



REGULATIONS made by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs under section 155 of the Army Act, No. 17 of 1949

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Army Leave Regulations 1950

- 2. (1) A member of the Regular Force may, at the discretion of the Officer Commanding his unit, be granted in every year—
 - (a) casual leave with full pay for a period not exceeding ten days, and
 - (b) privilege leave with full pay for a period not exceeding twenty-eight days, so, however, that such leave shall not, at any one time, be granted for a period exceeding fourteen days and there shall be, save in circumstances which the Officer Commanding his unit may deem exceptional, at least four months continuous service between two periods of fourteen days continuous leave
- (2) Any leave, whether casual or privilege, not made use of in any particular year shall lapse and shall not be made use of in any ensuing year
- 3. Without prejudice to any leave which he may be able to obtain under any other provision in these regulations, a member of the Regular Force may, at the discretion of the Officer Commanding his unit, be granted during a week-end, short leave for a period not exceeding forty-eight hours. In circumstances which his Commanding Officer may consider exceptional or on compassionate grounds, short leave may be granted at periods other than week-ends, but in no case shall, short leave be granted so as to make it continuous with casual leave or privilege leave
- 4 Without prejudice to any leave which he may be able to obtain under any other provision in these regulations, every member of the Regular Force who is not on duty may, at the discretion of the Officer Commanding his unit, be granted three days' off-duty during the Easter public holidays and four days' off-duty during the Christmas public holidays. On other public holidays, a member of the Regular Force may, subject to the exigencies of the service, be granted off-duty, if such holidays are in respect of festivals relating to the religion he practises
- 5 (1) A member of the Regular Force may, on the recommendation of a Medical Officer, be granted leave on the ground of illness and such leave shall be counted against his privilege leave
- (2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in paragraph (1), where a member of the Regular Force is a patient in an Army or a Government Hospital, the period he spends in such hospital shall not be counted against his leave
- 6. Every member of the Regular Force specified in Column I of the schedule hereto, his wife and such of his children (excluding male children of not less than eighteen years of age) as are dependent on him, shall be entitled in each year to the railway warrants specified in the corresponding entry in Column II of that schedule.
- 7 For the purposes of these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, "year" means a period of twelve months commencing on the first day of January.

SUGAR (WHOLESALE AND RETAIL)

The Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Wilfred Henry Moore, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) for the Kurunegala District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the Order of the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Kurunegala District, dated October 4, 1943, published in Government Gazette No. 9,179 of October 8, 1943;
- (2) fix the prices specified in any Order for the time being in force made by the Controller of Prices (Food) under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance as the maximum wholesale and retail price per Cwt. and the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto as the maximum wholesale and retail price per Cwt. gross and the maximum retail price per pound, respectively, above which sugar of the description and grade shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that the provisions of this Order shall apply to the descriptions and grades of sugar mentioned in the First Schedule hereto;
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) the maximum price which may be demanded by a wholesale dealer from a retail dealer for any quantity of sugar which is less than one Cwt. shall be determined by reference to the maximum price per Cwt. fixed by this Order;
 - (d) the maximum prices fixed by this Order for sugar of any description and grade which is sold wholesale or retail by Cwt. shall include the container in which such sugar is sold;
 - (e) "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery;
- (5) direct that no trader shall sell sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, which is adulterated with any article or with sugar of an inferior description or grade or quality;
- (6) direct that every trader, who, at any premises within the areas mentioned in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, exposes for sale sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade;
- (7) direct that every trader who within the areas mentioned in Column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, sells any sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule shall give the purchaser of that sugar, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of the sale;
- (b) the quantity of sugar sold (by weight)
- (c) the description and grade of sugar sold;
- (d) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold; and
- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

HOOF and Mouth Disease among cattle having broken out in Manmunai North in the Batticaloa District, I Vidanelege Samson Manuel de Mel, Acting Government Agent, Eastern Province, in terms of Section 4 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance (Cap. 327), hereby declare an "Infected Area" the whole of the villages of Palaichenai, Keluthimadu, Palaikadu and Echentivu in the Divisional Revenue Officer's division of Manmunai North in the Batticaloa District.

- 2. Under Section 7 of the same Ordinance, I proclaim that no movement of cattle or cart traffic between one village area and another shall be allowed within the "Infected Area", for a period of one month from the date of this declaration.
- 3. The attention of all cattle owners and carters in the area is drawn to the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, which lay down the action which persons are by law required to take in an "Infected Area". Food Control—Extra Issue of ½ Measure of Rice for the 22nd and 23rd Rationing Weeks

FOR two weeks commencing from November 6, 1950, all rice consumers including those on estates will be issued an extra half measure of rice (or 1 measure of paddy where paddy is issued) per week at the unsubsidised price in addition to the legal ration which is issued at the subsidised price. This extra issue is the same for all categories whether worker, ordinary, child or infant. The purchase of this extra issue is optional; but the authorized distributor or Co-operative Store who normally issues rice on the rice coupon must issue this extra quantity if demanded by any consumer for any valid coupon surrendered by him during the week. The price of this extra issue will be 30 cents per measure more than the existing subsidised price which is 30 cents per measure in Colombo, so that the price for the extra issue in Colombo will be 60 cents per measure. Similarly, the price of paddy will be 15 cents per measure more than the existing subsidised price

All dealers and Co-operative Stores are reminded that this extra issue is optional on the part of the consumers. Serious notice will be taken of failure to issue this extra rice if demanded.

Failure to issue this extra rice by any dealer or cooperative store although demanded, should please be reported as early as possible to the Deputy Food Controller of the area so that necessary action may be taken without delay.
