- (b) A British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (c) A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b).

15. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or has other valid interest. The extent of the landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with the Department but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tenders, should state in which division or district or divisions or districts he had held similar contracts.

#### PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING—CONDITIONS OF SERVICE, &C.

1. Candidates should be qualified in General Nursing and below 35 years of age on September 25, 1950. They must be Ceylonese according to the following definitions:—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration, and
- (b) A person who has applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration and is deemed by the Honourable Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a prima facie entitlement to such citizenship.

2. Eligible candidates will be interviewed by a Selection Board, which will select suitable candidates for training. A competitive examination may be held.

3. Successful candidates will be required to pass a medical test.

4. On being selected they will undergo training in Public Health Nursing for six months at the Health Unit, Kalutara, and in Midwifery for twelve months at the De Soysa Maternity Hospital, Colombo, if they have not had the training in the latter already. At the end of each course they will be required to pass an examination in the subjects studied.

5. The period of training as well as one year thereafter will be on probation.

6. The Director of Medical and Sanitary Services reserves to himself the right of discontinuing at any time during the probationary period the services of nurses who are found to be unsuitable.

7. Uniforms to be worn while on duty will be provided free of charge.

8. During the period of training as Public Health Nurses, nurses who are already in service and who are selected for training as Public Health Nurses will be paid whatever salary and allowances they received as nurses, and also the house allowance as in the case of others. They are allowed to continue to contribute towards the Public Service Provident Fund on their substantive salaries. No incremental credit will be given during the period of training.

Others will be paid Rs. 1,488 per annum as salary together with the following allowances:—

Washing allowance—Rs. 60 per annum.

House allowance—Rs. 30 per mensem when furnished quarters are not provided (if not a new-entrant to Government Service).

They will not contribute towards the Public Service Provident Fund during training.

9. During the period of training in Midwifery and if free quarters are available at the De Soysa Maternity Hospital, Colombo, the house allowance will not be paid.

10. On satisfactory completion of the training, salary will be paid on the scale of Rs. 1,920—120—2,880 per annum. On appointment all officers will have to contribute towards the Public Service Provident Fund except those who are in the pensionable service. Their appointments will be made pensionable.
