(b) 100 ml. of dispersion in distilled water in a B.S.I. Crow receiver at $20 \pm 2^\circ$ C, and containing 3.85 per cent. benzene hexachloride, shall deposit in 10 minutes at rest not more than 25 per cent. of the total volume of sediment deposited after 48 hours at rest.

(c) When a dispersion containing 3.85 per cent. benzene hexachloride is prepared in salt water (27 g. NaCl + 5 g. $MgSO_4 \cdot 7H_2O$ in one litre of distilled water), the rate of sedimentation shall not differ appreciably from that in distilled water, as described in clause (b) above.

(d) When a dispersion containing 3.85 per cent. benzene hexachloride is prepared in hard water (111 pts. of $CaCl_2$ per 100,000 pts. of distilled water = 100 pts. $CaCO_3$), the rate of sedimentation shall not differ appreciably from that in distilled water, as described in clause (b) above.

(e) When 1-lb. of the material is creamed with one pint of water with good agitation, the cream so formed is satisfactory for further dilution to the concentration required in the spray fluid in not more than 30 seconds.

(f) When the material has been stored for one month at 50° C, the dispersion stability in distilled water shall remain essentially the same as for the original material.

4. 2. The Tender Board will have no objection to the tenderer importing the whole quantity of water wettable D.D.T. powder in one lot provided he undertakes to store the powder at his own expense and risk and deliver as instructed by the Superintendent, Anti-Malaria Campaigns.

3. The water wettable D.D.T. powder shall be packed in quantities of 150 lb. or less in sound water-proof containers capable of withstanding rough handling and prolonged storage. 4. The D.D.T. used in compounding the wettable powder shall have a Setting Point of 89°C. The D.D.T. itself while still in the 100 per cent state, before mixing with other ingredients, must be of such particle size that more than 90 per cent. passes through a 325 mesh screen. The wettable powder must be a fine, fluffy and free flowing powder of uniform particle size not exceeding (5) microns. It should readily go into and form a uniform suspension and should not flake or ball and thus clog spray nozzles when used in a 2½ per cent. D.D.T. concentration in all types of natural waters the maximum salinity of which does not exceed 2½ per cent. (expressed as Cl) and the maximum hardness of which is 50 parts per 100,000 (expressed as Ca. CO₃). The suspension characteristics of the finished product should be such that when it is mixed with water in 100 cc. cylinder in proportions to provide 2.5 per cent. D.D.T., a sample withdrawn at the 50 cc. level after 30 minutes of standing should contain 2.0 ± 0.2 per cent. D.D.T.

5. In that case, the quantity required will be smaller in proportion to the D.D.T. content of the dispersion. The minimum percentage of D.D.T. in any dispersion to be supplied shall be 50 per cent. In considering the price of the colloidal dispersion, the D.D.T. content of the product will be taken into consideration. Preference will be given to dispersions with higher concentrations of D.D.T. provided the prices are comparable and they conform to the specifications given below.

(b) The colloidal dispersion should contain particles of D.D.T. not bigger than (5) five microns in size and should not contain any inert solids. The para para isomer content of the D.D.T. used in the dispersion should not be less than 80 per cent. The dispersion should pour out readily from the container and should mix quickly and easily and stay in suspension with minimum of agitation when added to all types of natural waters, the maximum salinity of which does not exceed 2½ per cent. (expressed as Cl) and the maximum hardness of which is 50 parts per 100,000 (expressed as Ca. CO₃). It should not cake at the bottom of the sprayer and should not clog spraying equipment. The suspension characteristics of the finished product should be such that when it is mixed with water in a 100 cc. cylinder in proportions to provide 2.5 per cent. D.D.T. a sample withdrawn at the 50 cc. level after 30 minutes of standing should contain 2.0 ± 0.2 per cent. D.D.T.

(c) The colloidal dispersion shall be supplied in leak-proof 45-gallon drums.

(d) Two samples, each containing a gallon of the product tendered for, should be delivered. Full details as regards delivery of samples are laid down in para 5 above.
