# Special project to promote organic farming

The Agriculture Ministry has decided to implement a special project from January 2021 to increase the production of organic fertilizer and promote organic farming among local farmers.

Accordingly, the Ministry plans to increase organic fertilizer production from one percent to 30 percent by the end of next three years.

During a special meeting held yesterday at the Ministry Auditorium, Agriculture Minister Mahindananda Aluthgamage highlighted the urgent need of finding peranant solution for the issues erupted due to the improper usage of chemical fertilizer. Fur-

ther elaborating on this, Minister said that both farmers as well as consumers have to face various health issuess due to the overuse of cheical fertilizer. The Minister further high-

lighted the environmental polution that has resulted due to the usage of cheical fertilizer.

The Minister pledged to increase the subcidy given

under the governent fertilizer subsidy programme for organic farers and purchase their produce at a high cost in order to encurage farmers to engage organic farming.

Under this programme, it is expected to increase oraganic fertilizer production at State fertilizer companies, provide technical assistance for organic fertilizer manufactures, introduce new technologies for the anufactures and also to grant tax reliefs for private manufactures. It is also expected to provide lands for the manufactures and supply raw materials and impolemnt a proper distribution procedure through State ingtervention.

# Awareness classes for Three-wheeler drivers, motorcyclists violating traffic lane rules

Three-wheeler drivers and motorcyclists violating the traffic lane rules within the Colombo city limits will be directed to the awareness classes on road discipline conducted by the Sri Lanka police. Western Province Senior DIG Deshabandu Tennakoon said yesterday.

Speaking to the media while supervising the relaunch of the traffic lane rule and the bus priority lane in Colombo, he said the law will be strictly enforced against the motorists for violating these rules after the three-day trial period ends tomorrow.

The re-implementation of the traffic lane rule and the

bus priority lane in Colombo in the post COVID-19 period commenced from the Parliament Road, Galle Road, High-Level Road and Baseline Road yesterday. Nearly 1,500 officers including 150 women officers had been deployed along these roads to control the traffic by the police. According to Tennakoon, the

drivers would not be penalized for the violation of the rule during the trial period as they are being practiced to adhere to it and law will be strictly enforced after some

President Rajapaksa said it will be vital to uplift the economic conditions of the dairy farmer. He directed the Agriculture authorities to streamline their research institute services to achieve the intended targets expeditiously.

The dairy sector predominantly based on small farmers rearing cows will be incorporated to private -government medium partnership enterprises in line with the intended programme.

Chief of Presidential Task Force on Economic Revival, Basil Rajapaksa, Chief of the Presidential Task Force on Economic Revival Basil Rajapaksa expressed the need to expand cattle feed production to increase milk production.

They discussed the cultivation of high quality grasses and cattle feed production to increase milk production.

The discussion also focused on the future plans of the State Ministry of Livestock, Farm Promotion and Dairy and Egg Indus-



tries. The Government is set to expand the research required to introduce dairy breeds suitable for different parts of the country.

"Small-scale dairy farmers account for 85 percent of the total production of liquid milk. They need to be strengthened and steps need to be taken to increase the percentage, said Basil Rajapaksa, Chief of the Presidential Task Force on Economic Revival. Farmers are discouraged by rising production costs per liter of milk," the President said.

The President pointed out the need to provide dairy farmers with a cattle fee system.

President Rajapaksa stressed the importance of the Central Environmental Authority's intervention in the resolution of environmental issues related to animal husbandry and stressed that it should not be a burden on farm-

Agriculture Minister Mahindananda Aluthgamage stated that steps have been taken to raise 15,000 dairy cows with the participation of 15 plantation companies with a view to increasing milk production.

Expansion of poultry and egg production and directing large scale producers to the export market were also discussed. Exports of eggs, poultry and allied products are expected to earn US \$ 16 million in foreign exchange by 2020," private sector investors

North-Central and North-Western Provinces and in Trincomalee, Hambanthota and Nuwara-Eliya districts and along the western slopes of the central hills.Showers or thundershowers will occur at several places in the sea areas off the coast extending from Puttalam to Hambantota via Colombo and Galle. At a previous occasion, the Court of Appeal had issued an Interim Order staying the operation of arrest warrants issued by Colombo Fort Magistrate against former Finance Minister Ravi Karunanayake and six others in connection with the issuance of Treasury Bonds in March

This Interim Order will be effective until the final determination of the writ petitions.

The seven petitioners who had been named as the suspects in the Magistrate's Court former Finance Minister Ravi Karunanayake, PTL beneficiary owner Arjun Aloysius, PTL Chiefdealer Kasun Palisena, PTL Chairman Jeffrey Joseph Aloysius, Chitta Ranjan Hulugalle, S. Pathumanapan and Indika Saman Kumara had filed these writ petitions challenging Colombo Fort Magistrate's decision to issue warrant against them. In his petition, Ravi Karunanavake has been named Attorney General, Acting IGP C.D. Wickramaratne, SSP Ampavila, Fort Magistrate Ranga Dissanayake and OIC attached to the Financial Investigation Unit of CID as respondents.

The petitioner Karunanayake stated that the Bond Commission appointed to investigate Treasury Bond issuance never questioned the petitioner regarding the meeting held on March 28, 2016 and March 30, 2016 and any alleged link between the said meetings and the lease of the apartment.

The petitioner said the instructions given by the Attorney General dated March 3, 2020 was issued within a few hours of the dissolution of Parliament on March 2, 2020.

Ravi Karunanayake stated that the communication issued by the Attornev General is in excess of the powers conferred on the Attorney General under and in terms of Section 393(3)(b) of the Code of Criminal Procedure Act. The petitioner said the communication issued by the Attorney General deprives the petitioner of a fair and impartial inquiry. The petitioner further complained that Colombo Fort Magistrate did not allow his counsel to make submissions against the arrest warrant during the magisterial inquiry in contravention to the rules of natural justice and the provisions contained in the Judicature Act.

The petitioner further stated that the petitioner has learnt that Colombo Fort Magistrate in another case (B/8266/2018) which related to the issuance of treasury bonds forming the subject matter of the Bond Commission recused himself on November 8, 2018 from hearing the same when it was brought to his notice by the counsel for the prosecution including State Counsel Údara Karunatilake who appeared for the prosecution on March 4, 2020 that the Fort Magistrate's wife is working at the Central Bank of Sri Lanka, making it inappropriate fort the Magistrate to continue hearing the case and referred the case to the Judicial Service Commission to nominate another Magistrate to hear the case. The petitioner maintained that the fifth respondent Colombo Fort Magistrate is legally and morally constrained to hear the instance case which related to the issuance of

The petitioners have named Kurunegala Magistrate, Attorney General, Acting IGP, Director General of Archaeology, OIC of Kurunegala Police Station and **OIC** of Special Investigations Unit of Kurunegala as respondents.In his petition, Kurunegala Mayor stated that on or about

the 24th July 2020, a building situated within the city limits of the Kurunegala Municipal Council collapsed and in the following few days wide media publicity was given to this incident and certain allegations were made against him alleging that the building was an antiquity within the meaning of the Antiquities Ordinance.

The Mayor stated that no intentional criminal act was committed by him or any one of the other employees whose statements were recorded in the course of the investigations.

The petitioner further said he

and the other employees of the Kurunegala Municipal Council acted in good faith and in the course of their duties without any intent to commit any offence either under the Antiquities Ordinance or any other Law. The petitioner said he is entitled in law to apply to the Court of Appeal in respect of the abuse of the process of justice by the respondents and to quash the warrant wrongfully obtained by the respondents collectively. The petitioner states that notwithstanding the media reports pertaining to this issue speaks of an antiquity being destroyed, it is

relevant to identify whether the building concerned can be considered as an antiquity or not.

He further states that the entire incident has been misinterpreted and or inaccurately interpreted by persons with political interest.

## 'Yahapalana Govt. retained nominal democracy'

According to Head of the Department of Sanskrit and Eastern Studies of the Humanities Faculty, Kelaniya University Senior Prof. Ven. # International Day of Democracy today DEMOCRACY: THEN & NOW

id democracy exist in Sri Lanka from 2015 to 2019? Sri Lanka, which was a democratic nation before 2015, has again established democracy from November 16 last year. Anyone can simply check whether democracy existed in Sri Lanka from 2015 to 2019 by finding out what democracy is according to the global definition. Then everyone can see the real faces of those who are shouting from the rooftops pretending that they fight to protect democracy.

Democracy is Government by the people; a form of Government in which the supreme power is vested in the people and exercised directly by them or by their elected agents under a free electoral system. India provides an example to a democratic Government. In order to call itself democratic, a society must provide equality in voting, effective participation, enlightened understanding, citizen control of the agenda and be inclusive to all citizens.

