Notices Calling for Tenders

TENDERS FOR IMPORTED SLEEPERS FOR THE CEYLON GOVERNMENT RAILWAY

TENDERS are hereby invited for the supply of 220,000 broad gauge sleepers, sawn or hewn (10 per cent. more or less). Tenderers should preferably quote for the whole supply of 220,000 in hardwoods, but tenders for the supply of hardwoods in lots of not less than 50,000 will be considered. Tenders will also be considered for supplies in softwoods up to a maximum of 150,000, but the rate for a minimum of 80,000 should also be quoted. Tenders for the hardwoods and softwoods will be considered for the following species only—

Hardwoods

- (a) From Australia—Jarrah (*Eucalyptus Marginata*).
- (b) From India—Sal (*Shorea robusta*), Irul (*Xylia xylocarpa*).
- (c) From Burma—Pyinkadu (*Xylia dolabriformis*).
- (d) From Siam—Mai Teng Rang or Thitiya (*Shorea Obtusa*).

Softwoods

- (e) From Canada or the United States of America—Douglas Fir/Oregon Pine (*Pseudotsuga Douglasii*) Creosoted and Incised; Creosoting by Rueping Process 7 lb./cubic foot. All sleepers to be treated with 60 per cent. creosote and 40 per cent. Petroleum, and to be bored and adzed before treatment, to drawings which will be made available to the suppliers after the acceptance of the tender/s.

2. Delivery of the sleepers in Colombo, whichever tenders are accepted, must be effected as follows:—

- (i) For the full quantity of 220,000 in hardwoods. } Half supply not later than January 31, 1951, and the other half not later than March 31, 1951.
- (ii) For smaller lots in hardwoods. } Each 50,000 or more up to 120,000 to be delivered not later than January 31, 1951, and the balance not later than March 31, 1951.
- (iii) For 150,000 in softwoods. } Minimum of 80,000 to be delivered not later than January 31, 1951, and the balance not later than March 31, 1951.

Tenders must state the approximate date of delivery in Colombo and not the date of loading or shipment at the port of despatch.

3. The sleepers must be in accordance with the description, specification and conditions furnished below:—

Specification for Hardwoods

- (a) The sleepers are for the 5 ft. 6 ins. gauge track and are to be 9 feet long, 10 inches wide and 5 inches deep, subject to a variation of length of 1 inch either way, and a tolerance of one quarter of an inch in both thickness and width.
- (b) All sleepers shall be cut from well-matured trees of the true species of timber named in paragraph 1, felled in the proper season when the sap is not in circulation.

- (c) All sleepers shall be of good sound, strong timber, free from heartshake, sapwood, dry rot and knot holes.
- (d) In the case of Jarrah, sleepers to the Western Australian Government Standard Specification No. 10 will be accepted.
- (e) Allowance may be made for sound gum veins, gum pockets up to 6 inches by $\frac{3}{8}$ inch, surface sun shakes, end shakes up to 6 inches, a few pin holes but not in groups, firm sound knots not exceeding two inches in diameter.
- (f) Sap or wane must not occur under rail seat and must not exceed 2 inches on either face.
- (g) The sleepers shall not be cut on full quarter; shall be cut square out of winding and straight, except that hewn sleepers may have camber to the extent of half an inch.

Specification for Softwoods

- (h) In the case of Creosoted Oregon Pine/Douglas Fir from the U.S.A. or Canada, sleepers to the (old) London Midland and Scottish Railway Company's Standard Specification for CCE-2 Grade, described below, will be accepted:—

L.M.S. Specification

Definition.—The term "boxed heart" refers to sleepers in which the heart centre is further than one inch from either of the wide faces.

Variety and Quality of Timber.—The sleepers to be supplied shall be of Douglas Fir (British Columbian Pine), and shall conform to the following requirements:—

The timber shall be of good, sound quality, well-grown, close grained, free from large knots and also free from stain, rot and large round, cup or other shakes, large pitch seams, and defective hearts.

Each timber shall have not less than five annular rings to the inch on each end section in the quarter of the piece furthest from the heart, but the number of rings throughout each end section, measured along the longest radial line, must average not less than five to the inch.

The longitudinal grain shall not slope more than one in eight relative to the side of the piece.

The extent of sapwood permitted in any one piece shall not be more than 25 per cent. measured at one or other end section of the piece.

All sleepers shall be straight, rectangular in section, except as hereinafter modified, and uniform in size throughout the piece, and the ends shall be square.

