Pollution of Kelani River

I, Don Vincent Jayawardane, Chairman, Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda Urban Council, being the proper authority under Regulation No. 1 of the Regulations under section 2 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897 (Cap. 173), published in the *Gazette* of August 28, 1925, do hereby declare to be infected with disease that portion of the Kelani river between its junction with the San Sebastian canal and a point one mile to the north thereof. This piece of water shall be an “infected piece of water” until December 31, 1953.

Bathing in and washing clothes or animals in or using the water in this area is prohibited.

BY-LAWS

Conservancy and scavenging

1. The Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of any premises situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established, require such owner to provide a pail latrine of such size and type and in such a position on the premises as may be approved by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health or any officer authorized by such Medical Officer.

2. If the Medical Officer of Health or any officer authorized by such Medical Officer certifies that any cesspit or latrine (not being a pail latrine of the size and type referred to in by-law 1) situated on any premises within the area for which a conservancy service has been established is insanitary and dangerous to health, the Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of such premises, require such owner to close such cesspit or latrine.

3. Every owner on whom a notice referred to in by-law 1 or by-law 2 has been served shall comply with the requirements of such notice within such time, in no case to be less than two months, as may be specified in such notice.

4. Every occupier of premises provided with a pail latrine and situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established shall maintain such latrine at all times in a sanitary condition and in good repair.

5. No person other than a conservancy labourer employed by the Committee shall remove or otherwise dispose of the night soil from any pail latrine within the area for which a conservancy service has been established.

6. The occupier of any premises served by the conservancy service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Committee a conservancy fee at the rate of two rupees per bucket.

7. For the purpose of inspecting any cesspit or latrine, whether constructed or in the course of construction, on any premises, it shall be lawful for the Medical Officer of Health or an officer authorized by him, to enter the premises at any time between sunrise and sunset and the occupier of the premises shall render such officer all such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of the inspection.

8. The occupier of any premises situated within an area for which a scavenging service has been established shall cause all ashes, sweepings and other refuse from the premises to be deposited in a bucket or bin with a suitable cover and of such shape and size as may be approved by the Chairman.

9. The occupier of any premises referred to in by-law 8 shall—

- (1) daily, between such hours as the Chairman may from time to time notify by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, cause such bucket or bin to be placed by the edge of the road outside such premises but so as to cause no obstruction to traffic on the road; and
- (2) cause such bucket or bin to be removed within half an hour of the emptying of such bucket or bin by the scavenging labourers of the Committee.

10. No person shall place on any road any bucket or bin referred to in by-law 8 except between such hours as are referred to in by-law 9.

11. The occupier of any premises served by the scavenging service other than an occupier who is exempted by the Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Committee, a scavenging fee at the rate of twenty-five cents per bucket.

12. The conservancy fee referred to in by-law 6 and the scavenging fee referred to by-law 11 shall be paid to the Chairman or to any person duly authorized by him to collect such fee, on or before the tenth day of the month immediately following the month in respect of which the fees are due:

Provided that when the owner or occupier of any premises has given written notice in advance to the Chairman that the premises will not be occupied during the whole of any specified month, and such owner or occupier subsequently satisfies the Chairman that such premises were in fact not occupied during that month, no conservancy or scavenging fee shall be payable in respect of those premises for that month.

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee; and

“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Kachchai village area.

BY-LAWS

Sale of provisions

1. No person shall keep any shop or place (other than a market) for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables or other perishable articles of food, except on a licence duly obtained in that behalf from the Chairman. Every such licence shall, unless earlier cancelled under by-law 6, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

2. The owner or seller of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables or other perishable articles of food in any shop or place (other than a market) shall keep the meat, poultry and fish apart from the vegetables, and the poultry in baskets so made that the birds may not suffer unnecessary discomfort.

3. The Chairman or any person duly authorised by him in writing may inspect any shop or place (other than a market) used for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, fruit, vegetables or other perishable articles of food for human consumption.

4. (1) No meat shall be transported from any slaughter-house to any shop or place where meat is sold except in a box or vehicle which satisfies the conditions set out in the next following paragraph.

