REGULATION

The area specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be an urban area for the purposes of the Motor Traffic Act, No. 14 of 1951.

Schedule

The area within a circle having a radius of half a mile from the centre of the junction of the Kandana Station Road and the Colombo-Negombo High Road maintained by the Public Works Department and situated at Kandana in the Colombo District.

The Motor Traffic Act, No. 14 of 1951

REGULATIONS for the area comprised within the administrative limits of the Municipal Council of Colombo, made by the Minister of Transport and Works by virtue of the powers vested in him by sections 143 (1), 152 (1) and 239 of the Motor Traffic Act, No. 14 of 1951, and approved by the Senate and the House of Representatives.

REGULATIONS

1. On the highway known as Bagatelle Road in Colombo, no motor vehicle shall be driven at a greater speed than twenty miles per hour.

2. At the intersection of the highways known as Reid Avenue and Thurstan Road in Colombo, Rei Avenue shall be deemed to be the main road.

3. At the intersection of the highways known as Mattakuliya Centre Road and St. Mary's Road in Colombo, Mattakuliya Centre Road shall be deemed to be the main road.

4. At the intersection of the highway known as Galle Road and Dickmans Road in Colombo, Galle Road shall be deemed to be the main road.

Local Government Clerical Service Grade II Examination

Date of Examination.—A competitive examination for male candidates wishing to enter Grade II of the Local Government Clerical Service will be held in Colombo, Kandy, Galle and Jaffna, on June 21, 1952. The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. (1) Salary.—Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to posts in Grade II of the Local Government Clerical Service to serve Local Authorities (other than Village Committees) on the salary of Rs. 840 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 72 to Rs. 2,424 per annum. In this scale efficiency bars operate before Rs. 1,488 and Rs. 2,064 per annum. Rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be payable.

(ii) Conditions of Service.—(a) Candidates selected for appointment in the Local Government Clerical Service will not be permitted to sit for an examina-

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tion for entrance to any service under the Government or to apply for or accept an appointment in any Government Department during the first three years of their service in the Local Government Service.

(b) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws and regulations of the Local Authority subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(c) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' trial or probation. Those appointed to a Local Authority. (other than a Municipal Council) will be liable to transfer within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the above Ordinance, and may be posted to any station within the specified area in Ceylon. They will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of the date of appointment and no increment of salary will be given until the test is passed. They will be subject to the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, as amended by the Local Government Service (Transitional Provisions) Ordinance, No. 5 of 1946, any further amendments of Ordinance No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations made thereunder.

(d) Successful candidates with previous continuous service in a Local Authority may be allowed incremental credit for such service.

3. The names of successful candidates will be published in Part IV of the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

4. Eligibility.-(i) Candidates must be of good character.

(ii) Candidates must be Ceylonese.*

(iii) Candidates should have previously passed at least-

- (a) the Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation, or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or
- (b) the final examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or

(c) one of the following junior examinations: —

The Cambridge Junior; the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination of the Education Department, Ceylon, or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination held by a school approved by the Education Department for the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; TOGETHER WITH either (i) the Higher-Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce, or (ii) the Commercial Certificate Examination (either section) of the London Chamber of Commerce.

Note.—ORIGINAL CERTIFICATES OF EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS SHOULD BE ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION FORM.

(iv) Candidates must be within the age limits laid down in paragraph 6 (iv) except that, if necessary—

- (a) service candidates may deduct the period of their mobilized service in the last war from their age; and
- (b) candidates, who were or are temporary clerks in Government service for any continuous
- period of 2 years or more, may deduct such period of temporary service from their age provided that they were in such temporary
- employment on a date subsequent to April 1, 1946.

(v) Candidates should have been resident for at least three years immediately prior to April 1, 1952,

within an area specified in the Second Schedule to the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945.†

5. Eligibility of candidates already in the Local Government Service.—(i) Clerks in the Local Government Assistant Clerks' Service who possess the educational qualifications in paragraph 4 (iii) (a), (b) or (c) above and are under 45 years of age on June 1, 1952.

(ii) Clerks in the Local Government Assistant Clerks' Service who have been confirmed in their appointments on or before March 31, 1952, and are under 45 years of age on June 1, 1952.

(iii) Candidates in the permanent employ of a Local Authority and temporary clerks in Local Authorities with not less than two years' satisfactory service will be permitted to sit for the examination irrespective of age, provided they possess the educational qualifications prescribed in paragraph 4 (iii) (a), (b) or (c) above.

6. Applications.—(i) Applications for admission to the examination must be made on forms obtainable from the office of the Local Government Service Commission, Room No. 29 1/5, Gaffoor Building (First Floor), Colombo, up to April 24, 1952, and forwarded by registered post to reach the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, not later than May 3, 1952. Any applications received after that date will be rejected.

(ii) Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments or under Local Authorities, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their application through the Heads of the Departments or the Chairman of the Local Authorities in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.

(iii) The application must bear duly cancelled stamps to the value of Rs. 5.

(iv) The following documents must be attached to the form of application:—

(a) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born not earlier than June 21, 1927, and not later than June 21, 1935.

Note.—(1) Affidavits will not ordinarily be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(2) A certified copy of a birth registration entry effected more than one year after the date of the birth under section 18 (1) (b) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Cap. 94), will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the date of birth was established. Where the name appearing in the birth certificate differs from the name which the candidate ordinarily uses, satisfactory evidence will have to be adduced that the birth certificate is that of the candidate and not that of any other person. Where the candidate is under 21 years of age or is more than 21 years of age and has a parent living, applications should be made to the Registrar-General's or to the Provincial Registrar's or Assistant Provincial Registrar's Office in the district in which the birth took place, under section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, for the amendment of the entry in cage 2 of the birth registration entry, and in the other cases applications should be made to the District Court under section 20 for rectification of the entry in cage 2.

