



La Modernisation Industrielle "Colour Printing Apparatus"

Abstract :--- The invention relates to a printing machine for fabrics, papers and other materials by means of The stencils are adjusted in frames which are stencils. fixed and the fabric is shifted by a regular and discon-tinuous movement in respect to these frames. The colour is passed to the fabric through the stencils by The means of movable twin scrapers operating somewhat in the manner of a drawing pen and supplied by an adjustable feeder. There are preferably four stencils of sheet metal or of fabric. The stencils are separated by intervals in passing which the fabric is dried under the action of a hot air device arranged between the stencils. The interval between stencils, in the most favourable arrangement, is equal to double the width of the stencil.

The fabric passing under the stencil is carried along by The an endless belt which is suitably driven by a motor. fabric after printing and before winding on to a roller, passes into a drying and fixing device where it passes backwards and forwards over rollers and pulleys and finally in front of infra red lamps which ensure the fixing of the colour.

La Modernisation Industrielle Colour Printing Apparatus

Abstract:-The invention relates to a machine with endless stencils running between rotating drums for printing in several colours fabrics and other materials in a simple passage through the machine. An endless belt carries the material to be printed under the stencils and scrapers for applying colour to the material. These parts are arranged above a drying and fixing chamber which carries in its base electric infra red fixing lamps.

The fabric passes from a roller and tensioning rollers. and thence on to the endless belt and passes over rollers and then under the stencils from which it moves backwards and forwards in the chamber where it becomes dried and is fixed by the infra red lamps and finally passes out of the chamber over heated rollers.

"Improvements in and relating to collapsible containers or cartons ".

Abstract:-This invention relates to collapsible containers or cartons of the type having hinged end closure flaps certain of which are adhesively secured in position over another or other flaps in making a sealed closure.

The carton has closure means comprising an inner closure flap hingedly attached to the end of the so called front wall of the carton and having lateral gusset extensions attached to side walls of the carton adapted to fold inwardly under the inner closure flap and an outer flap hingedly attached to the end of the rear wall of the carton and adhesively securable over the inner flap. The specification is illustrated with two sheets of drawings.



Abstract:-The invention relates to the manufacture of biguanide derivatives of anti-malarial activity of the formula.
