No. 3,786 of January 3, 1951 (Date applied for under Section 46 of the Ordinance, October 21, 1946)

"Process for manufacturing soap".

Abstract.—This invention relates to a process for the manufacture of soap. According to the invention soap in the neat phase is continuously washed with a brine

solution of a concentration close to the critical concentration, in order to remove glycerol and rancidising factors. The concentration of the brine is preferably a little above the critical—say 1 per cent., and the treatment is carried out at about 100°C. To remove the excess salt the treated neat soap can be washed with an alkaline solution. The concentration of the washing solution has to be such that it will not dissolve the treated neat soap.

"Concentrated synthetic fruit powders and tablets".

Abstract.—This invention relates to the manufacture of concentrated synthetic fruit powders and tablets. The invention consists of processing 100 to 125 parts of pulverised soluble carbohydrate with two parts of flavour, 0.5 parts of concentrated acid from citrus and 0.005 parts strong sugary substance derived from coal tar and the mixture is processed in a dehydrated chamber.

The British Rubber Producers' Research Association

"Improvements in the manufacture of rubber".

Abstract.—The invention which relates to the manufacture of rubber consists of a process for the elimination of colour in manufactured pale crepe. Chemical agents belonging to the class of aryl or alkyl mercaptans or their active radicals which when added to latex under the conditions for coagulation have been found to produce crepe of a superior whiteness. Examples of such effective reagents are phenyl mercaptan, xylyl mercaptan, B naphthyl mercaptan, zinc B-naphthyl mercaptide, sodium B naphthyl mercaptide, thioglycolic acid, O.o'-dibenzamidodiphenyldisulphide dodecylmercaptan. Quantities as low as 0.05 per cent of the reagent calculated on the rubber is sufficient to produce the bleaching effect.

There are 4 examples and 11 claims.
