3. Any failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided however that in exceptional circumstances the Commissioner of Food Supplies (Guaranteed Price Scheme) may with the consent of the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Food and Co-operative Undertakings permit the employment of any non-Ceylonese labourers. The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include:—

- (a) a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration; or
- (b) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon; or
- (c) a British subject who is a descendent of a person falling within category (b).

10. The contractor shall, whenever he shall require new labour for this work, recruit such labour through Government Employment Exchanges. Provided however that the contractor shall be entitled with the consent, in writing, of the Commissioner of Labour to recruit new labour otherwise than through Government Employment Exchanges where the recruitment of suitable new labour is not reasonably possible through Government Employment Exchanges.

11. The contractor shall, whenever required to do so by the Commissioner of Labour, supply him with full particulars of the categories of workers employed by the contractor under this contract.

12. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions herein laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

13. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders. Portions of tenders will not be accepted. Any tender accepted will be for the performance of the entirety of the labour and transport services provided for in the tender form.

#### Scholarships in Architecture

THE following regulations governing the award of Scholarships in architecture tenable outside Ceylon are published for general information.

There will be awarded annually one Scholarship normally tenable either in the United Kingdom or in Australia for the prosecution of Architectural studies abroad for a period of 3 years. This number may be varied and the exact number will be decided annually by the Architectural Scholarship Board. The selection of scholars will be made by the Public Service Commission on the recommendation of the Architectural Scholarship Board consisting of the following:—

Director of Public Works (Chairman).  
A representative of the Permanent Secretary to the Ministry of Transport and Works

The Chief Architect, P. W. D.

Three Senior Government Architects of whom one shall belong to a Government Department other than the Public Works Department.

The Director of the Ceylon Technical College.

2. The selected scholars will be provided with:—

(a) Free travel from Ceylon to the place at which the study is undertaken and on termination of the scholarship from the place at which the study terminates back to Ceylon on the following scale:—

(i) 2nd class steamer fare on one sea journey outward and one sea journey homeward between Colombo and a port in U. K., or Australia as the case may be

(ii) 3rd class train fare in United Kingdom and intermediate class rail fare in Australia from the port of disembarkation to the place at which the study is undertaken on first proceeding abroad.

(iii) 3rd class train fare in United Kingdom and intermediate class rail fare in Australia from the place at which the study terminates to the port of embarkation for the return sea journey to Ceylon at the end of the Scholarship.

(b) Outfit allowance of Rs. 1,000.

(c) Medical expenses up to a maximum of £50 for the full period of the Scholarship.

(d) Tuition fees.

(e) Refund of expenses incurred on purchase of drawing materials and books certified to be necessary by the Head of the Faculty. Text Books, Books of reference and instruments but not drawing materials so obtained will be the property of the Government and will be returned to the Government at the termination of the scholarship.

(f) Living allowance of £325 per annum plus a temporary increase of £60 per annum. These amounts are payable if the scholar undergoes his training in London. The amounts payable in other places in U. K. and Australia will be according to scales approved by the Treasury.

3. If it is considered by the Architectural Scholarship Board necessary for the scholars to travel for the purpose of a course of study recommended by the Head of Faculty and approved by the Scholarship Board the Scholar will be paid subsistence allowance and travelling expenses as follows:—

*In United Kingdom*

(a) 15 shillings per night away from headquarters up to a maximum of 2 weeks and thereafter 10 shillings per night for a further 2 weeks for stay at one temporary centre.

(b) When a change of headquarters occurs, i.e., when an officer moves from one place to another, subsistence allowance at 15 shillings per night can be paid up to a maximum of one week.

(c) For absences of not less than 8 consecutive hours and not involving a night out an officer may be paid 7s. 6d. per diem.

or in terms of other circulars in force at the time.

*Note.*—The above rates are intended to cover all out-of-pocket expenses including fares, portage, &c., but excluding train fares.

(d) A refund of 3rd class rail fares.

*In Australia*

(a) 15 shillings (Australian) per night away from headquarters up to a maximum of 2 weeks and thereafter 10 shillings (Australian) per night for a further 2 weeks for stay at one temporary centre.

(b) When a change of headquarters occurs, i.e. when an officer moves from one place to another, subsistence allowance at 15 shillings (A) per night can be paid up to a maximum of one week.

(c) For absences of not less than 8 consecutive hours and not involving a night out 7s. 6d. (A) may be paid.

*Note.*—The above rates are intended to cover all out-of-pocket expenses including fares, portage, &c., but excluding train fares.

A refund of Intermediate Class rail fares may also be made.

