#### Regulation

The regulations for the town of Batticaloa published in *Gazette* No. 10,043 of November 11, 1949, are hereby amended, by the insertion, immediately after regulation 6, of the following new regulation:—

“6A. Every vehicle used on Munai First Cross Street shall be driven in the direction of the junction of St. Anthony's Street with Munai First Cross Street, and when halted, shall be halted facing that direction, and as near as possible to the left side of that street.”

BY-LAWS under section 272 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 29 of 1947, made by the Municipal Council of Kandy, approved by the Minister of Health and Local Government and confirmed by the Senate and the House of Representatives under section 268 of the Ordinance, as modified by the Proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

#### BY-LAWS

1. No person shall be selected as an employee unless he—
  - (a) is between the ages of 21 and 35 at the date of his selection;
  - (b) is of good character and produces at least two testimonials as to his character;
  - (c) has passed the sixth standard in English, Sinhalese or Tamil and produces a testimonial as to his educational qualification;
  - (d) has a height of at least 5 feet and 2 inches;
  - (e) has a normal chest measurement of at least 32 inches; and
  - (f) has passed a medical test to the satisfaction of the Municipal Commissioner.
2. Every employee shall—
  - (a) wear the uniform issued to him by the Council;
  - (b) devote the whole of his time and attention to the service of the Council;
  - (c) conduct himself in an orderly and sober manner;
  - (d) be clean in so far as the nature of his duties permits;
  - (e) be on duty at all times when he is not on leave;
  - (f) obey any lawful order issued to him by any of his superior officers;
  - (g) acquaint himself with the work of the Fire Brigade; and
  - (h) do his utmost to save life and property from destruction by fire.

3. No employee shall, without the sanction of the Council, receive any fee or reward for any service performed by him as an employee.

4. Where an employee has been detailed for telephone, first turn-out or any other special duty, such employee shall not leave the Fire Station until he has been relieved of such duty by the Fire Brigade Officer.

5. Every employee who is not on active duty but who has not been granted leave of absence shall make arrangements to ensure that he is informed forthwith of any fire call.

6. Every employee who is unmarried shall live in quarters provided for him by the Council and shall keep such quarters clean.

7. Every employee shall take such steps as may be necessary to keep the fire station in which he works and the appliances assigned to him in a clean and satisfactory condition.

8. Every employee who is married shall be entitled to a house allowance of Rs. 7/50 per mensem from the Council.

9. (1) The Fire Brigade Officer shall report without delay to the Municipal Commissioner in case of misconduct or breach of any of these by-laws by any employee.

(2) On receipt of a report under paragraph (1) of this by-law, the Municipal Commissioner shall take such action as he may deem appropriate to the case.

10. Every employee may, subject to the exigencies of the service, be granted—

- (a) periodic leave of twenty-four hours with full pay after every period of seventy-two hours of continuous duty;
- (b) fourteen days' casual leave with full pay every year; and
- (c) one month's sick leave on full pay in every year; and
- (d) privilege leave for a period not exceeding thirty-one days in any five years by the recommendation of the Fire Brigade Officer.

11. (1) Where an employee has been continuously on leave on grounds of ill-health for a period of six weeks, the Municipal Commissioner shall cause such fireman to be examined by a medical board selected by him for the purpose of deciding whether or not the employee is fit for service in the Fire Brigade.

(2) If the medical board decides that the employee is fit for service in the Fire Brigade he may, with the sanction of the Council, be granted leave with full pay for a further period not exceeding three months.

12. Every employee shall, on his leaving the Fire Brigade, deliver to the Council in good order (wear and tear only excepted) the uniform issued to him by the Council.

13. In these by-laws—

“Council” means the Kandy Municipal Council and

“employee” means the holder of a post in the Council's Fire Service, not being the holder of a scheduled post within the meaning of the Local Government Service Ordinance No. 43 of 1945; and

“Municipal Commissioner” means the Municipal Commissioner of the Kandy Municipal Council.

*By-laws relating to the tax on vehicles and animals*

1. The returns required to be furnished under section 180 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the town or outside and liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of vehicles and animals shall be filled up and furnished by the person to whom such form is addressed.

2. (1) If any person, after having filled up and furnished a return acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such return, he shall within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, keeping or use, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used.

(2) Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish information as required by the foregoing paragraph of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 176 of the Ordinance, every person who has furnished the return referred to in by-law 1 shall, without further notice be liable, in respect of every vehicle or animal entered in such return, to pay the tax for the year in which such return is furnished and every person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on every vehicle or animal referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicle or animal was acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

4. Any person who has furnished the return required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2 may by written notice given to the Chairman claim to be exempted from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or animal which has been in his possession for less than thirty days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such return or notice.