When it comes to democracy in Sri Lanka, the Parliament which existed after February 10, 2018 was not represented by the agents of people. It was represented by agents of foreign countries, NGOs etc. Equality in voting was not there; due elections were not held at all for people to vote. People were eagerly waiting to cast their vote but due elections were not held. Effective participation was also blocked by then Yahapalana Government.

There is no point of talking about 'Enlightened understanding' because it was only Goebbels Theory that was implemented from 2015 in order to mislead people. People saw and heard only the words such as corruption, malpractices and crimes that are related to fabricated acts done by the politicians of the previous (2014) Government. Fabricated evidence was provided for fabricated offences. All these issues were revealed together with the corruption and malpractices of the former Head of the Crimes Investigation Department (CID) along with a large number of telephone conversations took place between certain MPs and lawenforcing officers and officials connected to the judiciary.

Democracy is a form of Government in which the people have the authority to choose their governing legislation.

Who people are and how authority is shared among them are core issues for democratic theory, development and Constitution. Some cornerstones of these issues are freedom of assembly and speech, inclusiveness and equality, membership, consent, voting, right to life and minority rights.

During the period between 2015 and 2019, only the rights of the minorities were tightly protected while totally ignoring the rights of the majority. It went beyond the limit, and harassing and torturing the majority in the name of protecting the rights of the minorities took place without any proplem and protests. Even Buddhist Bhikkus were not left alone.

They were harassed in broad daylight. The words, 'elections and voting' were forbidden to use. Various tactics were used not to hold due elections. People were not given the opportunity to choose their governing legislation in order to prevent the dissolving of Parliament before four and a half years. Sri Lankans were forced to have a Parliament that did not have their mandate to govern them. The document which came out as a result of a conspiracy, the 19th Amendment, was used to do all those things. The agents of a minority ruled Sri Lanka from February 11, 2018 to March 2, this year during which democratic rights of the majority were not permitted.

Generally, there are two types of democracy: direct and representative. In direct democracy, people directly deliberate and decide on legislation. In representative democracy, people elect representatives to deliberate and decide on legislation, such as in Parliamentary or Presidential democracy. Liquid democracy combines elements of these two basic types. However, the noun 'democracy' has, over time, been modified by more than 3,500 adjectives which suggests that it may have types that can elude and elide this duality.

The most common day-to-day decision-making approach of democracies has been the majority rule, though other decision-making approaches like supermajority and consensus have been equally integral to democracies. They serve the crucial purpose of inclusiveness and broader legitimacy on sensitive issues and therefore mostly take precedence on a constitutional level.

In another words, democracy is a system of Government in which laws, policies, leadership, and major undertakings of a state or other polity are directly or indirectly decided by the

'people' - all adult citizens of a country.

During the past five years from 2015 to 2019, the people of Sri Lanka heard the word 'democracy' over and over again. Almost all Yahapalana politicians were talking about democracy which they brought to Sri Lanka and offered to people. They could not open their mouths without using this word 'democracy'. This is the word the United National Party (UNP) Leader used every time no matter where he was, what he did or about what he was talking about. He worshipped the word. Later, the citizens of Sri Lanka understood the real intentions of Yahapalana goons who preached democracy 24x7. What people saw and experienced by themselves were far different from what they expected as democracy.

Therefore, the people started telling their agents that they need real democracy and they wanted to change their rulers and the Parliament. But the Yahapalana regime was deaf and ignored the people's demand. The 2015 Parliament was maintained without being dissolved, ignoring the people's right to select their agents. The people expressed their will as soon as they were allowed to express their will on November 16 last year. Sri Lankans won real democracy on that day and re-confirmed what they won on August 5

At the moment, we Sri Lankans are enjoying real democracy under President Gotabaya Rajapaksa and the Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP) Government. The best example was given on August 5 by holding the General Elections in the middle of all possible barricades brought forward in order to not to hold the General Election.

# 475kT paddy production targeted for 2020/21 Anuradhapura Maha Season

The Anuradhapura District Agriculture Committee has decided to cultivate paddy in a minimum of 122,000 hectares during the forthcoming 2020/2021 Maha Season, Anuradhapura government Agent R.M. Wanninayake told the Daily News.



# A costly exercise

rovincial Councils have long being criticized by the majority of the public, and, even by politicians, as being White Elephants which is a drain on the exchequer, ever since they came into being as a vehicle for devolution of power, for the people of the North and East. No one exactly knows what functions are performed by these entities other than payment of salaries of teachers in the provincial schools and similar inconsequential chores, according to what one hears. In any event, Provincial Councils are no longer in operation, with their functions being overseen by the respective Governors, which office too raises more questions than they give answers. In fact the people have not missed anything by the non-functioning of Provincial Councils which has being consigned to the periphery of things though plans to hold the much postponed PC elec-

tions, anytime soon, is being discussed. If that be the case, the Central Government is going to be plunged into a massive financial hellhole at a time when the economy is in dire straits in consequence to the Coronavirus pandemic. According to a news report, the Government has spent close to Rs. 22,000 million to maintain the nine Provincial Councils in 2019 alone. This is due to the inability of the PCs to meet their expenditure as a result of massive shortfall in the income and this had been a continuing feature right through, the news report quoting the 2019 Central Bank report, stated. What is more, the expenditure of the Central Government on PCs has overshot by a massive Rs.16,000 million during the period they had ceased to function over that during which the PCs were in operation. According to the CB report, if the trend were to continue the Government will be hard-pressed to meet its budgetary commitments and if the pressure on the budget is to be eased there is a dire need for the PCs to rationalize their spending, and, importantly, seek more income generating avenues.

The Central Bank report, more than anything else, throws light on the criminal waste that have become the lot of the Provincial Councils. All right thinking members of the public, no doubt, would fully endorse the stance taken by the Provincial Councils and Local Government Affairs State Minister Rear Admiral (Rtd.) Sarath Weerasekera calling for doing away with Provincial Councils. In any event, PCs were an unwanted baby thrust upon this country as a solution to the call for extensive devolution by Tamils in the North which even Prabhakaran eventually rejected. PCs which were meant as a solution for the devolution call in the North East were thrust on the whole country and time was when PCs were operating everywhere except in the North and East for which it was primarily meant.

When, eventually, the North received the PC, allowing its politicians to manage their own affairs as per the rationale for setting up the PC system and bring development to the population the Chief Minister did everything else but this. Instead, the NPC devoted much of its time passing resolutions in support of international organisations critical towards the Government and the CM getting involved with protests and agitations espousing the separatist cause. The record of the Northern Provincial Council's service to the people could be gauged by the simple fact of the Chief Minister repeatedly returning unutilized funds meant for the development of the province back to the Central Government - all of which make one wonders on the feasibility of continuing with such wasteful project that is bleeding the central Government white at a time it is plaqued by scarce financial resources due to the Covid -19 damage. One must also not lose sight of the fact that in addition to the PCs there are the Local Government bodies with over 10,000 members to look after and maintain. Can the Government afford this, on the long run?

Understandably there were protests by the PC fraternity to alleged moves to do away with the system through the proposed 20th Amendment. These represent those elements who have grown into the PC system and cannot let go. It is no secret that PCs too lavish largess on its members though not to the extent of Parliamentarians. One recalls how certain PCs in the past sent entire entourages on foreign jaunts spending millions of tax payers money, ostensibly for workshops or study tours. Whether the benefits accrued to the public from these trips justified the costs is anybody's guess except that the garbage mountains, broken bridges and culverts were still very much in existence following these foreign tours.

much in existence following these foreign tours. As already mentioned, Provincial Councils are not being missed. The people do not feel the difference by the absence of PCs. The hands on approach by President Gotabaya Rajapaksa has ensured delivery of services to the remotest corner. His frequent interaction with the villagers, where their problems are discussed and prompt relief granted has obviated the need for PCs which had failed to address the people's grievances for all the funds left at their disposal, and, what is more, continue to be subsidized by the Government.

