SUPPLY OF TILES, MALMADUWA

Enlistment of Private Soldiers

APPLICATIONS for enlistment in the Army in the rank of Private are called for from candidates who fulfil the following qualifications:—

- (a) is a Ceylonese This means that he—
 - (i) should be a citizen of Ceylon by descent or registration; or
 - (ii) should have applied or intends to apply for citizenship of Ceylon by registration, and is deemed by the Minister of Defence and External Affairs to have a *prima facie* entitlement to such citizenship;
- (b) is not less than 18 or more than 21 years of age on March 1, 1951;
- (c) has passed the Vth Standard in English, Sinhalese or Tamil;
- (d) is of the necessary medical standard of fitness;
- (e) is of a height of not less than 5 feet 4 inches and of a chest measurement of not less than 32 inches.

The educational and physical qualifications stated above are the minimum required. Preference will, however, be given to those of higher educational and better physical standards.

2. Application will be made in the form appearing at the end of this notification. Applicants may prepare their own forms. Applications which are NOT in accordance with the prescribed form will be rejected.

3. Application forms will be forwarded to reach the Recruiting Officer, Army Headquarters, P. O. Box 553, Colombo, not later than December 30, 1950. Applications and envelopes enclosing them must be marked "APPLICATION ENLISTMENT".

4. Under no circumstances will applications be considered unless candidates possess the necessary qualifications stated in para 1 above.

5. Applications will be accompanied by a recommendation from the applicant's present employer or, if unemployed, from a responsible person of mature age who has been personally acquainted with him for at least six months prior to the date of the application. Applicants should also forward a certificate from the Principal of the last school attended testifying to the fact that the applicant has the required educational standard.

6. Procedure for selection will be as follows:—

- (d) Candidates who are considered suitable for enlistment by the Recruiting Board will thereafter be required to appear in Colombo at their own expense for final medical examination.
- (e) Candidates who are passed fit for service will be enlisted immediately.

7. Enlistment will commence on March 3, 1951, and candidates who are unlikely to be free to accept an

engagement from March 3, 1951, are accordingly advised not to apply.

8. Those candidates who are selected will be enlisted in the rank of Private in the Army and will then undergo a course of training at the Recruit Training Depot. At the end of this training they will be selected for and posted to Units of the Army according to their capabilities and the needs of the Units at the time.

9. Extract from the conditions of service in the Army affecting candidates for enlistment are set out below:—

Period of Engagement

The normal engagement is to serve for a period of 12 years, of which 5 years will be with a regular unit and 7 years on the reserve of the Army, after which a soldier will be discharged unless he falls within the categories set out in the two succeeding paragraphs.

An efficient soldier of good character who is recommended by his Commanding Officer for a vacancy may be permitted to continue in service till he has completed a period of 12 years' service.

At the end of 12 years, a soldier will be discharged but, if he is efficient and is recommended for a further period of engagement by his Commanding Officer for a vacancy, he will be permitted to re-engage for a period of 10 years.

At the end of the period of engagement (i.e., 22 years after the date of original enlistment), a soldier who has the requisite rank may be permitted to extend his service for a year at a time till he has done a further 10 years provided a vacancy exists for him.

It is therefore possible for a man to do as much as 32 years in service.
