"6A. Every vehicle used on Munai First Cross Street shall be driven in the direction of the junction of St. Anthony's Street with Munai First Cross Street, and when halted, shall be halted facing that direction, and as near as possible to the left side of that street."

By-laws

1. No person shall be selected as an employee unless he-

- (a) is between the ages of 21 and 35 at the date of his selection;
- (b) is of good character and produces at least two testimonials as to his character;
- (c) has passed the sixth standard in English, Sinhalese or Tamil and produces a testimonial as to his educational qualification;
- (d) has a height of at least 5 feet and 2 inches;
- (e) has a normal chest measurement of at least 32 inches; and
- (f) has passed a medical test to the satisfaction of the Municipal Commissioner.
- 2. Every employee shall-
- (a) wear the uniform issued to him by the Council;
- (b) devote the whole of his time and attention to the service of the Council;
- (c) conduct himself in an orderly and sober manner;
- (d) be clean in so far as the nature of his duties permits;
- (e) be on duty at all times when he is not on leave;
- (f) obey any lawful order issued to him by any of his superior officers;
- (g) acquaint himself with the work of the Fire Brigade; and
- (h) do his utmost to save life and property from destruction by fire.

3. No employee shall, without the sanction the Council, receive any fee or reward for any se vice performed by him as an employee.

4. Where an employee has been detailed for tel phone, first turn-out or any other special duty, su employee shall not leave the Fire Station until has been relieved of such duty by the Fire Briga Officer.

5. Every employee who is not on active duty b^t who has not been granted leave of absence shows 1 arrangements to ensure that he is inform for thwith of any fire call.

6. Every employee who is unmarried shall $li^{[i]}_{in}$ quarters provided for him by the Council $ai^{[i]}_{in}$ shall keep such quarters clean.

7. Every employee shall take such steps as m_{μ}^{μ} be necessary to keep the fire station in which f works and the appliances assigned to him in a cle and satisfactory condition.

8. Every employee who is married shall be e titled to a house allowance of Rs. 7/50 per mense from the Council.

9. (1) The Fire Brigade Officer shall repd^t without delay to the Municipal Commissioner al case of misconduct or breach of any of these by-la by any employee.

(2) On receipt of a report under paragraph (of this by-law, the Municipal Commissioner sh take such action as he may deem appropriate to t case.

10. Every employee may, subject to the exige cies of the service, be granted—

- (a) periodic leave of twenty-four hours with f pay after every period of seventy-two hou continuous duty;
- (b) fourteen days' casual leave with full pay every year; and
- (c) one month's sick leave on full pay in eve year; and
- (d) privilege leave for a period not exceedid thirty-one days in any five years by t Municipal Commissioner on the recomendation of the Fire Brigade Officer.

11. (1) Where an employee has been continuously on leave on grounds of ill-health for period of six weeks, the Municipal Commission shall cause such fireman to be examined by a me cal board selected by him for the purpose of deciding whether or not the employee is fit for service in the Fire Brigade.

(2) If the medical board decides that the e ployee is fit for service in the Fire Brigade he m with the sanction of the Council, be granted lear with full pay for a further period not exceeding t months.

12. Every employee shall, on his leaving the $\mathbf{F}_{E}^{\downarrow}$ Brigade, deliver to the Council in good order (fe wear and tear only excepted) the uniform issued him by the Council.

- "employee" means the holder of a post in Council's Fire Service, not being the hold of a scheduled post within the meaning the Local Government Service Ordinan No. 43 of 1945; and

y-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals

1. The returns required to be furnished under ection 180 of the Ordinance by an owner or other erson whether resident within the town or outside nd liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in espect of vehicles and animals shall be filled up nd furnished by the person to whom such form is ddressed.

2. (1) If any person, after having filled up and rnished a return acquires, keeps or uses any ehicle or animal, not mentioned in such return, he hall within one month of acquiring any such vehi-le or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use, and wrther furnish true and correct information in spect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, ept, or used.