# The Reemergence of China!

Historically, the West has always had an equivocal attitude towards China, not to mention the nonwhite world. A fear, a suspicion, a fascination, an uncertainty, a sense of superiority and even a

loathing reserved for an undeserving competitor pervaded its dealings. Perhaps, resulting from perceptions that evolved on the basis of the writings of 19th century visitors, missionaries, diplomats, traders, et al who came to China pompously full of their own socio-religious values and found a wealthy society that simply did not fit in to their preconceptions and that did not seem willing to accommodate their prescriptions. Instead the Chinese stayed with their own values. These prejudices have lasted to this day and self-serving commentators and politicians have not missed any opportunity to embellish them, even in the midst of the CORVID 19 epidemic which is now devastating the world.

arco Polo's travels along the Silk Road between 1271 and 1295 and his tales of wealth and grandeur of China, Cathay of the Yuen Dynasty, were largely dismissed with disbelief as fantasy. His record The Travels of Marco Polo (also known as Book of the Marvels of the World and IlMilione, c. 1300, a book that described to an incredulous Europe the mysterious culture and inner workings of the non-white and non-Christian Eastern world, including its wealth, superior organisation and the great extent of the Mongol Empire, provided the first comprehensive look into China, India, Japan and other Asian cities and countries. Over the centuries, largely based on a lack of understanding, the common perception that took hold was that of the Chinese as a toiling, poverty stricken mass of untrustworthy sexual predators who needed to be treated with caution and suspicion. Prejudice relating to China and the Chinese has undergone a recent revival. Many commentaries, including from journalistic sources and hastily compiled messages on the electronic medium have not missed the opportunity to revive the image of the nasty untrustworthy China man whose current prosperity is an illusion. The massive violations of human rights by the West until recently have all been sanitised as the focus has been deliberately moved elsewhere by an accommodating media and China has become a ready target.

It took two centuries and the painstaking work of intellectual giants like Joseph Needham and many university studies to almost convince a self-absorbed Europe and later the United States that a sophisticated, complex and powerful culture had been existing in the East for millennia while Europe was wallowing in the dark ages and much of what we take for granted today, paper, gun powder, silk, tea, porcelain, the compass, cast iron, the ploughshare, the stirrup, printing, clockwork escapements and even the passport (paiza or paizi or gerege in Mongolian) were known to the Chinese centuries earlier.

According to Professor Mahbubani, Singapore's former Permanent Representative to the UN, China produced over 25% of the world's product in 1840 and was incredibly wealthy but this share was to be reduced to less than 2% due to colonial depredations and the decline of the Chinese state.

The appallingly racist term "Yellow Peril", which seems to be undergoing a revival (as the Anglophone world closes ranks against China), gained currency in the 19th century. This term became widely used in Europe and the US during the Boxer Rebellion in 1900.

Despite the violence and the tribulations visited on China by Western Powers, today China having pulled itself up by its bootstraps, has become the second biggest economic power in the world but the Western world and its glassy eyed admirers in the East continue to look at China and the Chinese with the same historic mistrust.

Britain's first sustained attempt to build ties with the Qing imperial court, initially rebuffed, in the eighteenth century was focused primarily on trade. Britain coined the 'free trade' concept in order to sell opium to China. Over the next 150 years, Britain was at the forefront of some of the most painful experiences of Chinese encounters with the outside world, from the Opium Wars, the sacking of the Summer Palace, and the reparations imposed on China for the Boxer rebellion of 1900 and the rape and pillage of Beijing, to the maintenance of Hong Kong as a colony. The Chinese call this the century of humiliation. Since the return of Hong Kong to Chinese rule in 1997, while clamouring for democracy for Hong Kong which the British never conceded, policies of engagement have gradually replaced those of confrontation. As China's economy has eclipsed that of the UK, the transformation of that relationship has become imperative for the UK. The roles having changed, now it is Britain that is the supplicant at the gates of Beijing.

Britain, nervous with Brexit jitters, is more anxious than ever to keep Chinese cash flowing. Critics have commented that London is already less willing to criticise Beijing because it is aware how much it will need Chinese funds in the post Brexit World, although it joined with the US in restricting Huawei's access to the UK market.

The British sense of superiority, vis-a-vis China, began with the victory in the First Opium War 1839-42. After bombarding Canton from its fleet causing thousands of civilian deaths, Britain forced on the Chinese the Convention of Chuenpi, which was never ratified. In 1842, the Treaty of Nanking ended the war and Hong Kong Island was ceded to the British, and five treaty ports were opened to international trade. (For the British, it meant the right to sell opium to the Chinese). In 1843, the Treaty of the Bogue supplemented the Treaty of Nanking by granting extraterritorial status to British subjects in China and most favoured nation status to Britain. 1856-60 consequent to the Second Opium War, the Treaty of Tientsin was signed by Lord Elgin on behalf of Britain (who, incidentally, took the Elgin Marbles to Britain). In October 1860, the Old Summer Palace was looted and burned by British and French troops, resulting in the Convention of Peking and the cession of the Kowloon Peninsula to Britain and Britain opened a Legation in Beijing (Peking). In the following years British consulates were opened throughout the Chinese Empire, including Hankou (Wuhan!), Takao (Kaohsiung), Tamsui (near Taipei), Shanghai and Xiamen.

Anti-Chinese sentiment in the US has existed at least since the mid 19th century when Chinese migrants began arriving in the United States and contributed significantly to building the First Transcontinental Railroad. Thousands died in this effort. It surfaced with a vengeance in the 1860s and culminated in the racist Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882 (repealed only in 1943), prohibiting Chinese immigration and naturalization. These attitudes were transmitted to Americans who never left North America, triggering talk of the Yellow Peril, and continued through the Cold War during McCarthyism.

The Trump administration has demonstrated an inexplicable hostility to China, but Beijing's increasingly authoritative approach at home and assertiveness abroad has also alarmed many. The West is unfamiliar with Asians who strike back.

US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, the administration's most vocal China critic, took China to task for its apparent failure to be open and transparent when Corvid 19 hit, saying, "It took us too long to get the medical experts into country. We wish that could have happened more quickly." The effort to gain propaganda mileage is obvious but the same reservations could be applied to the current lack of cohesion in the US policy approach and the uncoordinated response to the increasingly menacing spread of Corvid 19 in the US.

The China hawks say privately that they see the virus weakening the Party's legitimacy (and hoping) but this may be a vain hope.

The expression of such hostility in the midst of a global health emergency was unfortunate. The Administration's lack of sympathy for China was quickly picked up by the Western media and accusations of a lack of transparency, a belated and high handed response, paucity of medical care, etc, were freely bandied around in the media despite clear statements to the contrary issued by the World Health Organisation. Critical and derogatory videos produced for propaganda purposes were freely disseminated on the electronic media. Now that China appears to have brought the spread of Corvid 19 under control and the virus has begun to seriously affect Western countries, Western media has modified its commentary. It has begun not to use the same harsh, derogatory and unsympathetic commentary. On the contrary, the reporting has become China's rise as a major world economic and military power, which followed neither the economic nor the political prescriptions of the West, clearly appears to have contributed to the contemporary anti-Chinese sentiment. The emergence of China has been seen to be at the expense of countries such as the US.

In April 2019, FBI Director Christopher Wray said that China posed a "whole of a society threat". In May 2019, Director of Policy Planning Kiron Skinner said that China "is the first great power competitor of the US that is not Caucasian. Of course, he appears to have forgotten Japan which not only challenged the US but was nuclear bombed in 1945. In the 1980s, Japan was the target of US ire for its relentless economic outreach.

The US position may sometimes appear to be contradictory and difficult to explain. It was the US that pushed for China (the Republic of China, ROC) to be given the status of a veto wielding member of the UN Security Council. The ROC had collaborated with the US in its war against Japan. But were there other factors. Did the US want a non-European state to balance the three veto wielding Europeans already in the UN Security Council? There were effective people to people and missionary ties with China. President Chiang Kai Shek was a Methodist. Did these factors influence American thinking at the time? However, Relations soured rapidly once the godless and non-cosmopolitan Communists under Mao Tse Tung took over China and evicted Chiang to Taiwan. Added to the pain, Communist China militarily thwarted US ambitions in the Korean Peninsula. The thought of nuclear bombing China did cross the minds of some US decision makers at the time. In Vietnam, Chinese support was a critical factor in the eventual defeat of the US backed South Korean regime in 1975.

Despite the Nixon-Kissinger rapprochement with Communist China, essentially as a counter to the Soviet Union, suspicions appear to have remained. China used the warming up of relations to seek investments and technology from the US and the West and create the most impressive economic miracle in history. Not only that, it has deployed its newly gained wealth to create a zone of joint prosperity in the wider region, extending to Africa, expanding its diplomatic clout way outside its traditional sphere of influence. China is now a major economic competitor of the West. Unfortunately, this development has been openly interpreted as a threat to the West and the US, in particular. The thought of a non-European competitor on the world stage may be unbalancing the thinking of European and US policy makers. The US has begun to employ each and every means available to vilify and counter China. The US has now begun to identify China and Russia as strategic competitors making US relations with China a discomforting factor to others who wish to benefit from China's munificence.

It is against this background that CORVID 19 has been used as another weapon to vilify China. David Fidler, Council for Foreign Relations, says, "we are seeing the weaponisation of the outbreak in the misinformation being circulated for different political purposes. For me, this outbreak is different in that the weaponisation has connected to the change in geopolitics, with the rise of China and worries about China's growing power and influence sharpening and broadening criticism of China's response to the outbreak. Here, unlike Ebola in Africa, we have the outbreak entangled with the increasing rawness of balance of power politics between the United States and China".