Supplies are also subject to the following additional clauses:—

Dimensions.—The sleepers shall measure 5 inches (depth) by 10 inches (width), 9 feet (length). No sleeper shall be less than the specified length or exceed that dimension by more than 2 inches or vary from the specified width or thickness by more than one quarter inch in either case.

Manufacture—It is preferred that the sleepers shall be cut from logs not larger than will produce two sleepers with the heart centre, if present, not more than 1" from the wide face, and any sleepers manufactured by quartering logs will not be accepted unless the annular rings rising from the heart face terminate on the narrow face. Variation from these clauses will be permitted in 5 per cent. of the total number of sleepers supplied, i.e., this specification allows the supply of sleepers containing boxed hearts and "vertical" grain provided that the quantity of "boxed heart" sleepers plus "vertical" grain sleepers does not exceed 5 per cent. of the total number of sleepers supplied.

Wane.—The sleepers may have wane in no case exceeding one inch on each of the two edges of one wide face, except for the central 3 feet of their length where the wane must not exceed one and half inch on either edge; both edges of the opposite face shall be square.

4. Tenderers must state the country or state in which the timber for the sleepers was grown, and must give the correct botanical name of the timber. No tender will be considered which does not give this information.

5. Tenderers must state the number of each species they are prepared to supply and, if more than one species is offered in any tender, the rate for each species should be specified, with the minimum and maximum number of each kind that can be supplied. Tenderers must also state whether the sleepers are sawn or hewn.

6. In the case of Australian woods, all sleepers must be passed before shipment by the Government Inspector of the State from which the timber is obtained.

In the case of sleepers from Canada or the U.S.A., certificates of the Pacific Lumber Inspection Bureau should be furnished for each shipment covering grade of sleepers and certificate of MacDonald and MacDonald to be furnished covering preservative treatment.

In the case of sleepers from countries other than Australia, Canada or the U.S.A., arrangements will be made for inspection of sleepers, either by representatives of the Ceylon Government or by representatives of the Governments of the countries of supply, prior to shipment from these countries, provided that the Governments concerned are prepared to undertake the inspection after prior agreement with the Ceylon Government regarding their nominees. Such inspection will be at specified portholes or within 25 miles therefrom. The fees for inspection and other expenditure incurred by the Ceylon Government in this connection should be paid by the contractors.

The above arrangements for inspection of sleepers prior to shipment from any of the countries mentioned, are made without prejudice to the Ceylon Government's right to inspect these sleepers on arrival in Colombo and to reject any which do not comply with the specifications laid down. This stipulation is applicable even if the sleepers were inspected by the Ceylon Government representatives in the countries of supply.

7. Should a contractor fail to complete delivery by the specified date, the purchase price of the sleepers delivered to and accepted by the General Manager of the Railway after the specified date shall be subject to a deduction as damages of 10 per cent on their value and such deductions shall be regarded as a reasonable pre-estimate of actual damage which the General Manager of the Railway will and may sustain by reason of the default of the contractor to complete delivery within the specified time, and shall for all purposes be deemed to be, and be regarded as, liquidated damages, and not as a penalty.

8. Should the contractor at any time during the execution of the contract find that he will be unable to deliver the full quantity of sleepers, or any portion of them, within the period stipulated, he shall at once give notice accordingly to the General Manager of the Railway, who shall have absolute discretion, either to grant an extension of time, or to determine the contract and recover damages as provided for hereinafter in clause 32.

9. Save and except on all questions relating to any breach of the covenants and conditions of this agreement on the part of the contractor on which questions the decision of the General Manager shall be final and binding as herein provided for and on all other questions where it is expressly stipulated herein that the decision of the General Manager shall be final and binding, if any difference or controversy should arise between the contractor and the Chief Engineer, Way and Works, Ceylon Government Railway, and the Contractor wishes to appeal against the decision of such officer the appeal must be forwarded within ten days of such decision to the General Manager, who will submit it, together with his own report, to the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Transport and Works, whose decision will be final and binding, if no request for arbitration, as hereinafter provided, be made by the contractor, but, if so requested by the Contractor in writing to the Chief Engineer, Way and Works, Ceylon Government Railway, within seven days of the decision of the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Transport and Works, being communicated to him by the Chief Engineer, Way and Works, Ceylon Government Railway, the Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Transport and Works, will appoint a competent person to investigate and arbitrate upon the matters in dispute.

be purchased in the open market such quantity of sleepers, as the contractor shall have failed to deliver by the specified time, the General Manager of the Railway shall give to the contractor 30 days' notice in writing of his intention so to purchase in the open market.

