NCPA and special attention was paid to rectify the drawbacks that occurred during past nine years up to September 30, 2019, a period before the appointment of the new management. During this short period in office, the Authority has been able to fulfil most of those drawbacks.

The said report mentioned that NCPA failed to prepare a national child protection policy. However, the NCPA wishes to state that on

October 29, 2019, the Cabinet had approved the National Policy on Child Protection.

Based on that, a five-year action plan for the National Child Protection Policy from 2020 to 2025 is being prepared and will be completed by September 2020 to create awareness among the public on child protection, to prevent child abuse and to protect and rehabilitate the innocent vic-

Also, an annual action plan aimed at children, families, schools, child development and care centres, professionals, voluntary organizations, the community and society is being carried out through our district and divisional officers.

Another point highlighted in the audit report was the shortage of staff in the NCPA. However, special attention has been given to recruit staff by the newly appointed Chairman and the Deputy. Out of the 534 cadre positions, 186 have fallen vacant in the past nine years. Fifty-two existing staff members who fulfilled the criteria of recruitment were utilized to make up the duties. Further, the approval of the Board of Directors was obtained and action has been taken to recruit new staff.

The new Chairman paid attention to solving the existing human resource management issues. By January 1, 2020, only 30 employees were permanent out of 358 who were in service. During the past seven months, an additional 105 employees were made permanent. Efficiency bar exams which were not conducted in time for promotions were held and the remaining eligible employees will also be made permanent in due

Lapsed annual increments of the employees for the past four years were updated and all justifiable transfers requested were made.

During past seven months, 60 percent of child abuse cases which were not solved during the past 10 years were completed and the remaining 40 percent are under observation at present. Almost all cases reported in 2020 are being investigated, coordinated and monitored, and action is being taken to arrest the suspects.

Police stations islandwide send 'First reports' of child abuse cases to the NCPA within 24 hours of the complaint. For the first time, a digital 'Police Complaint Update and Management System' (Police CUMS) was implemented to monitor those complaints.

During the Covid-19 period, a special progamme named "Sith Saviya - National Childcentered Psycho-Social Support Service (NCPS)" was established and offered counselling and psycho-social services to children and their families and currently it has become a service to the nation.

The toll free trilingual child-friendly telephone service was kept alive even during the 'work from home' period of Covid-19, by using call forwarding and hunting facilities of SLT. Further, during the lockdown period, 19 family reunions were made for the children who were separated from their families.

Recording of the video-evidence is a unique service of the Authority and 60 recordings were performed in 2020. Such video recording centres will be started in all nine provinces in the near future. Nine "Lama Piyasa" centres will be built for victimized children in paediatric units of each province and a separate "infant receiving centre" will also be developed in each such unit.

In future, every district will have a special court for children. The Authority will take special effort to include age appropriate sex education into the school curriculum.

Another responsibility of the NCPA is to develop the minimum standards and the monitoring of the child care institutions and the criminal justice system of children. However, the Authority has monitored only 400 centres for child development for the past nine years and now we have extended monitoring up to 50,000.

As more cases of the disease were discovered in the country, I shifted my focus to understanding the virus better: especially its asymptomatic nature.

Today, I am supporting the collection of COVID-19 samples and facilitating the research between several Institutions

This virus has an impact on all our lives, regardless of any religion or creed. To defeat it, we all need to work together."

CHANDRAN'S story

A vegetable vendor at one of Sri Lanka's busiest economic centres, Chandran kept his shop going even during the lockdown per the government's requirement. Despite various challenges, he believes in the role he must play to keep the economy flowing. He currently supports a family of eight with his small business.

"I've had this small shop at the Narahenpita Economic Centre for over eight years. It's how I support my mother, sister and her children. Even during the lockdown, the Centre stayed open for the sake of the consumers and the farmers.

The livelihoods of many depend on the sales we make. We were lucky because there was no shortage in produce supply. My family is worried because I'm working in such a busy environment during COVID-19. We adhere to all the health guidelines. This is something I am especially careful about.

"We are in the food business: whether there is a pandemic or not, we must be responsible for the produce we sell because it has a direct impact on people's health. I always handpick the items I sell and ensure that they are safe for consumption."