The deterioration of relations between the US and China is unfortunate and is unlikely to benefit either country or, for that matter, the world. Both possess enormous potential to collaborate for the good of each other and the rest of the world. But history and deep rooted suspicions of ambitious politicians who play on the uncertainties and fears of ordinary people may result in misery for the vast majority who might get sucked in to an unfortunate confrontation unwittingly.



# Rajapaksas performed some miracles – now the people are doing so

mation in the wake of the massive two thirds majority obtained by the SLPP led government. Chandraprema, the author of *Gota's War*, a book chronicling the defeat of the armed and dangerous LTTE, is Sri Lanka's newly named Permanent Representative to the UN Human Rights Council in Geneva. He is awaiting confirmation by the Parliamentary High Posts Committee, and will take up duties in Geneva shortly after those formalities end.

The 20thAmendment and the new constitution on the cards are the issues that dominate the public discourse. Would you say a new Constitution was part of the two-thirds mandate?

A: Very much so.

Q So-called civil society seems to pretend the 20thAmendment is a move in the authoritarian direction. What say you?

A: After the 20th Amendment the president will have the same powers that Maithripala Sirisena had, to begin with. This is not a final outcome in any event. There is a Constitution coming behind this. Nobody should assume that people like Romesh de Silva, Manohara de Silva and all those people on the nine member committee have been appointed for some sort of deception. They have been appointed for a very serious purpose. To say that a president is more authoritarian than a prime minister is really a myth. You take Mrs. India Gandhi in India. Or Mrs. Bandaranaike in Sri Lanka. Is anybody going to claim that Prime Minister Sirimavo Bandaranaike was less authoritarian than J R Jayewardene? There are other factors as well. This so called authoritarian President can only contest twice even after the 20th Amendment. A Prime Minister can contest for

# And nobody even talks about that I suppose ...?

A: No no, it's in fact taken as a matter of pride. People say that Dudley was four times prime minister and Ranil was five times premier and so on. What counts in a premier or a President is not the label or the post. What counts is that he or she is the head of the government.

The argument is that the prime minister is part of the legislature and the president is stand-alone. But in effect its more of a psychological barrier I guess, these two different ways of looking at these posts ...?

A: It is more psychological than real I would think. Our own experience shows that Mrs. Bandaranaike did many things that J R Jayewardene wouldn't even think of, like acquiring people's property. At that time they had no fear of touching those very personal things like people's per-

# sonal property. The UN Human Rights Council was expressing opinions about our Constitution. What's your view since you are going to be posted there — is the matter of a Constitution something this body will think to dwell on once more ...?

A: There may be all types of foreign parties expressing views on what system of government is best suited for Sri Lanka. But whether Sri Lanka should take any of that into consideration is a moot point. I would think that the nine member Committee appointed to draft this new Constitution should discuss things with locals only. They are the people who will be living under that Constitution.

# Q: A strong presidency equates greater national security? You think that's correct?

A: A strong government equals greater national security. It can be the president, it can be the prime minister, but a strong head of government equates greater national security. What happened was that though the

president has been designated as the head of the government, certain powers have been given to the prime minister as well. With the 19th Amendment the prime minister's power only rests on one factor, which is that he has to be consulted before the appointment of Ministers. That was brought in through the back door, just to please Ranil Wickremesinghe.

# They wanted to give him all the powers but the Courts stood in the way, right?

A: The Courts were right. You can't have a president and take the powers away from him.

# Wasn't it a power grab, Ranil Wickremesinghe wanted all the powers?

A: It was something just to please Ranil. It wasn't practical. Other than the Rajapaksa brothers nobody can rule this country now under this arrangement (under the 19th Amendment.)

# So in that context what does the 20th Amendment do?

**A**: It will be a restoration of the status quo ante.

# Liberal lobbyists so called have lost their heads saying the Elections Commission is going to be appointed by the President, and so on. Your view?

A: Elections Commissioner was

always appointed by the president. But the EC has always been vested with enough independence to do his job. That was what justice Mark Fernando opined in that famous case. Dayananda Dissanayake the then EC was found fault with by Mark Fernando J for not examining the veracity of the declaration of Emergency imposed by Chandrika Kumaratunga in postponing the PC elections. He blamed the government for having gone with the government point of view and not taken any resolute action. That's the independence he expected of the EC. So if you take that as a benchmark, the EC is always independent. Deshapriya EC was also appointed by the president. That is the time he ordered the officials to shoot people in the head if they try to disrupt the election. After he became the chairman of the Independent Elections Commission he has not asked the police to shoot anybody. Even any outside observer will say Deshapriya was in his element when he was the Elections Commission-

er, and not the head of the Elections Commission. When he was the Chairman of the Elections Commission he failed to do what was necessary to hold the Local Government elections. which was postponed for three years. A member of that Elections Commission went to Courts against holding that election. what is his moral right (ne has)? The way that the Elections Commission was appointed by the Constitutional Council was also questionable. If we did not have a 100 per cent Yahapalanaya Constitutional Council which did not appoint 100 per cent Yahapalana people may be we would have had a different scenario. But the people who engineered the 19th Amendment did not allow that (sort of independence) to take place. Once I interviewed the Solicitor General Srinath Fernando and he said these independent Commissions have become something to give jobs to the boys. Look at some of these Chairmen who were appointed to head these independent Commissions. They were Yahapalana fellow travellers, and if they were right thinking persons they should not have accepted those positions. They are trying to portray themselves as democrats and Rajapaksas as dictators, but if they were democrats and superior as they portrayed themselves to be, they should not have accepted those positions. Ultimately it turns out that they have also been after power and position and nothing else. 99 per cent of the people in the country I'm sure would not care two hoots about the 19th Amendment because they have heard so many bad things about it. And none of them would have any problem with the president acquiring those powers.

# What about the Provincial Councils and the considerable opinion that they should be got rid of with the new Constitution?

A: The Provincial Councils have been criticized from the day they came into existence. Many people think they are white elephants. Despite those criticisms they were kept going for the last 30 years as a sort of concession to people who have been asking for more devolution of power and that sort of thing. They were kept going at enormous expense to satisfy certain psychological needs. Even if it is kept going on that basis .. well some countries do spend enormous amounts of money to give people psychological satisfaction. My question is, did it even satisfy that (psychological) need? Today the PCs are tied up in so many knots that there is absolutely no way that they can be revived without a two thirds majority. Without the TNA votes the last government would not have been able to pass that law about the PCs. When the AG said that a two-thirds majority is needed for the law to be passed according to Article 77 of the Constitution, they mustered the two thirds somehow to pass the law. The law reduced the first past the post quota from 60 per cent to 50 per cent. So they managed to get that Act passed with a special majority and it cannot be repealed therefore without a special majority. The way they have formulated that law, even the delimitation report has to be passed with a two-thirds majority. The only way that the Act can be repealed today is with a two-thirds or a Court ruling to state that if an Act is not operational the previous repealed law prevails.

# On the flip side will the system be too centralized do you think without the PCs ...?

A: But they will not be abolished the government says the PCs will be there.

#### But will they be functional?

A: That depends on two things whether there is a two-thirds majority or a Court ruling.

# The Minister in charge himself says the system should go?

A: No it's funny that people who did everything to see that the Provincial Council Elections should not be held are now saying that the PCs should not be abolished. The Minister can state what he wants.

# Q: Is the two-thirds majority a real harbinger of optimism, or how do you read it ...?

A: Yes, we are already experiencing that. It's not that there is no pandemic in the world. But it just does not affect Sri Lanka. When it comes to facing the economic downturn that is expected due to this pandemic, the only people who have any chance of handling that are in this government. People like Dr. Jayasundera, Ajith Nivard Cabraal — they are the only people who can handle this situation. The Finance Ministry is back again under Mahinda Rajapaksa, and he knows how to get these things going.

# There are noises being made by the detractors about what they call creeping militarization. What's your take?

A: I just don't buy that. The SLPP got the entirety of the Rana Viru military vote. The armed forces and their families constitute a vote bank of over a million in this country. If you ask the SLPP to ignore that constituency that is not going to happen. So if you have some Secretaries etc. from the military that is to be expected, because they are part of the SLPP constituency.

#### Q: I think the finger pointing is in the fact that they perceive the President to be an ex military man having an overtly military orientation .. as they characterize it ...