(b) A certificate of good character signed by a responsible person to the satisfaction of the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission. If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate of character must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it

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may be from the candidate's teacher or school-master by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary or generally speaking some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made;

- (c) A certificate of residence from a Divisional Revenue Officer, a Justice of the Peace, Advocate, Proctor or Notary Public, vide para. (4) (v);
- (d) The original certificate of, or regarding, candidate's educational qualifications.

N,B.—(1) ANY APPLICATION WHICH IS NOT ACCOMPANIED WITH ALL OR ANY ONE OF THE DOCUMENTS REQUIRED BY THIS NOTIFICA-TION WILL BE REJECTED.

(2) DOCUMENTS THAT ARE NOT ATTACHED TO THE APPLICATION FORM, BUT ARE SENT LATER WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

(3) APPLICATIONS NOT MADE ON THE PRESCRIBED FORM WILL BE REJECTED.

(v) The Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, will issue admission forms to those candidates whose applications are accepted. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of admission. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Candidates must sit for the examination at the examination hall assigned to them. A candidate presenting himself at an examination hall other than the one assigned to him will be refused admission to the examination.

A copy of the time table and the rules for the guidance of candidates for examination will be forwarded together with the admission form. These should be read carefully by candidates. Every candidate presenting himself for the examination must give up his admission form to the Supervising Examiner on the day of the examination.

If a candidate does not receive his admission form at least seven days before the day of the examination he should communicate without delay with the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, informing him that he has not received the admission form and giving the following particulars:—

7. Should any of the particulars furnished by candidates be found to be false within their know-ledge, they will, if appointed, be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalized.

8. Withdrawals and Refunds.—In no circumstances will a refund of the value of stamps be made.

9: Leave to Officers to attend Examination.— Heads of Departments and Chairmen of Local Authorities are kindly requested to grant to officers of their departments and of Local Bodies, whose applications have been approved by the Chairman, Local Government Service Commission, duty leave to present themselves at the examination.

10. Identity Cards.—Candidates will be required to prove their identity in the examination hall to the satisfaction of the Supervisor for each subject they offer. For this purpose any one of the following documents will be accepted:—

(a) Identity Card issued by the Postmaster-General.

- (b) A valid passport issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination.
- (c) Any certificate, licence, or other documents embodying a photograph of the holder and issued within the 3 years preceding the date of this examination, on the authority of a Government Department.

No candidate will be admitted to the examination without one of the documents referred to above in addition to his admission card.

11. Subjects.—The subjects for the examination are as follows:—

(1) English Language and Composition— A one and half hour paper which will include an essay, a precis, and questions to test the correct use of the English Language ... 150

(ii) General Paper-

A two and a half hour paper in three sections as follows: —

- (a) fifty minutes. A test of accuracy with figures including tots and additions of various kinds;
- (b) fifty minutes. A test of general intelligence;
- (c) fifty minutes. A test of general and local knowledge

(iii) One of the following:-

Sinhalese Tamil Arabic English (Special paper)

Sinhalese must be taken by Sinhalese candidates and Tamil by Tamil candidates. Candidates who are neither Sinhalese nor Tamil will be given the option of taking Sinhalese or Tamil or Arabic or a special paper in English, but candidates of mixed parentage must offer the language of one of their parents within the group English (Special), Sinhalese, Tamil or Arabic.

- (iv) The following optional subjects may be taken: ----
 - (a) Book-keeping and Accounts (one hour paper). The paper will consist of questions in Elementary Book-keeping and Accounts and will be designed to test accuracy in handling figures and a knowledge of simple fundamental rules of Book-keeping i.e. (principles of double entry and their application, trial balance ledgers and books of first trial balance ledgers and books of first entry, balance sheet and profit and loss account) ... 50
 - (b) Typewriting (20 minutes paper) Making a correct copy of a passage of about 500 words on the typewriter in 20 minutes, i.e., 25 words a minute 50

N.B.—EVERY CANDIDATE WHO OFFERS TYPEWRITING MUST BRING THEIR OWN TYPE-WRITER TO THE EXAMINATION HALL.

(v) Viva Voce Test-

Candidates are required to produce at the viva voce test the original certificates granted to them in respect of the examinations they have passed which qualify them for admission to the Local Government Clerical Service Examination ... 100

12. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the result of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the viva voce. The number to be called at the viva voce examination will be fixed by the Local Government Service Commission. In all written papers, marks will be deducted for bad handwriting and mistakes in spelling. Candidates, whose writing is illegible, are liable to be disqualified. The viva voce examination will be held in Colombo.

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13. Medical Examination.—The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

The examination will be conducted by the Commissioner of Examinations.

2. (i) Salary.-Successful candidates will be appointed as vacancies occur to serve Village Committees on the salary of Rs. 576 per annum, rising by annual increments of Rs. 36 to 936 per annum. An Efficiency Bar operates before Rs. 792 per annum. Rent allowance and a temporary cost of living allowance will be payable:

(ii) Conditions of service.—(a) The grant of leave and other conditions will be governed by the by-laws of the Village Committee, the Village Committee Rules framed under the Village Communities Ordinance and the provisions of the Local Government Service Ordinance, No. 43 of 1945, and any regulations framed thereunder.

(b) Successful candidates will be appointed on two years' trial or probation.