MADHURA'S story

Madhura started to cultivate exotic vegetables with the support of the Agribusiness Partnership Programme sponsored by the International Fund for Agricultural Development. Despite challenges related to the COVID-19 lockdown, he kept on farming and participating in the market. Following the lockdown, he has made great profits by adapting new strategies in his agribusiness.

"Though my parents were into traditional agriculture, I always knew that we could improve on what we had. That is why I started to cultivate more exotic vegetables with the support of the Agribusiness Partnership Programme. I needed to become not just a farmer but a young entrepreneur. With the support of the programme I drafted business proposals, obtained

loans and got the technical know-how to improve my business. My first crop of salad cucumbers was a great success. Later, I moved on to cultivating other vegetables such as bell peppers. Since November 2019, in less than a year, my business became quite successful. When the markets dropped due to the COVID-19 pandemic, I knew I had to remain courageous and not lose faith. Today my persistence has been rewarded, the demand for bell peppers have shot up and my crop is selling at almost double its previous value. I believe young people like me should not shy away from agribusiness; we can think outside the box and change our country for the better."



IROSHINI'S

story

Iroshini Seneviratne Manike is an agrarian officer, who works closely with the UN Food and Agriculture Organization on several agriculture development projects.

When Sri Lanka went in to lockdown in March, the Government was determined to keep the food production going. She was among the field officers who ensured that the farmers had the necessary support to keep producing goods despite the nationwide lockdown. Her work especially focused on promoting home gardening.

"There was not a single day that I spent at home. Agrarian Service officers were categorized as essential service workers during the COVID-19 pandemic. Although visits to the farming communities I serve were initially limited, I stayed in constant contact with them over the phone to provide advice. We had to support the local production of crops such as mung-beans, cow pea, groundnut, maize, chilies, big onions and turmeric.

As Agrarian Service officers or Agriculture Extension officers, who work in the field and interact with people, there is a risk to our health. However, we cannot abandon our farmers who are driving the food production of the country.

Many of these farm families are poor. They grapple with a myriad of problems like keeping their farmlands and home gardens safe from pests or wild animals, and economic instability while ensuring the health and wellbeing of their families.

We have to stand with them, encourage them and help them through the sharing of sound technical knowledge, now more than ever. The future food security of our country depends on it."

India is doing well in the region

n a telling statement, Sri Lanka's new Foreign Secretary Jayanath Colombage has said that Colombo will have an "India first" strategic policy outlook. Arguing that while the Rajapaksa Government has adopted a posture of neutrality in its dealings with major regional and global powers, he was categorical in underlining that "the President [Gotabaya Rajapaksa] has stated that we have a strategic securitywise 'India first' policy because we cannot be, we should not be, we can't afford to be a strategic security threat for India, period." These are powerful words indeed, and along with Colombage's acknowledgement that the decision to give Hambantota port on a 99- year lease to China was a "mistake", it underscored the pitfalls of a rather infantile debate in this country about India's neighbourhood policy in recent months.

There has been a barrage of criticism that India is "losing" its neighbourhood as border tensions with Nepal have grown and China has continued to spread its tentacles in India's vicinity.

That Indian and Chinese forces are squaring off at the border has reinforced this plaintive cry that New Delhi is getting marginalised in the neighbourhood. Even foreign secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla's visit to Bangladesh, his first outside India since the Covid-19 lockdown, got mired in needless debates about rising Chinese clout in Dhaka.

By all accounts, Shringla's visit to Dhaka was a successful one and it managed to convey Bangladesh's privileged position in Indian foreign policy matrix. Against the backdrop of the two nations celebrating "Mujib Borsho", and the 50th year of the liberation of Bangladesh as well as the establishment of diplomatic relations next year, this visit was key to setting the tone for a busy calendar of events ahead and a number of high-level bilateral visits. From expediting and conceptualising major connectivity projects to diversifying bilateral engagement, the two nations are getting serious about their priorities.

What is key here is the role played by top leadership in both nations. Both Narendra Modi and

Sheikh Hasina, despite some domestic scepticism, understand the importance of cultivating strong bilateral relations. For Modi, the development of India's East and Northeast is a top priority and a strategic imperative for New Delhi.