A: But is that true? Take the demonstrations near the Presidential Secretariat. Nobody protesting has been tear gassed and chased away up to now. The military was directing traffic. The question is what works — if it works, do it. Without the tri-forces and the police all working together with the health authorities, this (pandemic situation) couldn't have been brought under control like this. If the other countries had also take this so called military approach they would also have had their situations under control. The Health Authorities are doing a fantastic job, but the infected people have to be brought to the hospitals to be treated. So who is going to do that?

# On the foreign policy front, how would you classify the Gotabaya government?

A: I think the Rajapaksas had a very clear policy of steering clear of

the major power blocs. The compliment that was paid to the Rajapaksa Government was what the former Indian diplomat and National Security Advisor Shiva Shanker Menon stated in his book. He said that India was given several guarantees about their security by that (Mahinda Rajapaksa) government and those were adhered to until that government was voted out of power.

# That did not however prevent various elements from trying to tie us up with China or saying that we were veering too close to China?

A: As a political gimmick it may have had some value to them, but was it true? If they were even perceiving it to be like that, they have not been listening to what these people were saying; if Shiva Shanakar Menon said that, then the Indian government doesn't want anything beyond that. That was what they wanted and they got it.

When they themselves, that is the new government in 2015, had to go back to the Chinese, somebody came up with the theory that we couldn't pay back the loans on the Hambantota Port and that it had to be given over to the Chinese. That's absolute claptrap. Fourteen million dollars which was the amount to be paid back on that Port loan was something that the Yahapalanaya government took as loans in the course of an afternoon. They took commercial loans far in excess of that.

## What of the opposition .. your views?

A: The main thing in politics is to have a set of principles. You can't have a situation where one party takes the General Secretary of another party and makes him their presidential candidate. When the Yahapalana government came to power, two people wrote books about it and there were serializations in the papers about this great power shift that happened, but they were evicted. I could see that it was not going to last.

They thought it was permanent or that they were going to be in power for the next twenty five years. We have seen achievements bordering on miracles under the Rajapaksas — one was the ending of that so called unwinnable war. Then there were the construction projects that had been on the cards for 50 to 60 years almost, and then the controlling of Covid 19. Now the people themselves have started performing miracles. Despite all the chauvinism and the parochialism that they used, the 2109 election was won with a massive major-

**FRANCE:** The overall number of global COVID-19 coronavirus cases has topped 29.1 million, while the number of deaths have increased to over 922,000 as of Monday morning, according to the Johns Hopkins University.

The COVID-19 coronavirus pandemic has killed over 930,000 people worldwide with more than 29 million cases confirmed.

The US accounted for the world's highest number of cases and deaths at 6,519,121 and 194,041 respectively, according to the

India is currently in the second place in terms of cases at 4,846,427 while the country's death toll stood at 79,722.

In terms of cases, Brazil ranks third (4,330,455), and is followed by Russia (1,059,024), Peru (722,832), Colombia (708,964), Mexico (668,381), South Africa (649,793), Spain (566,326), Argentina (555,537), Chile (434,748), France (402,893), Iran (402,029), the UK (370,928), Bangladesh (337,520), Saudi Arabia (325,651), Pakistan (301,481), Turpines (261,216), Indonesia (218,382), per day will soon be reached. 

# Googling for gut symptoms predicts COVID hot spots - Study

**US:** Internet searches on gastrointestinal symptoms predicted a rise in Covid-19 cases weeks later, researchers at Massachusetts General Hospital found, demonstrating a novel early warning system for hot spots of the pandemic disease.

Researchers at the top-ranked hospital in Boston compared search interest in loss of taste and appetite, and diarrhea with the reported incidence of Covid-19 in 15 US states from Jan. 20 to April 20. Using Alphabet Inc.'s Google Trends online tool, they found the volume of searches correlated most strongly with cases in New York, New Jersey, California, Massachusetts and Illinois - states with high disease burden - three to four weeks later.

The research, published in the journal Clinical Gastroenterology and Hepatology, showed that the same approach used to monitor

than a decade ago could be deployed for the coronavirus, the hospital said in a report this month. Patients with Covid-19 often report gastrointestinal symptoms, such as abdominal pain and

He said it was "so interesting" that he was able to announce the deal on the anniversary of the September 11, 2001 attacks by Islamist radicals against the United States.

Palestinian leaders have called for protests against the "shameful deals" over fears their drive for a homeland is losing steam in the Arab world, which had held fast to a 2002 Saudisponsored initiative calling for Israel's complete withdrawal from occupied territories.

The recognition is a huge coup for Netanyahu, bringing the Jewish state closer to its goal of acceptance on the world stage, and the reaction in Israel has been effervescent.

"It feels like our countries are dating," said Jerusalem's deputy mayor Fleur Hassan-Nahoum. "We both see each other as exotic birds. There's such excitement in the air, both sides are thirsty for peace." In the Gulf states though, the response to the deals has been much more restrained. - AFP

## Can Antarctica be free from COVID-19?

ANTARCTICA: At this very moment a vast world exists that's free of the COVID - 19 coronavirus, where people can mingle without masks and watch the pandemic unfold from thousands of miles

That world is Antarctica, the only continent without COVID-19. Now, as nearly 1,000 scientists and others who wintered over on the ice are seeing the sun for the first time in weeks or months, a global effort wants to make sure incoming colleagues don't bring the virus with them.

From the Rothera Research Station off the Antarctic peninsula that curls toward the tip of South America, field guide Rob Taylor described what it's like in "our safe little bubble.'

In pre-coronavirus days, long-term isolation, self-reliance and psychological strain were the norm for Antarctic teams while the rest of the world saw their life as fascinatingly

extreme. How times have changed.

"In general, the freedoms afforded to us are more extensive than those in the UK at the height of lockdown," said Taylor, who arrived in October and has missed the pandemic entirely. "We can ski, socialize normally,

run, use the gym, all within rea-

Like teams across Antarctica, including at the South Pole, Taylor and his 26 colleagues must be proficient in all sorts of tasks in a remote, communal environment with little room for error. They take turns cooking, make weather observations and "do a lot of sewing," he said.

Good internet connections mean they've watched closely as the pandemic circled the rest of the planet. Until this year, conversations with incoming colleagues focused on preparing the newcomers. Now the advice goes both ways.

"I'm sure there's a lot they can tell us that will help us adapt to the new way of things," Taylor said. "We haven't had any practice at social distancing yet!"

At New Zealand's Scott Base, rounds of mini-golf and a filmmaking competition with other Antarctic bases have been highlights of the Southern Hemisphere's winter, which ended for the Scott team when they spotted the sun last Friday. It had been away since April.

O'Connor said they will be able to test for the virus once colleagues start arriving as soon as Monday, weeks late because a huge storm dumped 20-feet (6-meter) snowdrifts. Any virus case will spark a "red response level," he said, with activities stripped down to providing heating, water, power and food.As a frightened world was locking down in March,

the Antarctic programs agreed the pandemic could become a major disaster.

With the world's strongest winds and coldest temperatures, the continent roughly the size of the United States and Mexico is already dangerous for workers at 40 year-round bases.Since Antarctica can only be reached through a few air gateways or via ship, "the attempt to prevent the virus from reaching the continent should be undertaken IMME-

DIATELY," it said. - HINDUSTAN TIMES





# TRUMP CAMPAIGN RALLIES FOLLOW 2016 RITUAL

**US:** The red-hatted crowd roils, claps and chants: "We love Trump! We love Trump! We love

US President Donald Trump's campaign rallies are packed with familiar rituals, classic chants and routines.

They are essentially the same as the Republican billionaire's 2016 campaign, giving a sense of traveling through time, even if Joe Biden has replaced Hillary Clinton as the Democratic chal-

During his eight years in the White House, Trump predecessor Barack Obama changed significantly: his hair grayed, his face grew thinner and more lined. But Trump, 15 years older, seems to want to offer a more enduring image. The same shade of blond hair, the same hairstyle - a source of intense speculation that he himself has joked about - and the same red tie.

With 52 days until the election, Trump rolled out that collection of now well-known rituals at his rally Saturday night in Reno, Nevada.

After a long musical intro, featuring Michael Jackson's "Billie Jean," the eagerly awaited announcement echoes out: "Ladies and gentlemen, the 45th President of the United States, Donald J. Trump!'

Grinning broadly, the 74-yearold former real estate mogul walks on stage to the sound of the very patriotic "God Bless the

country music icon. The refrain, American!" the song goes. heady and nostalgic, sets the tempo, while the verses – set to a softer melody -- offer the incumbent president the opportunity to take charge of the

Trump applauds, pointing at someone in the crowd, holding up his fist in a victory sign.

