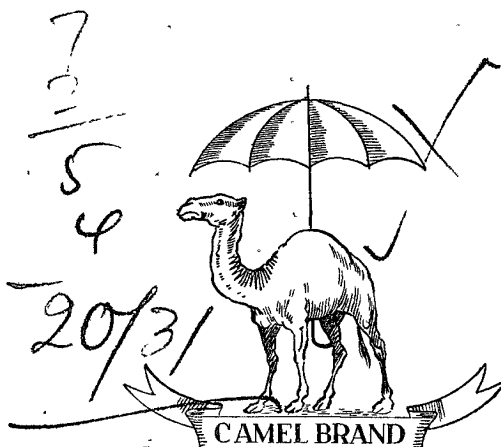

## Notifications under "The Patents Ordinance, 1906"

THE following specifications have been accepted:—

No. 3,671 of October 4, 1949. (Date applied for under Section 48 of the Ordinance, October 25, 1948)

*N. V. De Bataafsche Petroleum Maatschappij.*

"Process for preparing concentrated, fine-dispersed stable suspensions which, with water, form stable sprays suitable for combating injurious organisms."

*Abstract.*—The invention relates to the preparation of concentrates of fine dispersed and stable suspensions which can be easily diluted with water to produce stable aqueous sprays.

The process according to the invention consists in grinding the D.D.T., or another solid synthetic contact insecticide or contact acaricide which begin to melt or soften at relatively low temperature, in the presence of an organic liquid which is insoluble or slightly soluble in water and in which the insecticide is not or only slightly soluble, in such a ratio that a concentrated paste is obtained, ensuring at the same time that the product to be prepared contains an emulsifying agent.

"Improvements relating to cargo ships."

*Abstract.*—This invention relates to cargo ships and the disposition of accommodation for the crew therein. Accommodation for crew in a cargo ship having two or more decks is arranged wholly or principally immediately below the shelter deck and preferably wholly in the midships portion of the ship. In one convenient arrangement, the ship has an engine casing extending downwards through the shelter deck and main deck in the midships portion of the hull and two or more cargo hatch trunks also extending between and through the shelter and accommodation decks. The crew accommodation is constructed wholly or principally below the shelter deck around the engine casing and the two adjacent cargo hatch trunks lying respectively fore and aft of the engine casing.

"Improvements in the chemical creaming of latex."

*Abstract.*—This invention which relates to the chemical creaming of rubber latex consists of the addition of both the creaming agent and the soap to the latex before clarification by passing through a centrifuge type of clarifier. It is claimed that in this process there is no visible amount of foam coagulum produced, that the strainability of the final latex cream is greatly increased and that the through put of the clarifier is greatly increased thereby enlarging the capacity of the clarifier. Comparative figures of runs according to accepted practice and according to the present invention are given.

*Electrical and Musical Industries, Ltd.*

"Improvements relating to the manufacture of metal articles by electro-deposition."

*Abstract.*—The invention which relates to the manufacture of metal articles by electro deposition has the following objectives in view:—

- (a) An improved method to facilitate the separation of the deposited metal from the electrode.
- (b) An improved method of making a pressing matrix for use in making gramophone records.
- (c) An improved method of making a gramophone record.

The methods consist in providing the electrode with an adsorbed film by a hydrophilic colloid which is not an electrolyte. A suitable medium for the purpose consists of 2 gm. of egg albumen, 2 gm. of borax (Stabilizing agent), 1 gm. of the wetting agent "Permal W" (an alkylated aromatic sulphonate) and 1 litre of water. The thoroughly cleaned master matrix is immersed in the above medium for not less than five seconds and then rinsed in running water. The metal is now deposited on the matrix (electrode) so treated.