30. If subsequent to the issue of the notice of intention to purchase in the open market and within the period of 30 days covered by such notice, the contractor shall deliver to the General Manager of the Railway the entire quantity, of sleepers; then remaining undelivered, or any part of such quantity, it shall be lawful for the General Manager of the Railway for good cause shown or otherwise to him appearing to accept such quantity of sleepers, or any part thereof, and in the event of the General Manager of the Railway within the said period of 30 days accepting a part only of the quantity of sleepers, remaining undelivered, such acceptance shall in no way be deemed to be or construed as a waiver of the written notice hereinbefore referred to, which said notice shall, despite such acceptance, be deemed to be for all purposes valid and effectual with a view to enabling the General Manager of the Railway lawfully to purchase in the open market such quantity of sleepers, as shall yet remain undelivered at the expiration of 30 days covered by the said notice.

31. Should the sleepers so purchased cost more than the contract price, the contractor shall be liable to pay to the General Manager of the Railway the full amount of the excess cost, together with all expenses attending the purchase and procuring of the same.

32. Should the contractor fail to supply the sleepers in the quantities and in the time agreed upon, or should he commit a breach of any of the covenants of the contract, the General Manager of the Railway shall be at liberty, by notice in writing, to forthwith determine the contract, and thereupon the contractor will be liable to pay to the General Manager of the Railway all costs and expenses incurred by the failure to supply the sleepers, or by the breach of any other covenant of the contract, and shall, in addition be liable to forfeit the sum deposited by him as security which said sum shall be paid and forfeited as liquidated damages, and not by way of a penalty, and shall not be deemed to include the costs and expenses hereinbefore referred to.

33. The contract, which shall be stamped by the contractor at his own expense in terms of the Stamp Ordinance, shall be entered into by the contractor with the General Manager of the Railway acting for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

34. The Contractor shall indemnify the Ceylon Government against any claim, by or in respect of any employee of the contractor, under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Cap. 117).

35. The amount of security required shall be deposited by the contractor in the name of the General Manager of the railway and shall be mortgaged, assigned, and set over to and with the said Government of Ceylon for securing the due and punctual performance on the contract on the part of the contractor and the payment of all moneys which the contractor may become liable to pay to the Ceylon Government under the contract.

TENDERS FOR TRANSPORT OF FOODSTUFFS

INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES FOR CADETSHIPS IN THE CEYLON NAVY

TWO vacancies are now offered for Cadetships prior to commissioning in the Ceylon Navy.

2. Applicants for Cadetships will be required to fulfil the conditions set out in paragraph 4 below. A preliminary selection will be made from applications received from those who fulfil these conditions, and a final selection will be made after interview of the selected candidates by a Selection Board appointed by the Minister of Defence.

3. The following is the procedure which will be adopted and the rules which will apply in respect of those candidates who are selected for the existing vacancies —

- (a) Candidates will be entered as Cadets in the Ceylon Navy and subject to their qualifying in the various examinations and their continued suitability they will be required to serve in the Navy as a career.

- (b) On entry Cadets will be required to undergo such training in Ceylon as may be prescribed.
- (c) On the successful completion of the training referred to in paragraph (b) above Cadets will be sent to the Royal Naval College, Dartmouth, for one term and will subsequently be sent to sea in the Royal Naval Training Cruiser for two terms.
- (d) On the successful completion of their time in the Training Cruiser Cadets will be promoted Midshipmen and will then return to Ceylon for duty at sea or undergo a series of courses in the United Kingdom in Naval subjects which would last for about 21 months or may be required to serve in His Majesty's Ships according to circumstances. They will return to Ceylon for duty on completion of these courses. They will be commissioned only on assumption of service in Ceylon after satisfactory completion of their period of training or such other periods as may subsequently be considered necessary.
- (e) During the period of training at the Royal Naval College, in the Training Cruiser and also during the series of courses in Naval subjects referred to in paragraph (d) above all tuition and maintenance fees will be paid for by the Ceylon Government. All expenses such as pocket money, maintenance during compulsory leave periods between terms at Dartmouth, the cost of civilian clothes which may be worn when off duty, etc., will be the responsibility of the parents or guardian of the individual Cadet. Such expenses should be about Rs. 2,000 per annum for the period during which the Cadet is away from Ceylon.

- (f) *Normal Length of Service in Rank.*
Cadets ... one year approximately
Midshipmen ... two years approximately
Sub-Lieutenants .. not less than one year

The over-all time that Officers serve as Cadets, Midshipmen and Sub-Lieutenants will normally vary according to the degree of success that each Officer achieves in examinations. Sub-Lieutenants are normally promoted to the rank of Lieutenant after not less than one year's satisfactory service as Sub-Lieutenants. Promotions from the rank of Lieutenant will normally depend upon seniority, efficiency, vacancies and such other factors as may need to be considered.

