"Improvements in or relating to the preparation of plasticizable elastomeric compositions"

*Abstract.*—This invention relates to the preparation of plasticizable elastomeric compositions of a natural or a synthetic rubber

The process comprises adding to a latex of the elastomer an effective amount of an aqueous dispersion of an O, O'-diacylamino diphenyl disulphide, in which the acyl groups are identical and contain alkyl radicals of from 1—12 carbon atoms, coagulating the solids content of the latex, washing the coagulum and drying the washed material.

"Improvements in or relating to a method of and apparatus for moulding hollow articles of self-setting materials"

*Abstract.*—This invention relates to a method of and apparatus for moulding hollow articles of self-setting materials such as concrete.

The method comprises placing a non-self supporting mix of self-setting material in a mould outside a hollow, thin walled, open ended former positioned therein. The hollow of the former is filled with loose particulate material and the former is withdrawn during or after placing and filling operation while leaving said particulate material in situ at least until the mix has become self-supporting.

Apparatus suitable for use with this method is also described.

"Lever indicator gramophone record cabinet for ready selection of records".

**Abstract.**—This invention relates to gramophone record cabinets. The cabinet has compartments to hold records on levers so arranged that when the levers are drawn out the record automatically gets lifted above the edge of the compartment. The lifting device works on the principle of the inclined plane. When the record is lifted out a spring device is operated which locks the lever and prevents it being drawn out any further. Replacing the record releases the lock and enables the lever to be pushed back.

"A process for the production of a valuable gas comprising carbon dioxide and hydrogen".

**Abstract.**—This invention relates to the production of gases—especially fuel gases containing CO and H<sub>2</sub>.

Finely divided fuel in suspension in a gas comprising oxygen and a small amount of steam is fed into a reaction chamber at ignition temperature in the form of a jet at a temperature below 100°C. Simultaneously with an annular stream of gas comprising an endothermic reactive medium coaxial with the jet and along the walls of the chamber. The proportions of oxygen, etc., are suitably adjusted to raise the temperature from 50°C to 100°C—1,200°C to 1,600°C.

Details of the process and a specimen example are given.

**Abstract.**—This invention relates to electrically illuminated advertising signs. It comprises a box-shaped housing one side of which is formed by a panel bearing the sign proper, behind which panel and spaced from the walls of the housing is disposed a drum carried on a longitudinal spindle driven by an electric motor arranged within the housing, the surface of said drum being at least partially perforated and/or provided with transparent or translucent portions. Reflecting surfaces are arranged within the housing to more effectively throw the light from the lamps on to the sign to produce a kaleidoscopic effect.

"A tilting cup and cover to prevent rain water washing out the rubber latex".

**Abstract.**—This invention relates to contrivances or mechanical devices for safeguarding latex collected from the influx of rain water.

The invention comprises of a metal container having a rim or edge which is slid into the side grooves of a metal balance cover plate shaped like a bat. The balance cover plate is suitably balanced on a pivot wire. The plate is provided with a slit for the latex to go through. The narrow end of the cover plate carries a weight so adjusted as to be tilted upwards when the container at the other end is weighted and the water and latex is just short of overflowing. Any extra quantity will cause the balance cover plate to tilt so that all extra water will flow away from the container.

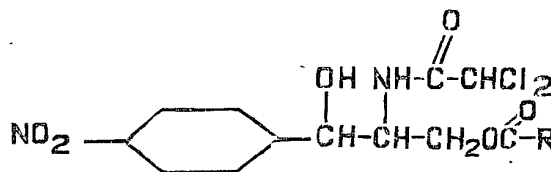

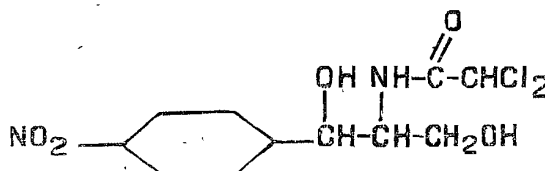

**Abstract.**—This invention relates to therapeutically valuable esters and to methods for obtaining the same. According to the invention esters having the general formula



are produced by the monoacylation of a 1-p-nitrophenyl-2-dichloroacetamidopropane-1, 3-diol compound of formula,



(Threo form)

The monoacylation by the use of acyl halide or acyl anhydride is preferably carried out under anhydrous conditions, the best results being obtained using a basic catalyst. The temperature should not be allowed to rise beyond 150°C. When a basic catalyst is used it is seldom, if ever, necessary to heat the reaction mixture above 60°C. Large excesses of acylating agent are to be avoided as this materially lowers the yield of the desired ester.

The ester products of this invention are claimed to possess all the therapeutic properties of the antibiotic chloramphenicol.
