SEASON REPORTS FOR THE MONTH ENDED JANUARY, 1896.

CENTRAL PROVINCE.

MATALE DISTRICT.

Matale South.—Weather : the rainfall registered at Matale was fair. The harvesting of the maha crops has commenced in most places, and the outturn is the best for the last four years. The fine grain cultivation is good.

Matale North.—Most of the tanks are full, and the cultivation is extensive and ripening. Chenas are doing remarkably well. In some villages a second sowing was necessary owing to the damages done by "polangete."

Matale East.—Paddy crops have been reaped in some villages with satisfactory results. The chenas are growing an excellent crop, especially chilies, in Gāngala Udasiyapattu.

EASTERN PROVINCE.

TRINCOMALEE DISTRICT.

Rainfall : 8·10 inches.

Paddy : the munmari cultivation in Koddiyar, Kaddukkulam, and Tamblegam pattus is in ear ; the state of crops is reported good.

Dry grain : the crops in Kaddukkulam ripe, and the plants in Koddiyar are reported fair.

Tobacco : the plants in Kaddukkulam were much damaged by the incessant rain, but they are thriving.

Cassava : the cultivation is being carried on in the Koddiyarpattu, and is reported to be in a fair condition.

Price of staple articles : rice, Rs. 3·75 per bushel ; paddy, Re. 1·50 per bushel ; dry grain, Re. 1·50 per bushel ; cassava, 3 cents per lb.

WHEREAS by the 6th section of "The Medical Wants Ordinance, 1880," it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, group together estates into districts, and may in the same and in like manner from time to time amend the grouping of any district or districts, or abolish any district or create a new district or new districts :

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the Twenty-third day of August, 1895, the several estates mentioned therein were grouped together into districts for the purposes of the said Ordinance :

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the several districts in the said Proclamation mentioned and to create new districts in lieu thereof :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation abolish the several districts set forth in the said Proclamation of the Twenty-third August, 1895, as from and after the Thirty-first day of January, 1896; and do further by these presents as from and after the date last aforewritten group together, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, the estates appearing in the schedule hereto into the districts therein set forth.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-six.

A right of way through the reserve from Dekinda to Ambagamuwa, Dekinda to Nāwala-pitiya, Dekinda to Galboda station.

The right to keep up elas leading from the following amunas through the proposed reserve:—Habaragalla amuna, Dekindawela mul-amuna, Hapuwattawela amuna, Amunewela amuna on the Dekinda-oya, and Paragasdeniya amuna on the Agara-oya, and to repair the amunas themselves with material taken from Crown land adjoining.