And that region can only achieve its full potential if it's better integrated with Bangladesh, thereby ensuring that India-Bangladesh connectivity projects will continue to be at the top of the agenda. It is important to recognise that this connectivity push is being shaped by a politician like Narendra Modi who has been forthright about the challenges posed by illegal immigration. The fact that by next year India and Bangladesh are likely to have nine rail links is an indicator of how fast priorities in New Delhi are evolving.

There is also a growing desire on the part of the

two nations to look beyond the Bengali-Bengali narrative and shape the engagement by bringing in new stakeholders more in sync with 21st century realities. There is a sizeable Tamil and Telugu population in Bangladesh in the textile industry and tech space, and a growing number of Bangladeshi students and medical tourists are now visiting South India, thereby changing the very complexion of this engagement.

It is, therefore, quite curious to suggest that India might be losing ground in Bangladesh. Of course, the all-pervasive China factor has to be reckoned with. In most of India's neighbours, China has a seeming advantage that, unlike India, it is not part of the domestic political calculus. But, unlike India, it also does not have a long-term stake in the South Asian region.

egion.
It can afford to ignore the region, which it does,

when its interests are not served. New Delhi doesn't have that luxury. For good or bad, India's future and that of its neighbours remain intertwined. So while China's financial commitments to various countries in the region are much talked about, given their size, they are largely declaratory. Even in the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, China's actual spending has been quite limited, compared to the US\$ 62 billion amount which is often advertised. India's declared loan commitments might be small, but when it comes to actual delivery, India is not far behind. Its loan terms and payment conditionalities are much better too.

For all the hue and cry about India "losing" the neighbourhood, the ground reality is quite different. With Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and the Maldives, New Delhi's relations are robust and progressing well. Bhutan remains as close as ever and even in the case of Nepal, it was Prime Minister KP Oli who recently reached out to his Indian counterpart.

Afghanistan is passing through a difficult phase, but both the Afghan Government and the Taliban leadership recognise India's critical role in shaping their nation's future trajectory. And all this has happened when India has been able to successfully marginalise Pakistan, regionally and globally. To view India's neighbourhood policy through the lens

of "wins" and "losses" is to miss the structural imperatives that shape the outcome. A region shaped by two major powers will never have a linear trajectory. And such a narrative also does a great disservice to smaller nations in the region, which have their own agency in shaping their engagements with these powers.

Finally, there has never been a golden period of foreign policy when New Delhi's ties with its neighbours were seamless. Going by India's historical record, Delhi's regional outreach today is quite promising. Indian discourse today seems more driven by domestic political imperatives than by the empirical realities on the ground. (Hindustan Times)

UN laments 'blatant' violations

of Libya arms embargo



The interim UN envoy for Libya, Stephanie Williams, on Wednesday denounced what she called "blatant" ongoing violations of the arms embargo in effect on the war-wracked coun-

Since UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres last briefed the Security Council on July 8, "some 70 resupply flights landed in eastern airports" in support of strongman Khalifa Haftar, Williams said.

Another 30 such flights were sent to western Libya to help forces loyal to the UN-recognized Government of National Accord (GNA), she added.

Nine cargo ships docked in western Libya, while three others reportedly arrived in the east of the country. She also accused foreign powers of "fortifying their assets" on both

Turkey and Qatar have backed the GNA, while the United Arab Emirates, Egypt and Russia support Haftar, who is also suspected of receiving French backing.

"The arms embargo remains totally ineffective," according to an interim report from UN experts, who added that the violations are "extensive, blatant and with complete disregard for the sanctions"

Williams said the activity "constitutes an alarming breach of Libya's sovereignty, a blatant violation of the UN arms embargo." The UN mission in Libya, whose mandate is up for renewal in mid-September, "continues to receive reports of large-scale presence of foreign mercenaries and operatives," she said.

Williams added that their presence complicates "chances of a future settlement." Russia's UN envoy, Vassily Nebenzia, rejected any accusation of Russian interference.

'Not a single Russian serviceman is currently in Libya," he said, while his US counterpart Kelly Craft slammed the presence of Russian mercenaries linked to the Kremlin.

"There is no place for foreign mercenaries or proxy forces in Libya,

including the Russian Ministry of Defense proxy Wagner Group, which is fighting alongside" Haftar, she said.