He approaches the podium, adjusts the microphone with his left hand, and booms: "Wow, beautiful. What a crowd!" The former reality television star plays up his connection with the crowd, one of his talents. He

"You are a hell of a crowd, I'll tell

"You are my kind of people, we love each other," he interjects a little later. His rally speeches are filled with approximations, exaggerations and fullon falsehoods, but the crowd is not there to fact-check his state-At one point, he describes - against all evidence USA" by Lee Greenwood, a say - that I'm proud to be an cuts off sharply mid-sentence: to the contrary - "tens of thou-

awaiting his arrival. His aggressive words are the most eagerly awaited, and he denounces attacks against him by Democrats, saying, "It's a disgrace!"

"You know the good part? Now I can be really vicious," he adds and the crowd goes wild.

Once he gets going, Trump acts out skits. He plays the role of someone else, making flattering comments about himself, though it's impossible to know if these people exist.

"I have a friend, a very smart guy," Trump begins. "He said, You have to be the most honest guy to go through three years of investigations." Delighted, the crowd cries out for more. At one point, Trump points to the platform facing him, set up for news cameras.

"The Fake News! Look at all those people back there!" he says to boos and whistles from the crowd. Attacks against "sleazebag" journalists serve as a narrative thread for the whole evening. Trump repeatedly refers to the night of November 8, 2016, when his victory over Clinton shocked the country - as if to instill the idea that the same scenario will play out on November 3, 2020. A favourite refrain is imitating television news anchors, stunned by the political

# France urges firms to avoid virus layoffs

FRANCE: France's Prime Minister Castex on Monday called on companies to negotiate part-time work accords with employees, financed in part by the state, to avoid outright layoffs as the COVID -19 crisis hammers

the economy. "I strongly encourage you to sign a massive number of long-term partial activity agreements within sectors and companies, and very quickly, between now and November 1," Castex said during a visit to a factory east of

For companies that sign up, the government will pay 93 percent of an employee's net salary even if they are no longer working full time. The scheme is scheduled to run at least until next summer.

The government has already spent billions of euros to keep paying most of the salaries for people who otherwise would have been dismissed during the coronavirus lockdown from March to May this year, and the subsequent business slump.

The goal is to limit unemployment that is expected to reach 9.5 per-

cent by the end of 2020 after 715,000 jobs were lost during the first half of this year.

France has unveiled plans to spend a further 100 billion euros (\$119 billion) to help the economy recover, but "this will work depending on one single condition: your total mobilisation," Castex said.

Already 345 part-time agreements have been signed between employers and staff bodies since March, saving 50,000 jobs overall, according to the labour ministry.

These accords also allow you to organise professional training for your teams when they are unemployed," Castex said. The government estimates the economy will contract by 11 percent this year, though Finance Minister Bruno Le Maire has hinted that officials are preparing to release a less pessimistic number this month. - AFP

# Afghan forces, Taliban clash despite Doha peace talks

**QATAR:** Taliban and Afghan government forces clashed across Afghanistan hours after the start of long-awaited peace talks in Doha on Saturday, officials said, underscoring the uphill challenge of settling a 19-year insurgency.

Talks between the two sides were to begin shortly after a US-Taliban agreement in February, but began only over the weekend after months of delays, caused in part by continuing Taliban offensives in the war-torn country.

"With the start of intra-Afghan talks we were expecting the Taliban to reduce the number of their attacks, but unfortunately their attacks are still going in high numbers," Fawad Aman, a spokesman for the Afghan defence ministry,

Representatives from a number of countries who spoke at the inauguration of the peace talks called on the Taliban to announce an immediate ceasefire before negotiators sat down to find a way to end decades of war in Afghanistan.

The Taliban did not say anything about a possible ceasefire at the ceremony. Achieving a significant

# Lebanon's new domestic worker contract to end 'Kafala' system

**LEBANON:** Lebanon has approved a new work contract allowing foreign domestic workers to resign and keep hold of their own passport, but activists say the exploitative "kafala" system remains in place.

The economic crisis-hit Mediterranean country is home to around 250,000 migrants, mostly women from Africa and Asia, who toil away in people's homes as housekeepers, carers or nannies.

They are not protected by the country's labour law, but instead work under a set of laws, policies and customs called kafala, repeatedly slammed by rights groups as allowing a wide range of abuse.

Under kafala, meaning "sponsorship" in Arabic, the employer sponsors the worker's legal immigration status in the country, and the latter cannot resign without their consent or they become undocumented. The law also does not ban withholding a worker's passport.

All this leaves a worker at the employer's mercy.

Lebanon's economic and coronavirus crises have increased the urgency for reform over the past year, with many families now paying their workers in the devaluated local currency, and some not at all.

In recent months, dozens of foreign helpers have been thrown out into the streets without due pay or even their passport, many of them interviewed to the national minimum wage of

by AFP. After the August 4 blast at Beirut's port that devastated swathes of the capital and killed more than 190 people, foreign workers have staged rallies outside their consu-

lates appealing to be sent home. The labour ministry this month

finally published a new and revised work contract for domestic workers, the main legal document governing their stay in Lebanon.

Outgoing Labour Minister Lamia Yammine has said the new contract -to replace a 2009 version -- "abolishes the kafala system".

Campaigners have welcomed the detailed five-page document outlining workers' rights, but say it is only a

"It is no doubt a much better version than the older one," said Amnesty International researcher Diala Haidar. But "a contract alone doesn't end kafala.'

Most importantly, the new contract gives the workers the right to resign and change employers, and says they can keep their passport.

If their employer withholds their wages or passport, they can immediately quit without notice.

It finally gives the worker the right

675,000 pounds (\$450 before the crisis, less than \$100 at the black market rate) - albeit allowing the substraction of an undetermined amount to cover food, board and clothes.

The new contract states workers must be provided with a private, wellventilated room with a key, an improvement after many women said they were forced to sleep in the living

room or on a balcony. It limits labour to eight hours a day in a six-day week, and details the right to daily rest, paid holidays and sick leave.

But activists warn that all these new provisions will amount to nothing without inspections and unless employers violating the agreement are held accountable.

"In the absence of an enforcement

mechanism, this contract will remain ink on paper," Haidar said. The old contract, for example, states the worker must receive their wages at the end of the month, but this had not stopped some from kicking out workers with-

Filipina domestic worker, insisted there are two sides to the story.

"The employer needs to keep at least one document as security... I know some employers are bad but also some employees are ungrateful," the 59-year-old said, asking not to be named. Rights groups have documented manifold abuses over the years, including no day off, locking workers inside the house, and physical or sexual assault. Activists have reported up to two deaths a week.

They have repeatedly called for an end to kafala, which is common in the Middle East and often compared to modern-day slavery.

Zeina Mezher of the International Labour Organization (ILO) called the new contract "one step in the right direction" towards dismantling kafala. But it's just "the first step on a road that is still complicated", she said.

She said support was needed to ensure a worker could resign without losing their residency permit.

Activists have also called for parliament to amend the labour law to bring all domestic workers -- Lebanese and foreign - under its protection, and give them the right to set up unions. But Banchi Yimer, a former domestic worker and activist, said the new contract was no longer a priority.

"We discussed it when everything was normal, but now everything is upside down," she said.

# **FOUR former BRITISH PMs slam Boris Johnson on BREXIT plan**

**UK:** Former British Prime Minister David Cameron has criticised Boris Johnson's plan to break international law, warning that ignoring a treaty is "the very, very last thing you should contemplate".

Cameron joins former Prime Ministers John Major, Gordon Brown and Tony Blair in condemnation, meaning all former living Prime Ministers have now urged the PM to change course.

"Passing an Act of Parliament and then going on to break an international treaty obligation is the very, very last thing you should contemplate. It should be an absolute final resort, so I do have misgivings about what is being proposed," he said.

MPs on Monday were expected to debate the Internal Market Bill, which includes provisions that violate the Brexit withdrawal agreement signed by Boris Johnson last year.

the UK's standing in the world and make it harder to criticise other countries that shirk their obligations.

At the weekend Blair and Sir John "irresponsible, wrong in principle and dangerous in practice".

Major and Blair who played crucial roles in bringing peace to Northern Ireland joined forces Sunday to urge lawmakers to reject government plans to override the Brexit deal with the European Union, arguing that it imperils that peace and damages the UK's reputation.

In an article in The Sunday Times, John Major and Tony Blair slammed the current British government for "shaming" the country with legislation that, in places, goes against the very deal it signed to allow for the UK's smooth departure from the EU earlier this year.

Major, a Conservative Prime Minister from 1990 to 1997, and Blair, his Labour successor for a decade, said Prime Minister Johnson's Boris Internal Market Bill "questions the very integrity" of the UK

"This government's action is shaming itself and embarrassing our

nation," they said. The planned legislation, which will be debated by British lawmakers this week, has led to a furious outcry with-

in the EU as it would diminish the bloc's previously agreed oversight of trade between mainland Britain and Northern Ireland if a UK-EU trade agreement isn't secured.