(2) (a) Every box used for the transport of meat must have the inside lined with zinc or other impermeable material and be fitted with a lid.

(b) Every vehicle used for the transport of meat must be provided with—

- (i) a roof to protect the meat from the sun or rain or from contamination by flies or dust;
- (ii) a covering at each open end to screen the meat from public view; and
- (iii) a compartment, the inside of which is lined with zinc or other impermeable material, for storing the meat.

(3) Where any meat is transported in contravention of paragraph (1) the person liable for such contravention shall be the person on whose behalf or at whose directions the meat was so transported.

5. The holder of a licence to keep any shop or place (other than a market) for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables or other articles of food shall—

(a) keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the premises in which such trade is carried on, the licence obtained under by-law 1, or where such licence cannot be so affixed cause a board to be affixed with the licence number and the name of the holder of the licence clearly painted, in a conspicuous place on such premises, and

(b) keep such premises in a clean and sanitary condition and close up all rat holes with cement and glass.

6. It shall be lawful for the Rural Court, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to the sale of provisions; and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.

7. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee; and

“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Mutur village area.

BY-LAWS

Eating-houses, restaurants, and tea or coffee boutiques.

1. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;

“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Udugampola-Mabodale village area;

“offensive or dangerous trade” means any of the trades specified in by-law 17; and

“village area” means the Udugampola-Mabodale village area.

2. (1) No person shall establish, or carry on the business of, any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall, unless it is earlier cancelled under by-law 10, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

3. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 2, unless the premises to be used as any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique are in conformity with the following requirements:—

(a) the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;

(b) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and whitewashed;

(c) the floor must be cemented; and

- (d) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof.
4. The licensee of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall cause—
- the premises thereof to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition;
 - all utensils, furniture or other equipment used in, or belonging to the eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to be kept clean;
 - all refuse and dirt in or about the premises of the eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to be swept and removed twice daily;
 - all cakes, sweets and other food exposed for sale on such premises to be kept in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases;
 - all waste tea, coffee or milk and all remnants of food to be collected in a fly-proof receptacle with a close-fitting lid or cover, and removed from such premises twice daily;
 - all utensils used in the preparation, sale and consumption of food or drink to be washed with soap and water at least once in every twenty-four hours;
 - every utensil or receptacle used by a customer to be washed immediately after such use and before being used by another customer; and
 - a list of the names and addresses of all employees to be kept at all times in the premises so as to be available for inspection.
5. The licensee of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall not permit—
- any waste tea, coffee or milk or any remnants of food to be thrown on the floor of the licensed premises; or
 - any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place on the licensed premises.
6. The licensee of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall cause at least two spittoons to be kept at all times on the licensed premises so as to be readily available to the visitors to the premises, as well as to the employees.
7. No person shall spit within the premises of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.
8. No person who is suffering or has recently suffered from any contagious, cutaneous or infectious disease, or has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any person in charge of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to enter such place or to take part in the preparation or sale of any food or drink therein until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.
9. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or the Medical Officer of Health, or the Sanitary Inspector or any officer authorised by the Chairman in writing at all reasonable times, to enter and inspect any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, and the licensee or the person in charge of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, shall permit him to enter and inspect the premises, and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.
10. It shall be lawful for the Rural Court, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to eating-houses, restaurants, or tea or coffee boutiques, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.
- Sale of provisions*
11. No person shall keep any shop or place (other than a market) for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables or other perishable articles of food, except on a licence duly obtained in that behalf from the

Chairman. Every such licence shall, unless it is cancelled under by-law 16, expire on the thirty-first day of December in each year.

12. The owner or seller of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables or other perishable articles of food in any shop or place (other than a market) shall keep the meat, poultry and fish apart from the vegetables, and the poultry in baskets so made that the birds may not suffer unnecessary discomfort.

13. The Chairman or any person duly authorised by him in writing may inspect any shop (other than a market) used for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, fruit, vegetables or other perishable articles of food for human consumption.