France's UN ambassador Nicolas de Riviere called for a reinforcement of the world body's mission in Libya, so that it can help shepherd an eventual ceasefire and ensure that the arms embargo is respected.

Several Council members called for a quick nomination of a permanent UN special envoy for Libya.

Ghassan Salame stepped down in March for health reasons, and bickering between the United States and its partners on how the role should be defined has stalled naming a succes-

Libya has endured almost a decade of violent chaos since the 2011 NATO-backed uprising that toppled and killed veteran dictator Moamer Kadhafi.

The GNA and a Haftar-backed eastern administration are now vying for power against a backdrop of dozens of local conflicts. (AFP)

World Weather TYPHOON MAYSAK Typhoon Maysak forecast path.

Typhoon Maysak drenches North and South Korea

At least one person was killed and more than 2,000 people evacuated to temporary shelters in South Korea as a powerful typhoon churned across the peninsula, authorities said Thursday.

Typhoon Maysak - named after the Cambodian word for a type of tree -- made landfall early Thursday in Busan on the southern coast, knocking down traffic lights and trees and flooding streets.

A woman was killed after a strong gust shattered her apartment window in Busan, while a man in his 60s was injured when the wind toppled an outdoor refrigerator, crushing

More than 2,200 people evacuated to temporary shelters and around 120,000 homes left without power throughout the night across south-

ern parts of the country and on Jeju Island.

Maysak was making its way up the eastern side of the peninsula into the Sea of Japan, known as the East Sea in Korea, packing gusts of up to 140 kilometres per hour (87 miles per hour).

The typhoon's influence on our country will gradually weaken," South Korea's Meteorological Administration said, forecasting heavy downpours and strong winds in eastern areas.

Maysak was forecast to make landfall again at around 0300 GMT at Kimchaek, North Hamgyong province. Natural disasters tend to have a greater impact in the North due to its creaking infrastructure, and the country is vulnerable to flooding as many mountains and hills have long been deforested. Pyongyang's state media was on high alert, carrying live broadcasts of the situation.

"The trait of this typhoon is that has brought heavy precipitation,' said a news reporter for Korean Central Television in its early morning newscast, standing in an inundated street in the eastern port of Wonsan.

"The total precipitation from 21:00 on September 2 to 6:00 on September 3 is 200 millimetres (around eight inches)," he added.

Maysak is the second typhoon in week to hit the peninsula.

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un last week visited a farming region hit by Typhoon Bavi and expressed relief the damage was "smaller than expected". (AFP)

Nine troops killed in Jihadist attack in Nigeria

At least nine Nigerian troops were killed in an offensive by jihadists in northeast Borno state, two security sources said Wednesday.

Fighters from the socalled Islamic State West Africa Province (ISWAP) in 10 trucks fitted with machine guns overran a military position in the town of Magumeri late on Tuesday, killing nine troops, they said.

"The terrorists over the (military) post around 4:00 pm (1500 GMT) and dispersed the troops, killing nine," the first source told AFP.

The militants burnt three vehicles at the base. including an armoured tank and an excavator used in digging fortifications to



sions, said the second source who gave the same toll. A military reinforcement from the regional capital Maiduguri engaged the retreating attackers in a fight and killed 20 insurgents, the sources said. In a statement late Wednesday, ISWAP claimed

Magumeri attack where it said 10 soldiers were killed, with weapons and vehicles seized.

The militants also claimed to have killed a similar number in another offensive against Nigerian troops near the fishing town of Baga on the Lake

Chad area, according to the statement.

ISWAP have repeatedly attacked Magumeri in recent days, burning a clinc and local administration building as well as robbing residents of phones, money and personal

Troops have been deployed to protect the town after residents began to flee to escape the insurgents. The decade-old conflict which started in 2009 has killed 36,000 people and displaced around two million from their homes. The violence has spread to neighbouring Niger, Chad and Cameroon, prompting the formation of a regional military coalition to fight the jihadists. (AFP)

Greek ministers self-quarantine after investor meeting

Three Greek ministers on Thursday said they were self-quarantining after meeting an investor who has tested positive for the novel coronavirus.

Development Minister Adonis Georgiadis and his deputy Nikos Papathanassis said they had gone home pending tests, cancelling plans to travel with Prime Minister Kyriakos Mitsotakis to port city Thessaloniki later Thursday.

