(2) The owner shall submit with the application a plan of the burial ground certified by or on behalf of the Surveyor-General or by a duly licensed surveyor.

(3) (a) Where the owner intends to appoint a person to be the keeper of the burial ground, the name of the keeper shall be stated in the application.

(b) The person named as keeper in the application shall

sign the application in acknowledgment of his acceptance

of the office and the duties of such keeper

Where the name of the keeper is not stated in the application or where the keeper so named has not signed the application in the manner specified in by-law 3, the owner shall, on the burial ground being registered, be deemed to be the keeper of that burial ground.

5. In the event of the death of the keeper of a burnal ground or his inability from any cause to fulfil his duties, the name of another keeper shall be registered, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until such fresh registration has been effected, except with the

special permission of the Charman, or in his absence, of the Vice-Chairman.

6. (1) The keeper of a burial ground shall enter in a register particulars of every burial or cremation carried out in that burnal ground and shall, within twenty-four hours of such burial or cremation, send to the Chairman a true extract of such entry.

(2) The register shall be in a form approved by the

Chairman.

7. The keeper of a burial ground shall permit the Chairman, or any person authorised in that behalf in writing by the Chairman, at any time-

(a) to inspect the burial ground, and

(b) to examine the register referred to in by-law 6.

8 The owner of a burial ground shall fence it to the satisfaction of the Chairman, and shall maintain the fence in good repair.

9 The owner of a burial ground shall keep it clear of jungle and in a clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

10. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth or

less than three feet distant from any other grave.

11. Except on the orders of an authority competent to order the disinterment of any dead body, no person shall re-open any grave-

(a) within nine months of the burial therein of any dead body without a coffin, or

(b) within two years of the burial therein of a dead body in a coffin.

No person shall, within a burial ground, behave in a disorderly manner, or do any act with intent to annoy any person or knowing or having reason to believe that it is likely to annoy any person or to cause a breach of the peace.

13. No person shall construct, or cause the construction of, any wall, barrier or structure on a burial ground except on a permit issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

14. It shall be the duty of every person applying to have a burnal or cremation in a burnal ground to obey the lawful orders of the keeper of the ground.

15. The by-laws published in Gazette No. 5,786 of June 14, 1901, and therein called "Rules" are hereby amended in so far as they apply to the Udapalata village area, by the rescission by-laws 15 and 16.