14. (1) No meat shall be transported from any slaughter-house to any shop or place where meat is sold except in a box or vehicle which satisfies the conditions set out in the next following paragraph.

(2) (a) Every box used for the transport of meat must have the inside lined with zinc or other impermeable material and be fitted with a lid.

(b) Every vehicle used for the transport of meat must be provided with—

- a roof to protect the meat from the sun or rain or from contamination by flies or dust;
- a covering at each open end to screen the meat from the public view; and
- a compartment, the inside of which is lined with zinc or other impermeable material, for storing the meat

(3) Where any meat is transported in contravention of paragraph (1) the person liable for such contravention shall be the person on whose behalf or at whose directions the meat was so transported.

15. The holder of a licence to keep any shop or place (other than a market) for the sale of meat, poultry, fish, vegetables or other articles of food shall—

(a) keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the premises in which such trade is carried on, the licence obtained under by-law 11 or where such licence cannot be so affixed, cause a board to be affixed with the licence number and the name of the holder of the licence clearly painted, in a conspicuous place on such premises; and

(b) keep such premises in a clean and sanitary condition and close up all rat holes with cement and glass.

16. It shall be lawful for the Rural Court, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of the by-laws relating to the sale of provisions; and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of the cancellation.

Offensive and dangerous trades

17. (1) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive trades:—

- Storing of cured or dry fish.
- Storing of perishable articles of food and provisions for the purpose of trade by wholesale.
- Manufacture of compost or artificial manure.
- Manufacture of vinegar.
- Curing or manufacture of rubber.
- Manufacture of soap.
- Manufacture of crackers and fireworks.
- Keeping of a tannery.
- Curing of arecanuts.
- Boiling of blood or offal.
- Storing of hides.
- Storing of bones.
- Icing of fish.
- Curing of planks.
- Keeping of a kraal for soaking coconut husks.
- Storing of artificial manure or material used for the preparation of artificial manure in quantity over three bags.

(2) The following trades shall be deemed to be dangerous trades:—

- Manufacture of aerated waters.
- Manufacture of copra.
- Manufacture of coconut oil by machinery.
- Any trade in which machinery driven by oil or other fuel or steam or electricity is used.
- Extracting of oil by apparatus.
- Quarrying of cabook, gravel or metal.
- Storing of copra.
- Storing of straw.
- Manufacture of desiccated coconut.
- Burning or storing of lime.
- Manufacture or storing of fibre.
- Storing of cotton wool.
- Manufacture of matches.

(3) The following trades shall be deemed to be offensive and dangerous trades:—

- Dyeing of fibre.
- Burning of bricks and tiles.

18. (1) No person shall carry on any offensive or dangerous trade unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence shall, unless it is earlier cancelled under by-law 20, expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

(3) No licence shall be transferable.

19. No person shall be entitled to a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade unless—

- (1) the place at which that trade is to be carried on is approved by the Medical Officer of Health; and
- (2) any building to be used for the purposes of that trade is in conformity with the following requirements:—
 - (a) the building must be in good repair, well ventilated, well lighted, and provided with adequate drainage and latrine accommodation;
 - (b) the roof of the building must be made of some permanent material and the floor must be cemented;
 - (c) the eaves of the building must be not less than seven feet from the ground;
 - (d) every room in the building must be provided with windows capable of being opened, and the area of such windows when open shall be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space;
 - (e) the walls of every room in the building must be not less than seven feet in height and must be built of brick, stone or cabook;
 - (f) the internal surface of such walls to a height of at least four feet from the floor must be limeplastered and lime-washed; and
 - (g) the woodwork of the building must be oilpainted or limewashed.

20. If at any time during the period for which a licence has been issued, any building used for the purposes of the offensive or dangerous trade to which the licence relates, ceases to conform to by-law 19, the Chairman may, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, cause a notice to be served on the holder of the licence requiring him to do, before a day to be specified in the notice, all things necessary to make such building conform to such provisions, and if the licensee fails to comply with the requirements of such notice within the time specified therein, the Chairman may cancel the licence.

