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Notices Calling for Tenders

TENDERS FOR THE TRANSPORT OF DRINKING WATER FROM PUTHIAMPUTHUR TO TATTAPPARAI CAMP FROM NOVEMBER 1, 1950 TO OCTOBER 31, 1951

TENDERS are hereby invited for a period of one year from November 1, 1950, for the supply of two bulls and a cart driver for the transport of drinking water daily from the Mission House well at Puthiamputhur to Tattapparai Camp.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate, sealed under one cover and should be addressed to the Director, Quarantine Department, Borella, Colombo 8.

3. Tenders should be marked "Tender for the Transport of Drinking Water, Tattapparai Camp" on the left hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the Director, Quarantine Department, Colombo, not later than midday on October 17, 1950.

4. Tenderers should quote the rate per trip and should be prepared to undertake as many trips per day as is deemed necessary by the Superintendent of Quarantine, Tattapparai Camp.

5. The water should be pumped from the well into the water tank by means of the Evinrude Pump installed at the well. This pump will be under the care of one of the employees of the Camp.

6. In the event of failure of the pump and until the necessary repairs can be effected within a reasonable period of time, the filling of the water cart tank with water from the same well should be undertaken by the contractor at his own expense and should be by means of clean and sterile buckets provided for the purpose.

7. The cart for the conveyance of the drinking water and an employee for working the petrol pump will be provided by the Department. The contractor should supply the bulls and his own man to drive the bulls.

8. The water should be distributed daily, in quantities adequate to meet the daily requirements, to the various units or quarters in the Camp. An employee of the Camp will assist the contractor in this distribution of the water.

9. No accommodation either for the bulls or the cart driver or the contractor shall be provided inside the Camp and the bulls should be taken out of the Camp premises daily, as soon as the water has been distributed to the residents, and the bulls should on no account be permitted to wander about, within the Camp.

10. Any damage to the water cart caused by the negligence or otherwise of the cart driver shall be repaired by Government at the contractor's expense except such damage as is the result of fair wear and tear.

11. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

12. A deposit of Rs. 50 will be required to be made at the office of the Superintendent of Quarantine, Tattapparai Camp, and a receipt obtained and attached to the tenders. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond after he has tendered or to furnish security within 10 days of receiving notice in writing from the Director, Quarantine Department, Colombo, or his duly authorized representative that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Government and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. Notice of acceptance of the tender will

be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at the address given by the tenderer. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

13. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons in Ceylon or in South India whose address must be given for engaging to become surety for the due fulfilment of the contract.

14. The successful tenderer will be required to furnish a cash security of Rs. 300 for the satisfactory carrying out of the contract.

15. The Director, Quarantine Department, may for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

16. Contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Director, Quarantine Department, Colombo.

17. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract when depositing the earnest money, should furnish the officer with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given.

18. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

19. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

20. The contract shall be entered by the contractor with the Head of the Department acting for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.