Pay
Cadets receive Rs. 5 per diem.
Midshipmen Rs. 6 50 per diem.
Sub-Lieutenants Rs. 8.50—Rs. 9.50 per diem.
The pay and allowances for Officers in the Ceylon Navy are still under consideration.

Uniform.
Each Cadet will be provided with a free initial issue of uniform at Government expense.

- (g) (i) In the event of a Cadet voluntarily terminating his candidature for a commission during his course at Royal Naval College, the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on account of such Cadet. Such Cadet will also be required to return to Ceylon at his own expense.
- (ii) If at any time during his course, a Cadet is reported on by the authorities as being unsuitable to receive a commission, for reasons of misconduct, or due to causes within his own control, his parents or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred on his account by the Ceylon Government.
- (h) Parents or guardians are required to sign declarations as given in paragraph 10 below and to forward them together with the application. Parents or guardians of selected candidates will be required to enter into a bond substantially in this form with the Ceylon Government prior to the appointment of these candidates.

4. The conditions under which candidates may be accepted for Cadetships are as follows:—

Instructions to Candidates for Cadetships prior to Commissioning as Second Lieutenants in the Ceylon Army

SIX vacancies are now offered for Cadetships prior to commissioning in the rank of Second Lieutenant in the Ceylon Army.

2. Applicants for Cadetships will be required to fulfil the conditions set out in paragraph 4 below. A preliminary selection will be made from applications received from those who fulfil these conditions, and a final selection will be made after interview of these selected candidates by a Selection Board appointed by the Minister of Defence.

3. The following is the procedure which will be adopted and the rules which will apply in respect of those candidates who are selected for the existing vacancies:—

(a) Candidates will be enlisted as Cadets in the Ceylon Army on a normal regular engagement for a period of five years with the Colours and seven years with the Reserve.

(b) On enlistment, selected candidates will be required to undergo such training in Ceylon as may be prescribed by the Commander of the Army.

- (c) On successful completion of the training referred to in para (b) above, Cadets will be sent at Government expense to the United Kingdom where they will undergo a short period of training with the British Army, commencing on December 29, 1950, before being admitted to the Royal Military Academy, Sandhurst, for a course of training of 18 months, commencing in February, 1951.
- (d) During the period of training at Sandhurst, all tuition and maintenance fees for which will be paid by the Ceylon Government, the status of Cadets will be that of other ranks and they will be subject to Military law. Their basic rate of pay while under training in the United Kingdom will be that of a One Star soldier of the British Army (i.e. 5s. per diem) on first enlistment and that of a Three Star soldier of the British Army (i.e., 6s. 6d. per diem) on completion of 12 months' service. No cost of living allowance is payable. All expenses such as pocket money, maintenance during compulsory leave periods between terms at Sandhurst, the cost of civilian clothes which may be worn when off duty, &c., will be the responsibility of the parents or guardian of the individual Cadet. Such expenses should be about Rs. 2,000 per annum for the period during which the Cadet is away from Ceylon. However, they will be entitled to 3s. 4d. per diem as ration allowance during compulsory leave periods (i.e., periods of non attachment to a mess).
- (e) (i) In the event of a Cadet voluntarily terminating his candidature for a commission during his course at Sandhurst, the parent or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred up to that time by the Ceylon Government on account of such Cadet. Such Cadet will also be required to return to Ceylon at his own expense.
- (ii) If at any time during his course, a Cadet is reported on by the authorities at Sandhurst as being unsuitable, for reasons of misconduct, or due to causes within his own control, for the issue of a Commission, his parents or guardian will be required to refund to the Ceylon Government all expenses incurred on his account by the Ceylon Government.
- (f) Parents or guardians will sign declarations as given in paragraph 10 below in respect of sub-paragraphs (d) and (e) above and forward them together with the application. Parents or guardians of selected candidates will be required to enter into a bond substantially in this form with the Ceylon Government prior to the appointment of these candidates.
- (g) After successful completion of the period of training at Sandhurst, Cadets will return to Ceylon at Government expense and will thereupon be commissioned as Second Lieutenants in an arm of the service of the Ceylon Army according to their aptitude and the needs of the Army at that time. On appointments to commissions, Cadets will be discharged from the Regular Army engagement into which they entered as "Other Ranks". Officers will be expected to serve in the Army for a minimum period of 5 years after commissioning. The prospects and conditions of pay and service for officers of the Ceylon Army are as published in the *Government Gazette* and reproduced in the Press.