4. Scholarships will be awarded on the results of a written and oral examination conducted by the Architectural Scholarship Board at which scholars must satisfy the Board that they are suitable in every way to hold an architectural scholarship.

5. The Architectural Scholarship Board will draw up a syllabus for the scholarship examination which will be published by the Board in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*. The Board may from time to time amend the syllabus of the examination and they will publish every amendment so made in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

6. A candidate to be eligible for an architectural scholarship—

(a) must be a citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration.

(b) must have matriculated in an English University or obtained exemption therefrom.

(c) must satisfy the Architectural Scholarship Board that he has successfully completed the 3rd year of the Ceylon Technical College course in architecture and that he has had suitable practical training in architectural subjects, or that he has had not less than 5 years' experience as a draughtsman engaged on the design and construction of buildings in the office of a Chartered Architect and that he has been suitably trained, or that he has served a regular apprenticeship as an architectural pupil under a Chartered Architect for a continuous period of not less than 4 years, that he has been diligent in his studies and in his work during his apprenticeship and that he has attained a satisfactory standard of proficiency in architectural work.

(d) must not have completed his 30th year before the first day of the month fixed for the Architectural Scholarship examination.

(e) must be certified as physically fit by a Medical Board appointed by the D.M. & S.S. to undergo a course of training in architecture abroad.

7. No candidate will be admitted to the Architectural Scholarship examination conducted by the Board unless he is eligible in all respects for an architectural scholarship except 6 (e) above.

8. The conditions of the Scholarships are.—

(a) The holder shall follow a course of study in architecture at an Institution approved by the Architectural Scholarship Board and he shall not change the course of study without the prior approval of the Board.

(b) The holder shall not during the tenure of the scholarship follow any course of study or undertake any training which has not been approved by the Architectural Scholarship Board and he shall not sit for any examination which, in the opinion of the Architectural Scholarship Board, is not pertinent to this scholarship.

(c) The holder shall transmit quarterly to the Architectural Scholarship Board a certificate signed by the Head of the Faculty of the Institution at which the course of study is being followed or the person authorised by him to do so stating that the holder continues to pursue his studies with diligence and that his conduct is satisfactory.

(d) The holder shall return to Ceylon on the successful termination of the full period of the scholarship and engage himself in Architectural work in the Public Works Department, Ceylon, if

## Scholarship in Architecture

(ii) The scholar's conduct is considered by the Architectural Scholarship Board or the Head of his Faculty to be unsatisfactory in the event of which the scholar and/or his surety will be liable to repay in full the amount expended by the Government of Ceylon on the training.

(iii) The scholar fails in health.

In this event the scholar will retain the right to a free passage to Ceylon provided he returns when instructed to do so. Failure to return to Ceylon when instructed to do so, will entail the forfeiture of the right to a free passage to Ceylon.

(h) If a scholar resigns the scholarship before the expiration of the tenure of the scholarship for reasons which are not considered by the Architectural Scholarship Board to be satisfactory, he will be deemed to have resigned his claim to a free return passage to Ceylon and in this event he will be required to reimburse the Government with the full amount spent by the Government on him in connection with the Scholarship.

(i) A scholar shall not return to Ceylon during the tenure of a scholarship except during the long vacation and with the permission of the Architectural Scholarship Board. EXAMINATION

1. *Building Construction*.—Building construction up to the design and erection of buildings of two storeys in height.

Selection, consideration and preparation of sites.

Testing of soil; setting out of foundations; excavations; timbering and foundations of general types.

Brick work and rules for general masonry construction including bonding and spanning of openings and all technique of application in building. Beams; lintols; piers, &c.

Carpentry and joinery. Floor and roof construction. Finishings internally and externally. Materials of construction. Services in buildings.

2. *Theory of Structures*.—The theory and design of structures which would embrace the provision of foundations, walls, openings, piers and stanchions, lintols, upper floors, framings and roofs for buildings up to two storeys.

3. *History of Architecture*.—The Architecture of Egypt; West Asiatic regions; Greek Architecture; Roman Architecture; Early Christian Architecture in Europe; Byzantine Work; Romanesque Architecture; European Renaissance; Eastern Architecture of India and Ceylon including Buddhist, Dravidian, Indo Aryan, Chalukyan and Jain; Saracenic Architecture from Spain to India. Trends in contemporary Architecture in the West and in the East.

4. *Architectural Design*—The preliminary study of a building not to exceed two storeys in height to a specification provided. Development of preliminary study into finished presentation of the whole or part of the scheme by means of plans, sections, elevations and perspectives.

5. *Essay*.—An essay to be written without previous preparation from a group of selected subjects to show the writer's powers of observation on Architecture and allied subjects.
