**IRRIGATION DEPARTMENT****Kantalai Augmentation Scheme, E. P.**

5. Tenderers may tender for both or either of the two items

6. Only contractors who are registered in the Irrigation or Public Works Department for works costing Rs. 100,000 and over are eligible to tender for any one item. Firms of repute and sound financial standing who are desirous of tendering for the work but are not at present registered as contractors in either of the above-named departments should get themselves registered as contractors before applying for tender forms for the work.

7. Those tenderers who have contracts already in hand under Government should obtain certificates of satisfactory progress thereon from the respective Superintending Engineer or Divisional Irrigation Engineer in charge and submit same on application for tender forms.

8. No tender will be considered which is not made on the recognized form or which does not wholly comply with the conditions herein mentioned.

9. Tendered rates and amounts under each sub-item in the bill of quantities must be entered clearly in ink and any alterations therein should bear the initials of the tenderer. The tendered rate for each sub-item must be entered in words as well as in figures. The total amount of the tender must also be entered in words as well as in figures. Where the amount given in words differs from the amount in figures or if no amount is stated in words, such tender is liable to be rejected. The tenderer should give his full address on the tender in block letters.

10. Tenders should be submitted in duplicate, signed and dated, in sealed covers, addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, Ministry of Agriculture and Lands, P. O. Box 500, Colombo. The sealed covers should be marked "TENDER FOR THE CONSTRUC-

11. A notice in writing from the Director of Irrigation or his authorized representative accepting his tendered rates will be sent to the successful tenderer who will then be required to enter into an agreement with the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury within fourteen days from the date of issue of such notice. He will also be required to deposit five per centum of the amount available for tender in respect of the item of work as security for the due performance and satisfactory completion of the work before he enters into agreement. The security may be furnished in cash or through a guarantee bond executed with a bank approved by Government as surety.

12. Should a tenderer fail to enter into agreement on the basis of his accepted tender, when called upon to do so, his tender deposit will be forfeited and his name included in the List of Crown Defaulting Contractors

13. The work should be commenced within thirty days of signing the agreement and completed to the entire satisfaction of the Director of Irrigation on or before the date to be specified in the contract.

14. The contract should not be assigned or sub-let without the authority of the Deputy Secretary to the Treasury, or his authorized representative.

15. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on behalf of the contractor.

16. The selected tenderer will be required to supply his own equipment—plant, tools, materials, &c.—for carrying out the contract in accordance with the terms of the "Specification"

17. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is in the List of Crown Defaulting Contractors either individually or jointly with any other person or to whom the Director of Irrigation, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects.

18. The Director of Irrigation will not accept liability for errors in tenders due to inadequate description of service in the bill of quantities. Intending tenderers should satisfy themselves as to what is actually required by inspection of the site, plans and "Specification", and by obtaining any other information necessary from the Office of the Senior Designs and Research Engineer referred to in clause 3 above

19. The agreement will be liable to an *ad valorem* stamp duty based on the amount of security recovered in terms of clause 11 above. If a guarantee bond is furnished in lieu of cash security, the bond will be liable to a stamp duty of Rs 10. The contractor should supply the stamps necessary for the purpose of the agreement, when summoned to sign it.

20. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers will be made a condition of the contract and failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be considered a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances, the Director of Irrigation may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Agriculture and Lands. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval and concurrence is forbidden.

The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; or
- (b) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (c) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b).

These loans carry a higher rate of interest than fixed deposits in Banks and the interest is paid half-yearly by Government to the holder. When the rent period is over and the security can be released the notes can be tendered by the holder as security for subsequent rents or contracts with Government or where the holder has no further rents or contracts with Government the value of the notes can be realized without loss in the open market. The Banks too accept these notes as security for overdrafts.