21. Any notice under by-law 20 shall be deemed to have been served on the holder of the licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade, if it is affixed to the premises at which he carries on the licensed trade or if it is left with any person employed in such premises by him.

22. Every holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall cause—

- (a) the floor of every building used for the purpose of the licensed trade to be swept and cleaned daily;
- (b) the walls of every such building to be lime-washed at least once in every twelve months;
- (c) all apparatus, implements, and vessels used in such trade to be kept clean; and
- (d) all refuse, sweepings, scrapings and waste and by-products which are not to be subjected to further trade processes to be removed daily in covered receptacles from the premises in which such trade is carried on.

23. No holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall contaminate any well or tank or any river, stream, canal, channel, lake or other inland water.

24. No holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall carry on such trade in any manner likely to cause a nuisance to, or to be injurious to the health or comfort of persons in the neighbourhood.

25. Every holder of a licence to carry on any offensive or dangerous trade shall cause any offensive vapours or gases which are emitted in the course of carrying such trade—

- (a) to be discharged into the external air in such a manner and at such a height as to admit of their diffusion without injurious or offensive effect; or
- (b) to be passed directly through a fire or into a condensing apparatus.

26. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, or the Medical Officer of Health, or the Sanitary Inspector or any officer of the committee authorised in writing by the Chairman, at all reasonable times, to enter upon and inspect any premises at which any offensive or dangerous trade is being carried on, and the holder of the licence or person in charge thereof shall permit the inspection to be made.

BY-LAWS.

Construction of latrines

1. Whenever the Committee defines an area within which the owner or lessee of any premises used for human habitation shall be required to construct and maintain a latrine the Chairman may, by notice in writing served on such owner or lessee, direct such owner or lessee to construct a latrine of such type and size, and in such a position on the premises, and with such connecting drains, as may have been determined by the Committee and are specified in the notice.

2. Every owner or lessee of premises on whom a notice is served under by-law 1 shall, within thirty days of the service of such notice, construct a latrine which is in conformity with the requirements specified in such notice.

3. No person shall construct or maintain a pit latrine within a radius of one hundred feet from any well, except with the permission of the Chairman.

4. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee; and

“Committee” means the Village Committee of the Soranatota village area.

BY-LAW

The by-laws relating to pensions and gratuities published in *Gazette* No. 8,040 of March 23, 1934, as last amended by by-law published in *Gazette* No. 8,561 of December 22, 1939, are hereby further amended as follows:—

(1) in by-law 1 thereof—

(a) by the substitution, for the word “Governor” of the words “Commissioner of Local Government,” and

(b) by the substitution, for the words “thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.” of the words “thereof to the Commissioner of Local Government.”;

(2) in by-law 16 thereof, by the substitution, for the words “to the Commissioner of Local Government for transmission to the General Treasury (Establishments Division) for submission to the Governor,” of the words “to the Commissioner of Local Government for submission to the Minister of Health and Local Government.”; and

(3) in by-law 17, by the substitution, in paragraph (1) thereof, for the words “with the approval of the Governor,” of the words “with the approval of the Minister of Health and Local Government.”.

BY-LAWS made by the Kuliypitiya Urban Council under section 61 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939, and approved by the Minister of Health and Local Government by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 167 of the Ordinance, as modified by the proclamation published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,773 of September 24, 1947.

BY-LAWS

1. These by-laws shall apply to the resthouse situated within the administrative limits of the Council.

2. (1) The resthouse is intended primarily for the use of travellers. Every person using any part of the resthouse as an office or place of business during his occupation of the resthouse shall pay, in addition to the occupation fee, a special fee of one rupee for each period not exceeding one hour during which any part of the resthouse is so used as an office or place of business. Every person so using

the resthouse shall desist from doing so if the resthouse-keeper so requests in the interests of the comfort and convenience of other visitors to the resthouse.

(2) The Chairman may permit the use of the resthouse or any portion thereof for the purpose of any lunch, dinner, garden-party or other organized reception on payment of a fee, for occupation and the use of linen only, of ten rupees for the first six hours and one rupee for every additional period not exceeding one hour.

