THE Deputy Food Controller, Jaffna, will receive tenders up to 12 noon on Tuesday, December 19, 1950, for the above service for the period ending September 30, 1951.

2. Tenders should be made on forms obtainable on or before December 17, 1950, from the Deputy Food Controller, Jaffna.

3. The Tenders in duplicate and sealed under one cover and marked, "Tender for the transport, rebagging, &c., of foodstuffs for the D. F. C., Jaffna, 1950 to 1951 at Point Pedro Supply Station," in the left-hand top corner of the envelope, should reach this office not later than the prescribed time. They should either be deposited in the Tender Box of the Jaffna Kachcheri or sent by registered post.

4. Tenders should be made on forms which will be supplied upon application at the Kachcheri, Jaffna. No tender will be considered unless it be on a form duly authenticated by this office. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderer.

5. A deposit of Rs. 50 (Rupees fifty) will be required to be made at the General Treasury or at any Kachcheri and the receipt produced before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract on the acceptance of the tender, or fail to furnish the required security within ten days of his receiving notice, in writing, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at the address given by the tenderer. All other deposits will be returned upon the signing of the contract.

6. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become sureties for the fulfilment of the contract.

7. Each tenderer should furnish proof of the possession, entirely at his disposal, of a sufficient number of licenced vehicles and other means of transport as may be required for the satisfactory performance of the contract.

8. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of each contract. The amount of security required should be given in cash as shown against each of the items in the tender form. The right to vary the security deposit whenever necessary, is reserved. All other necessary information on this matter can be obtained upon application at this office.

9. No tender will be considered, unless, in respect of it, all the conditions laid down above have been strictly fulfilled.

10. The Government reserves to itself—

- (1) the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.
- (2) the right to refuse to recognise a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorising him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

11. No tenderer will be allowed to withdraw his tender. If he does so, his tender deposit is liable to be forfeited and his name submitted to the Tender Board to be included in the list of defaulting contractors.

12. The Deputy Food Controller, Jaffna, will, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any persons specified in such notice and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

13. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for, will be a condition of the contract, failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. However, in exceptional circumstances, the Deputy Food Controller, Jaffna, may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Treasury. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers, without such approval and concurrence in writing is forbidden. The term Ceylonese shall mean:—

- (a) A citizen of Ceylon by descent or by registration, or
- (b) A British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon, or
- (c) A British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (b).

14. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government contract, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or has other valid interest. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interest should also be given.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with the department but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tender, should state in which division or district or divisions or districts he had held similar contracts.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should specify the name of the department for which, and the district in which, the service was rendered.

15. The successful tenderer will be responsible for ascertaining from the Store-keeper the volume of work that has to be carried out each day. Failure to comply with this requirement will render him liable to pay penalties for the delay. The decision of the Deputy Food Controller, Jaffna, on this question will be final.

The successful tenderer will have to work on Sundays and Public Holidays if required.

16. The Supply Station which has a number of Stores attached to it, will mean all Stores in charge of the Store-keeper.

17. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Deputy Food Controller, Jaffna, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.