5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 176 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of all vehicles, other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, mule, bullock or ass kept or used within the administrative limits of the Council.

6. The annual tax in respect of any vehicle or animal shall be paid at the office of the Council.

(1) On payment of the annual tax, the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the Schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued.

(2) Where any plate issued under paragraph (1) becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner of that plate shall, on returning it to the Chairman and making a payment of twenty-five cents, be entitled to receive a fresh plate.

(3) The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate issued under paragraph (1) has been lost or stolen, issue to the owner of that plate a fresh plate on the application of that owner and payment by him of fifty cents.

Where the plate referred to in by-law 7 has been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the administrative limits of the Council, the driver or person in charge of that vehicle shall be

guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

9. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, the Revenue Inspector, any Police Officer or any other officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road within the limits of the Council for the purpose of inspecting the metal plate referred to in by-law 7; and the driver or person in charge of such vehicle shall permit such officer to make such inspection and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.

10. Every driver or person in charge of a vehicle who contravenes the provisions of by-law 9 shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

11. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council;

“Council” means the Kegalla Urban Council;

“Ordinance” means the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939; and

“Revenue Inspector” means the Revenue Inspector of the Council.

BY-LAW

## BY-LAWS

1. The area comprised within the administrative limits of the Alutgama Town Council is hereby declared to be the market area assigned to the public markets established under the control of the Alutgama Town Council.

2. No person shall sell, or offer or expose for sale within that market area any meat, fresh fish, fruit, or vegetables, except in the public markets: Provided that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to—

- (a) the sale of poultry, fruit, or vegetables by itinerant vendors as defined in section 165 (5) of the Ordinance; or
- (b) the sale by the licensee of a hotel, eating-house or tea or coffee boutique, of fruit for consumption on the premises.

3. Every contravention of by-law 2 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees and in the case of a continuing contravention with an additional fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees for every day during which the contravention is continued after conviction thereof by a Court or after service of written notice from the Chairman directing attention to such contravention.

## BY-LAWS

*Tax on vehicles and animals*

1. (1) For the purpose of the tax on vehicles and animals levied under section 47 of the Ordinance, every person who has possession or custody or control of any vehicle or animal liable to such tax, shall furnish to the Chairman a schedule of particulars relating to such vehicle or animal in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee.

(2) The schedule referred to in paragraph (1) of this by-law shall be filled up and returned to the Chairman within seven days of its receipt by the person to whom it is delivered.

2. If any person, after having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1, acquires, keeps or uses any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring or commencing to keep or use such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of that fact, and further furnish true and correct information in respect of such vehicle or animal.

3. Every person who, having furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice referred to in by-law 2, claims to be exempt under section 47 (3) of the Ordinance from the liability to pay the tax in respect of any vehicle or animal which is referred to in such schedule or notice, shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claims for the exemption specifying the grounds on which the claim is made.

4. The annual tax imposed by the Committee in respect of vehicles and animals under section 47 of the Ordinance shall be paid at the Office of the Committee or to any person authorized in writing by the Chairman on or before the thirty-first day of March in each year: Provided that in any case where the schedule referred to in by-law 1 or the written notice

referred to in by-law 2, is furnished to the Chairman after the thirty-first day of March in any year the tax in respect of each vehicle or animal referred to in such schedule or notice, shall be payable within one month of the date on which such schedule or notice is so furnished.

5. (1) On payment of the annual tax for any vehicle by any person, the Chairman shall issue to that person in respect of that vehicle a metal plate with such of the distinguishing letters for vehicle specified in the schedule hereto as are appropriate to that vehicle and with figures denoting the year in which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles.

(2) Where any plate issued under paragraph (1) becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise the owner of that plate shall return it to the Chairman and he shall be entitled on making a payment of twenty-five cents to receive a fresh plate.

(3) The Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate issued under paragraph (1) of this by-law has been lost or stolen issue to the owner of that plate a fresh plate on the application of that owner and on payment by him of fifty cents.

6. The person having possession, custody or control of any vehicle in respect of which a plate has been issued under by-law 5 shall cause that plate to be affixed to a conspicuous part of that vehicle.

7. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or any officer authorized by him in writing, to stop and detain any vehicle proceeding on any road or path for the purpose of inspecting the plate which is required by by-law 6 to be affixed to that vehicle and the driver or person in charge of any such vehicle shall stop the vehicle and permit the Chairman or such officer to make such inspection and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.

8. In these by-laws—

- “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;  
“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Medapalata village area; and  
“Ordinance” means the Village Communities Ordinance.

## BY-LAW

The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 9,963 of April 1, 1949, are hereby amended by the

substitution, for by-law 22, of the following new by-law:—

“ 22. (1) No person shall use any stall, seat or space in a village market unless—