Their ministry was sed for disinfection and will reopen Monday, state agency ANA said.

Shipping minister Ioannis Plakiotakis also said he was self-quarantining after meeting the investor, whom he identified as Israeli, on Wednesday.

"All precautions were taken during the meeting,





Kishin Butani - rugby promoter par excellence

of any field there has to be a person behind it. In Rugby during the 1980's and 1990s which can be called the "Golden Era of Rugby" there was one person who became the cynosure of all eyes He was none other than Kishin Ramchand Butani well known as "Kishin" who played a pivotal role in developing the game, spending his time and wealth to make it one of the best sports in the country, which earned him a honorary life membership at the recently concluded Sri Lanka Rugby(SLR)

Kishin a proud product of St.Thomas College, Gurutalawa embarked on his rugby career way back in 1965 . He was the head prefect of College in 1966 and Captained the College Rugby team along with his team mates Prithiviraj De Silva, Sohan Weerasinghe, Kishin who was enthusiastic had a love for this game and after leaving school. he started to promote rugby in the Nuwara Eliya district from 1968 to 1970. In 1971 due to the insurgency all this came to an end and Kishin came to Colombo in 1972 and joined CH and FC. In the year 1978/1979 he was chosen to serve on the sports committee. He was appointed as the Rugby Secretary of CH and FC in 1982 when CH won the 'A' Division League Rugby Title under N.H. Karunasena as Captain and Y.C.Chang as the coach. Two years later he opted to finance the game, and was the first to sponsor the Clif-

ford Cup Knockout Tournament held In any success story irrespective in Kandy. He was also the Patron of Mercantile Rugby Football Association and was a pillar of strength co-sponsoring the event for many years. His company Butani Marketing won the Mercantile Rugby Sevens three times under his leadership.

It was Elmo Rajasooriya and Y.C. Chang who introduced Kishin to CH rugby in 1982 and he continued as rugby secretary until 1986. After a one year break, he came back in 1988 to revive CH Rugby recruiting School boys from Isipathana, Ananda, Zahira, St.Joseph's, St. Anthony's, Katugastota and Thurstan. He was also instrumental in becoming the first school rugby sponsor in history by sponsoring Isipathana College in 1989 and continued until 1992, which paved the way for a majoriry of Isipathana Rugby players of 1989 and 1990 joining CH like Bimal Perera, Chanka Jayaweera, Ruwan Dananjaya, Parakrama Ratnayake, Frank Abeysinghe, Miyuru Yuganthaa, Kimal Mustapha, Sudesh Abeysinghe, Champika Nishantha to name a few.

He then played a key role in organizing the inaugural under 20 tournament among all school leavers in 1989 /1990 season for the Ziyan Saheed Trophy. In 1985 Kishin was involved in bringing Chandrashan Perera and Simon Hunter to represent CH in Rugby.

In 1991 SLR constitution was changed to the Provincial model proposed by Jeff Matheson a former New Zealander. This led to the for-

With inclusion of two Fijians by Kishin in 1996, Etonia Qoro and Meli Nakuta the two exciting world class centres and continued with more Fijian flavour in 1997 with Opethi Turuwa, Manasa Qoro, Ameniyasi Kurinova and Apisai Nagata too playing for Kandy which won the Triple Crown.

Kishin was also CH Representative at the SLR during the period 1982 to 1986 and was included in the Organizing committee of the R. Premadasa Trophy Knockout Tournament In 1984/85/86 along with Y.C.Chang. Kishin Butani was the Chairman Joint Sports of Gymkhana Club in 1988 and 1989 and became Chairman Gymkhana Club from 1990 to 1993 ushering in the golden era of CH and FC rugby.





President wants Eravur in 2021 Budget

President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has directed the state agencies dealing with infrastructure to inform the expenditure needed for the infrastructure of the planned Eravur Investment Zone to be included in the 2021 Budget.

This is where the President had asked Government heads in state agencies such as the National Water Supply and Drainage Board, Ceylon Electricity Board, Sri Lanka Telecom, the Road Development Authority to provide him with a expenditure from et al which would be presented to Parliament in November to be included in the 2021 Budget.