(2) Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairan or to furnish information as required by the regoing paragraph of this by-law shall be guilty an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding ty rupees.

Subject to the provisions of section 176 of the dinance, every person who has furnished the turn referred to in by-law 1 shall, without further tice be liable, in respect of every vehicle or animal tered in such return, to pay the tax for the year r which such return is furnished and every person ho has sent the written notice required by -law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on every hicle or animal referred to in such notice for the ar in which such vehicle or animal was acquired by

ar in which such vehicle of annual was acquired by n or otherwise came into his possession. 1. Any person who has furnished the return uired by by-law 1 or the written notice required by-law 2 may by written notice given to the by-law 2 may by written notice given to the airman claim to be exempted from the liability pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or animal ich has been in his possession for less than thirty rs in any year and is entered in or referred to in h return or notice.

5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions section 176 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or fore the thirty-first day of March in every year respect of all vehicles, other than those exempted the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, ny, mule, bullock or ass kept or used within the ministrative limits of the Council.

The annual tax in respect of any vehicle or mal shall be paid at the office of the Council.

(1) On payment of the annual tax, the Chairin shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of ery vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal te with distinguishing letters for the several ids of vehicles as specified in the Schedule hereto a with figures denoting the year for which the te is issued and the corresponding number in the sister of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a ispicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which plate was issued.

(2) Where any plate issued under paragraph (1) omes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, owner of that plate shall, on returning it to the owner of that plate shall, on returning it to the

10. Every driver or person in charge of a vehicle who contravenes the provisions of by-law 9 shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees. 11. In these by-laws-

1. The area comprised within the administrative limits of the Alutgama Town Council is hereby declared to be the market area assigned to the public markets established under the control of the Alutgama Town Council

2 No person shall sell, or offer or expose for sale within that market area any meat, fresh fish, fruit, or vegetables, except in the public markets: Provided that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to-

- (a) the sale of poultry, fruit, or vegetables by itinerant vendors as defined in section 165 (5) of the Ordinance; or
- (b) the sale by the licensee of a hotel, eatinghouse or tea or coffee boutique, of fruit for consumption on the premises.

3. Every contravention of by-law 2 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees and in the case of a continuing contravention with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction thereof by a Court or after service of written notice from the Chairman directing attention, to such contravention.

Tax on vehicles and animals

(1) For the purpose of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Ordinance, every person who has possession or custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax, shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule referred to in paragraph (1) of this by-law shall be filled up and returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt by the person to whom it is delivered.

2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring or commencing to keep or use such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of that fact, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of such vehicle or animal.

Every person who, having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is referred to in such schedule or notice, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claims for the exemption specifying the grounds

on which the claim is made. 4. The annual tax imposed by the Committee in respect of vehicles and animals under section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the Office of the Committee or to any person authorized in writing by the Chairman on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year: Provided that in any case where the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice

referred to in by-law 2, is furnished to the Chai man after the thirty-first day of March in any yea the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referre to in such schedule or notice, shall be payable with one month of the date on which such schedule d notice is so furnished.

(1) On payment of the annual tax for an 5. vehicle by any person, the Chairman shall issue t that person in respect of that vehicle a metal plat with such of the distinguishing letters for vehicle specified in the schedule hereto as are appropriate t that vehicle and with figures denoting the year id which the plate is issued and the correspondin number in the register of vehicles.

(2) Where any plate issued under paragraph (1 becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise the owner of that plate shall return it to the Chain man and he shall be entitled on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate.

(3) The Chairman may, on his being satisfied b affidavit or otherwise that any plate issued under paragraph (1) of this by-law has been lost or stoler issue to the owner of that plate a fresh plate on th application of that owner and on payment by hit

of fifty cents. 6. The person having possession, custody or cor trol of any vehicle in respect of which a plate ha been issued under by-law 5 shall cause that plate t be affixed to a conspicuous part of that vehicle. 7. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or
