



IT is announced with the deepest sorrow that the Right Honourable D. S. SENANAYAKE, Prime Minister, passed away peacefully at 3.30 this afternoon.

All officers of the Public Service will observe mourning till after the late Prime Minister's funeral. It is hoped that other persons would also observe mourning during this period as far as they are able to do so.

It is ordered that flags be flown at half-mast daily till after the funeral.

The body will lie in state in the Assembly Hall of the House of Representatives from 10 a.m. on Monday the 24th March.

The funeral procession will leave the House of Representatives at 3 p.m. on Saturday the 29th March.

The day of the funeral will be observed as a Public and Bank Holiday.