The background to this stems from the reality that Sri Lanka gets lesser concessions from the European Union when it comes to General Systems of Preferences Plus by virtue of this country being a Middle

Income Country vis a vis countries such as Bangladesh which are considered to be least developed countries, JAAF Secretary General Tuli Cooray told Daily News Finance yesterday.

This will also mean that the more raw materials that Sri Lanka manufactures for the apparel industry within the country such as the fabric and accessories, the higher the benefits which it will get from the EU, he said.

He also said that Sri Lanka also purchased US \$ 881 million worth of fabric and accessories from the domestic market from the seven fabric factories which are in situated in Sri Lanka and that there was a dire need for increasing the production of the raw material basis within Sri Lanka itself. Sri Lanka, although eligible to export all apparel products on a duty free basis to the EU under the GSP+ provided by the country of origin rules, and also due

to the products that are exported from Sri Lanka not having the ability to meet the country of origin rules, only 47% of the products are getting the duty free facility for the importers in those countries.

The remainder is being manufactured with fabric from other sources and when they enter the EU markets, the importer is liable to pay import duties. It is in that context that the Eravur

The first digital auction was conducted in April. "Everyone is now used to the online system,' said, Karunarathne, adding,

"I don't think we will ever go back to holding the auction the old way.

Auction prices have stabilized, and the focus has returned to strategic planning. Parliamentary elections August 5 gave the ruling party a two-thirds majority.

The election has helped settle nine months of uncertainty calmed by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa, who described his vision for the country in a major address last week





Russell Dandeniya says hisimage of Colombo is medium rise three to four storied buildings in a city with a fusion of colonial historic building fabric with modern cozy public spaces. "If we want to make Colombo more vibrant, we have to extend the night life. It should simply be an Asian brand of night life based on family life, as example Javasalmi in India-rooftop night life which is a family-based night life, where they use mostly folk music. Some great cities of the world are dead in the night. It should be a vibrant and awakened city if we continue mix development, I am sure we will be the 'Wonder of Asia' with more control and a holistic planning approach," said Dandeniya.

Dandeniya pointed out that what we see in Colombo places like Marino Mall, Shangri-La, One Galle Face and Colombo City Center is more than an architectural trend - it responds to a free market economy driven by consumerism and profit motivation. However, he says that Colombo should retain its identity or its 'poetic rhythm', an identity that Colombo has built up over the vears. Changes should complement the image of the city.

"I can see most of these high rises can be found anywhere in the consumerist world. I have seen many countries that have



ccording to the Scientific American, a "living building" as approved by the United States Green Building Council is the new construction ideal in the United States. According to Euronews, another important web source, the world population is bound to turn 68% green by 2050, with an increased number of individuals striving to meet the criteria of turning working and home facilities into "green" or "living" buildings. With so many constant changes occurring in our environment and a clearer shift in human consciousness, we predict that there is a high chance of interest, and thus investments in such structures will boost by 2040. So, it would be helpful to check out the criteria for qualifying as a green building, wouldn't it? This is exactly why we are here for. Let's explore these concepts together.

According to researcher Joseph Allen at Harvard University, "sick" buildings exist, and they pollute the environment. They are, therefore, toxic and unfit for the changes that will unfold, at least from an environmental perspective. In the end, a green building promotes healthy construction behaviors and a desirable environment. Moreover, these buildings should meet the following

A green building should take on a design that easily adapts to the changing environment without hesitation. That means, the design must be sustainable so, according to the World Commission on the Environment and Development, it should meet each generational need. To build up such a schema, you must ask yourself the following ques-

• Is it beneficial for the environment?

• How about the building's energy use? • Would your project damage the environment in any way?

 Can the elements that were used for construction be recycled and renewed? If not, could they be replaced without damaging its whole structural design?

• Does the building contribute or could possibly contribute to the waste stream?

That is because Europe has been putting in a constant effort throughout the years to keep its buildings green and thus, sustainable. Europe is closely followed by Asia in the green building progression industry, with Japan having built almost 80% of its urban structure in a "green" way. The projects are

estive cakes can make any : occasion special, and the Malaysian delicacy called kek lapis Sarawak is so beautiful that no other table centerpiece is needed. First baked in the 1970s, layer cakes from Indonesia originally inspired bakers in the state of Sarawak to develop their own version with complex designs comprising thin, naturally flavored layers.

