'Separation and extraction of stalk from dry tea'.

Abstract:—This invention relates to apparatus for separating and/or extracting stalks and the like from

vegetable tissues and more particularly to an apparatus for separating and/or extracting stalks from cut and/or uncut, dry tea leaves. It consists of a feed hopper, a pair of parallel, co-operating toothed and/or serrated rollers between which the material to be treated is adapted to be passed, means for rotating the rollers in opposite directions at different speeds, whereby the material passing between the rollers is subjected to a tearing action to detach the stalk from the tissue. At least one of the rollers is movably mounted with respect to the other to allow the clearance between rollers to be varied. The movable roller is mounted in sliding bush bearings which are spring loaded in a direction normally to urge this roller towards the other.

The feed hopper is provided with a mechanically vibrated or agitated feed tray

A delivery chute, which is constituted in part at least by a sifter and a further delivery chute are provided beneath the first chute to collect the fines. The sifter is mechanically vibrated or agitated.

'Separation and extraction of stalk from dry tea'.

Abstract:—The apparatus comprises of a stationary, longitudinal tubular casing, a roller having one or more helical substantially V shaped, peripheral grooves, rotating with clearance within said casing, and inlets in the top of the casing for feeding material to be treated and an outlet in the bottom of the casing axially displaced from the inlet.

The trailing edge or face of said groove forms a pushing face to convey the material from inlet to outlet. The material falls away from the groove when it traverses the lower half of the casing and is subjected to a squeezing or smooth grinding action between the sloping face and the casing wall whereby the tissue is detached from the stalk without substantial breakage of the stalk. The material as it leaves the outlet may be passed through a known tea sorter to remove the stalk. In the alternative a portion of the underside of the casing may be provided with screening means.

“Improvements in the fabrication of building elements
such as bricks”.

Abstract:—The invention relates to the fabrication of
building elements which are moulded into shape under
pressure. The method as suggested consists of confining
a plastic mass in a mould of rectangular parallelepiped
shape and moving each of two opposed walls inwardly
relatively to one another and to the remaining walls to
decrease the internal volume of the mould. The opposed
walls are moved towards one another or while one is kept
stationary. Means are provided for keeping one or other
of the opposed walls stationary while the other is moved
or for moving both walls simultaneously so as to
decrease the volume.

The apparatus comprises a frame on which the mould
is mounted, a displaceable massive lid constituting one
of the pair of opposed walls, a latch to hold the lid closed,
and a base constituting the other opposed wall.

There is also a lever rotatably pivoted on the frame
and motion transmitting mechanism between the lever
and the base to convert the rotary movement of the lever
to straightline movement of the base along its prescribed
path.

Means are also provided for automatically disengaging
the latch of the lid after the internal volume of the mould
has been decreased to the predetermined extent.