The British government has admitted that the legislation would break internaance policy for that potential 'no-deal' scenario. Johnson has said the legislation is needed to end EU threats to impose a "blockade" in the Irish Sea that the prime minister asserted could "carve up our country."

Britain's Justice Secretary Robert Buckland told the BBC on Sunday that the legislation was a "break the glass in emergency provision," if needed, and that he would resign if he believed the rule of law was broken in an "unacceptable" way.

"I don't believe we're going to get to that stage," he said.

EU leaders have furiously rejected Johnson's charge that the bloc is planning a major disruption to normal trade between mainland Britain and Northern Ireland.

Irish Foreign Minister Simon Coveney told the BBC



"What's next? You have the protests, coronavirus pandemic, now the wildfires. What else can go wrong?" lamented Danielle southeast of Portland.

The known death toll from fires in the three states stood at 36 and was expected to rise sharply. Most of the deaths were in California and Oregon.

Oregon's emergency management director said officials were preparing for a possible "mass

fatality event" if many more bodies turn up in the ash. And the state fire marshal was abruptly placed on administrative leave after the state police superintendent said the crisis demanded an urgent response that required a leadership change.

A half-million Oregonians were under evacuation warnings or orders to leave. With air contamination levels at historic highs, people stuffed towels against door jambs to keep smoke out. Some even wore N95 masks in their own homes.

Some communities resembled the bombed-out cities of Europe after World War II, with buildings reduced to charred rubble piled atop blackened earth. Residents either managed to flee as the flames closed in, or perished.

In Oregon alone, more than 40,000 people have been evacuated and about 500,000 are in different levels of evacuation zones, Governor Kate Brown

Fires along Oregon's Cascade

Range grew Saturday, but at a slower rate than earlier in the week when strong easterly winds acted like a bellows, pushing two large fires — the Beachie Creek Fire and the Riverside Fire toward each other and the state's major population centers, including Portland's southeastern suburbs, wildfire managers report-

Fire managers did get a spot of good news: Higher humidity slowed the flames considerably.

In California, a total of 28 active major fires have burned 4,375 square miles, and 16,000 firefighters are trying to suppress the flames, Cal Fire Assistant Deputy Director Daniel Berlant said. Large wildfires continued to burn in northeastern Washington state too. The weather conditions that led up to the fires and fed the flames were likely a once-in-a-generation event, said Greg Jones, a professor and research climatologist at Linfield University in McMinnville, Oregon. - AFP



# Ravi Wijenathan a top class ruggerite and academic

Sri Lanka has produced several yesteryear players in all sports including rugby, with the support of the schools, which played a key role in unearthing some highly skilled players, who played for the love and passion of the game. One of the schools in the forefront was Royal College, Colombo, which contributed immensely not only in the sports arena but also in the field of Education. Ravi Wijenathan was one of the top class academics and a Rugby player who played a pivotal role at school, club and International levels.

Ravi Wijenathan popularly known as 'Python' in rugby circles commenced his academic career at Royal from the junior to senior level. His father who was a leading lawyer later retired being a Magistrate and was one of the finest products of Trinity and Jaffna College,. Ravi had three brothers and a sister in his family, where all three boys were engaged in sports. His father was instrumental in motivating Ravi to take up rugby at school, He was a compatriot of

S.B.Pilapitiya, Bobby Shanmugam, Frank Sirimanne, P.Naguselwaran(his first cousin) few to be named, who donned the Trinity jersey at the Bradby Shield.

Ravi stepped into the rugby arena in 1974/5 joining the famous 'Summa Navaratnam's junior' rugby classes at CR and FC grounds, which was opened to all schools. Some of the others who attended that school in that era were retired Major General Sathyapriya Liyanage and late Fassy Doray while. Leon Fonseka and Micheal Wickremaratne( now known as Rev Dishan) who also attended these classes played with Ravi in the Royal College first XV front row position in 1981.

He started his college career from 1978 representing the under-17 team. Gradually he matured into the senior rugby team from 1979 to 1981. # Sports Minister to award foreign scholarships for ten best athletes

Sports Minister Namal Rajapaksa has decided to give ten foreign scholarships to the athletes who perform well at the forthcoming National Sports Festival. This scholarship duration will be three years and ten athletes will be selected according to their performance.

The 46th National Sports Festival is scheduled to be held next December at the Sugathadasa Stadium and the Minister already has given instructions to cut down expenses in conducting this National Sports Festival and use that money for the athletes' scholar-

According to a senior official of

the Sports Ministry due to the COVID-19 outbreak, all sports events will be conducted under the medical regulations and up to international standards.

There are 30 sports events included for the National Sports Festival while the Cross Country championship had already concluded at Nuwara Eliya on March 15 before the lockdown period. The three events Marathon, Cycling and Road Races will be held on October 11 and 12 at Kataragama. The events of the National Sports Festival were conducted in four stages divisional secretariat level, district level, Provincial level, and final stage National Sports Festival.

secretariat level advanced to the district level and the winners of the district level will qualify for the provincial level and provincial winners get a chance to take part in the National Sports Festival. The athletics event is the final sport to be conducted at the Sugathadasa Stadium and after 12 years athletics will be conducted at Sugathadasa Stadium in Colombo.

The Sports Ministry already has allocated 75,000 rupees for each divisional secretariat Rs. 200,000 each for one district and Rs. 300,000 for each province The first, second, and third places of the individual events will receive 15,000

The winners of the divisional rupees, 10,000 rupees, and 6,000 rupees respectively while for the team events, each member of the winning team will receive 6,000 rupees and second and third place team members will receive 4,000 rupees and 2,000 rupees each. Also, the best athlete of each event will receive 20, 000 rupees.

Meanwhile, cycling, marathon, and road race winners will receive higher cash awards. The first place will receive 50,000 rupees while second and third places will receive 40,000 and 30,000 rupees respectively. In addition, from the fourth place up to ten will receive cash awards from 20,000 rupees to 8,000

The Table Tennis Association of Sri Lanka (TTASL) will finally get a permanent place for the players' practices at Torrington Sports Ministry premises new building. This is a much-needed requirement for the paddlers and several times this issue was pointed out by the officials of TTASL. The present President of the TTASL State Minister Kanaka Herath finally submitted this proposal to the new Sports Minister Namal Rajapaksa.

Last week after a successful discussion between Sports Minister Namal Rajapaksa and Plantation State Minister Kanaka Herath, this much-needed place for the table tennis players' practices was obtained.

"This is good news for the local paddlers who are expected to get a permanent place for

practices. They had to train on their own with their coaches and this was a big issue especially when the national pool was named by the selectors as all of them couldn't practice at one place," said former Secretary of the TTASL Chandana

Perera.

In addition, TTASL has to pay money for private places for the practices. Last South Asian trials they had to hire Mercantile Badminton Association courts and most of the time they have to conduct their tournaments at the S.Thomas Gymnasium in Mt. Lavinia, however now TTASL have their own place for at least their practices. Nevertheless TTASL still has to find a place to conduct the tournaments. The new place at Torrington is also an asset for the players as Sports Ministry

Gymnasium is also close to this

place. Meanwhile, after a break of six months, TTASL will resume their activities by conducting a few local tournaments. They are expected to start off by conducting the Mayor's Cup tournament in Kandy in October for leading paddlers after a break of six months followed by the National Championship in November. This will be followed by the South Asian Junior championship in November in Bangladesh.

Sri Lankan Table Tennis players are only second to the Indians at the South Asian level and their aim is to come up with hard training. However, Indians have better facilities and the present TT administration headed by State Minister Kanaka Herath wanted to give better facilities to promote this sport and get successful results in the

# Namal intervenes to get B'desh **Cricket Tour back on track**

The Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) have shown their displeasure over the conditions stipulated by Sri Lanka Cricket (SLC) over the quarantine period of 14 days. CEO Ashley de Silva said this condition has been laid down by the health authorities and there is nothing much SLC could do about it. BCB are therefore likely to cancel the tour and reschedule it to a later date.

After monitoring the various news items published in social media regarding the tour, Sports Minister Namal Rajapaksa tweeted: "As we all know the Covid-19 pandemic is still at large globally, prevention measures are a high priority. However, given the significance of cricket in the region, I have asked SLC officials to consult the Covid task force and reconsider the BCB tigers BCB was initially informed

As per the Dhaka Tribune, one of the Bangladesh's leading media organizations, "Bangladesh Cricket Board [BCB] President Nazmul Hasan has said it is not possible for the Bangladesh National team to tour Sri Lanka under the conditions that have been set by Sri Lanka Cricket, the hosts cricket board." The decision was taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors and higher-ups at BCB headquarters at Sher-e-Bangla National Stadium on Monday.