3. The fees and charges payable in respect of the use and occupation of the resthouse shall be determined according to the rates set out in the Schedule hereto:

Provided that no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—

- (a) a child in arms;
- (b) a servant who is in attendance on a visitor and sleeps within the resthouse;
- (c) the chauffeur of a car garaged in the resthouse premises, if he sleeps in the car or in the garage:

And provided, further that the Chairman may order that fees calculated at half the rates set out in the Schedule hereto shall be charged in the case of persons making up a party of school children or students accompanied by a teacher or teachers, such party being not less than twelve in number, if he is satisfied that they are breaking journey at the resthouse in the course of an educational tour.

4. (1) Every visitor shall, on his admission to the resthouse, legibly write his or her correct name in the resthouse visitors' book and shall enter therein in the columns provided for the purpose, his or her permanent address and the date and time of arrival at the resthouse.

(2) No visitor shall be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments until he has complied with the requirements of paragraph (1).

5. No person shall occupy any portion of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days, without the special authority of the Chairman.

6. No charges other than those payable to the Council shall be entered by a visitor in the resthouse visitors' book.

7. The resthouse fees and charges shall be paid in cash on demand. In default of such payment, the resthouse-keeper shall be entitled to refuse further supplies. The attention of visitors is invited to the Hotel Keepers Protection Ordinance (Chapter 30), a copy of which shall be exhibited together with these by-laws in some conspicuous place in the resthouse.

8. (1) No room shall be reserved for any visitor prior to his arrival unless it is engaged at least one day in advance and unless a fee of Rs. 7.50 which shall be credited to the visitor's account if the accommodation is taken as arranged, is paid in advance when the room is so engaged.

(2) Until the arrival of the person or persons for whom a room is reserved, the room shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.

(3) Every request for the reservation of a room shall be made in writing addressed to the resthouse-keeper.

9. Where a room reserved by any person under by-law 8 is not occupied by him, the fee paid in advance shall be forfeited: Provided that such fee or a portion thereof may be refunded at the discretion of the Chairman, if, in his opinion, sufficient notice of the cancellation of the reservation has been given; but in no case shall any refund be made if the Council is deprived of revenue which would otherwise have accrued to it but for the fact that accommodation had been previously reserved.

10. No bed, sofa, or couch in the resthouse shall be used by any visitor for the purpose of sleeping, unless a sheet is spread thereon. A breach of this by-law shall be punishable with a fine of five rupees.

11. The value of all articles damaged or broken by any visitor or his servant shall be paid by that visitor in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

12. Visitors shall be entitled to call upon the resthouse-keeper to attend on them personally. The resthouse-keeper and servants shall wear clean white coats and cloths when attending on visitors.

13. (1) Any complaint which a visitor may have to make about the resthouse or the resthouse-keeper shall be noted in the complaint-book.

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse-keeper to produce the complaint-book when called upon to do so.

14. No visitor shall bring any dog into the resthouse unless such dog is under proper control. Where a nuisance is created by the presence of a dog in the resthouse and complaint thereof is made to the resthouse-keeper by a visitor, the owner of the dog shall cause such dog to be removed from the resthouse.

15. (1) No person shall use the resthouse for any immoral purpose.

(2) No resthouse-keeper or other person in charge of the resthouse shall aid or abet or be a party or be privy to the contravention of this by-law by any visitor to the resthouse, or permit any visitor contravening this by-law to continue to be in occupation of any part of the resthouse.

16. A breach of any of the above by-laws other than by-law 10 shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

17. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Kuliya-pitiya Urban Council; and

“Council” means the Kuliya-pitiya Urban Council.

18. The rules relating to resthouses made by the Provincial Road Committee of the North-Western Province and published in *Gazette* No. 8,348 of February 4, 1938, are hereby rescinded, in so far as they apply to the resthouse situated within the administrative limits of the Council.

After the lapse of 12 hours, visitors shall pay for occupation at the rate specified in item 1 (1) (a), irrespective of the fact whether he has made use of a bed or not.

No charge is made for vehicles brought into the resthouse compound, but not garaged, by a visitor.