The confections were initially crafted for special holidays, but the popular dessert has become a source of regional pride and is now sold year-round from master bakers who have spent years perfecting their skills. The construction of kek lapis Sarawak is labor-intensive; one cake can take up to eight hours to complete. It's thanks to the geometric designs that help give the name. ("Lapis" means layers in Bahasa Malaysia, the official language of Malaysia.) To create these motifs, the batter must be baked in large pans, adding a new thin layer of color every 10 minutes. The cakes are then strategically cut based on a sketch designed by the baker. They are then reassembled, using condensed milk or jam as a binding agent, and their kaleidoscopic beauty appears as cross-sections that are revealed with each slice.

Baking kek lapis Sarawak requires years of skill and practice - just ask Jennifer Chen. She first baked the delicacy in 1980 at the request of a friend who missed her own mother's recipe. Through experimentation with flavors, Chen built a successful business. Although she retired from professional baking in 2003, Chen has said that while her decades of practice allow her to easily bake kek lapis Sarawak, "For a learner...I don't think


pick it up so soon. It's very confusing." Kek lapis Sarawak became a passion for Chen and her family. Chen's daughter, Karen Chai, continues her legacy with her business Kitchen Confidante. Chai builds off her mother's expertise and knowledge with her own background as an engineer and her training at Le Cordon Bleu, the legendary cooking school in Paris. In an email to My Modern Met, Chai reflects on how her kek lapis Sarawak has evolved, writing,

he Covid-19 pandemis forcing tourism businesses to think outside the box in order to stay afloat. Case in point, a Kerala hotel and spa that turned its pristine swimming pool into a fish

The Aveda Resort and Spa in Kumarakom, Kerala had to shut down operations in March, as part of a nationwide coronavirus lockdown, and hasn't been able to open since. To make sure that its employees have some activity and that the property generates some income to hopefully pay basic bills so it can survive until tourism opens again, management decided to repurpose a 7.5-million-litre swimming pool as a fish pond.

"We have had zero revenues, so in June, we put around 16,000 2-monthold pearl spot fish in the pool," Aveda's general manager, Jyotish Surendran, told AFP. "We plan to harvest by November and will export to the Middle East."

Surendran estimates that Aveda will be able to harvest around four million tonnes of pearl fish from the makeshift pond, which they plan to sell for around \$40,000 in the Middle East. That's hardly enough to cover the losses sustained by the business during the lockdown, but at least it keeps the staff busy and should help pay maintenance

many as "genetically perfect" recently became the world's most expensive sheep, commanding a price of 350,000 guineas (\$490,000) at a Scottish auction. Texel sheep, originating from the tiny island of Texel, ust off the coast of the Netherlands, routinely command five-figure prices at auctions, thanks to their lean meat and wool used for hosiery yarns, but a particularly special specimen just made other Texels look cheap. Double Diamond, am outstanding lamb featuring the best genetics, had sheep breeders in the whole of the UK up in arms trying to somehow get their hands on him. Even before the Scottish National Texel sale in Lanark had started, some breeders had already partnered up to bid a higher price for Double Diamond.

"It was more nerve-racking than excitement," Jeff Aiken, one of three breeders who allied to bid for Double Diamond, said. "We knew it was going to be something really special. He was just an outstanding animal, backed up by all the best genetics. There was about seven or eight people who really, really wanted him and that's what led to the price.'

Before the auction, Aiken and another breeder had decided to bid for the lamb together, but as competition became stiffer, a third breeder joined the partnership. Thus the trio managed to outbid everyone else. offering a whopping 350,000 guineas (\$490,000) for Double Diamond. The previous record for a sheep sold at auction stood at just over \$307,000, set in 2009.

"Don't get me wrong, it is an obscene amount of money to pay for a sheep, and it definitely should not be a reflection on the farming community," Aiken pointed out.

So what's next for Double Diamond, the new world's most expensive sheep? Well, his three owners will be sharing him on their farms, pairing him off with dams for a premium price, and as he gets older, his sperm will be collected for artificial insemination, so he can continue passing on his exceptional genetics. One

thing is for sure, Double Diamond will have a lot of work to do to justify