The news item further elaborated that BCB President Nazmul Hassan had shown his disagreement to tour Sri Lanka under conditions for-Sunday. It further stated that team was in jeopardy.

that the touring contingent will require no Covid-19 quarantine upon reaching the island on 27 September and they could step on to the field from the very next day to prepare for the series, which is scheduled to start on 24 Octo-However, subsequent devel-

opments saw SLC stipulate certain protocols that put BCB in dilemma. SLC insisted that the touring party would require a 14-day long strict quarantine at the hotel, and also the contingent should not consist of more than 30 members including the coaching staff. Restriction over the number of members in the team meant BCB's plan of including its high-performance warded to them by SLC last unit alongside the national

When contacted Ashley de Silva (CEO of SLC) said that they hadn't received any feedback from BCB officially after they informed them about the health requirements to be adhered to last Sunday. "We are waiting for their response. We saw a foreign media report that BCB is in disagreement with the terms and conditions stipulated by our Health Authorities. # Morgan hails aces Archer and Woakes as England rally to beat Australia

MANCHESTER, UNITED KINGDOM: England captain Eoin Morgan praised "aces" Jofra Archer and Chris Woakes after the two pace bowlers set up an extraordinary come-from-behind win in the second one-day international against Australia on Sunday.

World champions England were on the brink of going 2-0 down in a threematch contest at Old Trafford and losing their first bilateral ODI series since 2017 when Australia, chasing a target of 232 for victory, were 144-2.

But the new-ball duo, brought back into the attack as a last-ditch measure by Morgan, combined to take four wickets for three runs in 21 balls as Australia slumped to 147-6.

Woakes removed the well-set pair of Marnus Labuschagne (48) and captain Aaron Finch (73) as well as dangerman Glenn Maxwell, with Archer cleaning-up Mitchell Marsh for just a single following the all-rounder's 73 in Australia's 19-run victory on Friday. Archer had already struck twice in a hostile new-ball spell, dismissing opener David Warner for the fourth innings in a row before a well-directed

# Thiem beats Zverev to win US **Open for first Grand Slam title**

NEW YORK: Dominic Thiem produced a historic comeback to beat Alexander Zverev in a nervy five-setter and win the US Open on Sunday for his first Grand Slam

The second seeded Austrian beat the fifth seed 2-6, 4-6, 6-4, 6-3, 7-6 (8/6) in 4hr 2min inside a near-empty Arthur Ashe Stadium. It marked the first time in the US Open's Open era

history that a player had recovered from losing the opening two sets to win the title. It was also the first time the final had been settled by a tie-break. "I wish we could have two winners today.

I think we both deserved it," said Thiem. The title is the 27-year-old Thiem's maiden Grand Slam trophy after three previous defeats in finals of tennis majors. Thiem was runner-up at the Australian Open earlier this year and also lost in the last-two

showdowns at the French Open in 2018 and 2019. He also becomes the first new Grand Slam champion since Croatian Marin Cilic won at Flushing Meadows in 2014. Thiem is also the first Grand Slam champion other than Novak Djokovic, Rafael Nadal or Roger Federer since Switzerland's Stan Wawrinka won the third of his majors at the 2016 US Open. "I achieved a life goal, a dream of myself, which I had for many, many years," said Thiem. Zverev, 23, smashed four aces and 16 winners in the first set as he displayed an impressive serve and volley game to take a 1-0 lead in just 30 minutes. AFP

# **Economies to face substantial** credit challenges - Moody's

Moody's Investors Service says in a new report titled "Sovereigns - Global: Global risk appetite recovery supports emerging market funding; liquidity strains to persist for lowest-rated sovereigns" that while global financing conditions have eased markedly in recent months, many emerging and frontier market economies will commence their recoveries with greater fiscal and external weaknesses.

"Emerging and frontier market economies have experienced a substantial shock through multiple channels: a drop in export values on lower commodity prices; weaker tourism and lower global demand; and volatility in non-resident cappressures will rise toward serious stress or

ital flows. We expect fiscal and external imbalances to widen and, in the most severe cases, liquidity default," says Michael S. Higgins, a Moody's Analyst.Some of these sovereigns have struggled to find external sources of borrowing to fund fiscal and external gaps, and have tapped emergency financing from international financial institutions like the International Monetary Fund and other multilateral lenders. However, as global capital flows remain volatile, many will face substantial credit challenges through their recoveries, even if they do emerge from the crisis without defaulting. Cash flow of the general insurance sector too was impacted negatively. However, from a claims perspective there was a positive outcome as the number of accidents reported and resulting claims were minimal".

In such an environment, the member companies of IASL, together with the regulators office - the Insurance Regulatory Commission (IRCSL) came forward to grant relief to policyholders with offering 3 month's grace period to pay premiums keeping all those policies live and liable to pay any claims that arose. "The insurance industry has always been a rock solid one that has come forward to shoulder the responsibility of protecting the insured public. This time was no different and the industry continued to offer the level of protection that was offered under normal circumstances with no difference".

According to Rajapaksa, this years' Insurance Day, which was held for the fourth consecutive year, was a virtual event to raise insurance awareness.

# New Music and Creative Technology department for Sri Jayewardenepura University

he Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences of the University of Sri Jayewardenepura took another step towards modernizing its degree programmes and getting new knowledge across to the students when it established a new Department of Music and Creative Technology under the headship of Professor Pradeep Ratnayake to give access to Sri Lankan music students to learn new methods of music creation, like the composing and performing music through the computer, and being better able to be of service to the new demands made by the entertainment industry in this digital age.

Professor Ratnayake had spent two years in Columbia University, New York, as a Fulbright scholar working at the Music Department and then the Computer Music Department, working with professors Brad Garton and Terry Pender, who were involved in cutting edge music technology research at that time. Professor Ratnayake's music compositions for

films like Sri Siddhartha Gautama that won the award for the Best Music Direction at the World Buddhist Film Festival organized by the United Nations, held in Vietnam in 2014, was - except for the sitar - composed, arranged and performed, mainly on the computer. Computer music was introduced to the Department of Languages and Cultural Studies in 2004 by Pradeep Ratnayake when he joined the University of Sri Jayewardenepura, perhaps making it the first state university to do so. Ratnayake went on to become the Head of that department for two terms, in which time it changed its name to the Department of Languages, Cultural Studies and Performing Arts, and now, the music stream has started an independent journey as a new department, where Ratnayake is better positioned to bring the knowledge he gained at universities like Columbia, to the Sri Lankan students. Developing courses based on the technological aspect of music, the department hopes to offer as a separate degree subject soon, while also having a degree programme that is more conventional and tradi-

tional with regard to teaching music.

"This is the first time that a department of this kind is being introduced to the conventional university system in Sri Lanka. So, we are expecting something unique to come out of this, especially with regard to innovations connected to Sri Lankan music. We have high hopes for it," says Professor Sudantha Liyanage, the newly appointed Vice Chancellor of University of Sri Jayewardenepura.

dge music technology research at that time. Professor Ratnayake's music compositions for Sri Jayewardenepura.

Professor Shirantha Heenkenda, Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences says, "Every faculty moves forward by incorporating new subject areas, and giving students new knowledge, so that they can meet the new demands made on them by the world. So, I am happy that Professor Ratnayake has established a new department of music and creative technology that brings in technological skills and the use of the computer to the production of music. We have also made plans to provide the department with state-of-the-art studio facilities to record even a Symphony Orchestra in it, along with sperate audio production rooms with world class equipment and industry-standard software. The midi lab will facilitate 25 students at a time – and all this will greatly open up this field to new possibilities for the

students.' The department offers courses in singing, violin, percussion, esraj, guitar and the sitar, as well as in Western music, where they can learn the piano and are encouraged to sit the exams in either Royal Schools of Music or Trinity College of Music, while they pursue their degree studies. The department staff has as senior lecturers, Gitara Wanasinghe for violin, Dr. Priyantha Thilakasiri for vocals, Muditha Arumawadu for music and video technology and Amitta Bandaranaike for Music Technology. As visiting lecturers, they currently have Chintaka Jayakody for guitar, Sachiththa Fernando for piano and western music theory, Isuru Perera for percussion, Isuru Kondasinghe for violin, Gitika Abeysekara for vocal and Handun Pathirage for Esraj.

"Soon, there will be two degree programmes in the department, a more traditional one for producing a good musician and performer at the end, who nevertheless will have an idea of the technological dimensions of music, having followed some courses in it – and then one for more technologically oriented students - who will also have followed some courses on music per se – so that they become performing musicians to some extent too. Students of both programmes get an understanding of the other, therefore," says Professor Ratnayake, who adds that he is very grateful to the faculty and the university for the support it had extended towards the establishment of the new department.




